## DX TESTS

**KCKM 1330 Monahans, TX** will be conducting a DX Test on Saturday, March 22, 2014 from 0100 to 0130 ELT (Midnight-0030 CLT). The test will be at full daytime power of 12,000 watts using a non-directional pattern into a five-eighths wave tower. The test will consist mainly of Morse Code, sweep tones and sound effects known to cut through the mud. There will be a few voice announcements spread out throughout the 30-minute test.

Reports sent via E-mail are preferred, but will accept reports submitted via snail mail. If you send an E-mail, please send MP3 attachments only; WAV files would be too big.

These wandering spurs are causing wandering hets and come in a pattern with one 70 to 90 kHz above and 70 to 90 kHz below and are constantly drifting. Always NW/SE loop bearing. Suspect station to southeast on 1340 kHz is the source. This has also been heard on car radio 10 miles away from home. [TMJ-IL]

600 CKAT ON North Bay – 1/26 1739 noted with a Country format, "Today's Best Country, CKAT" ID by male announcer. The station was noted again at 1846, airing play-by-play of a hockey game. The signal was noted mixing with WCAO and unidentified stations playing vocal music and talk. (KK-VA)  
600 WCAO MD Baltimore – 1/26 1710 noted with paid programming (infomercials-eb) promoting all types of "miracle cures". "Heaven 600" ID by a male announcer noted at 1730. The signal was noted mixing with CKAT and unidentified stations playing vocal music and talk. (KK-VA)  
610 CKTB ON Saint Catharines - 1/26 1759 noted with "This is News/Talk 610 CKTB, Niagara's place to talk" ID by a male announcer. The signal was noted mixing with WIP and WXVA. (KK-VA)  
610 WXVA VA Winchester – 1/26 1710 noted with an enjoyable variety of music, "It's simple. If it's good, we play it; 610 WXVA" ID by a male announcer. The signal was noted mixing with CKTB and WIP. (KK-VA)  
620 WHEN NY Syracuse – 1/26 1727 noted with "Having a whole lot of fun right here at Power 620, Central New York's Only R&B Radio Station" ID by a male announcer. The signal was noted mixing with WDNC, WKHB, WVMT and an unidentified vocal music station. (KK-VA)

1050 KLOH MN Pipestone – 1/22 0740 noted with ad for Southwest Hearing Technologies and a car dealer in Pipestone. A poor signal was noted, with other stations nulled. (JJR-MI)

- 1060 WHFB MI Benton Harbor/St. Joseph – 1/28 1834 noted with “Like us on...or write Rick-at-WHFB-dot-com” mentions. Kind of nice for one watt, hi! A poor signal was noted in KYW’s null. (JJR-MI)  
(You probably caught them when someone forgot to cut from 5 kW day power. This is happening a lot more these days-eb)
- 1060 KNLV NE Ord – 1/24 0820 noted with temperatures for various cities in Nebraska, before finally hearing: “At the Ord Airport, clear and 23” mention. A poor signal was noted; it was the only audible station on the frequency. (JJR-MI)
- 1240 WJMC WI Rice Lake – 1/27 0918 noted with ad for Olson’s Hearing Center in Rice Lake, followed by a “1240 WJMC” ID before fading out. A poor signal was noted. (JJR-MI)
- 1270 WWWI MN Baxter – 1/24 0716 noted with ad for Insty-Prints, gave 828-4248 as its phone number before the signal faded out. Poor signal over a weak WMKT. (JJR-MI)
- 1440 KCHE IA Cherokee – 1/28 0817 noted with call letters and Web information by a female announcer, into a well-produced newscast. The signal was still in 15 minutes later! This station is rarely heard at this location. A poor signal was noted with KDIZ and WNFL tightly nulled. (JJR-MI)
- 1450 WATZ MI Alpena – 1/23 1958 noted with University of Michigan hockey play-by-play from the ING radio network; two promos and a public service announcement before this legal ID: “You’re listening to Michigan Hockey on WATZ Alpena”. This one is rarely heard in L’Anse. A poor signal was noted. (JJR-MI)
- 1460 KDWA MN Hastings – 1/25 0917 noted with mention of “At the Dairy Queen in Apple Valley” and “right here on KDWA 1460.” This is not a common reception in L’Anse. A poor signal was noted; it was the only audible signal on the channel. (JJR-MI)
- 1490 KOVC ND Valley City – 1/27 0946 noted with “Dakota Country News” mention before fading to the multitude of stations on 1490. A poor signal was noted. (JJR-MI)
- 1640 WKSH WI Sussex – 1/27 2150 noted with “WKSH Sussex” legal ID into music from Broadway shows. Another legal ID was noted at 2210. A poor signal was noted over KZLS. (JJR-MI)

#### EDITOR’S NOTES

Once again, thanks to John and Kraig for their logs!

Trivia Time: Before WCAO 600 Baltimore, MD adopted its present Urban Gospel format, it was a Country station. When I was vacationing in Williamsburg, VA for Spring Break in 1984, this was the dominant station on 600. For many years, WCAO was Baltimore’s Top 40 station. For those who have the “Cruisin’” series of albums, WCAO was featured on “Cruisin’ 1968”; Johnny Dark relived his days at WCAO on the album. The DJ even mentioned the club he had at the time, “The Dark Corner”.

As stated in my notes on the front page, this week marks 50 years since The Beatles came to the United States to appear on “The Ed Sullivan Show”, which aired on CBS television. For those of us who were born after The Beatles’ U.S. television debut, we could only imagine what Top 40 radio would have been like at the time. For those of us who were twisting the dials in 1964, I’m sure you heard their music on every third or fourth station, regardless of whether that Top 40 outlet was a 250-watt peanut whistle or a 50,000-watt blowtorch. In my home market, the local Top 40 outlet was a 5,000-watt station on a low channel, some 260 miles (as the crow flies) from the nearest 50,000-watt Top 40 powerhouse in Chicago.
