AGENDA FOR THE 2013 CONVENTION - "LEARNING AND SHARING" IN THE TWIN CITIES

The program agenda for the combined 2013 DX Convention is taking shape. This year's event is called *"Learning and Sharing 2013"* and we have a lot of both for you. Folks from the National Radio Club, the IRCA and the Minnesota DX Club will keep your attention through the three days of the get-together. Here's a partial list of topics:

"Interference workshop" (DX-ing in noisy environments, how to enlist the help of the power company for electrical noise; how to quiet down smaller antennas).

We'll hear about Nick's "**DXFISHBARREL**" and share a session on using the grey-line. There'll be updates on what's going on these days from Long-Wave to 10 gigahertz.

Sessions on Ultralights and SDRs:

Antenna design sessions will include short verticals for MW, antenna advancements by Kaz; the quest for the 'perfect' loop antenna, and the latest on the FSL antenna.

Thursday night we're trying to put together a DX-Pedition with a Beverage antenna on an abandoned railroad bed. We also hope to set up an antenna at the hotel for your use in capturing signals in the Minneapolis area.

As a bonus, **we've added a Friday lunch** to the schedule, featuring a fascinating presentation by the IEEE on state-of-the-art antenna advancements.

Friday night at the Museum we'll enjoy a Pizza-Fest, "Show-and-Tell" from members and we'll block out time for separate club business meetings, followed by discussions of general interest. (Among topics will be "the aging of the clubs," how to attract new members, what services club members would like.) The world-famous auction will also be held at the Museum Friday night, and this year we anticipate some very nice radio gear going on the block.

Saturday evening's banquet will feature Dean Sorenson, long-time radio broadcaster and a DX Audio Service member who'll share a fascinating look at what it's like to build and manage radio stations. The banquet will be followed by the DX Quiz

- 560 MÉXICO, XESRD, Santiago Papasquiaro, Dgo. 0554 4/23 after music, ID as "La Tremenda." dominant unless nulled when US stations can be heard, ie XESRD, 10/1 kW per Cantú. I was wondering about the derivation of this strange name; no info on that in Wikipedia, but I do learn it is a town about the same size as Enid but four times as high; many emigrants from there are in Chicago. In the news lately for kidnapping. Googling, I don't find the name Papasquiaro applying to anyplace or anyone else. (GH-OK)
- 580 MÉXICO, XEMÚ, Piedras Negras, Coah. 0549 4/23, promo for "Noticias Rancherita del Aire," singing ID for same, live DJ with timecheck and 26 degrees; often dominant over opposite WIBW Topeka KS with which it makes a 2 Hz SAH, ie XEMU, 5/2.5 kW. (GH-OK)
- 620 MEXICO, XEBU, Chihuahua, Chih. 0540 4/27, SS ad for an event mentioning 93.3, apparently an FM sponsor of it; hoped I had something other than XEBU, since its own FM is 91.7, but after some federal PSAs for Diputados, Suprema Corte, ID as Chihuahua, La Rancherita. The 93.7 there per Cantú is XHBW, Magia Digital, whose AM is 1280. Maybe they are same group? Or just a crossover commercial. (GH-OK)
- 650 MÉXICO, XETNT, Los Mochis, Sin. 1112 4/25, XETNT with 5:12 TC, unique show "Buenos Días, Yarderos." (GH-OK)
 - + 1155 4/27, Mexican music, fading at 1156 during R 65 sung ID, polca. Tuning down the band, XETNT, is the only XE still audible on lowband here, 12 minutes after our sunrise. (GH-OK)
- 660 MÉXICO, XEACB, Ciudad Delicias, Chih, La Lupe. 0524 & 0536 4/34, IDs in passing for 98.9, La Lupe, mixing with others, so that s XEACB, not the hummer. (GH-OK)
 - + 0504 4/25, another station which is not the hummer, ID as La Lupe, ie XEACB, still on tho listed as sign-off at 0600 which would be 0500 during DST. (GH-OK)
 - + Tuning in even earlier at 0449 4/28 trying to sort out the one about to hum: initially preacher in SS on top; 0450 music station takes over, 0457 mentions 98.9 so that s XEACB, only now do I hear an XE NA weakly underneath and no hum after 0500; probably from the preaching one earlier. (GH-OK)
 - + 0501 4/20, probably XEACB, main signal of Mexican music looping SW, but in its null toward the SE, can hear some hum, which fits for post-midnite XEFZ Monterrey NL, which is considerably further east. (GH-OK)
- 660 MÉXICO, XEÁR, Tampico, Tams. 0455 4/25, I am switching back and forth with 690 KGGF, here trying to nail down which XE is the one switching to a big hum heard several nights after NA finished at 0500. But now there are two or three stations mixing. Initially Mexican music is atop, not NA starting before hourtop. 0500 full ID for "La Mexicana, 12 en punto" and then short choral NA, 0501 another slogan ID. That's XEAR, 5/1 kW, listed as 24 hours by IRCA. I can barely hear some hum in the background from the other mystery station. (GH-OK)
- 660 MÉXICO, XEDTL, México, DF, R Ciudadana. 1109 4/25, NA is ending late, in mix of several stations, then full sign-on by an IMER station with 5-letter call, also mentioning its HD channel, ie on FM. This has to be XEDTL, 50/1 kW (remember when it was commercial XERPM? That call is no

