1110 ON Matachewan CBON-10 License surrendered. 50 watt rebroadcaster of CBON 98.1 Sudbury.

**TECHNICAL CHANGES GRANTED**

960 ON Mississauga CKNT-cp Relocate transmitter. Power will remain 2,000 watts (days)/280 watts (nights).

**OWNERSHIP CHANGES GRANTED**

1220 ON Saint Catharines new-cp From Sivanesarajah Kandiah and David J Dancy to Radio Dhun.

580 AB Edmonton CHAH(cp) Owner of the former CKUA-AM transmitter site refused to sign a long-term lease because of future residential development of the land. The area was recently annexed by the Town of Beaumont. CHAH has been approved by the CRTC and signed a long-term lease with the CBC to share CBX-740's transmitter site. Power is still 10,000 watts and Day Pattern is essentially the same, but Night Pattern is unknown as it was not included in the approved Application. Since there is no longer a need to protect Salmon Arm and Winnipeg – both 580s moved to FM – Night Pattern could change dramatically. (Jon Pearkings)

740 AB Edmonton CBX Can be expected to be off the air, or running non-directional at lower power, for several hours at a time between now and when CHAH-580 begins its Test Period, to prepare the CBX transmitter to co-host CHAH. In the past, to avoid Union Overtime costs, CBX has scheduled off-air preventative transmitter maintenance for mid-afternoons on weekdays, but the CBC may insist on overnight periods for outages when CHAH is paying the costs. CHAH has until January 6 2019, to start broadcasting. (Jon Pearkings)

- 580 WDBO **FL**, Orlando – 10/19 0600 noted with "ESPN 580 Orlando, streaming live on the ESPN app and ESPN Radio-dot-com" ID by a male announcer; dominant on frequency. (MC-MA)

When I lived in Georgia in the late ‘80s and early ‘90s, this was a semi-regular as WAPI-FM “I-95”. I’m guessing this is a recent development – eb)

WOKV **FL**, Jacksonville – 10/28 0730 suddenly jumped out of the jumble (power and pattern change?) mentioning the upcoming Fox News Radio newscast, “*The Home and Garden Show* will be back” into Fox News Radio before fading out. “WOKV” ID at 0734 before *The Home and Garden Show*. The signal was at good strength but fading. Dominant for a few minutes at 0802 with local news, mention of “Time for Florida-Georgia” (think SEC football Saturday!) and several local references, including News 104.5 (WOKV-FM), CBS 47 (WJAX) and “Join us at ten on Fox 30” (WFOX) and an ad announcing a phone number of 674-6830. (HD-KY)

KGGF **KS**, Coffeyville – 10/28 0600 noted with a good ID for KGGF, again at 0720 with a Kansas college and high school football report and a clear “690 AM KGGF” ID before mentioning that Coffeyville High lost 32 to 18. I was confused that 690 had a sportsman’s show interviewing archer Laura Franchese up to 0600 and a show called *Hook and Hunt* between 0600 and 0700, with information on hunting ducks, deer and Sandhill cranes, wrapping up with some fishing tips, all at good strength with some fades. The ads referenced Oklahoma and the Fort Smith (AR) area. KGGF is on the Oklahoma border and within striking distance of Fort Smith, so I’m guessing this was all KGGF and Hook and Hunt is a regional show popular on stations in that area. (HD-KY) (KGGF covers six states during the daytime – eb)

WQNO **LA**, New Orleans – 10/28 0600 noted at the end of a hymn sung by a male choir with a clear “WQNO” ID into a spoken word program. Faded up around 0630 with a pre-recorded program with call-ins and E-mails receiving spiritual guidance with several mentions of EWTN Radio. Briefly dominant at 0728 with promos for multiple EWTN programs scheduled through the week. (HD-KY)

+11/1 0204 noted with the *Mornings with Mother* program. A fair at times to very poor signal, mixing with an unidentified Spanish language station; confirmed via Web stream at Catholic Community Radio-dot-org; CKGM was off. (PS-ON) (Your Spanish may be XEN Mexico City DF; the only US Spanish stations on 690, WADS Ansonia CT and WPHE Phoenixville PA, are daytime only – eb)

WZAP **VA**, Bristol – 10/28 0750 fading in and out with a Southern Gospel format and local announcer, then a “professional” announcer mentioning a phone number of (276) 669-6950, references to “690 WZAP-dot-com” and the Tri-Cities. “And thanks for listening. 690 WZAP” ID; back from 0809-0830 with *It’s Gospel Time with Roger Boone*, giving the show’s address in Weaverville, NC, ending with the “Thanks for Listening” tag. (HD-KY)

CBKF1 **SK**, Gravelbourg – 11/1 0113 noted with two female announcers interviewing a male guest named Pierre in French, “Radio Canada Premiere” ID at 0138. A poor to very poor signal was noted, mixing with WELD and an unidentified Spanish language station (not Cuba’s Radio Progreso). Confirmed via Tune-In Web stream; CKGM was off. (PS-ON)

710 WAQI **FL**, Miami – 9/9 0500 noted with “Radio Mambi” ID and talk show in Spanish over a mix of Radio Rebelde (Cuba) and WOR. (MC-MA)

720 WRZN **FL**, Hernando – 9/10 2101 noted with Hurricane Irma coverage, ID for a long list of stations on the network including “WRZN AM Hernando”, over Cuba. (MC-MA)

WGCR **NC**, Pisgah Forest – 10/28 0859 noted with a Southern Gospel format, “WGCR 720 and 94.9” ID into a dramatic program that started out like an old-time radio show. “Let’s join... as they speed down the runway” mention, followed by the father saying to his son: “If I ever need to make a forced landing in the river, I would need to know if you can swim.” Somehow this morphs into a Christian lesson show. (HD-KY) (This sounds like *Unshackled*, produced by the Pacific Garden Mission of Chicago IL, and airs on many Christian radio stations and networks worldwide, including the Bott Radio Network [WCRT 1160] and the Bible Broadcasting Network [WYFN 980] – eb)

730 WLTQ **SC**, Charleston – 10/8 2000 noted with IDs for Catholic Radio in South Carolina stations, including “WLTQ 730 AM Charleston/Beaufort/Hilton Head”; a good and dominant signal was noted. (MC-MA) (I’ve logged the CR in SC stations in Saint Matthews and Greer at my location – eb)

740 WYGM **FL**, Orlando – 9/10 0600 noted with an Orlando area affiliates list and mention of “Fox Sports... trending NOW!” A fair signal was noted. (MC-MA)

CHCM **NL**, Marystown – 10/7 1900 noted with “Your VOOC” network ID. A good signal was noted over Radio Angulo (Cuba). (MC-MA)

760 WLCC **FL**, Brandon – 9/25 0600 noted with talk by a male announcer, then a “WLCC Brandon/Tampa/Saint Petersburg” legal ID in English by a female announcer; dominant. (MC-MA)

