JAPAN JOAK, Tokyo, NHK1. Bits of talk by woman in Japanese through the IBOC noise at 1303 12/21. (NP-AB)

613 UnID. (4QR?) At 1313 12/24 with carrier signal in moderate KCSP-610 QRM; unintelligible audio briefly at 1320-1321. (RA-OK)

JAPAN JOAB, Tokyo, NHK2. The clear winner among the Japanese today, fair level with English lesson at 1258 12/21. (NP-AB)

UnID. (2BL?) Weak carrier at 1333 12/24. (RA-OK) 702

JAPAN Tokyo, AFN. Eagle 810 rears its head in the later morning hours. It's almost always there, but fairly regularly it's barely above the mush, but I can "Tell" it's there. Fairly regularly the reception is well, Fair and sounds like this recording on 1853 12/14

http://onairdj.com/AFNTheEagle810_12142016_953am.mp3. What's kind of interesting is when this signal is good, it never stays good for long... it'll pop

above the mush for 30 seconds, 2 maybe 3 minutes usually before fading into oblivion. The clip above from 12/14 had reception hanging around for over 20 minutes or more. However, on 12/20 between 1915 and 1921, I had some pretty good reception for a little while. The signal was about as good as I've ever heard them and included the tail end of a PSA, a station liner along with two pop music songs. Two clips from 12/20:

https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bPwilUAN8Js and https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=sx-LKNUITTA. In that second clip, you can hear how quickly the signal turns to mush and how mushy and messy it gets. It's easy to spot an AFN station because the majority of their few AM signals that are left which play music are playing hit/pop/current music. (PW-AK)

JAPAN JOBB, Osaka, NHK2. Could make out the time pips at 1300 12/21, but just the odd trace of talk after that. (NP-AB)

AUSTRLIA 4TAB, Brisbane, Radio Tab. 10kw and very directional. 3 tower array. I think the NE lobe from 4TAB must be smack pointed right at Galena

AUSTRIA 41AB, Brisbane, Radio 1ab. 10kw and very directional. 3 tower array. I think the NE lobe from 41AB must be smack pointed right at Galena AK. Recorded at 1011 12/23 with a very good signal https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=JQirBtmG-Dw. The station is mainly horse racing results and play by play of horse races. They got a power upgrade from 5 to 10kw in 2001 and operate 24/7 on generator power from an island off Brisbane. (PW-AK) 1377t CHINA Xingyang, CNR1. Even managed a few seconds of threshold audio, along with a presumed 1503-JOUK (no NHK1 parallel available). The low band was distinctly anemic, with 594, 693 and 774 practically missing in action. (GDB-WA)

1566 REP KOREA HLAZ, Jeju, FEBC. First noted at 1342 12/19 with woman talking, then piano music. Interestingly that was the same time Richard had them in OK. Was in and out the next hour here, never better than fair. (NP-AB)

+Was the main star, reaching huge levels even on an experimental 5 inch "Baby FSL." Its Japanese service hit many S9 peaks from 1300-1340 12/20.

+Japanese service at a thunderous level at 1311 12/20; the pulsing, high-pitched tone every 2 seconds is the North Korean Jammer (which sounded pretty wimpy up against HLAZ this morning) https://app.box.com/s/lkfrr1cbokz9ui153xijgh437k7yxs28. (GDB-WA)
+Monitored 1320-1400 12/20 (LSR 1337). Japanese service was barely audible at 1336; poor from 1340 to close at 1344:30; Chinese language heard at 1345; barely audible Chinese talk in XERF-1570 splatter at 1352; music at 1354; fading away at 1356 with fragmentary signal traces until 1359. Signal was not as strong as yesterday. (RA-OK)

+Didn't check until later today, but heard Christian music, with talk by man and woman at 1459 12/20. (NP-AB)

+Poor, but definitely man and woman talking in Japanese at 1302 12/21. (NP-AB)
+I was recording the station as part of an A/B antenna test. Had S9 peaks around 1257 12/21, along with its partner (the North Korean Jammer) which had peaks of around S5. https://app.box.com/s/owdvvzi0kulsvlpnv0mk6uyx8ovtrqn0. (GDB-WA)

