EDITOR'S NOTES

Thanks to Kraig for his report this week...note the high frequency we started the column with this week. Much of the country was gripped by bitter cold this past week; in many places, the coldest air recorded in a quarter of a century. It was good weather to DX indoors, that's for sure.

Trivia time: What do some of the call letters you hear stand for? Here's just a few. One of my exlocals is WSB 750 in Atlanta. The calls stand for "Welcome South, Brother". Another famous call is WGN 720 Chicago...it's from the slogan of their owner, the Chicago Tribune: "World's Greatest Newspaper". Crosstown WLS got its calls from its original owner, Sears, Roebuck and Company (now part of Sears Holdings): "World's Largest Store". One of the few "W" stations west of the Mississippi River is WBAP 820 Fort Worth, TX...the calls stand for "We Bring A Program". WHB 810 in Kansas City, MO (originally on 710 kHz) stands for "World Happiest Broadcasters". One call no longer in use is KSO (formerly on 1460 kHz in Des Moines, IA); it stood for "Keep Serving Others". Finally, one call that was in use in one Colorado market (Denver) and currently used in another (Pueblo) is KFEL; the interesting thing the call stands for: "Kan't Find Enough Liquo"!

Dictionary definition of which is over-indulged or spoilt, hardly something positive. In DXLD 13-36, Henrik Klemetz said words like consentida imply mistress. (GH-OK)

TRANS PACIFIC HIGHLIGHTS

Gary DeBock

Although chasing Asian TP's in the back yard each morning doesn't exactly provide the same level of excitement as tracking down exotic DU's on an ocean side cliff while dodging 18-wheelers on Highway 101, this season provided some surprisingly strong TP's from China, Korea and Russia. Many of the MP3's linked below pegged the PL-380's S/N display at the 25 maximum (indicated with a double asterisk**) and some of them were the strongest ever received here in 7 years (indicated with a triple asterisk***). In general the signals from the Asian mainland have seemed significantly stronger here than last year, although that may be due to a new 12" FSL antenna being used (which provides a major sensitivity boost over last year's 8" model). Unlike the locations where the other TP-DXers live, this particular spot has always seemed to favor signals from the Asian mainland, and is only moderately favorable for Japanese signals.