780 WTME **ME**, Rumford – 9/24 2000 noted on 779.96 kHz; 40 Hz low of the listed nominal frequency with a sports talk format, “Western Maine’s new home for national and local sports, you’re listening to 780 Sports Talk. WTME Rumford/Mexico” legal ID. A good signal was noted. (MC-MA)

790 WAXY **FL**, South Miami – 10/2 1959 noted with “WAXY South Miami” legal ID, slightly over a mix of WNIS, WPRV and Radio Reloj (Cuba). (MC-MA)

+10/13 2000 noted with legal ID for WAXY South Miami and WSFS-HD2 Miramar. A good signal was noted, way over WNIS, WPRV and Radio Reloj (Cuba). (MC-MA)

800 WCHA **PA**, Chambersburg – 9/3 2000 noted with “96.3 WCHA Chambersburg” (it’s actually W242BY Chambersburg – eb) into the True Oldies format; signal getting better. (MC-MA)

820 WBAP **TX**, Fort Worth – 11/1 2230 noted with a traffic report, “WBAP” mention, weather forecast into news items. A poor to very poor signal in a station mix with CHAM dominating; I haven’t heard this for a while. (PS-ON)

830 WEEU **PA**, Reading – 10/17 2000 noted with “830 WEEU in Reading” legal ID, mixing with WCRN carrying music. (MC-MA)

850 WFTL **FL**, West Palm Beach – 9/9 0500 noted with “News/Talk 850 WFTL West Palm Beach” legal ID, atop WEEI. (MC-MA)

+9/29 2000 noted with ad for Toyota of Hollywood, “News/Talk 850 WFTL West Palm Beach/Coral Springs/Lake Worth” legal ID. A dominant signal was noted, way over WEEI. (MC-MA)

WTAR **VA**, Norfolk – 9/10 Midnight noted with “Your Home for the Washington Redskins” mention and “WTAR” ID over the jumble. (MC-MA)

900 WILC **MD**, Laurel – 10/8 2000 noted with talk in Spanish including a “WILC” ID and mention of Laurel, MD; over CHML, Radio Progreso (Cuba) and other stations. (MC-MA)

920 WDMC **FL**, Melbourne – 9/25 0600 noted with “WDMC Melbourne/Vero Beach” legal ID mixing with WHJJ. (MC-MA)

930 WFMD **MD**, Frederick – 9/9 Midnight noted with mention of Maryland and a “93 WFMD” ID; dominant. (MC-MA)

WDLX **NC**, Washington – 9/10 2100 noted with mention of Pirate Radio affiliates including a 1250 station (WGHB Farmville – eb) and a “930 WDLX Washington/Greenville/New Bern” legal ID. A good signal was noted. (MC-MA)

+10/8 2259 noted with a “93 CFBC” ID, mixing with WPKX. (MC-MA)

940 WINZ **FL**, Miami – 10/18 2000 noted with a “WINZ Miami/Fort Lauderdale” legal ID over other stations. (MC-MA)

WADV **PA**, Lebanon – 10/19 1901 noted with “Playing the Best in Southern and Country Gospel music, you’ve got Gospel Music Radio 940 WADV” ID by a male announcer. A fair to good signal was noted. (MC-MA)

960 KLTF **MN**, Little Falls – 10/29 0044 noted with Bluegrass music; the *Knee Deep in Bluegrass* program, according to the station’s Web site. “You are listening to AM 960 KLTF Little Falls, serving the... Minnesota area” legal ID at 0100 into the *Power Country* program. A fair at times to poor signal, but almost always audible over WFIR. I got a good recording of the top of the hour ID; possibly left the day power on. (PS-ON)

980 WCUB **WI**, Two Rivers – 10/30 2048 noted with what sounded like a “WCUB” ID into a Country format, “Cub Radio-dot-com” mention at 2050, more Country music, “980 WCUB” ID at 2057. A fair at times to very poor signal was noted, mixing with CFPL, WTEM and other stations. (PS-ON)

990 WDYZ **FL**, Orlando – 10/19 1900 with talk and Orlando mentions in Spanish, “WDYZ” ID in heavily accented English by a male announcer, then a “990 AM” ID in Spanish by a female announcer. A good signal was noted. (MC-MA)

A fair signal was noted at times, over and under CFRB and WINS; WCNL must have left the day power on. (PS-ON)

1040 WURN **FL**, Miami – 9/25 0600 noted with “This is WURN 1040 AM Miami FL, covering the Florida Keys” legal ID in English by a female announcer, followed by talk in Spanish by a male announcer. A good signal was noted. (MC-MA)

CKST **BC**, Vancouver – 11/3 0006 noted with mention of the Whitecaps and the Sounders (Vancouver Whitecaps vs Seattle Sounders FC soccer), “Bell Whitecaps Soccer... TSN 1040” ID at 0047, sports news, another “TSN 1040” ID at 0048. An occasionally fair signal over WHO to a very poor signal was noted under WHO. (PS-ON)

1160 WSKW **ME**, Skowhegan – 9/24 2000 noted with “Maine’s only station for Real Country music, Classic Country 1160 WSKW Skowhegan/Waterville” legal ID, followed by a promo for the Little Texas concert at the Waterville Opera House on November 10. A good signal was noted over WOBN and WVNJ. (MC-MA)

KGED **CA**, Fresno. 9/29 0500 – Way over KNTS with ad for Huckleberry's, slogan "AM 16-80 the answer" into SRN Town Hall news. Relog.  
KNTS **WA**, Seattle. 10/1 0300 – English/Spanish ID by male announcer, slogan "radio luz, iluminando mente y corazón." Relog.

KKLF **TX**, Richardson. 9/29 0358 – Fair with Spanish coverage of Texas Longhorns college football game vs Iowa State. Over KVNS, which was running English coverage of the same game. The following night heard their usual "banda 13" slogan. Relog.

