"Radio That Makes You Think" mention at 0535 into The Brian Kilmeade Show, which I thought I heard as "The Brian Tellman Show". A plenty strong signal was noted with interference from WIND Chicago. I suspect many stations don't comply with night power,

and hard to believe this armchair copy is a 55-watt signal. (HD-KY)

WV, Beckley – 10/22 0140 noted with Country format, "WJLS" jingle at 0145. A fair signal at times to very poor, almost over WFRB, occasionally mixing with usual CFOS. A very strong signal this AM; not usually dominant. Confirmed via Tune-In Web stream. (PS-ON) **WJLS** 

670 WWFE FL, Miami – 10/19 2210 noted with talk in Spanish and instrumental music in between. A good signal tonight; fair at times to very poor, mixing with

WSCR, Radio Rebelde (Cuba) and another Spanish language station; confirmed via Tune-In Web stream. (PS-ON)

IA, lowa City – 10/25 1855 noted with NPR programming, "WSUI" ID at 1900 into NPR News, lowa Public Radio news reported by Rob Dillard at 1904 into All Things Considered at 1906. (HD-KY) (This is a sunrise and sunset regular at my shack – eb) 910 WSUI

**WSFK** KY, Burnside – 10/25 1620 noted with a Country format, IDs mentioning the Lake Cumberland area; Burnside is right below Somerset in the Lake Cumberland tourist area. (HD-KY)

MI, Farmington Hills – 10/25 2332 noted with an ad for a job as a sales person (known as an Account Executive in the business – eb) at the station, gave a phone number in Area Code 586 (Warren, MI), "The Detroit Area's Only African-American Talk Station" slogan, followed by a "910 WFDF AM Super Station, WFDF Detroit" quasi-legal ID. (HD-KY)

OH, Marietta - 10/25 1821 noted with ID coming out of a Clark Medical Center program on smoke inhalation and other medical topics, then a **WLTP** message from Pastor Rodney, faded out briefly, faded back in with a political ad against Issue 2 in the November 7 election, claiming it would raise prescription prices and other reasons, followed by a local weather forecast returning to the Clark Medical Center program. The medical center is located in Parkersburg, WV. It seems WLTP targets Parkersburg; the town is frequently mentioned in subsequent monitoring. (HD-KY)

OH, Middletown – 10/25 1615 noted with Sacred Heart Radio mention, mixing with WSEK. (HD-KY)

TN, Johnson City – 10/25 1800 noted with an ad for Jim's Motorcycle Sales and ID into a network newscast. A promo for *The Chris Plant Show*, WJCW mentioning the air time as 0930-1200, at 1805. The station was in and out the balance of the evening as I tried to null them; a good number of local spots and mentions of the Tri-Cities area. (HD-KY)

**WEPG** TN, South Pittsburg - 10/23 2023 noted with "Now, That's My Kind of Country; The River, WEPG" ID into a Country format. "Playing Today's Hot Country Favorites" at 2114, local ad mentioning a phone number in Area Code 423 at 2123. (HD-KY)

IN, West Lafayette - 10/27 1736 noted on the car radio with the end of an area newscast from Indiana Public Radio, solid ID into and out of a 920 WBAA weather report before fading down. For the rest of the drive to a local high school football game, WBAA kept trading places with WLIV. (HD-KY) WV, Fairmont – 10/26 1924 noted with a clear ID after an ad cluster in a Pittsburgh Penguins hockey game. A very strong signal was noted on WMMN

peaks, but often overtaken by WLIV. (HD-KY)

NH, Derry – 10/24 2231 Tuned in to note Christian talk, "WDER and WDER-dot-com" ID, another talk segment, "Life-Changing Radio WDER" ID 1320 WDER

at 2234 into a sermon by a fire-and-brimstone preacher. A fair at times to very poor signal, mixing with CJMR and WJAS. (PS-ON)