longer in use anywhere per IRCA cross-reference). IRCA and Cantú do not list an FM for it, but probably refers to 660 programming being simulcast on one of their FM IBOC subchannels. Yes, explained here: http://imer.gob.mx/imerdigital/ with Ciudadana on 107.9 HD2. Looks like they have some good cultural programming. (GH-OK)

- 660 MÉXICO, XĚFZ, Monterrey, ŇL. I tuně in even earlier at 0450 4/29 to hear SS preacher finishing with Monterrey address, 0451 ID for R ABC, XEFZ in Monterrey and into choral multiverse NA. Mixing with others and they overtake by 0456, but this virtually confirms it's the station which had been broadcasting a big hum after the NA finished around 0500, but which is no longer heard. (GH-OK)
 - + 0455 5/2, choral multiverse NA is playing, looping SSW, ends at 0457 and nothing further heard from this one, presumed XEFZ, while another one with Mexican music further west fades in, presumed XEACB Delicias, Chih. (GH-OK)
- 660 MÉXICO, UnID. 0500 4/23 the Mexican NA is playing, followed by dead air, open carrier with background hum surging to foreground. So we know the big hum being heard here is from a United States of Mexican rather than United States of American. Next will have to tune in a few minutes earlier to determine which one. Apparently they leave on not only the carrier after sign-off, but also the Optimod which stupidly brings up the hum on the circuit. Tonight it's worse than usual, with slow pulsing too. 0548 recheck I think it is off, but fades back in along with another SS station still modulating. My hunch is that the hummer is XEFZ in Monterrey NL, which is usually the dominant Mexican on this frequency; but based solely on the schedule hours in the 2012 IRCA Mexican Log, which cannot remain totally accurate after publication: it's 24 hours as are XEEY Aguascalientes and XEAR Tampico, while these close at 0600: XEACB Cludad Delicias (which I have also heard before), XEWX Durango; while the others sign off at some other time. However altho presented in UT, those schedule times probably apply to winter non-DST rather than now. (GH-OK)
 - + 0455 4/24 tuning in early trying to nail down the hummer post-0500: dominant is lively Mexican music, but by 0456 an under-station is playing choral Mexican NA, and that's likely to be the hummer; yes: 0500 NA stops and hum surges. (Every station signing off with an anthem, anywhere, should be required to insert a quick legal ID *after* it!) (GH-OK)
 - + 0452 4/27, early NA already playing on unID station, presumably the one which has been followed by big hum; but losing out by 0454 to 'The Answer,' KSKY The Metroplex. Some checks after 0500 did not detect the hum, maybe no longer in effect? (GH-OK)
- 690 MÉXICO, XEN, México, DF. 0642 4/27, international exchange rates in SS, 0644 news about Tabasco. Main signal, with KTSM El Paso and KGGF Coffeyville OC more or less nulled, and peaks further east than most Mexicans I get. All adds up to presumed XEN, with its news/talk format. There is only one XE further east than that, in Veracruz but it's a Ke Buena, likely musical – or not? IRCA shows XEAFA in Coatzacoalcos as News & Ranchera. Still, XEN most likely, especially if running 50 kW nights as claimed instead of 5. (IIRC, 690 used to be a major frequency from Cuba, but not anymore.) (GH-OK)
