- MÉXICO UnID. SEP 15 1159 Mexican loops SW, 6:59 timecheck, "Mundo Deportivo" segment in news, something in the Estadio Jalisco. There are no tapatíans on 560, but most likely XESRD in Santiago Papasquiaro, Durango; or XEGIK in Monclova, Coahuila, although the only 560 with a purely news format in the 2015 IRCA Mexican Log is XEOC in México DF. But many musical stations include a morning news block, which can throw you off. [Hauser-OK]
- MÉXICO XETNT, Los Mochis, Sin. SEP 22 1215 ad for John Deere, Sinaloa, so XETNT, Radio 65, Los Mochis in agropecuaria wake-up show. Not a big dominant signal it used to achieve at sunrise. [Hauser-OK]

In total 6 new additions entered into the logbook over the four early mornings. Stations from 8 countries, 23 USA states and 6 Canadian provinces were logged during the DXpedition.