 CM-- **CUBA** Caribe, Isla Juventud. 10/1 0359 – Cuban anthem //1180 and other Rebelde channels. Consistently audible under Enciclopedia most nights. Relog.
- 540 XESURF **MÉXICO** Tijuana, BCN. 10/2 1056 – ID and Spanish contemporary Christian music. Relog.  
 XETX **MÉXICO** Nuevo Casas Grandes, Chih. 10/1 0401 – ID and usual "la ranchera de Paquimé" slogan. Relog.  
 XEHS **MÉXICO** Los Mochis, Sin. 10/2 1058 – Fighting XETX with usual "la mejor 90.9, aquí nomás" slogan. Relog.  
 XEWA **MÉXICO** San Luis Potosí, SLP. 9/29 0501 – Mexican anthem, "los 40" slogan. New.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 1059 – Mexican anthem. Most likely XEWA.
- 550 CM-- **CUBA** San Juan, Pinar del Río. 9/29 0300 – Fighting through KFYI with Rebelde interval signal //530 and many other channels. New.  
 XEPL **MÉXICO** Ciudad Cuauhtémoc, Chih. 10/1 0140 – This station still runs a bit of German programming as noted tonight. Relog.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/30 0502 – "Mundo de Trabajo" program, "para la educación ciudadana," seemingly produced by the government as it included a reference to a government web site. XEER web site lists a music program at this hour, but it's hard to know how up-to-date some station web pages are. The other remaining stations on 550, XEZK, XEGNAY and possibly XEHL, are all needed here.
- 560 CM-- **CUBA** Ciego de Ávila. 9/29 0402 – Rebelde programming with anthem //530, 600, 1180, etc. New.  
 XEGIK **MÉXICO** Villa Frontera, Coah. 10/2 0504 – Mixing with KBLU and KLZ with the Himno Estatal del Estado de Coahuila. New.  
 UnID **UnID**. 10/2 1100 and 1102 – Heard weak Mexican anthem(s) at these times, not sure if it was the same station or not. Remaining stations in the Central time zone include unneeded XEGIK and XESRD, and needed XEOC and (if they haven't moved to FM) XEMZA.
- 570 CM-- **CUBA** Santa Clara, Villa Clara. 10/1 0400 – Radio Reloj with long series of doorbell tones, 2 sets of 3 (or 4?) ascending notes played over and over again for at least 40 seconds, seemingly almost the full minute of 0400 UT. In the key of F it would be C-F-A, (C?)-F-A-C. Time pips and (usually!) "RR" Morse code signals at the top of each minute (see last year's report regarding the "RR" on Radio Reloj stations not being automated). Relog.  
 XEBJB **MÉXICO** San Nicolás de la Garza, NL. 9/29 0500 – Long high choral version of Mexican anthem. ID at 0500 "XEBJB 570 AM 92.1(?) FM... música regionomontana, una emisora de Grupo Radio Alegría." Noted again 10/2 1102 with what sounded like the same long anthem. Relog.
- 580 XEFI **MÉXICO** Chihuahua, Chih. 10/1 0402 – ID for XHFI-FM and XEFI-AM, "Fiesta Mexicana, una estación de Radiorama" followed by jingle "Radiorama en Chihuahua," same tune as the "Radiorama Mexicali" jingle used by XECL-990 and other affiliated stations. Relog.  
 XEMU **MÉXICO** Piedras Negras, Coah. 9/29 0300 – Fighting through XEFI with time check "diez de la noche en punto, la rancherita del aire." Relog.
- 590 XEBH **MÉXICO** Hermosillo, Son. 10/2 1056 – Under KSUB and KLBJ with usual "la mejor" slogan. Relog.  
 UnID **UnID**. 10/2 0402 – Mexican anthem weak under KSUB. This was Sunday night, so it would be a Central time zone station coming out of the National Hour at 11pm local time. The 4 Central time stations left on 590 are XEPH, XEE, XEGTO and XEFD, any of which would be a new catch.
- 600 CM-- **CUBA** San Germán, Holguín. 10/1 0359 – Cuban anthem //1180 and other Rebelde channels. Relog.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/30 0503 – Instrumental version of Mexican anthem. Possibly needed XEMN?
- 610 CM-- **CUBA** unknown location(s). 10/2 0400 – Cuban anthem //530, 600 and other Rebelde channels. Relog.  
 XEGS **MÉXICO** Guasave, Sin. 9/29 0358 – ID for XEGS-610 and XHGS-106.5, Grupo Chávez Radio. Relog.
- 620 CM-- **CUBA** Colón, Matanzas. 9/30 0402 – Cuban anthem //600 and other Rebelde channels. Relog.  
 XENK **MÉXICO** México, DF. 9/29 0457 – High choral version of Mexican national anthem already in progress. Into instrumental version of "At Last," which is apparently the theme song for the program "Me Nuevo Sin Dolor, Gracias Doctor," which followed. Possibly them again 10/2 1058 with Mexican anthem very weak under KTAR, KEXB and Rebelde. New.
- 630 XEFB **MÉXICO** Monterrey, NL. 9/29 0458 – Instrumental version of Mexican anthem, "la F-B" slogans by male announcer. New.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 0258 – Descending synthesizer tones poking through KSLR. Does anyone recognize this? I can send a recording to anyone who thinks they might be able to recognize it.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 0300 – 6-note doorbell theme (in the key of F it would be C-F-A, A-C-F, with A being the highest note and C the lowest). Similar doorbells heard an hour later the next day on 820.
- 640 CM-- **CUBA** unknown location(s). 9/29 0400 – Progreso program with Cuban anthem //690. The 640 station generally had its usual strong signal this year, whereas the other Progreso frequencies were generally weaker than normal, or conspicuously absent. Relog.  
 XEJUA **MÉXICO** Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 9/29 0300 – Over Radio Progreso with ID "La caliente XEJUA, cinco mil watts...." Relog.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/30 0402 – Seemed to be another Mexican station under XEJUA running ranchera or similar music. XETAM and XENQ are still active on AM, so possibly one of them (both needed).  
 UnID **UnID**. 10/2 0400 – Mexican anthem weak under Radio Progreso. This was Sunday night, so it would be a Central time zone station coming out of the National Hour at 11pm local time. The 2 Central time stations left on 640 are XENQ and XETAM, either of which would be a new catch. XEJUA was conspicuously absent – maybe they ran the National Hour and/or anthem early tonight, as XEJPV did?
- 650 CM-- **CUBA** Ciego de Ávila. 9/29 0400 – Progreso program extremely weak with Cuban anthem //640. New.  
 XETNT **MÉXICO** Los Mochis, Sin. 9/29 0500 – "Los Bonitos Recuerdos... el caballero de la noche... radio 65" followed by full ID for XETNT and XHTNT-FM mentioning Grupo Chávez Radio. Relog.
- 660 XEEY **MÉXICO** Aguascalientes, Agua. 10/1 0300 – Fighting through KTNN with "la caliente 102.9" slogan. Probably them again with Mexican anthem 10/2 1100. New.
- 670 CM-- **CUBA** unknown locations. 9/29 0302 – Two Rebelde stations running the 9-note theme slightly out of synch with each other. The second one is new (I think... see other Cuba tips on this frequency).  
 CM-- **CUBA** unknown locations. 9/30 0359 – There were three Cubans in tonight. One played the anthem at 0359 (this was not //Rebelde or Enciclopedia), another at 0401 (also not //Rebelde or Enciclopedia), and the third at 0402 (//Rebelde-530). There seem to be a variety of stations using the 670 transmitters right now, perhaps in emergency service after the hurricane. I have heard two Rebeldes, a W (dobleve) and a Progreso here, but since I have only heard 3 stations at the same time, I am only counting 3 stations, not 4.  
 CM-- **CUBA** unknown location. 10/2 0359:58 – Cuban anthem, into "El Ritmo de la Noche" program on W (dobleve) network. New, but see note above about "musical chairs" on 670.
- 690 CM-- **CUBA** unknown location(s). 9/29 0400 – Progreso program with Cuban anthem //640. Much weaker than usual this year, perhaps due to recent hurricane? Relog.  
 XEN **MÉXICO** México, DF. 9/29 0300 – Over CBU and KGGF with ID: "Estás escuchando XEN, 690 kHz, cien mil watts, Grupo Radio Centro." New.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 0458 and 0501 – two stations with Mexican national anthems mixing with XEWW, KTSM and KGGF. Most likely unneeded XEN and needed XERG or XEMA. 10/2 1101 – Also noted a Mexican anthem under XEWW.  
 UnID **UnID**. 10/2 0400 – Mexican anthem weak under KGGF. This was Sunday night, so it would be a Central time zone station coming out of the National Hour at 11pm local time. The 3 Central time stations left on 690 are unneeded XEN and needed XERG and XEMA.
- 700 XEDKR **MÉXICO** Guadalajara, Jal. 9/29 0500 – Fast choral version of Mexican anthem, into news, "La Red informate," //XERED-1110. Relog.
- 710 CM-- **CUBA** unknown locations. 9/29 0302 – Three Rebelde stations running the 9-note theme slightly out of synch with each other. The third one is new.  
 CM-- **CUBA** La Palma, Pinar del Río. 9/29 0259 – Guamá with series of 3 and 4 ascending tones //990. Relog.  
 XEDP **MÉXICO** Ciudad Cuauhtémoc, Chih. 9/29 0359 – Fighting through KGNC and Rebelde with ID mentioning 5kW. Very strong at times. Still "la ranchera de Cuauhtémoc." This station runs a VERY long national anthem each morning. Relog.  
 UnID **UnID**. 10/2 1105 – Mexican anthem weak under XEDP, whose 4 ½ minute anthem had just finished. Probably XEMP which has been heard here before. The other surviving stations on 710 are XEMAR (Radio Disney) and XERPO, both of which seem a lot less likely.
- 720 XEJCC **MÉXICO** Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 9/30 1203 – "Grupo ACIR, fonógrafo 7-20." Relog.  
 UnID **UnID**. 10/2 1100 – Very weak Mexican anthem. Seems an hour too early for XEJCC. Probably unneeded XEDE. The other 2 remaining stations in the Central time zone (XEKN, XEZX) seem a lot less likely.
- 730 CM-- **CUBA** La Fe, Isla Juventud. 9/30 0400 – Progreso program with Cuban anthem //640. Relog.  
 XEHB **MÉXICO** Hidalgo del Parral, Chih. 10/1 1235 – "XEHB Estéreo Fiesta." Relog.  
 XEX **MÉXICO** México, DF. 9/29 0403 – "Estás escuchando W Deportes" followed by usual Mexican government PSAs. New.  
 XESOS **MÉXICO** Agua Prieta, Son. 9/29 0457 – "La ranchera 97.3." Usually on top of channel. Relog.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 1059 – Mexican anthem, very weak. Probably XEX which has become a common catch here and at home after not being heard at home for many years.