- 700 MÉXICO. XEDKR. 1045 4/25, ID for R Red on 1110, and FM. XEDKR, Guadalajara relay of XERED DF on 1110, per Cantú 10000/150 watts, but nevertheless the default station at night with WLW nulled. (GH-OK)
- 700 MÉXICO, XEGĎ, Hidalgo del Parral, Chih, La Poderosa. 0517 5/2, YL in SS vs WLW but not in its null, so approximately opposite direction: that points to XEGD, 5/1 kW per Cantú, assuming XEETCH in Sonora is really a daytimer. I had just been nulling WLW and hearing a different station playing music in EE, probably previously heard XEDKR, R Red AM in Guadalajara, but there's also now-SS KHSE in The Metroplex TX. (GH-OK)
- 700 MÉXICO, UnID. 1108 4/25, dominant signal now with FM frequency 102.5, "Noticias MBF" (or NDF? Or some combination of similar sounding letters). Cantú and IRCA show no 700 with an FM on 102.5, nor XERED 1110 either. However, Cantú does list in the DF: "102.5 Noticias MVS, Noticias, programas hablados. XHMVS 80,100 watts. Grupo MVS Radio." So the question is, which XE on 700 would be relaying this? As far as I can tell from their website with lots of news and visuals, http://www.noticiasmvs.com/#//home it`s an independent company, and no affiliate list to be found. Search site on 700 and you get loads of news stories mentioning this figure. By now, it has 700 to itself, WLW faded out. (GH-OK)
- 710 MÉXICO, XEDP, Chihuahua, Chih. 0546 4/27, béisbol with crowd noise, presumably a live late game if in Mexico too they are open-ended; loops SW and soon mentions Cuauhtémoc as one of the teams, so usual XEDP, breaking away from ranchera format. It's almost local midnite in the UT-6 zone. Surely more nite games to come when it's cooler around the diamond. (GH-OK)
- 720 MÉXICO, XEDE, Saltillo, Coah. 0549 4/27, timecheck as "48" and temp as 18 grados, back to music; typical automated time & temp format at every break of XEDE. Altho 50 kW WGN has as strong a signal as 250-watt(?) XEDE, WGN is totally nullable, avoiding slow SAH; not too far from collinear either, eg around Dallas, where listening to WGN must be quite a problem. (GH-OK)
- 730 MÉXICO, XEX, México, DF. 730, May 2 at 0519 5/2, SS talking over and over about pelotas, presumably sports format XEX as the DF fits; thought it might be a late béisbol game from further west, but then at 0521 talking about Barcelona. Tho they're mad about soccer there, unlikely to be a live game this early in the morning. (GH-OK)
- 700 MÉXICO, XEHB, Hidalgo del Parral, Chih. With XEX nulled, another SS about "Las reinas de Radiorama" and "Ke Buena" ID, ie XEHB. XEX is allegedly 100 kW at night, and XEHB only 1, but their 50 kW day transmitter may be getting some extra usage. On the Ke Buena slogan, be aware that there is another one on 730, per Cantú, XEEBC in Ensenada BCN, 1/0.25 kW. Its FM is 97.9 while XEHB's is 107.1. (GH-OK)

