#### NEW FROM NRC PUBLICATIONS

NRC Publications is now accepting orders for the 34<sup>th</sup> Edition of the **NRC AM Radio Log**. This began final production shortly after the Minneapolis convention, and should be shipping by the time you read this. The member price is good for NRC and IRCA members. The member price is \$22.95 (media rate); \$26.80 if you want this shipped via Priority Mail. The non-member price is \$28.95 (\$32.80 if you want this shipped via Priority Mail). For shipping to Canada, the price is \$35.00, and if shipped overseas, the price is \$39.00. All orders shipped to Canadian and overseas addresses will be sent via Global Priority Mail.

Also new from NRC Publications is the 7<sup>th</sup> Edition of the **NRC AM Pattern Book**, which began shipping following the Minneapolis convention. Prepared by noted DXer Paul Swearingen, it is an all-inclusive book of day and night operation patterns for stations in the United States, Canada and selected foreign countries. The data sources for the information come from the 34<sup>th</sup> NRC AM Radio log and the comprehensive Mexican station listing put together by noted DXer John Callarman. There are 240 pages in this book; the maps cover each frequency from 530 to 1700 kHz, depicting the U.S. "Lower 48", Canada and Mexico. Hawaii and Alaska are shown on separate maps at the end of the book. The member price is \$22.95 (\$26.80 for shipping via Priority Mail); the non-member price is \$28.95 (\$32.80 for shipping via Priority Mail). I was hoping this would be enough to pin it down, but we have contradictory info. First thought is the DF station, XEOC, as googling matches up 560 with GRC in the DF; maybe it once was, but the GRC website now has an AM dial starting at 690. As for affiliates elsewhere, can't find any listing of them on GRC website. IRCA Mexican Log 2012 has no GRC nets on 560. Cantú does not include nets on the by-frequency list, but has: XEOC R Chapultepec México, DF 750 500. And so does WRTH 2013; really low-powered compared to the other DF stations! Other sources contradict that info: IRCA has XEOC as La Mejor with 5/5 kW, but in the PM – Promomedios group. Perhaps one of the seven other XEs on 560 now is a GRC station, but which? (GH-OK)
- 630 **MÉXICO**, XEFB, Monterrey, NL. 0657 9/23 noted with pop music, call letters, CDT time checks in SS. Fair to poor signal with digital interference from WOI 640. Local 630 off the air during transition from KJSL to KYFI. (EB-MO)
- 680 **MÉXICO**, XEORO, Guasave, Sin, La Mera Jefa. 1212 9/23, PSA for something in Sinaloa, then SHVA ad or promo, 1213 "Noticias en Punto," 6:14 timecheck, "en el valle del Yaqui," then detailed estado del tiempo (weather report). So this is again: XEORO + FM 93.7 1,000 500. (GH-OK)
- 660 **MÉXICO**. 0512 9/23, partial ID includes an FM in .7 and maybe "La Lupita," but these point to two different possibilities in Cantú: XEACB La Lupe + FM 98.9 Cd. Delicias, Chih. 3,000 1,000 or XEAR La Mexicana + FM 101.7 Tampico, Tamps. 5,000 1,000. (GH-OK)