+With fragments of audio at 1310 12/21; barely audible (unintelligible) talk at 1314; faded away after 1316 with only traces of a signal until 1344. Reception definitely wasn't as good as the past two days. No other TP signals were detected. (RA-OK) +Barely audible in moderate XERF-1570 QRM at 1336-1344 12/24. (RA-OK)

1575 THAILAND Ban Phachi, VOA. Presumed the one heard very weakly at 1458 12/19 with "Joy to the World" then talk by woman. (NP-AB)

+Presumed the one with traces of audio at 1501 12/20. A second decent carrier there today too, about 10 Hz low. (NP-AB)

CHINA Changzhou, CNR1. Heard a mix of the CNR and NHK time pips at 1500 12/20, but at 1502 it was CNR with a woman talking (news?) on top. This 1593 was actually the strongest TP today, a bit better than 1566. (NP-AB)

UnID. (CNR?) Barely audible fragments of audio at 1347-1348 12/20. (RA-OK)

PAN AMERICAN DX ROUNDUP

890 CUBA CMBC, Chambas. 12/17 good in KDXU null. 0439 with "Radio Progresso" and mention of transmitting from Havana, Cuba during Spanish language programming. First time heard from Mesa. (JcJ-AZ)

ODDS AND ENDS

12/20 (via IRCA eGroup). I know from my own extensive experience that jammers change their sound over long distances (from my own words, as a matter of fact), but it doesn't sound like the 1566 laser jammer. The sound is too... smooth, and the pattern is too consistent and spread apart for it. It would be less consistent as it tries to break through typical audio, as you can hear in the clip below. But then again, I didn't hear any of your audio outside this clip, so it's hard to truly judge, and I don't know what the jammer would sound like overseas where it would obviously be mixing with Jeju's directional signal. I just feel it would be a hard time justifying this one as the jammer, in my opinion anyway, from someone who used to hear this pain in the ass every night. http://beaglebass.com/dx/external/Jammer_1566_Laser.MP3.

I am curious if any of you receive the super-powered 1467 jammer (//1566) in North America though, or any of the other North Korean jammers. That thing on 1467 has some serious comph! But I feel it's aimed south. I have that feeling for most of the jammers, which are certainly high enough power to be heard across the Pacific, unless aimed south.

12/20 (via IRCA eGroup). I recall a certain group mistakenly believing that same 1566 jammer was from Yanbian too, until I notified that it most certainly was not since Yanbian People's Radio could not broadcast from the same town as a high-powered jammer. :o)

My recordings of 1566 while in Seoul in early November clearly show the jammer is *exactly* as it was in the past, as 1467 is as well. Nothing has changed with either of those signals (ie the actual jamming sound of them as heard locally). 1467 is the same laser jammer at the moment as I listen to it. 1566 is the same too as I'm listening to it right now.

However... with that said, North Korea does use a different type of jammer than the south does, technology-wise. The 1584 jammer starts out low and gradually sounds bigger before it eventually self-destructs (no better way to put it) and starts over again. You can see the whole hilariously awkward process on the SDR actually, as I have saved images of it.

It's possible that everyone is hearing this same process in the audio of the 1566 jammer but not hearing the actual laser-like sound as you seem to be suggesting too. Jammers sound different from a distance, absolutely. The signal sounds... wider somewhat, a lot like 1206 Yanbian... that loud hum their signal has that shows as a really wide line on the SDR and kind of kills the clearness of their audio. I hear that same sort of hum when the jammer is behind Jeju and it's possible in coordination with the jamming noise, it is cycling every 2 seconds, which is what you end up picking up from it and may also explain why the sound sometimes peaks and gets louder over Yanbian in my recordings of it.

Jeju is too strong on my friend's SDR to *clearly* hear the jammer, as compared to the signals in the city, which usually heavily favor Pyongyang and northeast

China. And Yanbian is, as usual, interfering with it too.

