XEEW in Matamoros; furthest out but only UT-7 is XEXX Tijuana. Then I have doubts: did they say "once" instead of "ocho" which I thought I clearly heard? That would be in the UT-6 zone, ie XÉF (GH-OK)
- 1430 MÉXICO XEWD, Ciudad Miguel Alemán, Tama. "Radio X, Catorce-Treinta", "La mas autorida en radio". 0816 9/14, I heard the following - "Radio X, 14-30 AM." Well, all my scribbled notes from past DX sessions over a six-month season tell me this should be XEWD, Ciudad Miguel Aleman, Tamaulípas, but their "short ID" of "Radio X" doesn't match anything I have. Gabriola Island DX report

Nick Hall-Patch, Victoria, BC

A guick trip to Gabriola Island on 17 July while Gary and Chuck were working the cliffs at Rockworks, with completely different results.

I was monitoring the DX Fishbarrel in Victoria while DXing on Gabriola; Victoria was hearing Tahiti 738 at audible levels, while Gabriola was barely getting a carrier using a westerly KAZ antenna with a FLG100 amplifier, so I expected that Zedders might be missing, and I was not surprised. Although there's about 6 km of water path along that direction, there is a further 90 km chunk of Vancouver Island before the Pacific Ocean, and that seemed to be killing any hope of NZ reception there.

Things faded out fairly quickly after 1200UT, and before that, it was all Asia.

HLAŽ 1566 had two women in Chinese at 1152 at completely readable levels, and 1287 had a man in Japanese. NHK pips were barely heard at 1200 on 594 and 828, plus, even more barely, 1503. Otherwise, lots of carriers in the usual spots, 774, 972, 1053, 1179, 1269 etc., but little audio. And no audio and few carriers at all from DU as sunrise approached.

On 18 July, Asians were weaker, again from 1130-1200 mostly, though HLAZ faded up briefly again with the pattern change to the Japanese program at 1230UT. Otherwise only weak audio from 1287 and 1503, with NHK pips at 1200 from the latter.

Interestingly, there was a little Aussie action after 1200, but only above 1600kHz, with 1611, 1629 and 1701 delivering weak audio and off channel hums. THANKS TO THESE REPORTERS
