- MÉXICO, XETX, Nuevo Casas Grandes, Chih. 12/15 weak signal. 0544 with "XETX" call ID and mention of La Ranchera. [JcJ-AZ] 540
- MÉXICO, XEDT, Ciudad Cuauhtémoc, Chih. 0646 12/15. Noise peaks NE/SW, presumed the open FM STL still being retransmitted on AM from XEDT. (GH-OK)
- MÉXICO, XEQ, México, DF. 1004 12/16. Noted with "XEQ" ID in promo, "XEQ" jingle into Adult Contemporary format in Spanish. Good to fair signal over 940 WMIX. (EB-MO)
- MÉXICO, XEK, Nuevo Laredo, NL. 0600-0605 12/21, Fox-hole dead-air of KGWA Enid checked with tight null: tonight it's inhabited by Spanish romantic 960 song, 0601 choral NA, 0602.5 XEK Nuevo Laredo ID, more romantic music past 0605 when KGWA modulation cuts back on. Making fast SAH with the KGWA carrier. (GH-OK)
- MÉXICO, XERDO, Matamoros?/Reynosa?, Tama. 0945 12/18 noted with Nortena music, "La Raza 1060" ID and promo in Spanish. Good to poor signal
 - with WRHL, KYW. (EB-MO)

 [Slightly on the low side] 0230 12/19. I'm looking for the new XERDO in Reynosa, Tama, as reported by KAZ. There is a big signal dominating with romantic music in Spanish, "cada canción", but it's E/W, not N/S; and 0233 ID as "KXPL [letters pronounced in English], Radio El Paso-Juárez, con su música, toda A-M", then ranchera. However it disappears abruptly at 0234.4*. It is *supposed* to be a 10-kW daytimer-only. Official FCC sunset for it in December is 0000 (January: 0030). It does have a PSSA of a hefty 7 watts! But in December that would last only until 0200. 1060, as soon as KXPL goes

 "Letter and the support of the N/S at 0234 12/19: SHVA exclaims "10-60, la estación de todos", but heavy QRM. This may well be XERDO. On NRC-AM, Neil Kazaross, IL, reported 12/17: "For the past couple of nights I'd noted a signal on the high side of 1060 in Spanish and since XEEP was also noted as usual and since KIJN had been noted running all night earlier in the season, I didn't pay any attention to it. Last night it was quite strong and certainly didn't sound like religious Spanish programming, and wasn't XEEP so I paid more attention to it. My Perseus measured the frequency as 1060.076. At 0400 I recorded a nice ID with calls and "La Raza" slogan and 7000 watts mentioned and an address in Reynosa. There's some as 1060.076. At 0400 I recorded a nice ID with calls and "La Haza" slogan and 7000 watts mentioned and an address in Reynosa. Inere's some differences in where this is actually located shown on various sites, but this site says Reynosa. http://www.mpm.com.mx/?r=radio/view&id=9736003F-3B3B-A79A-8618-7CCA15F69578. Anyhow, their move from 1450 licensed to Matamoros is complete and I expect this station to be widely heard. 73 KAZ Barrington IL Perseus and Phased DKAZ antennas with the beam steered about WSW." Barry McLarnon, Ottawa ON, replied, "I've also noticed this signal recently, producing a "hum" on the high side of KYW, which was being back-grounded by XEEP. Two nights ago, I measured the carrier frequency to be 1060.0774. Not much chance for audio given my local noise woes, but it's nice to know what it is anyway. Barry" At 0325 12/18, Kaz replies again: "Trivial to log XERDO again tonight with grupera music and seemingly an ID after every song. "La Raza, Mil Sesenta, La Estacion de Todos. 73 KAZ" ie "Toto, I think we are back in Kansas." That clinches it for me as I heard the same slogan. Although XERDO on 1060 from Reynosa instead of 1450 from Matamoros changed too recently to make it into the IRCA Mexican Log or the WRTH 2015, it was already reported more than a biweek ago by Greg Hardison. At the time I did not realize it was newly on 1060: "I've been playing a remote receiver in New Orleans, during middle-of-the-night spare time, and note this morning (12/2) that WLNO/1060 is off the air, shortly after 0700. Frequency without local consists mostly of a battle between Ranchero XERDO, and the much more entertaining XEEP; one of whom seems to be somewhat of frequency, creating a half-buzz SAH. WLNO's woes seem financial in nature, affecting owner Communicom Corp. of America, also ex-owner of KXXT/1010 and KXEG/1280 in Phoenix. Both of the Arizona outlets were noted up & running during a visit starting Nov 20; FCC website lists new owners for those two. Very 73z – GREG HARDISON' The MPM listing of it on 1060 linked above was last updated on 10/16. Also says transmitter site is Vallehermoso, Tams, which is SW of Matamoros, further from the border, but also further from Reynosa. Cantú has it on 1060 as 7/2.5 kW, but nombre as "La Radio" and location as Matamoros, not Reynosa. 0235 12/19 I am now getting a Spanish music station from E/W, but it's praise music, keywords such as "redentor", "bendición", so it's obviously the usual KIJN Farwell TX cheater, which earlier had been overcome by KXPL. At 0239 123/19 back aiming N/S, Spanish station is not //6185 XEPPM, so at the moment it must again be XERDO. (GH-OK)
 - I was able to hear XERDO here from about 1204 12/20 until it faded out under CFMX after 1313. The signal was fair to good between 1230 and 1300 with música grupera and numerous "La Raza" announcements, ID-ing as "XERDO XERDO". (RA-OK)

MÉXICO, XEIB, Caborca, Son. 12/22 good signal mixing with KFAQ or on top of frequency. 05:33 with "XEIB" ID and city. Numerous "Radio Vida" mentions between songs. [JcJ-AZ]

One of the reasons why our Ultralightdx Yahoo group has had booming growth for over seven years is because we have accepted many diverse challenges.. from the basic challenge of DXing with a simple pocket radio (which all of us share) all the way up to the challenge of developing 21st Century antennas (and discovering innovative DXing sites) to make pocket radios surprisingly effective in Transoceanic DXing results.

John was an ex-Professor of Architecture at Oklahoma State University in Stillwater, and he had a natural teaching style familiar to all those who knew him. John was the one who introduced me to DU-DXing in 2008, teaching me all the basics of how to track down exotic South Pacific DX right in the middle of the worst possible season – the dog days of summer. At the time it sounded like science fiction to me, and I thought that John might be "pulling my leg" but he was absolutely right.

I don't have anywhere near the accomplishments or leadership ability that John had, but he and I did share a fascination with antennas - especially monster antennas that could make Ultralight radios highly competitive in Transoceanic DXing. So, in the spirit of John Bryant, I would like to offer some links to articles that have inspired many Ultralight Radio DXers to really push the limits in antenna construction - including one article that John and I wrote together. As I have shared with anyone willing to listen, I'm convinced that the future of our Ultralight Radio community is very bright – and optimism and innovation will win out over pessimism and boredom every time. Sometime this winter, why not try something new to increase your Ultralight Radio DXing fun – maybe a new Ultralight radio, a new antenna, a new band (FM, SW or Longwave) or Transoceanic DX reception? The future belongs to those of us who are excited about it - one of the primary reasons why our Ultralight Radio Community has become one of the most vibrant segments of the AM-DXing community.
