I correspond regularly with a guy in the Auckland region and, back in May, I had a chance to go thru 2,000 old business cards from Australia, so a lot of the cities were familiar to me. As many of you have heard by now, I have relinquished my duties as Editor-in-Chief of DX Monitor to Phil Bytheway. With my mother's health deteriorating and helping my father take care of her cutting into my time with doing that particular duty, I felt that it was time for a change. I'm still doing Eastern DX Roundup and SportChannels, as well as compiling the IRCA Amateur Radio list. It's been a learning experience these past four-plus years I've been Editor-in-Chief; it's a valuable experience for me. It's hard to believe that, as you're reading this, it will be 33 years since I officially started spinning the dials as a DXer. I began casually listening to distant AM stations when I was 10 years old. The DX bug bit me at age 13, when I heard Radio Moscow via CMKV Urbano Noris, Cuba on 600 kHz. In October of 1981, I began DXing the shortwave bands with a Realistic DX-60 AM/FM/CB/SW receiver. Within three months, I was DXing the AM broadcast band. In local happenings, WSDZ 1260 Belleville, IL remains on the air with Radio Disney; the station did not go off the air on September 28. Radio Disney has decided to keep the stations they're selling on the air until buyers are found. I'm sure quite a few of them will be sold to Christian or conservative operators, but I wouldn't be surprised if WSDZ becomes a Spanish outlet. The St. Louis area only has one full-time Spanish language station (WIJR 880 Highland, IL), and one daytimer (WQQW 1510, also in Highland, which is leased from Entertainment Media Trust, d/b/a Insane Broadcasting). KXFN 1380 was off for about a week last month for technical isound included to reporting the media trust, d/b/a Insane Broadcasting). KXFN 1380 was off for about a week last month for technical issues involving their daytime transmitter; they have dropped night operations (at least temporarily), and operating at 5,000 watts DA-D. The station has long had problems with their 1,000-watt night operations; this dates back to when they were an Oldies station as KGLD. And if the problems with KXFN aren't bad enough, sister station KFNS 590 has been on open carrier some nights instead of carrying the usual NBC Sports Radio programming. The problems at night has allowed KXSP Omaha to dominate at night on 590 with the Cuban in the background; on October 11, the station heard in KXSP's null with KFNS on open carrier wasn't Cuban, but rather, WJMS Ironwood, MI. The station was noted at 0315 ELT 10/11 with a Classic Country format and "U.S. 59" ID. This is my 41st station from Michigan; one of the few I've pulled in from the Upper Peninsula. My 40th Michigan AM came from the Lower Peninsula as WJIM 1240 Lansing was noted at from Michigan; one of the few I've pulled in from the Upper Peninsula. My 40th Michigan AM came from the Lower Peninsula as WJIM 1240 Lansing was noted at 0500 ELT 10/6 with a legal ID into ABC News. During WGNU 920's regular Sunday morning silent period, KLMR 920 Lamar, CO was noted at 0338 ELT 10/12 with Country music, station promo, weather forecast, local ads and ID. Over the summer, I spent some time looking over my AM BCB logbook from my present location, which I started back in July 1992, and filled in some gaps; the most recent being after I logged WDQN 1580 Du Quoin, IL for my 120th Illinois AM station. I noted that one of the AM stations missing from my log was WBBA 1580 Pittsfield, IL; I originally logged that one in October 1993. So, my Illinois AM count is one higher. I also found out that I have never logged a single station from these of the "Lower 48": Delaware, Idaho, Maine, New Hampshire, New Mexico and Vermont. I only count call letter changes on AM; call changes don't count on FM and TV (analog and digital) and NOAA Weather Radio. By state, my totals are as follows: AL-74, AZ-3, AR-53, CA-12, CO-24, CT-1, DC-2, FL-33, GA-64, IL-121, IN-44, IA-52, KS-36, KY-58, LA-42, MD-8, MA-3, MI-41, MN-46, MS-36, MO-108, MT-4, NE-23, NV-1, NJ-4, NY-19, NC-24, ND-14, OH-36, OK-34, OR-1, PA-15, RI-1, SC-18, SD-11, TN-102, TX-106, UT-3, VA-11, WA-4, WV-9, WI-61, WY-4. From Canada, my province count is as follows: AB-7, BC-1, MB-14, ON-36, PEI-1, QC-10, SK-8. From Mexico, the most productive state isn't a state, but rather, Mexico, City (Federal District) with 10. One each has been logged from Ages calingtes, Jalicoa. Mexico City (Federal District) with 10. One each has been logged from Aguascalientes, Jalisco, Michoacan and Quintana Roo, two each from San Luis Potosi, Tabasco and Veracruz, five from Coahuila, six from Chihuahua, and seven each from Nuevo Leon and Tamaulipas. I've also run across a new problem in recent months: my father purchased a 51-inch HDTV set, and the video interference from that set wipes out the entire AM broadcast band. I've tried using RF chokes on the FRG-7 and on the TV, but it only reduces interference on the shortwave bands. I'm still working on the AM side. I've only been able to DX in the evenings, starting around local sunset, outdoors. As of 10/15, my AM logbook stands at 1,534. 73.
