FL, Brandon - 12/19 1759 noted with "WLCC Brandon/Tampa/Saint Petersburg" legal ID in English by a female announcer, into a Talk format in 760 WLCC Spanish. The signal was noted mixing with WJR, WCIS and an unidentified talk station. (KK-VA) (Kraig, your unidentified Talk station could be WETR Knoxville TN - eb)

770 WLWL NC, Rockingham – 12/19 1631 noted with "We appreciate you listening to WLWL..." mention by a male announcer. The signal was noted mixing

with WABC and unidentified stations carrying Oldies and Talk. (KK-VA)

NY, New York – 12/19 1800 noted with "WABC" ID in Morse Code. The signal was noted mixing with WLWL and unidentified stations carrying 770 WABC Oldies and Talk. (KK-VA)

NC, Forest City - 12/19 1700 noted with "You are tuned to 780 WWOL Forest City, North Carolina; Your Gospel voice of the Carolina Foothills" 780 WWOI

1230 KHAS NE, Hastings – 12/23 0649 noted with "...726 Hastings, Nebraska" mention and "Music you enjoy, news you need. Nebraska Sports Talk at 6:00 p.m. on 1230 KHAS" ID. A poor signal was noted; in for about five minutes. (JJR-MI)

As I recall, WLWL Rockingham NC (on 770 and before that, on 1500 kHz) was famous for signing off with Henry Mancini's version of the theme from the 1963 movie "The Pink Panther". When I was living in Georgia, I still remember that obnoxious sign-off from WTAK 1000 (now WDJL) Huntsville AL, which they blamed stations in Chicago and Mexico City for why they had to sign off at sunset. PAN AMERICAN DX ROUNDUP

- MEXICO, XEBU, Chihuahua, Chih. 1427 1/1, only station audible is weakly in Spanish, re 2015 arriving in Chihuahua Capital, at La Norteñita, ie XEBU. This is half a sesquihour after our Enid sunrise of 1343 which will reach its latest of the year in another week, 1344, per gaisma.com. I suppose KMKI
- Plano (Dallas) TX, the Disney station is still on, unsold, just not propagating at 1427. Yes, teeny-bopper music on groundwave at 2003 check 1/1. (GH-OK)

 MÉXICO, XEFB, Monterrey, NL. 1306 12/30, weather in Spanish from "Radar 63" including SR/SS times, then traffic, starting with the highway MonterreyLaredo, so certainly XEFB. Only poor signal, but strangely, hardly any QRM from US 630s; where are St Louis and Denver? Radar 63 is the name of the 630 newscast on XEFB, not its total slogan. One can find it twice deep within the packed Facebook page at https://es-es.facebook.com/630radio. "El noticiero radiofónico con más tradición del Norte de México" on "FB 630". Or more directly at http://fb630.com/ which shows Radar 63 M-F at 6-8 am, 2-3 & 6-7 pm [12-14, 20-21, Tue-Sat 00-01 UT]. Besides news, seems main format is Deportes with FB now standing for Fútbol, and in three different versions: Mexican, American, even Premier League! However, Facebook has a link for those who are Sick of Football:

(GH-OK) MÉXICO, XEDKR, Guadalajara, Jal. 0144 1/2, Spanish from SSW, discussing Premio Nobel de la Paz, probably year-in-review show, 0146 ID as "Radio Red AM", which is XEDKR, 10000/150 watts, so still on day power? Lucking out that WLW is inaudible, must be in fade cycle as eg Chicagoans are not 700
- knocked out by aurora. Yes, by 0151, WLW is back with silly ballgame, though still can be nulled for something Spanish making slow SAH. (GH-OK)
- MÉXICO, XEQ, México, DF. 0606 12/29, low audible heterodyne from slightly on the low side, ID as "XEQ Radio" from México DF. Sometimes it's off 940 frequency, sometimes not, perhaps due to two separate transmitters alternating. (GH-OK)

 MÉXICO, XEK. 0601 1/2, tonight's Fox-hole by local KGWA 960 Enid is occupied by XEK, as immediately obvious by their proud announcement of
- 960 founding in 1937, and "estamos en la cuarta generación". Since that was 78 years ago, just how long is a "generation"? XEK goes on to play "Cuando Calienta el Sol", although Nuevo Laredo is far from a beach, unless they refer to the Rio Bravo or dammed-up parts of it. That love song is really steamy, as monolinguals may not realize. No NA heard during this window. KGWA carrier is much hummier than usual, impeding XEK but it remains atop something much weaker in English until KGWA modulation resumes at 0605. (GH-OK)
- UnID MÉXICO. 1130, Jan 3 at 0348 1/3, weak signal in Spanish, best from the NW/SE, but that's influenced by needing to null KMOX IBOC from the NE. 1130 Mentions a .mx website so that narrows it down to four of the seven XEs not in the West. Nothing from KWKH as I tune in, must be in a fade, then back up a bit, but it's always weak at night here on tight westward pattern. (GH-OK)
- MÉXICO, XESAL, Saltillo, Coah. 0058 1/1, Noted underneath XEB with fair signal. At times XEB would fade, XESAL would rise to a nice readable signal 1220 on the channel. ID noted at 0100 with call letters and station slogan, then into long version of National Anthem. Found the internet feed at http://www.radionarro.com/. (JN-TX)
- MÉXICO, XELBL, San Luís Río Colorado, Son. 0100 1/2 dominant over KSRO and others with ID over Magnificent Seven theme and slogan Radio 1350 Centro. Sounded like he said 8kw. (MS-CA)

