

Rockwork 4 DXpedition – Top Ten Signals from the South Pacific

Hello All, Exceptional propagation to both New Zealand and Australia made the recent Rockwork 4 ocean cliff DXpedition (from August 6-10) one of the most thrilling ever conducted. My DXpedition partners Chuck and Tom both set up small broadband loops for Perseus-SDR spectrum capture at the narrow Highway 101 turnoff (with a plunging 400 foot sheer cliff), while I chased South Pacific DX with a modified Ultralight radio and monster (17") FSL antenna. A photo of the DXpedition setup at the cliff on August 7th is posted at https://app.box.com/s/fa2heca0v3ll2umbc84ko7zq2oj9k8uy. Posted below are links for the ten strongest DU stations heard at the ocean cliff site with the 7.5" loopstick C.Crane Skywave Ultralight radio and 17" FSL

8/8. Between the two 'cliffsider' DXpeditions organized by Gary DeBock I had the opportunity for another trip to the west coast visiting the Grayland Motel in Grayland, WA and a place called Sans Souci, between Yachats and Florence, OR from July 26-31 2015.

I'm still working my way through the Perseus .wav files but you can get a look/listen to what I heard and uncovered so far on this webpage: http://realmonitor.com/am_logs_grayland12.php.

Highlights so far include; a nice ID on Samoa on 540, Kiribati on 1440 with their National Anthem at 1000 s/off, Fiji on 558 and a bunch of Aussie and NZ stations.

This time Murphy stayed away and I was able to get three concurrent days of wav files from Grayland and Sans Souci for later comparison of conditions. Based on a limited sample of the past 3 years of the same situation it appears that Sans Souci is more conducive to Aussie reception than Grayland. We'll see how this year's stats feed into that conclusion.

Antennas used at both locations were 160' DKAZ pointing at 230-250 deg with a fixed, 902 Ohm terminal resistance [Rt] in Sans Souci and a variable, vactrol Rt in Grayland. If you're into EZNEC modeling, both antennas used 20 gauge wire.

2015-2016 IRCA DX CONTEST RULES

The object of this year's IRCA contest will be to use letters of a station's callsign to hear 15 stations for each letter of the alphabet. Log 15 stations containing the letter A in their call sign, 15 stations with the letter B, 15 with the letter C, etc. Since there are 26 letters and 15 possible stations for each letter, the total points available will be 390 points. Any position may be used in any tier. Example: kAbc, kcBs, Cbu, krID, kEdo, etc. There is one point per station. Call letters are to be used only once, so be sure to make your choice of placement of each station carefully. For example, if you hear KHAC you might not want to use it as an "A" but use it in the "H" position instead.

Entry reports need to be in alphabetical order. Your entry for any letter may be a partial tier. If you complete only 10 of the A tier, you would have 10 points to report. You can be working on all 26 letters at any one time (you do not need to complete A tier before going on to B). The contestant with the most total points at the end of the contest will be determined the winner.

The contest will be open to all IRCA members in good standing. Entrants will be disqualified if they cease to be members of the club. The contest will run from 001 September 1 2015 through 2359 May 31 2016. You may join the contest at any time during the year. All loggings must be made within 25 miles of your main DX location. If a person moves during the contest they may start over at the new location.

Stations must be in the normal 530-1710 kHz band, licensed by the US, Canada or Mexico. TIS and utility stations are not eligible for contest purposes. To count a US station, you must hear the actual call letters. To count a Canadian or Mexican station, you must hear the actual call letters or hear a recognized slogan plus location. Loggings may be first time heard, or relogs of stations heard before. If a station changes call letters it may be relogged and be counted. Contest entries must list station call letters, frequency, location, date and time of logging.

Your contest report of stations heard in any particular month must be postmarked by the 5th day of the following month. For example, a station heard on September 12th must be submitted by October 5th to be eligible. Failure to do this will disgualify the item in guestion for points. Contest entries must not be sent along with WDXR DX tips as they easily become lost when filed away in the WDXR file. Contest entries may be sent e-mail or postal mail to the address above. Email entries must not be "attached files."

The contest manager will have the final word on all station and interpretation of all rules, including disgualification of a station for scoring or a member from the contest.

Standings will be updated on the 15th of each month and results published in the next available bulletin subject to normal deadline delays. The final standings will be tabulated on June 15, 2016 and will appear in the July bulletin.

The contest manager may join the contest, but will be ineligible for the prize. There is no entry fee for the contest.

Entry in the contest implies consent to all rules, including those which may appear later as necessity dictates. If you have any questions please write.

Prize: One only \$5.00 IRCA Bookstore credit for the contest entrant with the most final points. The contestant with the most total points at the end of the contest will be determined the winner.
