- UnID. 11/25. Not quite at audio level, but a puzzle, as multiple carriers noted, from 1547.97 up. Not something I recall seeing in recent times. (NP-AB)
- REP KOREA, HLAZ, Jeju, FEBC. Audio first evident at 1433 11/25, but never got better than a poor level, before fading around 1500. (NP-AB) 1566
- THAILAND, Ban Phachi, VOA. The first with audio, at 1426 11/25, staying in the poor range, until getting a boost to fair around 1450 sunrise. Still in audio for several minutes past 1500. (NP-AB) 1575
- 1593 CHINA, CNR1. First noted with traces of audio at 1443 11/25. Improved to fair (even bordering on good at times) with man and woman conversing by 1454, and nice clear pips and ID at 1500. (NP-AB)

I logged 2HD at a very good signal level early in this session, until another station, possible 4HI came crashing in with peaking audio, turning this frequency in to a real mess.

is 48 I managed to confirm this station as 4QD via an announcement for "ABC Queensland.

Gabriola DXpedition Report

An interesting little trip to Gabriola Island. Unfortunately, I think conditions deteriorated after my arrival. The first night, Nov 23 UTC, featured quite a lot of Japanese second tier fading in at their local sunset, but the recorder didn't work, and I needed to sleep. Figured the remaining two nights would repeat, when I would be better prepared, but just didn't happen unfortunately. Some TA action on Nov 24 UTC boded well, but in fact, conditions in the morning were less high latitude than the previous morning, and the final day was just poorer overall, yet with Chinese popping up. Weather was nice though.

TRANS ATLANTIC

- ICELAND, Gufuskálar, Rikisútvarpid Rás 1+2. Not strong but pretty steady with rock music //webstream http://www.ruv.is/ras-2, fighting with local noise. 1541 11/25. (NHP-BC)
- 855 UnID. 0603 11/24 man talking, very murky, then woman, back and forth; Romania Actualite had a similar "back and forth" per their webstream, but nothing distinctive to act as an ID. Just about time, the stream went to music, this dropped out. Didn't have the RNE stream to hand, but more northerly paths are often better on the west coast, especially outside of solar minimum. As well, there were brief bits of audio on 999 1089 and 1215 noted this evening, plus a number of carriers on 9 kHz channels. (NHP-BC)

TRANS PACIFIC

It may be that for a few months previous they were simulcasting, but now only on 1190, it seems. One is hardpressed to find anything on this FB relating this station to Ciudad Juárez, as all the locals obviously know where it is. But there is a link to their real website whose URL remains as if on 99.1: http://www.radiocentro991.com/. but everywhere else it`s branded only as RADIO CENTRO 1190. Although it appears to be 100% Mexican, part of Grupo Radio México (not Radio Centro [flagship XEQR 1030] itself), their studio phone number has an El Paso area code! "Cabina: (915) 229-1991". Nothing on the Contacto link any closer than that, let alone a street address in Ciudad Juárez. Is the studio really across the frontera?? Anyhow, the 1190 Ciudad Juárez facility is XEPZ, ex-Radio Norteña per WRTH 2015, IRCA log 2014-2015, and Cantú as of Feb 2015, with 5000/100 watts (yeah, sure). Many years ago I visited XEPZ, when it was also an adjunct to some bigger station, and consisted of little but a record player

ODDS & ENDS

11/24. I love reading others' DXpedition reports & loggings. In that same spirit I offer the following.

From Nov. 15-21 I was at Quoddy House to try my luck at east-coast-style trans-oceanic DX.

While there's still LOTS of wav files to go through, enough is available to get a 'glimpse' of things.

Highlights so far include Ethiopia on 918 and 1359 kHz and Eritrea on 945 kHz. Thanks to the great folks on the RealDX mail list for ID help!

Quoddy House [QH] is near Lubec, Maine: https://maps.google.com/maps?q=44.818103,-66.962673&t=h&z=18

As much as a DX opportunity, a visit to QH is an opportunity to try out new antennas and new configurations of trusted antennas. Over the past few visits I've gotten an idea of where it's possible and useful to put up antennas. This year I stuck with what I've come to consider my 'stock' weapon – a 160' DKAZ – one at 55 degrees for TAs and one at 155 degrees for LatAm. I used a Vactrol termination resistance to vary Rt from the shack and then replaced it with a fixed resistor when I had determined the best value.

11/24. Here's where we're at with a Newfoundland report. We were in Cappahayden NOV 7-16. John Fisher, Jean Burnell, Chuck Hutton and me. One crisis that may have turned into an opportunity is that we suffered killer buzz saw interference at our normal location, something in the power line and it was centered on our exact location though evident for about a mile radius. One of our resourceful team members went knocking on doors in nearby Renews and found a willing saint allowing us to use the garage and Oceanside countryside for Perseus operations and two antennae. So unlike previous years, that included north and Brazil wires, at Renews we aimed east with one wire and more to the west on our south wire. Several days in each wire moved about 15 degrees further to the west. Eritrea is

one of the loggings that the east wire seems to have allowed; maybe not possible on our old north wire. The downside is that we were not able to engage in live DXing at all during our time there. It's all in the recordings; it's all review. So, at this point, we have little to share concerning the daily conditions.

We are still behind in reviewing Perseus files from 2010, 2011 and 2013, so 2015 will be even more challenging because each team member has the complete east/south files from 1930-1100 for each day (disclaimer: some days the south recordings failed; a DX curse of sorts). It takes me several days, usually, to get through just one file; and I think we have 300 of them.

So the first thing we agreed to is to submit a complete file of November 7 to the various lists, so that's what we're working on as a first step. I've completed the east wire for the 7th (lots of Spanish locals, more Egypt than usual, lots of open channels, but the south wire is more time-consuming). As Brazil fades in at 2030 lots of low-powered northeastern stations (Ceara, Rio Grande Del Norte, Algoas) are audible before the higher powered Brazilians kick in. I've heard at least 20 new Brazilians between 2030 and 2200 I am now up to 2230, and I hope we will be able to circulate our report for November 7th soon.

Some of our team has been dabbling in dates beyond the 7th, and impressive logs of Eritrea and Panama have been reported. I can't wait to get there!
