As many of you may know, my mother passed away on October 24 2015. She battled Primary Lateral Sclerosis, a slower-progressing form of Lou Gehrig's Disease, for 18 years. From 1997 to 2009, I was able to juggle work, school, taking care of my mother, some semblance of a social life and, of course, DXing. She helped me buy my first shortwave radio receiver, a Realistic DX-60 AM/FM/CB/Shortwave portable, back in October of 1981; she was always supportive of my hobby, regardless of whether I was DXing or talking on the Amateur Radio bands. She will be missed. In local radio news, KFNS 590 Wood River IL is back on the air as of November 5; the station is now broadcasting a mix of Sports and local talk from Internet station Inside STL; they simulcast KXFN 1380 (the station never did change to KRFT) during daylight hours. Both stations are being leased by Inside STL from Grand Slam Sports. The on-air lineup is anchored by two of the more controversial personalities in St Louis radio history: JC Corcoran and Kevin Slaten. During the month of October, I caught several stations on day power after sunset to cover high school football. New logs in October included KEWI 690 Benton AR on October 2 at 2213 ELT with the end of a high school football game, Little Rock area ads into the post-game show in a KSTL null. A new country was added on October 4 when I pulled ZNS3 810 Freeport, Bahamas through WHB at 0427 with soul music, an ID and local ads. This is my 20th country logged from my present location. KEYL 1400 Long Prairie MN was noted with an ID and Country music poking through the mess on October 7 at 0357 for my 50th Minnesota AM. I also caught KGND 1470 Vinita OK on day power that same morning at 0436 with talk on the post-season in baseball and "The Sports Animal" ID. KYAL 1550 Sapulpa was also in; the 1550 signal was stronger. KJOZ 880 Conroe TX must have been on day power and pattern when I logged them at 0428 on October 14 with local spots, calls in a want ad for an account executive, ID and a rock format. A New Mexican was added when XEP 1300 Ciudad Juárez Chih was heard on October 16 at 0343 with a Mountain time check, promo for the upcoming newscast at 0400 ELT and light vocal music in Spanish. DX conditions have been very good since the switch to standard time at the beginning of November. WWOW 1360 Conneaut OH was heard on November 2 at 1657 ELT with an Oldies format and legal ID over KBKB and WSAI. KNEK 1190 Washington LA was noted the same afternoon at 1740 with an Urban AC format and local spots; it was tough copy through WOWO with KQQZ nulled. WBKV 1470 West Bend WI noted on November 4 at 1620 ELT with Oldies and "Cool Oldies 1470 WBKV" ID, taking out WMBD with some splatter from KHOJ 1460. Long-wanted KOEL 950 Oelwein IA was finally bagged that same afternoon at 1643 with Country music and call letters in a KWOS null. WSJM 1400 Saint Joseph MI was noted on that same afternoon at 1725 with a promo, ID and sports talk, taking out KJFF. As of November 6, 1,628 stations are in the logbook. 73.