- 740 UnID **UnID.** 9/29 0258 – Mexican Army/Air Force PSA, ID at 0300 sounded like "XEEH..." I can almost convince myself it's XEVAY (the Y being pronounced as "yeh" as opposed to "igriega", so that the "eh ache" I think I'm hearing would be "veh ah yeh"), but it's too unclear to be sure.  
UnID **UnID.** 9/29 1059 – High choral version of Mexican anthem. Probably unneeded XEQN, but heard bits of romantic music afterward so it might be needed XEVAY.
- 750 YVKS **VENEZUELA** Caracas. 9/29 0400 – Announcement by male announcer "en Caracas," then into long elaborate arrangement of the Venezuelan anthem, with an orchestra and chorus starting with female and male soloists. New.
- 760 XEABC **MÉXICO** México, DF. 9/29 0300 – News and mention of web site oem.com (parent company of ABC Radio). 10/2 1100 – ID mentioned "desde el corazón de la capital de la república, ABC Radio" and another OEM promo. Relog.  
XENY **MÉXICO** Nogales, Son. 10/2 1106 – ID under XEABC. Relog.  
UnID **UnID.** 9/29 0459 – Mexican anthem after ranchera/norteña music. Possible mention of "zeta." Maybe needed XEZZ?
- 770 HJJX **COLOMBIA** Bogotá. Struggling at first through KKOB's noisy bumper music, but faded up nicely at 0403 at the end of a spot for Banco Popular, followed by a nice clear "RCN Radio." New.  
CM-- **CUBA** Las Tunas-Victoria. 10/1 0359 – Cuban anthem //1180 and other Rebelde channels. Very faint under KKOB. New.  
CM-- **CUBA** La Salud. 9/29 0359 – Radio Artemisa with theme music, Cuban anthem //1020. New.  
UnID **UnID.** 10/2 1058 – High choral version of Mexican anthem, extremely weak under KKOB. Too early for XEREV. Probably unneeded XEACH. The other remaining stations in the Central time zone (XEML, XEANT) seem less likely.
- 790 CM-- **CUBA** unknown location(s). 10/1 0400 – Radio Reloj with long series of mostly *descending* doorbell tones possibly //950 but not the same tones as //570. The doorbells I heard on several Reloj channels were almost constant for the full minute of 0400 UT, not like the doorbells heard between news stories on YVRQ and other South American stations. I've never noticed this before, but it really seemed to be coming from the Reloj stations. Relog.  
UnID **UnID.** 9/29 1059 – Grupo Fórmula programming and Mexican anthem. Almost certainly XENT-BCS which has been getting out really well lately (Radio Fórmula affiliates in the Pacific and Mountain time zones generally pick up the anthem from the national feed at 6am and Midnight Central time. Some add an additional anthem at 6am and Midnight in their local time zone).
- 800 XEROK **MÉXICO** Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 9/29 0258 – Female DJ with request program. Big signal but other stations occasionally poke through, as tiny KDDD did last year. Relog.
- 810 PJB **NETHERLANDS ANTILLES** Bonaire. 9/29 0300 – "Radio Transmundial, isla de Bonaire." Relog.  
HJCY **COLOMBIA** Bogotá. 9/29 0259 – Ad for event taking place at an auditorium in Bogotá, followed by government PSA. Fighting KXOI, both stations way over KGO. Relog.
- XERSV **MÉXICO** Ciudad Obregón, Son. 10/1 0138 – Faded up with local announcer and time check. Usually signs off around 0200. Relog.  
UnID **UnID.** 10/2 1059 – Extremely weak Mexican anthem in progress, under KXOI. There are about 5 possibilities, all of which are needed here.
- 820 CM-- **CUBA** Ciego de Ávila. 10/1 0359 – Radio Reloj with usual time pips and "RR" signals. Almost couldn't hear the crazy doorbell tones through WBAP. Relog.  
CM-- **CUBA** Arroyo Arenas, Ciudad de la Habana. 9/29 0400 – Mixing with Radio Reloj with short piano theme and Cuban anthem. Heard every night of this year's DXpedition. Must be Radio Ciudad Habana. Relog.
- XEABCA **MÉXICO** Mexicali, BCN. 9/29 0501 – "Canal 820 AM, ABC Radio." Relog.  
UnID **UnID.** 10/1 0400 – 6-note doorbell theme (in the key of F it would be C-F-A, A-C-F, with A being the highest note and C the lowest). Similar doorbells heard the previous day on 630. This was on the EESE (Cuba/Venezuela) wire, and a Cuban anthem was heard about a minute later.
- 830 XEITE **MÉXICO** México, DF. 10/2 1111 – "Capital" slogan and time check "las 6:11." Usually audible alongside XELN, and seems to air the anthem right around the same times as XELN. New.  
XELN **MÉXICO** Linares, NL. 9/29 1101 – Mexican anthem, slogan "105.7 la caliente." New.  
UnID **UnID.** 10/1 0400 – Faint station airing what appeared to be news about Cuba. Maybe needed Radio Revolución, but couldn't pull up a // on 840, and no anthem was noted.  
UnID **UnID.** 10/2 1059 and 1100 – Two Mexican anthems starting about 7 seconds apart. Most likely unneeded XEITE and XELN.
- 840 HJJK **COLOMBIA** Neiva. 9/29 0300 – Way over KXNT with ID "H-J-doble-K, 840 AM, Sistema INRAI AM" into Colombian national anthem. New.  
UnID **UnID.** 9/29 1215 – Male announcer saying "atención cadena" and giving a UTC-6 time check every minute. On top of unidentified Spanish religious station which might have been needed KVJY. This was on the SESE (Colombian) wire which would cover much of Mexico and Central America.
- 850 HJJC **COLOMBIA** Bogotá. 9/29 0300 – "Escucha Candela" followed by ID "Esta es Candela 850 AM, otra emisora Radiópolis." Listened to their webstream later, and found that they sometimes substitute the name of the current show or host in place of "Candela" in that ID. New.
- 860 CM-- **CUBA** unknown location(s). 9/29 0402 – Radio Reloj weak with usual time tones and news. Relog.  
XEZOL **MÉXICO** Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 10/2 1114 – Local newscast for El Paso area. Relog.  
UnID **UnID.** 10/2 0400 – Mexican anthem weak under KTRB. This was Sunday night, so it would be a Central time zone station coming out of the National Hour at 11pm local time. The 3 remaining possibilities on 860 are XEUN, XENL and XECTL, any of which would be a new catch here. Or did XEZOL run the National Hour and/or anthem early?
- 870 CM-- **CUBA** unknown location(s). 10/1 0400 – Radio Reloj with long series of doorbell tones //570. Relog.  
UnID **UnID.** 9/29 0302 – Station on SESE (Colombian) wire, sounded like either "la zeta" or "planeta." Can't find any matches.
- 880 XEAAA **MÉXICO** Zapopan, Jal. 9/29 1059 – Mexican anthem under KWIP. The only Mexican left on 880 is XEAAA, which gets out well and has been logged here and at home. Relog.
- 900 CM-- **CUBA** San Germán, Holguín. 9/29 0400 – Progreso program with Cuban anthem //640. Much weaker than usual this year. Relog.  
XEW **MÉXICO** México, DF. 10/2 1102 – 4 descending tones, "noticias W Radio." Relog.  
XEOK **MÉXICO** Monterrey, NL. 9/29 1100 – Female announcer, "la O-K 900 AM." Relog.  
YVMD **VENEZUELA** Maracaibo. 10/1 0359 – Venezuelan anthem, male announcer. New.  
UnID **UnID.** 10/2 1100 – 3 tones or chords, medium-low-high. XEW was noted with different tones just over a minute later.
- 910 CM-- **CUBA** Villa María, Ciudad de la Habana. 9/30 0358 – Cuban anthem in progress, ID "Radio Metropolitana, la radio de la casa" into program of odd choral chanting. Relog.  
YVRQ **VENEZUELA** Caracas. 10/1 0400 – Venezuelan anthem, followed by news with doorbell sounds between stories. New, country #11.
- 920 UnID **UnID.** 10/1 0402 – Brief orchestral music, then a 5(?) note theme (some fading) sounding roughly like "O Come All Ye Faithful." (In the key of C it would be C-G-C-D-G with D being the highest note and G the lowest). This was on the EESE (Cuba/Venezuela) wire at a time when the Venezuelans were in.
- 930 CM-- **CUBA** unknown location(s). 9/29 0401 – Radio Reloj weak with usual time tones and news. Relog.  
XETLA **MÉXICO** Tlaxiaco, Oax. 10/2 1101 – Mixing with KAFF, KAPR and KIUP. Mexican anthem sung by children in a native language, accompanied by a school band. XETLA is the only Mexican station left on 930, but I listened to their webstream several days later to confirm they run this very unique version of the anthem. 5kW daytimer. New and probably the first time I've heard Oaxaca from anywhere.
- 940 XEQ **MÉXICO** México, DF. 9/29 0458 – End of Mexican national hour, "la ke buena 940 AM, XEQ, 50kW" into Mexican anthem. Relog.
- 950 CM-- **CUBA** unknown location(s). 9/29 0400 – Radio Reloj weak with usual time tones and news, but also the full minute of doorbells (see 570 and 790). Relog.  
UnID **UnID.** 9/29 0300 – On SESE (Colombian) wire I had three ascending tones followed by 5 slightly higher ascending tones. Soon lost to KNFT and XEKAM.
- 960 UnID **UnID.** 9/29 0302 – On SESE (Colombian) wire I had 9 doorbell tones (high-medium-low, high-medium-low, medium-low-high).
- 970 XEJ **MÉXICO** Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 9/29 0457 – ID, still says 1kW, "Radio México Noticias." Relog.  
UnID **UnID.** 10/2 1059 – Two stations, the first very weak with a Mexican anthem. Several possibilities still exist for this one. The other was talking about 92.1 Red FM, La Red, Radio Red, which would probably lead to XEJ (Grupo Radio México/Radio Centro).
- 980 CMCK **CUBA** El Sapo, Ciudad de la Habana. 9/29 0400 – Cuban anthem noted nightly, female announcer. Must be CMCK "Radio Coco." New.  
XEFQ **MÉXICO** Cananea, Son. 9/29 0504 – Spanish coverage of Astros/Reds baseball game, "la F-Q." Relog.  
UnID **UnID.** 9/29 0459 – "Su estación favorita... Estás escuchando la máxima frecuencia(?)," time pips on the hour (5 short, one long). XEFQ was noted about 5 minutes later, so possibly them.

