AGENDA FOR THE 2013 CONVENTION - "LEARNING AND SHARING" IN THE TWIN CITIES

The program agenda for the combined 2013 DX Convention is taking shape. This year's event is called "Learning and Sharing 2013" and we have a lot of both for you. Folks from the National Radio Club, the IRCA and the Minnesota DX Club will keep your attention through the three days of the get-together. Here's a partial list of topics:

"Interference workshop" (DX-ing in noisy environments, how to enlist the help of the power company for electrical noise; how to quiet down smaller antennas).

We'll hear about Nick's "DXFISHBARREL" and share a session on using the grey-line. There'll be updates on what's going on these days from Long-Wave to 10 gigahertz.

Sessions on Ultralights and SDRs:

Antenna design sessions will include short verticals for MW, antenna advancements by Kaz; the quest for the 'perfect' loop antenna, and the latest on the FSL antenna.

Thursday night we're trying to put together a DX-Pedition with a Beverage antenna on an abandoned railroad bed. We also hope to set up an antenna at the hotel for your use in capturing signals in the Minneapolis area.

As a bonus, we've added a Friday lunch to the schedule, featuring a fascinating presentation by the IEEE on state-of-the-art antenna advancements.

Friday night at the Museum we'll enjoy a Pizza-Fest, "Show-and-Tell" from members and we'll block out time for separate club business meetings, followed by discussions of general interest. (Among topics will be "the aging of the clubs," how to attract new members, what services club members would like.) The world-famous auction will also be held at the Museum Friday night, and this year we anticipate some very nice radio gear going on the block.

Saturday evening's banquet will feature Dean Sorenson, long-time radio broadcaster and a DX Audio Service member who'll share a fascinating look at what it's like to build and manage radio stations. The banquet will be followed by the DX Quiz.

Sports talker WDAE now simulcast on 95.3 FM May 9, 2013 By: Doug Miles Credits: www.620wdae.com

620 AM WDAE (Tampa, FL-ye ed) is now simulcasting on the FM side of the radio dial at 95.3 FM. The switch took place earlier this week. The sports talker's signal is using the 250-watt translator W237CW that was most recently simulcasting the audio of hip hop WBTP "95.7 The Beat." The FM signal gives WDAE an FM presence joining WHFS 98.7, which has struggled to find an audience since its debut in August 2012. AM radio is hanging on for dear life as more stations are transitioning to the FM dial. Music is all but gone from AM radio and now talk programming is shifting to FM in most markets. While the FM signal may not carry as far as AM, the quality is better and with repeaters and translators, stations can get the same coverage with an FM signal as they did on AM. (WDAE's city of license is actually St. Petersburg, FL-EiC)

Also heard "Camargo" mentioned a couple times, presumably one of the teams from a nearby town. (GH-OK)
- 660 MÉXICO, XEFZ Monterrey NL. 0506 5/17, really big hum atop the channel, much more than 24 hours earlier, presumed fault of XEFZ. (GH-OK)
 - + 0502 5/18, big hum from XEFZ dominating channel. (GH-OK)
- MÉXICO, XEÑ. 0505 5/22 dominant signal from the DF instead of KTSM or KGGF (but whose carrier is probably still on), is SS, finishing choral NA, full ID as XEN, 100,000 watts, Grupo R Centro, "la 69 es noticias," beginning playback of Jacobo Zabludovsky's 1 pm talkshow, and announced as also on several other GRC stations including XERED 1110 (now or originally, or both?) Conditions somewhat auroral; K index at 03 was 4, by 06 down to 2, and "no spaceweather storms" per WWV. (GH-OK)
- MÉXICO, XEDP, Cuauhtémoc, Chih. 1115 5/17, a few words of Low GG, dead air, and canned sung ID for "XEDP, la Ranchera de Cuauhtémoc," Chihuahua, and more music. Fridays are a regular day for this minority preacher, but he stopped rather abruptly, maybe unintentionally, cuing a silence-sensor. Not sure what other days he may be on during this semihour. I have to get up this early now for any sunrise skip DX from NW Mexico as our Enid sunrise is now 1123, to reach its earliest in less than a month circa 1113. Just before this on 710, I was still getting a good signal with ID on 650 from the very reliable R 65 in Los Mochis, Sinaloa, XETNT. (GH-OK)
 - + 1108 5/28, Chihuahua state song is ending; trying to outdo the national anthem for militarism (after all, the tierra of Pancho Villa); 1109 full ID for XEDP and XHDP with MW power as 5 kW, which really gets out (WRTH has odd figure of 7 kW), "La Ranchera de Cuauhtémoc" sung ID, but first: a bit of choral hymn, and 'Die Bibel Sagt' in Low GG (sorry, I know how to spell that only in High GG, if different); preacher keeps asserting past 1121 this day, but fading after 1115 with CCI coming up from KGNC and/or KCMO. Enid sunrise today 1117, to attain 1113 in a biweek. (GH-OK)
