 WCND **KY**, Shelbyville – 10/18 0014 presumed Spanish language programming on the frequency; this is a 10-watt signal. At 41 miles, the signal is strong in the daytime; still a lot of interference for 10 watts at night. (HD-KY)
 WFAW **WI**, Fort Atkinson – 10/17 2319 noted with The Jim Bohannon Show until 2358, followed by the WFAW Community Calendar. (HD-KY)
 960 WERC **AL**, Birmingham – 10/18 0140 noted with a clear "News Radio 960 WERC" ID during *Coast-to-Coast AM with George Noory*. (HD-KY)
 WPRT **KY**, Prestonsburg – 10/18 1827 noted with an ad for the LM Restaurant in the Landmark Hotel in nearby Pikeville, KY. No affirmative ID heard, but the Pikeville ad clinched it. (HD-KY)
 WFIR **VA**, Roanoke – 10/20 1700 noted with a clear ID coming out of Sean Hannity into ABC News, followed by a local newscast with an anchor named Evans, followed by a remote hosted by Gene Morano; a weather forecast from WDBJ-TV was followed by the meditation feature *Take a Time Out* into *The Greg Roberts Show*. Slogans included "The Roanoke Valley's News and Weather Station" and "From the Best of the Blue Ridge, WFIR Roanoke". (HD-KY)
 980 WYFN **TN**, Nashville – 10/20 1820 noted with mention of the Bible Broadcasting Network into a spoken word Christian program. (HD-KY)
 WWTB **VA**, Bristol – 10/20 1812 noted with "105-3 the Beat" and "The All-New 105-3 the Beat" IDs, Hip-Hop/R&B format and an ad for a Kia dealer in Kingsport TN. (HD-KY) (105.3 is W287CF Bristol TN – eb)
 990 WWKY **KY**, Winchester – Ground radials are scheduled to be plowed in during the week of 10/23, with testing starting ASAP thereafter. Due to the use of a folded unipole antenna, they are only required to use 90 radials instead of 120. Will be 350 watts day and 20 watts at night to start. (HD-KY)
 1200 WJXY **SC**, Atlantic Beach – 10/12 2133 noted with an Urban Gospel format, "103.5 Rejoice FM" ID at 2135, caller with a "shout out" to a friend. A fair at times to very poor signal, mixing with an unidentified Spanish language station (maybe WRTO); possibly on day power. Ex-WMIR. (PS-ON) (103.5 is W278CB Atlantic Beach SC – eb)
 1250 WGL **IN**, Fort Wayne – 10/19 0002 noted with *The Jason Smith Show*, plenty of mentions of Fox Sports and Fox Sports Radio, national ad cluster including Auto Zone and Geico, various show promos, "You are listening to 1250 WGL, Fox Sports Radio the Ticket" ID at 0100. A fair at times to very poor signal was noted, mixing with CJYE, WARE, WPGP and other stations. (PS-ON)
 1250 WRAY **IN**, Princeton – 10/19 0002 noted with news items and a clear "1250 WRAY" ID, followed by another "WRAY" mention before fading out. A very poor signal was noted, mixing with CJYE, WARE and other stations while trying to identify an unidentified Oldies station and a Fox Sports Radio affiliate. (PS-ON)

10/21. I'm still going through the file review for the August Rockwork 4 DXpedition, and still coming up with a few surprises. Most TP-DXers know that 558-Radio Fiji One is the native language program in Fiji, while 900-Radio Fiji Gold is the English program (which Theo recently assured me is being heard very well in NZ, despite the fact that it apparently never showed up for us on the Oregon cliff).

With the rejuvenated 558-Radio Fiji One pounding in on most days with potent-level English music it was already a great improvement over past DXpeditions, but while reviewing the August 8th recording I was able to come up with a Radio Fiji One English ID for the first time in 9 years of TP-DXing (at a near S9 level to boot) at 1315 UTC on that exceptional morning, at the 27 second point <https://dreamcrafts.box.com/s/2m8y5m0aiax080rj3uvfvqivecbz7gni>

This was the first English that I have ever heard on RF1 (after about 18 receptions), so it was quite a surprise. This was received on a 7.5 inch loopstick Tecsun PL-380 Ultralight boosted by a 15 inch "Airport Unfriendly" FSL antenna on the ocean cliff near Manzanita, Oregon.