IN, Gary – 10/21 0028 noted with an Urban AC format, "You have discovered Soul Music, 1370 WLTH" ID at 0036. A poor to very poor signal was noted in a station mix, confirmed by Web stream at 1370 WLTH-dot-net. was noted, mixing with WLTH and other stations. announcer in English mentioning "does not reflect the views of Radio Mega, WJCC" at 2259, followed by possibly the same announcement in French with Radio Mega mentions, "WJCC 1700 AM Miami Springs" legal ID in English by a male announcer with a Caribbean accent at 2300 followed by a repeat of the English disclaimer, into a music segment. A poor to very poor signal in a mix of stations; confirmed via Tune-In Web stream. I have officially heard all U.S. stations on 1700. (PS-ON)

During last Augusts' Rockwork 4 DXpedition Tom Rothlisberger and I were both lucky enough to receive a couple of Western Australian stations on August 4th, including AFL football play-by-play at a good level on 531-6DL (//594) on a modified CC Skywave and 15 inch FSL antenna at 1222 UTC https://dreamcrafts.box.com/s/2ms23dtebe7zvl6v0mynhxhjmcqinbs8. We also both received 558-6WA on the same morning, and on August 5th.

As Tom mentioned on his excellent Rockwork 4 DXpedition page (with the aerial photo taken by his drone, far above the DXing site at (http://www.qsl.net/k7wv/RockworkDX4.htm), the ABC network has exclusive rights to broadcast the AFL games. 6DL is also the only ABC network station on the frequency. So at least until Gary Deacon of South Africa or Tony King of NZ checks in with a new list of US receptions:) the reception of the 10 kW 531-6DL in Dalwallinu, Australia from the ocean cliff site near Manzanita, Oregon appears to be the longest Ultralight radio worldwide reception at that power level since records have been kept (9,050 miles or 14,564 km). Records are made to be broken, however, so I'm waiting for an email from Gary or Tony:-) Gary DeBock (in Puyallup WA, USA)

10/29. This year's DXpedition has concluded, however the review of recordings will go on for months. One highlight was a new country in Romania on 1179. We had TA conditions which ranged from fair to very good, sometimes within the space of an hour, and some moderately auroral conditions as well. An initial loggings list will be collected and posted hopefully next weekend.

WQQW 1510 Highland IL has made another format flip, this time from Classic Country to Adult Standards. This is the third format the station has had in two years, after Regional Mexican and Classic Country. Classic Country can still be heard locally on KQQZ 1190. The last station in the St Louis area to program this format was WQQX 1490 (now KFTK). Speaking of KQQZ, the station and sister station KZQZ 1430 have switched news affiliation to USA Radio. KMOX 1120 has not been broadcasting in digital format for six months now; they have apparently dropped digital service, leaving KFUO 850 (a staunch "HD" supporter) to carry on this failed technology. WSDZ 1260 is the latest AM station to be relayed by an FM translator; the station and its Conservative Talk format is now simulcast on K236CS 95.1 St Louis MO (a 99-watt relay). Sister station KXFN 1380, with primarily health and medical talk, will also be getting a relay, in the form of a new 99-watt FM translator on 105.3. This one may be tough to hear because of semi-local WAOX out of Staunton IL. The 104.5 translator for KXEN 1010 has been tough to hear because of another semi-local, KSLQ out of Washington MO. Last month, I purchased a County Comm GP-5/SSB Ultralight receiver from Universal Radio, and joined the trend of Ultralight DXing. I've concentrated on DXing the domestic AM stations, but have heard a handful of Cubans and Mexicans. The receiver also has shortwave

in AM and SSB mode, as well as FM broadcast band. The FM section is good, hearing the local FM relays of AM and HD2 signals, as well as regional 50,000 watt and 100,000 watt FM stations. A call change was noted on the receiver: ex-local WTZA 1010 Atlanta GA (it was WGUN when I lived there) was noted 6/23 at 0545 ELT with Christian music and "Vida 1010 AM en Georgia" ID in Spanish. A new station was added to the log on 7/6 in the form of WNSR 560 Brentwood TN at 0459 ELT with local ads, legal ID in the form of a jingle into sports headlines from CBS Sports Radio. They were apparently on day power; I thought for a while I had WQAM Miami FL. June 29 marked 25 years since I returned to the St Louis area from the Atlanta area; as of July 6 2017, 1,693 stations have made it into the logbook. 73 from the Florissant Valley Dial Twister.