- 700 **MÉXICO**, XEGD, Hidalgo del Parral, Chih, La Poderosa. 1205 9/23, romantic music, ID thrice only as "La Poderosa," more music, dominant until 1215 fading down, 1218 gone, but right back up playing choral NA at very odd time, apparently very short version; 1219 bit of a song mentioning Chihuahua, but incomplete, IDs for XEGD 700 y XHGD 90.3, "Sistema combo desde Parral," "Buenos días, con XEGB, La Poderosa" singing ID, back to music. Cantú: XEGD + FM 90.3 5,000 1,000. No, he shows the FM is really XHEGD, following the usual pattern if the added FM four-letter XH-- call is already assigned somewhere else. (GH-OK)
- + 1203 9/24, big hum added to open carrier as often heard in mornings; station warming up for late sign-on, still hum at 1210; at 1211 some CCI in SS starts to appear underneath, could be KHSE TX. 1218 choral NA is in progress, 1219 full sign-on ID from XEGD, La Poderosa in Parral, ie as in Cantú: XEGD + FM 90.3 5,000 1,000. (GH-OK)
- 700 **MÉXICO**. 1200 9/26, YL with lots of news items referring to the "DF," 1201 "Noticias MVS," Today in History segment with clips in EE of a poet, Olivia Newton-John with "Xanadu." Like my previous log 4/25 at 1108, I am still wondering which 700 station is taking this network feed out of the DF. Obviously same one heard 9/12 at 1201 with history clips, probably XEGD in Hidalgo del Parral, rather than XEDKR in Guadalajara. (GH-OK)
- 710 **MÉXICO**, XEDP, Cuauhtémoc, Chih. 1204 9/26 "iniciamos Noticiero Cuestión de Minutos," a rather odd name for a newscast, W&M anchors chat, weather for Chihuahua, so as expected it's just XEDP, the usual dominator. (GH-OK)
- 710 **MÉXICO**, XEDP, Cuauhtémoc, Chih. 1149 9/24 noted with "La Ranchera de Cuauhtémoc" jingle, Ranchera music and local ads in SS. Fair signal, alone on channel. (EB-MO)
- 720 **MÉXICO**, XEJCC, Ciudad Juárez, Chih, Extremo 7-20. 1209 9/23, low-key conversation, 1211 mentions Extremo 720, music break; Cantú still hasn't corrected the extra zero on the night power: XEJCC 1,000 1,000 [sic]. (GH-OK)
- 760t **MÉXICO**, XEES, Chihuahua, Chih, Antena. 0510 9/26, preacher in SS, but sounds almost sane, NE/SW and way over WJR with SAH from opposite direction, gradually fading back up. Unseems any US SS station, leaving it to Mexico. Chihuahua would be the obvious choice, tho none listed as totally religious; recheck at 0527, I make out an "Antena 760" ID way under WJR mentioning Chihuahua, but by then not necessarily same station, altho SAH seems the same. Cantú: XEES + FM 102.5 10,000 1,000. Meanwhile, WJR is on 'Redeye R,' usual hateful anti-Obama rants; tnx a lot, WBAP. (GH-OK)
- 770t **MÉXICO**, XEACH, Monterrey, NL, R Fórmula Primer Cadena. 1217 9/20, dominant here instead of KKOB or KKOB is SS YL and sidekick, livening up a This-day-in-history segment with a quiz, guess the year? Pertaining to Zoroaster and Juárez, what a pair. Presumed this one per Cantú based on format and previous logs: XEACH 25,000 1,000. (GH-OK)
- 780 **MÉXICO**. 1159 9/21, KSPI OK open carrier on early as usual but no programming quite yet; with it nulled, there is romantic music, 1201 ID as "La Poderosa" on an FM frequency I could