- 990 CM-- **CUBA** Pinar del Río. 9/29 0259 – "La hora en Radio Guamá" followed by 3 and 4 ascending tones //710. Relog.  
 XECL **MÉXICO** Mexicali, BCN. 10/2 1101 – Fighting KSPV with usual "rocola 9-90" slogan. Not as big a pest this year. Relog.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 0401 – Doorbell signal – not the series of 3 and 4 ascending tones I have heard on Radio Guamá (which had already run its anthem at 0359 tonight), but a slightly longer theme (I could hear 10 notes) where the notes went down, up, and down again.
- 1000 CM-- **CUBA** Media Luna, Granma. 9/29 0359 – Radio Granma mixing with KKIM and XEFV with Cuban anthem, and Granma chimes at 0401:17. New.  
 XEFV **MÉXICO** Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 9/29 0403 – Contest promo on "la madre de todos, la rancherita." Relog.  
 XEOY **MÉXICO** México, DF. 9/29 0300 – Promo "mañana a las 8, hora de México, en Mil AM."  
 XENLT **MÉXICO** Nuevo Laredo, Tama. 10/1 0400 – Radio Fórmula 1<sup>st</sup> network with Estilo de Vida program ("I Dream of Jeannie" theme, etc.). Relog.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 0459 – High choral version of Mexican anthem. Probably unneeded XEOY.
- 1010 XEHL **MÉXICO** Guadalajara, Jal. 9/29 1059 – Mexican anthem, W Deportes programming. New.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 0500 – Slow low choral version of Mexican anthem mixing with KXXT.  
 UnID **UnID**. 10/2 1102 and 1105 – Fast choral version of Mexican anthem very weak under XEHL, KTNZ and CBR. Possibilities in Central time zone include XELO, XEHGO and XEPA plus XEKD if they haven't moved to FM.
- 1020 CM-- **CUBA** Bahía Honda, Artemisa. 10/1 0359 – Radio Artemisa with theme music, sign-off announcement by female announcer, Cuban anthem //770. New.  
 CM-- **CUBA** Santa Lucía, Pinar del Río. 9/30 0400 – Radio Guamá with Cuban anthem //710, 990. Listed 1kW. New.  
 CM-- **CUBA** Las Tunas. 9/29 0402 – Radio Reloj weak but audible here some nights with usual time pips and news. New.
- 1030 XEYJ **MÉXICO** Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 9/29 1100 – Mexican anthem, Radio Fórmula programming. Relog.  
 1040 HJCJ **COLOMBIA** Bogotá. 9/29 0258 – Promo for sports report with Carlos Orduz (Colmundo sports director) "lunes a Viernes de las 5 a las 6 de la tarde... Colmundo, la radio que te acerca." Gave e-mail address for complaints/concerns denuncia@colmundoradio.com.co. "...por una Colombia mas segura." New.
- CM-- **CUBA** Güines, Mayabeque. 10/1 0400 – Sign-off announcement "Radio Mayabeque... mañana a las 6... Radio Mayabeque 10-40 AM" followed by 5 note descending/ascending musical theme. New.  
 XESAG **MÉXICO** Salamanca, Gto. 10/2 1100 – Mexican anthem, "Radio Lobo" slogans. Relog.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 1101, 10/1 1100 – Mexican anthem, very weak. Based on antenna direction this was probably XESAG, logged last year. 10/2 1102 – Traces of a second anthem under XESAG.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 0458 and 0501 – Two stations with Mexican anthems. Possibly unneeded XESAG and XEBBB but there is also a station in Estado de México which still appears to be active on AM. I'm pretty sure XEHES and XEGYS have left AM but I'm still trying to confirm.
- 1050 XED **MÉXICO** Mexicali, BCN. 9/29 0501 – Fast choral version of Mexican anthem, "XED, la gran D 10-50 AM." Relog.  
 XEBCS **MÉXICO** La Paz, BCS. 10/2 1102 – "La radio de Surcalifornia." Mentioned 99.1 FM. Relog.  
 XEG **MÉXICO** Monterrey, NL. 9/29 0457 – "La ranchera de Monterrey," Mexican government PSAs, US oldies, Mexican anthem. Relog.  
 UnID **UnID**. 10/2 0359 and 0400 – Had 2 Mexican anthems here under KTBL. This was Sunday night, so it would be a Central time zone station coming out of the National Hour at 11pm local time. Unless XEBCS or XED ran the anthem early, this would seem to point to XEG and XEQOO, the latter of which is not confirmed to still be active on AM. Methinks somebody ran the anthem extra early tonight.
- 1060 CM-- **CUBA** Jovellanos, Matanzas, Radio 26. 10/1 0400 – Attention signal (three descending tones) followed by Cuban anthem. New.  
 XEEP **MÉXICO** México, DF. 9/29 0501 – Mexican national anthem and classical music. Relog.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 0500 – I seem to have just a few seconds of the Mexican national anthem here, almost a full minute before XEEP ran their anthem. If so, it would be needed XERDO, which is the only other station currently operating on 1060 kHz in Mexico. 10/2 1100 – Possibly them under KDUS with Mexican anthem and what sounded like ranchera music.
- 1070 XESP **MÉXICO** Guadalajara, Jal. 9/29 0302 – News and/or political speech, "noticias 10-70" slogan. Probably them with Mexican anthem 10/1 1100 and 10/2 1102. Relog.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 0458 – I have what seems to be some kind of anthem here, but it does not match the anthem of any GMT-5 country likely to be heard on this antenna, or the state anthems of the two Mexican states that still have stations active on 1070 (Jalisco and Campeche).  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 0504 – Rock music, 5-note theme (in the key of C it would be G-C-E-F-E, with G being the lowest note and F the highest) straight into Mexican anthem. Probably unneeded XESP. The only other Mexican remaining on 1070 is in Campeche which seems unlikely on the ESSE wire.