- BOLIVIA. 0130 1/4, very poor with music, no doubt Radio Yura, as Bob Wilkner reported reactivated lately at least sporadically. (GH-OK)
- CUBA. 0322 1/3, no signal from Radio Progreso, which had been scheduled 0130-0500 (not 0030-0400 as in Aoki: that's DST timing). Hope it hasn't 4765 been canceled with a new calendar year. (GH-OK)
 - +0131 1/4, still no Radio Progreso, nor at 0149 recheck; canceled for 2015y? However, there is a JBA carrier, and running-water ute QRM. I assume it's TAJIKISTAN, which EiBi has on a 24-hour schedule, although Aoki shows 4765 off at 20-03; WRTH 2015 shows on at 23-19 UT, and HFCC misses it completely. EiBi also has two Brazilians on the air at this hour; WRTH only one as irregular. (GH-OK)

- UnID. 0322 1/3, very poor AM carrier. Aoki gives us two choices: Radio Difusora Roraima Brasil until 0400, 10 kW ND from Boa Vista RR; and Voice of 4875 Iranian Communist Party until 0430, 50 kW ND from Turkmenistan. However, I think the latter is long gone; not in WRTH 2015, only two other clandestines (not including Radio Farda). EiBi lists only Roraima, as 4875.1 - I should have checked the exact frequency. (GH-OK)
- 5025 CUBA. 0149 1/4, not only is Radio Progreso AWOL from 4765, but no Rebelde here either. At 0142, however, a Radio Rebelde is dominating 1620 kHz.
- 0619 recheck, 5025 is back on. (GH-OK)

 CUBA. 0522 1/1, RHC in English //6000, 6060, 6100, 6165. 5040 is supposed to stay in Spanish until 0600, then English, per own schedule, but this isn't 5040
- the first time we hear English on it also before 0600. Seems Arnie's new 90m outlet, 3365? Didn't make it to air in 2014. (GH-OK)

 EAST TURKISTAN. 0115 1/2, very poor signal on AM with talk; not a mix of nearby stations on 5 MHz, nor an image from 5960 where there is nothing. 5060 0118 some music, 0120 sounds Chinese talk. I am getting it on both the DX-398 and PL-880. No doubt it is the only broadcaster in the world on 5060 at this time and have heard before, PBS Xinjiang, 100 kW, 230 degrees from Urumqi per Aoki. Still there at 0153. That means the other three 60m frequencies should also be audible, and indeed they are, but only as JBA carriers: 4980 in Uighur; 4850 in Kazakh; 4500 in Mongolian. Of course, the Chinese service is first among "equals", though 4980 has same parameters. 4850 is 100 kW ND, and 4500 is 50 kW ND. (GH-OK)

Do any of you remember a unique sign-off from a daytime-only station in your DX career? As I was preparing Eastern DX Roundup for Issue 52-18, I ran across Kraig Krist's log of WLWL 770 Rockingham, NC. During my earliest days in this hobby, the station was on 1500 kHz before moving to 770 during the 1980s. A number of East Coast DXers, if my memory serves me well, remember this one signing off with Henry Mancini's version of the theme from the 1963 movie "The Pink Panther". One sign-off I remember from my days DXing from Woodstock and Marietta, GA (1988-1992) is the one from WTAK 1000 (now at 106.1 FM; the AM is now WDJL) Huntsville, AL. This one is one of the more obnoxious sign-off announcements I've ever heard. The announcer complains about the station not being able to stay on at night to protect stations in Chicago (then WLUP) and Mexico City (XEOY), even going as far as to call them "Yankees" and "Gringos". And you thought the Civil War was over a long time ago, hi! Since moving back to Hazelwood, I've heard WTAK on 106.1 (licensed to Hartselle AL); I logged this during a tropo opening in August 1998. I only worked at one daytime-only AM station in my entire radio career, which was WFTD 1080 Marietta, GA. It was a simple sign-off over a background of instrumental Christian music; not even the owner of the station (Pneuma, Incorporated, which was a ministry of Roswell Street Baptist Church) was mentioned. It was hearing that music so many times in the three years I worked there that helped me log the station from Hazelwood on January 4 1993. Some news from this end: W232CR 94.3 Jerseyville IL (erroneously reported in Broadcasting Information as W222CR; my bad) is now testing with the Modern Rock programming of WLCA 89.9 Godfrey IL. When it goes on regular schedule, it will relay the News/Talk format of WBGZ 1570 Alton IL. WBGZ has a really weird night signal for a 74-watt non-directional nighttime operation; it isn't heard very well in Edwardsville, but is dominant in parts of northern St Louis County MO. Their 1,000-watt day signal makes it as far south as University City and Clayton MO. No word yet on the sales of KFNS 590 and WSDZ 1260; the sale of KFNS to a Christian group has not yet been finalized, according to recent newspaper accounts. WSDZ is still going with Radio Disney programming; it'll be some time before that station is sold. KXFN 1380 is still chugging along with Extreme Talk; they're daytime only now because they lost the lease on their nighttime transmitter site. I've also noticed that KSIV 1320 and KHOJ 1460 have tweaked their nighttime signals toward my location. I can only put tight nulls on these stations now; they were easier to null just a few months ago. On 1320, I can only hear KELO in KSIV's null; on 1460, I can only hear WKAM in KHOJ's null. By the time you read this, WQQX 1490 will be starting its local sports programming from 0800 to 1900 ELT; it's a time buy, similar to the arrangement at WGNU 920. I'd like to wish everyone good DX in 2015! 73.