That's the best explanation I can give (aside from a totally separate north-aiming jammer I cannot receive in Seoul over a local south-aiming one), because these jammers have not changed at all, not as heard locally anyway. Mauno should always feel free to ask me about these things too. Even if I'm not in Seoul, many of my radio friends are and I can access some of their equipment online when needed. Just seemed silly to me to go through asking people from other countries for help when you've got someone with Pyongyang as daytime locals less than 100 miles away. :)

Those recordings are ... interesting though, although I'd never have the patience to deal with a mere hum....

On the morning of February 15 2016, I woke up with my arm shaking somewhat violently; I could not open the morning paper. When I got back to my bed, I could not stand up on my left leg. An MRI and angiogram revealed that I had suffered a stroke; a congenital deformity was found in my brain. As I write this Forum, I'm walking with the aid of a cane; I've lost some dexterity in my left hand. I took several months away from the dials to concentrate on recovery; five weeks were spent in a rehabilitation hospital in St Louis. There have been a number of changes on the dial here in the St Louis area. Three AM stations have added FM relays: KXEN 1010 St Louis MO is now relayed on K283CI 104.5 (99 watts, also licensed to St Louis); their hours have been reduced to 0600 to 0100 ELT. Also adopting this schedule is sister station WGNU 920 Granite City IL. KLPW 1220 Union MO is now being relayed on K224EZ 92.7 (250 watts, also in Union). WRYT 1080 Edwardsville IL has added a third FM relay in W224DC Caseyville IL (250 watts); they're also relayed on KHOJ 1460 St Charles MO. An FM relay is also being planned for WGNU. The use of FM relays tend to increase coverage of lower-powered AM stations. An example is W232CR 94.3 Alton IL, which relays WBGZ 1570. Their 74-watt night signal barely makes it to my shack; some nights, it's covered up by XERF. The FM signal (250 watts) is much better at night at my shack. Another new relay is K254CR 98.7 St Louis MO (250 watts), relaying KFTK-FM 97.1 Florissant MO. Speaking of KFTK, they've added an AM signal, taking over the former WQQX 1490 East St Louis IL which changed calls to KFTK, to match the FM), simulcasting a conservative-leaning News/Talk format. The Fox Sports Radio programming is now heard on KFNS 590 Wood River IL. Other programming changes of note: WQQW 1510 Highland IL dropped its Regional Mexican format and reverted to Classic Country, calling itself "Madison County's Hometown Station". Sister station KQQZ 1190 De Soto MO has added "Red Eye Radio" to its programming lineup; both stations are owned by Entertainment Media Trust, doing business as Insane Broadcasting. With the loss of the Rams to Los Angeles, KQQZ is carrying the Chicago Bears, while KMOX 1120 is carrying the Kansas City Chiefs this year. WGNU 920 dropped CBS Sports Radio on weekdays in favor of Business News; Urban Gospel programming remains on the station on the weekends (a holdover from the Chuck Norman days). KXFN 1380 St Louis MO returned to the air after Thanksgiving with Christmas music from the Salem Music Network; they will likely go Southern Gospel after Christmas. I've also added new equipment to the shack over the summer; I bought a Uniden Bearcat BCD996P2 scanner, which decodes most digital trunked radio systems, including APCO P25. In April, my FM/TV antenna setup blew down in a severe thunderstorm; the FM antenna (an Antenna Performance Specialties APS-9B nine-element Yagi) sustained minimal damage; the TV antenna (a Winegard HD8200U) sustained enough damage to warrant replacing it with a Channel Master CM3020 VHF/UHF antenna. New logs this season include WHIN 1010 Gallatin TN (09/21 at 0327 ELT), KGAF 1580 Gainesville TX (10/27 at 0224 ELT) and WRCR 1700 Ramapo NY (12/05 at 0450 ELT), along with call changes for KFTK 1490 and KAFN 690. Total as of 12/15 stands at 1,652. Merry Christmas, Happy Hanukkah and Happy New Year to all! 73.