- 1080 CM-- **CUBA** Villa María, Ciudad de la Habana. 10/1 0400 – Radio Cadena Habana with 4 tone attention signal (in the key of F it would be low C – high C long – A – F), 5 note jingle (since the "H" in "Habana" is silent, and therefore "Cadena" ends with the same vowel sound that "Habana" starts with, the name is pronounced "Cadenabana," 5 syllables), followed by the Cuban anthem. Listed 5kW. New.  
 XETUL **MÉXICO** Tultitlán, Mex. 9/29 0458 – Mexican anthem followed by the Himno Estatal del Estado de México. 10/2 1100 – Probably them again under KRLD and KSCO with anthem. New.
- 1090 UnID **UnID**. 9/30 0400 – Venezuelan anthem faded up, already in progress. Very weak. Almost certainly YVSZ Caracas (coastal location) but I can't rule out the other station. Whatever this was, it was new!  
 UnID **UnID**. 10/2 1059 – Mexican anthem extremely weak under XEPRS. Possibilities include XEHR, XEWL, and XEMCA. Another UnID rose up at 1108 and seemed to be calling itself "Amistad 10-90 AM."
- 1100 XETGO **MÉXICO** Tlaltenango, Zac. 9/29 0501 – Mixing with KDREY and KFNN. Mexican anthem, followed by ID. Tough to make out the call letters, but the studio phone numbers cinched it. There appear to be only 2 Mexican stations remaining on 1100, the other one being XEGRM in Guerrero. On XETGO's web stream I hear the slogan "Radio Cañon" with cannon bursts between songs. New.
- 1110 XEWR **MÉXICO** Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 10/2 1103 – Slow choral version of Mexican anthem, finally gave slogan ID at 1107 "Cristo Rey Radio 11-10 AM." Relog.  
 XERED **MÉXICO** México, DF. 9/29 0501 – Mixing with KFAB. Mexican anthem, "Radio Red... formato. Transmitimos desde... en la Ciudad de México, 1110 kHz, mas noticias del Radio Red" followed by "Radio Centro" jingle and additional IDs. New.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 0400 – Mexican anthem, very weak, noted each night. Possibly XEWR.
- 1130 XEYZ **MÉXICO** Aguascalientes, Aqua. 9/29 0503 – Weak with Mexican anthem, then faded up for ID: "escucha 107.7... XEYZ, la poderosa, la mas famosa." XEYZ and XEHN are the only two Mexican stations remaining on 1130. XEYZ was probably also the station I heard under KWKH and CKWX running the Mexican anthem at 0400 on 10/2 (Sunday night after the National Hour). New.  
 XEHN **MÉXICO** Nogales, Son. 10/2 1059 – "Toño, nunca sabes lo que va a poner." (Similar to "Jack FM" AC variety format in the US). Relog.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/30 0401 – Operatic duet, male announcer "lunes a Viernes... Venezuela... música de..." into choral version of Venezuelan anthem. Most likely YVRL Radio Ideal (coastal location) but I can't rule out the other one. Whatever this was, it was new!
- 1140 CM-- **CUBA** unknown location(s). 10/1 0359 – Cuban anthem // other Rebelde outlets. Relog.  
 CM-- **CUBA** unknown location. 10/1 0401 – Agramonte chimes (preceded by 4 ascending tones, not sure if that was another station) and Cuban anthem. Surprised to find them on this frequency. This channel, like 670, seems to be playing musical chairs lately. I'm only counting a total of 2 stations since I have only heard 2 simultaneously. New.  
 XEMR **MÉXICO** Monterrey, NL. 9/29 0500 – Male announcer "...mananial, Nuevo Leon... las 12 en punto" followed by long Mexican anthem. 10/2 1101 – Also noted with Mexican anthem and ID mentioning 50kW. Relog.
- 1150 XEAD **MÉXICO** Guadalajara, Jal. 9/29 0458 – Mixing with KAGO and KHRO. Promo for Mexican national hour (history of the national anthem) "aquí en Radio Metrópoli... Sincronice tu reloj, las 12 en punto... news, features, sports (Deportiva NotiSistema), choral Mexican anthem at 0505. Relog.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 1059 – Mexican anthem, pips, then I heard two stations, one with a male announcer and one with a female announcer, both reading news. This might just be KNRV picking up the anthem from the Radio Fórmula feed, but it could also be XEAD.
- 1160 -- **ANTIGUA** St Johns. 9/29 0401 – Caribbean Radio Lighthouse putting a good dent in KSL with sacred music program. E-mail verification already received for the recording I sent them by e-mail. I was surprised to find them on the air, given the total destruction on nearby Barbuda, but Antigua escaped the hurricane with relatively minor damage and the station was only off the air for a few hours the day the storm hit. New, country #12.
- HJOC **COLOMBIA** Bogotá. 9/29 0300 – "Fuego AM" ID repeated twice under KSL. New.  
 HJNW **COLOMBIA** Cartagena. 9/30 0401 – "Caracol Radio 11-70 AM." Relog.  
 XECD **MÉXICO** Puebla, Pueb. 10/2 1059 – Mexican anthem, ID mentioning address in Colonia La Paz, Puebla, into Mexican government PSAs. New.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 0458 – Jingle sounded like "Radio raro, la cosa final," which makes no sense. This was on the ESSE (Mexican) wire.
- 1180 CM-- **CUBA** unknown locations. 9/29 0258 – Radio Rebelde with at least 4 distinct signals with Cuba news. At least 3 distinct stations still discernible at 0500, with time pips about 20 seconds late. Relog.  
 UnID **UnID**. 9/29 0300 – Way under multiple Rebelde stations on SESE (Colombian) wire, a woman giving a web site address (sounded like ya... tro.com, not much help) and possible newscast.

