+10/6 2102 noted with a "WGRQ" mention by a male announcer. There is a WGRQ on FM 95.9 in Fredericksburg (actually, it's nearby Fairview Beach – eb). I'm not sure why I'm hearing the ID on 1240 kHz. The signal was noted mixing with unidentified stations carrying talk and vocal music. (KK-VA)
+10/6 2156 noted with an ad for the Putnam Record Insurance Agency, giving the number as (716) 366-2344, which corresponds to Dunkirk NY. The signal was noted mixing with WRTA and unidentified stations with Oldies and Country formats. (KK-VA) (This is definitely WJTN Jamestown NY. Dunkirk is due north of Jamestown. 714 is the Area Code for Anaheim, CA – eb)
+10/7 0100 noted with mention of "4:00, 1240 WRTO" by a male announcer; I'm not sure what I'm hearing at this time. The signal was noted mixing with WCNC, two unidentified Talk stations and an unidentified Oldies station. (KK-VA) (The time may have been part of a promo inserted into a legal ID. This is definitely WRTA Altoona PA; WRTO is on 1200 kHz in Chicago IL – eb)
+10/7 0300 noted with mention of "Celebrating 55 Years, the Voice of Red Rock County" by a male announcer. The signal was noted mixing with WDNE, WJTN and an unidentified station with *Coast-to-Coast AM*. (KK-VA)
+10/7 0457 noted with a mention of "1240 WGZZ" by a male announcer. The calls sounded like WGZZ. The signal was noted mixing with two unidentified Talk stations and an unidentified Oldies station. (KK-VA) (This sounds like WZCC Cross City FL – eb)
+10/7 0501 noted with mention of "Trapper's Latest, 1240 WPJP" by a male announcer. The calls sounded like WPJP. The signal was noted mixing with two unidentified Talk stations and an unidentified Oldies station. (KK-VA) (This could be either WPJL Raleigh NC or WPKE Pikeville KY – eb)
+10/7 noted with an Adult Standards format featuring "Blue on Blue" by Bobby Vinton //1230 kHz. Who carries this format on 1230 and 1240? The signal was noted mixing with unidentified stations carrying vocal music and talk. (KK-VA) (This might be WFTM Maysville KY – eb)
+10/7 0600 noted with mention of "Right now, WRIF" by a male announcer. The signal was noted mixing with unidentified stations carrying vocal music and talk. (KK-VA)
