- 702 **ALGERIA** RTA Chaine 1, Laghouat (tentative) – 9/18 2325 noted with reverberated Koranic chant; LOUD signal. Mauno Ritolo's comparison of audio to Iran, Saudi Arabia and Egypt ruled those out making the Algerian the most likely station on this busy channel. (Connelly O-MA)
- 801 **GERMANY** Bayern Plus, Munich and Dillberg/Newmarkt – 9/18 2325 noted with female announcer with "Musik für ein ganzes Leben" mention in German and music. Noted over Spain. Thanks to Mauno Ritola for ID help. (Connelly O-MA)
- 801.055 **SPAIN** Radio Nacional de España Girona – 9/19 0000 noted with growl against stations on 801.0 kHz; per Mauno Ritola, RNE Girona has been logged around this off-channel. (Connelly O-MA)
- 882 **SAUDI ARABIA** Broadcasting Service of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia – 9/18 2330 noted with Middle Eastern-sounding male vocal identified as the Holy Koran program from this Saudi outlet; over U.K. and COPE Spain. (Connelly O-MA)
- 1062 **IRAN** Islamic Republic of Iran Broadcasting 1, Kerman – 9/18 2358 noted with male group Middle Eastern vocal; to fair signal peak. Mauno Ritolo noted ID in the middle of the audio clip as "Inja Kerman ast, Sedaye Jomhuriye Islamiye Iran." (Connelly O-MA)
- 1080 **UNIDENTIFIED** – 9/18 2330 possibly the Arabic service of Israel with bits of Middle Eastern vocal; mixed with SER Spain and under WTIC. Different from Iran at the time per Mauno Ritola. Stations in Morocco and Libya are also listed on the channel. (Connelly O-MA)
- 1116 **IRAN** Islamic Republic of Iran Broadcasting 1, Bandar Lengeh – 9/18 2358 noted with piano music, then calm talk by male announcer //936, 1503 and 1574.97 kHz; to good signal peak over Spain. (Connelly O-MA)  
(Note: Voice of Rebellious Iraq program is long gone.-MC)
- 1126.5 **LIBYA** Radio Free Libya, El Beida – 9/18 2325 off-channel carrier with fragment of audio (Arabic?). Offset confirmed by Mauno Ritola. (Connelly O-MA)
- 1134 **KUWAIT** Radio of the State of Kuwait-Main Arabic Program, Sulaibiyah – 9/18 2359 noted with lively Koran recitation; over Spain. Audio confirmed as Kuwait by Mauno Ritola. (Connelly O-MA)



- 1197.02 **IRAN** Islamic Republic of Iran Broadcasting 1, Moghan – 9/19 0007 noted with Koranic male vocal; briefly through WXKS slop. Audio confirmed as Iran by Mauno Ritola. (Connelly O-MA)
- 1251 **IRAN** Islamic Republic of Iran Broadcasting 1, Sari – 9/18 2325 noted with talk in Farsi by male announcer; to good signal peak. (Connelly O-MA)
- 1259.845 **GREECE** Rhodos (Rhodes) – 9/18 2325 noted with growl against CKHJ 1260. Offset confirmed by Mauno Ritola. (Connelly O-MA)
- 1322.995 **IRAN** Voice of the Islamic Republic of Iran/IRIB 1, Jolfa – 9/18 2326 noted with a cappella male chant; fair signal. Audio confirmed as Iran by Mauno Ritola. (Connelly O-MA)
- 1395 **ARMENIA** Golos Rossii, Gavar – 9/19 0000 noted with 4+1 pips, music, talk by male announcer; poor signal. Thanks to Mauno Ritola for ID help on the mp3 clip. (Connelly O-MA)
- 1511.935 **GREECE** ERA, Chania – 9/18 2325 growl against Saudi Arabia on 1512.0 kHz. Offset confirmed by Mauno Ritola. Heard last January with pop music. (Connelly O-MA)
- 1574.97 **IRAN** Islamic Republic of Iran Broadcasting 1 Abadan – 9/18 2358 noted with piano music, then calm talk by male announcer //936, 1116 and 1502 kHz. Noted behind UAE and about 30 Hz lower in frequency. (Connelly O-MA)
- 1593 **KUWAIT** Radio Sawa, Kuwait City – 9/18 2326 noted with pop vocal music in Arabic; poor signal.