1190 XEPZ **MÉXICO** Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 9/29 0459 – "Desde Grupo Radio México, Radio Centro 11-90." Mixing with XECT and with KNUV (which airs the Radio Fórmula primera cadena feed, including the Mexican anthem at 0505). Relog.  
 XECT **MÉXICO** Monterrey, NL. 9/29 0501 – Mixing with XEPZ and KNUV. Mexican anthem, "contacto 11-90... Nuevo León." Relog.  
 UnID **UnID** 9/30 0402 – Tropical music, male announcer, then female announcer "la música que..., 11-90." Didn't sound Mexican. This was on the EESE (Cuba/Venezuela) wire which also picked up a few Colombians.

1200 CM-- **CUBA** Yaguajay, Sancti-Spiritus. 10/1 0358 – Female announcer "te invitamos a sintonizar lunes a viernes..." followed by some odd time pips (long pips at 0359:19 and short pips at 0400:06, maybe other stations?) and Cuban anthem at 0400:33. Couldn't find a // on 1190 or 1210 because the dominant stations on each of these channels were playing loud bumper music. New.  
 YVOZ **VENEZUELA** Caracas. 9/29 0403 – Venezuelan anthem, faded up nicely by 0406. I had heard what sounded like a clock striking around 0401 (and again a few minutes later), and a series of chimes around 0402 (about 12 notes) but this may have been a different station. New.  
 UnID **UnID** 9/29 0458 – Mexican anthem very weak under WOAI. There are only 2 Mexican stations left on 1200, XEQY and XEQJAL. I'm inclined to think this was probably XEQY because I heard some ranchera-style music (singer screaming "ja ja ja...") about 0504, and XEQJAL is supposed to sign off at 0500. XEQY is "la bestia grupera" but the "grupera" music format includes just about everything. It might be XEQJAL inasmuch as they are scheduled to run "Música Mexicana" from 0430 to 0500. Unfortunately XEQJAL's web stream hasn't worked once in the two months I've been trying to listen to it, but the station has confirmed to me via Facebook message that the 1200 AM is still active.  
 UnID **UnID** 10/1 1100 and 10/2 1100 – Long low choral version of Mexican anthem very weak under WOAI.

