After a long 14 months of work, I'm happy to present the completed Seoul AM Radio Listening Guide, a three-hour documentary broadcast exploring the Seoul AM band one frequency at a time, plus a look at the radio war on the Korean peninsula accompanied by a 115-page guide. http://www.beaglebass.com/dx/seoul/

In addition to radio broadcasts from across East Asia, the broadcast includes Korean noise jammers and AM, FM, shortwave, and television propaganda broadcasts from both the north and the south, additionally outlined in a 25-page broadcast transcript and 115-page informational guide. It also includes:

- A comprehensive list of 260 East Asian AM stations, including station names, tower locations, distance and direction from Seoul, parallel FM frequencies, broadcast hours, and station website links.
- * A full bandscan of 235 regular nightly skywave signals as heard after the sun sets over Seoul.
- Daytime groundwave bandscans taken from eleven different locations in the Seoul metro area, along the North Korean border, beside the sea, and in Korea's mountainous interior with background information about each location.
- * A guide showing stations organized by their network affiliations in addition to privately-owned stations and networks. Alternatively, stations are also shown organized by country, region, and city.
- * A chart showing signal strength for each bandscan day and night in bar graph format.
- * A full colour-coded regional station map covering both skywave and groundwave signals.
- A view of some of Korea's signal jammers as seen on an SDR (software-defined radio).
- * Plus, a complete transcript of the three-hour audio broadcast with additional information on the featured audio clips as well as the songs featured in those clips. Chris Kadlec

RNZ 5 January 2017

French Polynesia's public radio broadcaster says people in remote locations have complained about the end of transmissions on its AM frequency.

Radio Polynesie Premiere switched to an all FM service at the beginning of December, leaving pockets of inhabitants in valleys and on remote atolls without

any local radio service. The broadcaster added five FM transmitters to its network of 48 to improve its reach but in an area the size of Europe, the signal fails to reach all communities.

Concern has been expressed that vital weather warnings are no longer heard. The mayor of Makatea in the Tuamotus Julien Mai said there is a risk to public safety because people have always been advised to have an emergency kit that includes a radio when severe weather strikes.

Mariners can still receive weather updates via radio.

*** TRANS-PACIFIC DX ***

1566 SOUTH KOREA HLAZ, FEBC, Jeju Island. DEC 19 1339 - carrier looping NW on the DX-398 with internal antenna only, and at last I can pull some audio: talk, maybe Korean? and piano music. Could also get the carrier at 1343 but no audio on the R-75 with E-W longwire. At 1345 weaker, no audio audible. It's HLAZ, 250 kW. WRTH 2016 shows 1345 is the time it transitions from Japanese to Chinese, no doubt also antenna change correlating with signal drop here, although it's already just after surrise. Aoki also shows those times but no azimuth info. A few minutes earlier, I had sought TP carriers on lowband, 774 etc, but none audible. Then checked NK MW/low SW frequencies and found 2850 to be S7 at 1347, 3250 also audible, but nothing unusual.

+DEC 20 1339 - I'm chasing again HLAZ, and there it is looping NW, 1342 music, and I am listening with offset BFO for a carrier break, which happens for a few seconds at 1344:34 as the beam is being changed from Japan to China. Distance from the 250 kW station is 10995 km or 6832 statute miles. [Hauser-OK]

*** PAN-AMERICAN DX ***

530 CUBA Radio Rebelde. DEC 27 0320 - surprised to hear Spanish talk about béisbol, Radio Rebelde //1180 and a bit of an echo against //5025. Atop music from presumed Radio Enciclopedia, which is normally dominant, listed 10 kW from nearest Villa María, Ciudad de la Habana. WŘTH 2017 shows two Rebeldes on 530: unknown power in Caribe, Isla de Juventud, and 1 kW in far Guantánamo.

+DEC 31 0300 - Radio Rebelde IS of some notes from Cuban NA and then some electronic tones; presumably from the Isla de Juventud (ex-Pinos) transmitter, above Enciclopedia but not as dominant as last time, and also mixing with `K530AM` Vance AFB. [Hauser-OK]

CUBA Radio Enciclopedia. DEC 28 0153 – soft piano version of "Yesterday", so Radio Enciclopedia regains dominance, no sign of Radio Rebelde on 530 as heard 22.5 hours ago. Original format was presenting bits of spoken knowledge as the name implies, but strangely kept the name with flip to EZL music. Do they have any informational shows or segments when we don't hear them? [Hauser-OK]

MÉXICO XETNT, Los Mochis, Sin. DEC 31 0304 - Spanish atop WSM which is easily nulled. Whenever this happen, I hope it's something other than

XETNT, but soon promoting the Noticiero Altavoz from Radio 65 en Sinaloa. [Hauser-OK]

730 MÉXICO XEHB, Hidalgo del Parral, Chih. DEC 24 0151 – three canned "[E]stereo Fiesta, 107.1 FM, 700-30 AM" IDs by super-hype voice actor within two minutes, as XEHB is now known, outdating WRTH 2017 already on this which still shows "Ke Buena"; and IRCA Mexican Log 2015 with that plus "Viva Villa". [Hauser-OK]

MÉXICO XEACH, Monterrey, NL. DEC 24 0257 – explaining what a Villancico is, 0259 ID as "Radio Fórmula de Monterrey", ie XEACH, 25/1 kW. Dominant on my N/S antenna, while KKOB is on the E/W. [Hauser-OK]