not copy twice, and 780 AM; automated timecheck twice as "7 con 1 minuto" so it's certainly in the UT-5 zone CDT. The new 2013 NRC AM Log does not show any SS US station on 780. Last IDed XE on 780 was XEWGR in Monclova, Coah, and there are none further west or north, so I don't see how this could be anything else, but IRCA Log shows it named "Exa" which is primarily on FM. Maybe "poderosa" is just an informal slogan, and 10 kW on AM could qualify if that mattered in Mexican terms, but their FM 101.1 is only 2397 watts. No other 780s are named Poderosa in IRCA or Cantú (but both show a second Exa not to be confused with this): XEWGR Exa + FM 101.1 Monclova, Coah. 10,000 250 or XEZN Exa + FM 104.5 Celaya, Gto. 5,000 1,000. (GH-OK)

- 820t **MÉXICO**, XEUDO, Los Mochis, Sin, R UdeO (Univ de Occidente.) 1206 9/24 a state anthem is playing under WBAP (which I never can null out completely), making slow SAH; 1208 CCI from a third station, but the anthem ends with a prolonged hi note, unlike the Coahuila anthem I previously linked to. No sign-on announcement audible immediately after the anthem. There is nothing from Coahuila or Chihuahua on 820, in deference to WBAP. Could it be Durango where there's an 820, XEDRD? Official state anthem just premiered on July 8, 2013, as in: <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ZFwVpGu7n6Q> (Preview) by children's choir, certainly not the version I heard, and without the prolonged hi note at the end, tho that could be a certain singer's show-off on another anthem. Ajá, the Sinaloa anthem does have that prolonged hi note finale: <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ydkuaKP7vYw> (Preview.) It seems this too has just been adopted in April of this year, following a contest. So based on this somewhat tenuous connection, I will make the log tentatively the only Sinaloa on 820, per Cantú: XEUDO + FM 89.3 1,000 250. Sinaloa of course is a hot-spot for SRS MW DX around here with many other stations logged, despite distance of almost a kilomile. 650 XETNT is a regular. (GH-OK)
- 850 **MÉXICO**, XEM, Chihuahua, Chih, Milenio R. 1150 9/23, Milenio R dominant with news, such that I can only hear KOA by nulling this; makes SAH about 5 Hz: XEM + FM 103.7 5,000 500. (GH-OK)
- 870 **MÉXICO**, XETAR, Guachochi, Chih, as La Voz de la Sierra Tarahumara. 1202 9/21, opening in presumed Tarahumara language, several announcers introducing themselves in SS; 1205 live time check by YL DJ with many IDs in passing as XETAR and also Guachochi, Chihuahua; she sounds a bit sleepy. (GH-OK)
- 960 **MÉXICO**, XEK, Nuevo Laredo, Tamps, La Estacion Grande. 0502 9/23, during local KGWA Fox-hole of dead air, amid QRMix I hear the 4 descending chimes of XEW, previously matched to XEK in Nuevo Laredo; Cantú: XEK 5,000 1,000. 0503 something playing "Let It Be" in instrumental band version, not necessarily XEK. I've continued to monitor the pentamminute KGWA Fox-hole which still happens almost every night, but hear the same old stuff, ABC news echoing, etc., from KGKL/KMA, so not reported. XEW/XEK chimes are rare enough to be notable. (GH-OK)
- 970 **MÉXICO**, XEJ, Monterrey, NL. 1212 9/26, choral NA at odd time, way under gospel huxter in EE, presumably KHVN Tulsa, atop XEJ Juárez which often owns 970 here at night. Yet in the noroeste there's another Chihuahuan, a Sonoran and a Sinaloa I would prefer to hear. (GH-OK)
- 990 **MÉXICO**, XET, Monterrey, NL. 0657 9/15 noted with pop music, "XET, La Grande T de Monterrey" ID, mention of frequency and 50,000 watts of power, into variety show in SS. Fair to poor signal, mixing with CBW and KWAM. (EB-MO)
- 1030 **MÉXICO**, XESDD, Tijuana, BC, R Romance. 1228 9/26, romantic music in SS, loops east-west; 1229 ID but missed the critical parts: "XE-- , Mil 30 AM, R...." Probably this as in Cantú: XESDD 5,000 5,000. (GH-OK)
- 1630 **MÉXICO**, XEUT, Tijuana, BCN. Finally, I hear sign-on to confirm that XEUT is the source of strong open carrier I've been hearing. (For months, strong open carrier running hours at a time, later, around daybreak, am hearing XEUT.) This session, caught Mexican anthem and s/on XEUT at 1310. (RB-AZ)

#### EDITOR’S NOTEBOOK

Thanks to Mark for another excellent report from Cape Cod!

Here’s a tip for those who live further inland, and want to try their hand at Trans-Atlantic DX: Avoid channels that end in 0, 1, 2, 8 or 9. The domestic stations will always slop over to the adjacent channel stations within at least 2 kHz of the frequency of the domestic station (which always has a frequency ending in “0”). The only two Trans-Atlantic stations I’ve noted at my location were noted in 1996 on 684 (RNE Radio 1 Sevilla, Spain) and 1215 kHz. (the United Kingdom, when it was Sir Richard Branson’s “Virgin Radio”). Start with the frequencies that end in “5” (like 585, 675, 1215 or 1305 kHz) if you don’t have a local 5 kHz away (I have a local on 590 kHz, for example), and work your way to frequencies that end in “4”, “6”, then those that end in “3” and “7”. You also should be far away from a local station that broadcasts in digital format, or a 50 kW powerhouse like WWL 870 New Orleans (which can wreak havoc with stations on 864 and 873 kHz). I also have a 5 kW day/1 kW night local on 1380 kHz which can wreak havoc with signals on 1377 kHz and 1386 kHz. I live 700 miles from the closest point on the Atlantic coast (Charleston, SC and Savannah, GA), which makes Trans-Atlantic DXing even more challenging.