- 830 MÉXICO, XEIK, Piedras Negras, Coah. 1215 4/28, SS weather in C, mentions 100.9 FM; 1216 TC for, 7:17. No doubt it's XEIK, a semihour after sunrise here and soon to fade out. (GH-OK)
- 990 MÉXICO, XET, Monterrey, NL. 0506 5/2 after NA and full XET ID, produced opening of 'La Ruta Musical de la T.' address Apartado 203, Monterrey NL, then to live host welcoming 990 and internet listeners everywhere, referring to yesterday being workers` May Day, but no mention this time of his program number in the 18-thousands. His speech is quite slurred, not your usual glib radio announcer, but hey, he's just turned 98 on 4/15! Again could not copy his name. I wonder if he now has a home studio or goes to work at XET every night for 50+ years? The Multimedios website is no help for anything but streaming linx to its multitude of stations, http://www.mmradio.com/estaciones/ciudad but searching on the program title found this lengthy article about Don Chabelo Jiménez, former beisbolista whose mother lived to 107: http://www.larocka.mx/sexion-dos/suciedad-dos/1684-chabelo-jimenez-el-cronista-de-todos-

- 1460 MÉXICO, XECB, San Luis Rio Colorado, Son. 0101 5/2, male announcer with ID in SS "XECB," and slogan "R Ranchito," to Mex polka and banda music. Fair. (RB-AZ)
- 1520 UnID. 0508 4/25, KOKC has QRM from vocal ballad Mexican music. Unfortunately, unlike other OKC signals I can't completely null KOKC so have to put up with the nonsense from Redeye Radio while trying to ID the QRM, from which I have yet to copy any announcement. At least I get a pretty good DF on it, SSW or maybe NNE, which if correct rules out the Californians as Greg Hardison helpfully suggested. There it is again at 1053, music making fast SAH with KOKC. I think we can also rule out KSIB in Creston IA, our closest 1520 to the NNE since it's a daytimer and still active in EE per website. Based on proximity and direction, the most likely one in Cantú is: XEVUC La Norteñita Allende, Coah. 1,000 D, with one little problem: listed as a daytimer, but as we know, that doesn't necessarily stop USA or USM stations from running all night. The IRCA Log 2012 has this one on 1050 instead, as "La Gigante," so recently moved? I can see how they would want to get off XEG's frequency, and maybe really operate at night on the new channel. WRTH 2013 also has this La Norteñita on 1520, as 1 kW fulltime, ie no "d" indicating a daytimer. (GH-OK)
- 1570 MÉXICO, XERF, Ciudad Acuña, Chih. 1142 4/27, XERF with 6.42 timecheck on "La Poderosa," brief Efemérides = day in history with Col. Bogey whistling theme, 1144 federal and Coahuila state PSAs; 1145 SS music CCI grows apparently as KZLI Tulsa icoses its 50 watt PSRA per NRC AM Log to 1000 watts day at official sunrise there; but I can still hear at 1145 XERF mentioning some cumpleaños and at 1146 an instrumental-only version of "Mañanitas," unlike last time. Anyhow this seems to be a regular morning ritual for them. But in May, KZLI goes to day power at 1115, and in June, 1100. Never mind the 50 watts: FCC AM Query shows PSRA is only 8 watts, limited by XERF every month except June when unneeded. Can anyone in Tulsa or even Catoosa really hear them on 8 watts atop XERF? (GH-OK)
 - + 1151 4/30, probably just finished 'Mañanitas,' XERF now in "Servicio Social" with missing-person "avisos personales" requests, including those last known to be in Coahuila, Chihuahua, phone numbers to be contacted. Have also heard this at other times on XERF. Good for a broad-coverage public radio AM station like this, and something you don't hear elsewhere on either side of la frontera. 1208, XERF still in with stocks in pesos, other Mexican tipoffs instead of SS KZLI Tulsa. (GH-OK)

- 3925 JAPAN, R Nikkei. 1130 4/20. Woman in JJ, music, Very good. (RBAZ)
- 3985 **REP KOREA**, Echo of Hope. 1145 4/22. Man in KK with co-channel jammer signals. (RB-AZ)
- 4055 GUATEMALA, R Verdad. 1140 4/22. Organ music to woman in SS. Very good and rock steady. (RB-AZ)
- 4557 **REP KÓREA**, V of the People. 1140 4/20. Man in KK to music, and woman announcer. Heard under both jammer and super-swooper. (RB-AZ)
