Happy Anniversary, IRCA! I have just re-upped for another year. As an intro, I'm 51, single, and working as a route driver for a local O'Reilly Auto Parts "hub" store in Omaha. I began skywave DXing in April 1981 and starting actively participating in DX Clubs in 1988. I initially joined IRCA in the fall of that year, and have attended 4 conventions in which IRCA has been a part of, either by itself or jointly with other clubs -Knoxville 1990, Minneapolis 2013, Billings 2014, and last year in Fort Wayne. Over the years, I've kept track of my loggings at three different QTHs - Iowa City, Iowa from 1985 (the beginning of my college years there) to 2001, Spirit Lake/Arnolds Park, Iowa during 1995-96, and from here in South Omaha, starting in 2010. Iowa City ranks as my most successful location, having logged 1373 stations from the US and Canada and 1428 overall during my time there. Spirit Lake/Arnolds Park (a resort area in the "Okoboji" region of Northwest Iowa) ranks as the quietest location from which I've DXed, as the closest locals, KKOJ-1190 Jackson, Minnesota and KILR-1070 Estherville, Iowa are only 250 watts, and sign off at sunset. Next closest local is KICD-1240 Spencer, lowa, which is 20 miles away. Had I stayed in Spirit Lake for several years after leaving in July 1996, I don't think there's any question I could have topped at least 1500 loggings and maybe even made 2000 a reasonable goal. As it was, I heard 596 from the US and Canada during my 14 months there. Omaha is, quite obviously, the most cluttered market that I've had to endure as a DXer. 10 locals on AM here, and plenty of images and mixing products to congest the upper end of the dial. I'm roughly 2 miles east of KOMJ-1490's tower, but also 2 miles north of the dual headache of KOTK-1420 and KLNG-1560. As of 2/28, I've logged 944 from the US and Canada and 994 overall. Within the past 4 years, I've added a 4th QTH, Davenport, Iowa, to my achievements, as I am keeping it in mind as a possible future residence. Just 217 from the US and Canada and 220 overall from there so far, but I anticipate those totals climbing. My radios have varied over the years. When I first got actively involved in the hobby in 1988, I was using a Reader's Digest RDA-127 barefoot (actually a Worldstar RDA-127, but with the Reader's Digest logo slapped on the front). On New Year's Day 1989, I upgraded by purchasing a Kenwood R-1000 and a Radio West loop antenna from longtime Chicago & Iowa City DXer Earl Higgins. Those served me well until June 1997, when I traded the R-1000 for a Sony ICF-2010. I then replaced the Radio West loop with a Quantum Loop in the fall of 1998. Stuck with both of those until March 2011, when I replaced the ICF-2010 with a Kenwood R-5000 and upgraded the Quantum Loop by acquiring a Quantum QX Pro, thus enabling me to readily switch off between LW and MW. In the fall of 2011, I got a Sangean ATS-909X, which was fresh off the assembly lines that year, and about which I had read several good reviews. In late 2014, I once again purchased a Sony ICF-2010 and just a few months ago, picked up a Grundig AN-200 antenna from Universal Radio. So for those keeping score at home, that's 1 tabletop, 2 portables, 1 loop antenna, and 1 passive antenna in my arsenal currently! I'm on the IRCA list server and also actively contribute to DXworld.com's broadcast band logger, which you can find at http://www.dxworld.com/bcblog.html. I will close for now, and once again put out a call to bumpersticker traders and collectors to bring what you have to the convention in Kansas City. Names like Ernie Cooper, Richard Wood, Don Erickson, Charley Keleher, RC Watts have been in my mind lately. It's hard to believe that I joined IRCA in March, 1965, just 51 years ago. Back then I was 19 and figuring I would never see 35. Now, I'm 70, gong on 71 and plan on living to at least 100. I'm still working 25-40 hours a week. My son had a stroke five years ago, just before he turned 42. He has recovered very well except for a problem with grasping a word now and then. We are praying for you. 73 until next time.