I’d like to hear from more of you in IRCA who live east of the Mississippi. Are you hearing Trans-Atlantic and/or Pan-American stations at your location? Regardless of whether you live on Cape Cod or Cape Hatteras, in New England, the Southeast or even as far inland as Illinois or the Upper Peninsula of Michigan, this is the place to send your reports.

Three changes have happened in the St. Louis area in the past month. The biggest one is the change in format at KYFI 630 (ex-KJSL). The fundamentalist Christian talk shows are gone from the station, replaced with a mix of Christian Easy Listening music and teaching from Bible Broadcasting Network.

The studios for the station were moved out of St. Louis to Charlotte, NC (BBN’s flagship is WYFQ 930). KJSL had its local studios in Creve Coeur. Crawford acquired the station (the former KXOK) in 1994. Crawford still holds onto KSTL 690, broadcasting an Urban Gospel format as “Shine 690”; for how long is another question. KSTL is back to 24-hour operation after selling the 630 outlet. There has been a major difference between the last time the local on 630 was off in 1994 and this recent silent period. In 1994, there was one dominant station throughout that period: WBMQ Savannah, GA. Since then, that station has cut its night power to 47 watts; it was inaudible this time around. One station that was logged the last time the local was silent has since moved to FM: CKRC Winnipeg, MB. This time, the dominant station was WAVU Albertville, AL. At sunset, CFCO was in with a fair to poor signal before cutting to night power and pattern before 2000 ELT. At night, WAVU, KSLR and XEFB were trading places. New logs in this 630 silent period included WNEG Toccoa, GA and WREY St. Paul, MN. WQQX 1490 is now on its third format since Entertainment Media Trust (d/b/a Insane Broadcasting Company) acquired the station from Simmons Communications. The station has dropped R&B oldies (except for a few hours on Saturday afternoon) for Fox Sports Radio with hourly news from Fox News Radio, identifying as “1490 The Champ”. The sports talk format is the one the station previously had as WFFX. Another EMT/Insane property, WQQW 1510 Highland, IL, has flipped from Classic Country to Ranchera and Tejano music as “La Que Buena”. Both of Highland’s AM stations now broadcast in Spanish; the other one being WIJR 880 “La Ley”. WQQW was previously leased to another group which focused on serving Madison County, IL. On the DX end of things, I’ve been experimenting with the use of prepared form cards (PFCs) for verifying reception reports. I read that it worked well with shortwave radio stations, so I thought I would give it a try. These are the kind of cards in which the station fills in the blanks to verify reception reports. Accompanied by a self-addressed stamped envelope (SASE), I have gotten three new verification cards through this method: KWAK 1240, WGIL 1400 and WZYX 1440. The average reply time has been a week. In the ‘80s and ‘90s, I experimented with prepared form letters; this met mostly with success on both AM and FM. I also have included SASEs with those I did not send cards to; I’ve gotten a verification letter back from KPSZ 940. The verification signer for this one is also good for KRNT 1350. I’ll get an article written on this subject for a future DXM. The transition from the print to softcopy DX Monitor went off with a few technical glitches in the first issue, but were pretty much resolved with the second and third issues. I reached another milestone in my logbook on August 22 at 1029 ELT, when I logged a station I’ve wanted for many years. KMMO 1300 Marshall, MO was noted with local ads and a farm report. KMMO-FM 102.9, its simulcast partner, was also in with a much stronger signal. WFRX, the regular on 1300, was surprisingly absent. KMMO is my 100th Missouri AM station from my present location, joining only Illinois in the 100-AM station “club”. Other new stations logged in the last month include: WCKI 1300 Greer, SC, KMNY 1360 Hurst, TX, WKWN 1420 Trenton, GA, WTLO 1490 Somerset, KY, WCAM 1590 Camden, SC and KPRT 1590 Kansas City, MO (completing my Kansas City logbook from this location). 1,440 stations are in my logbook as of 9/27. 73.
