Last time, I mentioned starting up a log for Michigan City IN using what I had heard/verified from when I lived in New Buffalo MI. I did start the log with 36 stations from 17 states and 1 Canadian province. It's an interesting mixture of stations with number three heard being KDLT-540 Delta UT. Number 28 is KEX-1190 Portland OR. Like I said, an interesting mix, but it should be noted that the first 32 stations were heard between 10/5/74 and 1/10/78. The other four were heard many years later as I passed thru the area catching newer stations which had come on the air after I left the area. My plans, right now, are to keep the old Gary log going after I get up there along with the new Mich. City log. If I hear a station new for Michigan City, but not Gary, it would just go in the Michigan City log. If new to Gary, it would go in both logs. I have a master log showing each of the eight logs I have had and which stations are listed in each log. A quick check shows that there are only 31 stations which have been heard at each location which range from Kalamazoo MI, Gary IN, Philadelphia, Wisconsin Rapids WI, Milwaukee, Columbia SC, Echo, Dale County AL (in the FL/GA corner of AL, and Indianapolis. All are clear channel stations with KOA-850 being the furthest west. I don't think it will be hard to work with and will help keep an interest for me in the hobby going. 73.