1210 UnID **UnID** 9/29 0258 – On SESE (Colombian) wire, I had ballad music, featuring flutes like one might hear in Ecuador.  
 UnID **UnID** 9/29 0501 – Male announcer reading news in Spanish. Mentioned "el interior del país" and possibly "Sinaloa," implying a Mexican. There are only two Mexicans left on 1210, XECOPA (a daytime) and XEPUE. XEPUE would be very likely for this antenna, but I heard no anthem and XEPUE is not scheduled to run news at this hour according to their web site. I may have to listen to their webstream at midnight to see if they run news at the top of the hour before starting the "Velada Mexicana" program.

1220 XEB **MÉXICO** México, DF. 9/29 0457 – End of "Noche de Estrellas" program, chimes, Mexican anthem, ID "Sintoniza XEB la B grande, cien mil watts, 1220 AM 94.5 FM HD2." Relog.  
 UnID **UnID** 9/29 0503 – Music way under XEB. Male announcer may have said "la zeta." It almost sounded like he said "la radio Caribe," but this was on the EESE (Mexican) wire, not the EESE (Cuban) wire.

1240 XEWG **MÉXICO** Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 9/29 0506 – "...12-40, Grupo Siete Comunicaciones, la mas prendida 12-40." La mas prendida is their secondary slogan, the primary one being Bengala. Relog.

1260 UnID **UnID** 9/29 0500 – Mexican anthem followed by the song "Mexicana hasta el tope," a lament of the migrant worker, which I notice many Mexican DJs play as the last song of their shift. Need to check webstreams to see if there is one (and only one) station that consistently plays this song after the anthem. XEL has been logged here in the past.  
 UnID **UnID** 10/1 0401 – "Los 40" (not the Mexican format, but an actual program with this name, which the announcer identified as "Edición 497"), "la mejor música de toda Latinoamérica." This was on the EESE (Cuba/Venezuela) wire which also picked up a few Colombians.  
 UnID **UnID** 9/29 0301 – On SESE (Colombian) wire. Slogan sounded like "la canesa" which doesn't make sense. At first I thought "la planeta."  
 UnID **UnID** 10/2 1059 – High choral version of Mexican anthem. At 1101 a child (who sounded like he had inhaled helium) read a promotion seeking advertisers ("anúnciase en..."). Might be able to ID this if I can get up early and listen to several webstreams.

1270 XEGL **MÉXICO** Navjoa, Son. 9/29 0505 – Promotional announcement mentioned the website of the La Verdad newspaper, which apparently is part of the same company as the radio station. Relog.  
 UnID **UnID** 9/29 0501 – Mexican anthem. Although XEGL was logged a few minutes later, they would not normally play the anthem at this hour. There are between 3 and 6 Mexican stations remaining on 1270, of which 2 (XEAZ, XEGL) are not in the right time zone to play the anthem at this hour. This is almost certainly XERPL, which is right on the main beam of this antenna and believed to be still active on AM. The other 3 (XEWN, XEQH, XEVHT) are believed to have finished moving to FM but I have not fully confirmed this yet.  
 UnID **UnID** 10/2 1104 – Under KINN, KVGH, KBZZ with roosters crowing, male DJ.

1280 XEAW **MÉXICO** Monterrey, NL. 9/29 0502 – "Desde Monterrey, Nuevo León, México, A-W" followed by automated time and temperature. Still uses "inolvidable" slogan. 10/1 1100 – Must have been them with Mexican anthem and garbled ID mentioning 10kW. Relog.  
 XEEG **MÉXICO** Puebla, Pueb. 9/29 0500 – Roughly even with XEAW, "buenas noches te desea ABC Radio" into Mexican anthem. New.

1300 XEP **MÉXICO** Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 9/29 0402 – ID and mention of 40kW power. Relog.

1310 XEAM **MÉXICO** Matamoros, Tama. 9/29 0258 – Mixing with presumed KALL and KTCK with Tamaulipas newscast. New.

1350 XEQK **MÉXICO** México, DF. 9/29 0500 – Mexican anthem, faded up nicely for ID by woman: "XEKQ 1350 kHz, 24 horas al día, Ciudad de México... IMER... [www.imer.mx](http://www.imer.mx)" followed by tropical music. New.  
 UnID **UnID** 10/2 1101 – Very weak with high choral version of Mexican anthem. ID garbled. Heard some "native" violin music a few minutes later so possibly unneeded XECTZ.  
 UnID **UnID** 9/29 0253 – Fast male vocal version of Mexican anthem. Perhaps a promo for the National Hour's upcoming segment on the history of the national anthem?

1370 UnIDs **UnIDs** 9/29 0458 – Two stations, the first with Radio Fórmula programming and Estilo de Vida program with "I Dream of Jeannie" theme (probably XEMON but possibly XEHN, both logged here before). The second had a Mexican anthem at 0458 and was most likely unneeded XEMON or XEGNK. Other possibilities exist, but these are the most likely stations for the EESE wire.  
 UnID **UnID** 9/29 1059 and 10/2 1059 – Mexican anthem, weak. XEMON seems most likely at this hour, but the time and temperature given on the 10/2 reception did not seem to be coming from ORF2 flagship XEDF. Maybe unneeded XEGNK?

1380 XECO **MÉXICO** México, DF. 10/2 1059 – Faded up underneath KHEY and KLPZ during ID. Gave phone# and "Romántica 13-80" slogan. Also mentions "Radiorama, la cadena que une a México." This might be the only Mexican station left on 1380 (I'm still trying to confirm that XEVD and XEGW have finished moving to FM). New.  
 YVNG **VENEZUELA** Puerto Cabello. 9/30 0402 – Ondas Del Mar with Venezuelan anthem. New.

1410 XEBS **MÉXICO** México, DF. 9/29 0500 Fast choral version of Mexican anthem, "bandolera 14-10, XEBS, 1410 kHz, 25kW." Relog.  
 UnID **UnID** 10/2 1101 – Mexican anthem very weak after XEBS had finished their anthem. Maybe unneeded XEKB?

1420 XEF **MÉXICO** Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 9/29 0501 – "XEF, la 14-20... activa 14-20..." followed by Mexican government PSAs. Relog.

1430 XEOX **MÉXICO** Ciudad Obregón, Son. 9/29 0500 – "Exa FM, yo creo en la radio, ponte Exa FM, followed by Mexican government PSAs and one more "Ponte EXA FM 106.5" slogan. ID noted later for XEOX and XHOX FM. Relog.  
 UnID **UnID** 9/30 0400 – Child singing "la programa que se llama 'Cerca de ti.'" Adult announcer spoke about a daily newscast or newspaper with commentary, etc. Followed by Mexican Army/Air Force PSA. Possibly unneeded XEWD, but I don't see a program with this name listed on any of the 3 or 4 surviving stations on 1430.

1440 UnID **UnID** 10/2 0359 – Mexican anthem weak under KRDX and KMAJ. This was Sunday night, so it would be a Central time zone station coming out of the National Hour at 11pm local time. The only 2 Mexican stations left on 1440 are XEEST (see note on UnID-1560 below) and XEABCJ, both still needed from here.

1460 XECB **MÉXICO** San Luis Rio Colorado, Son. 10/2 1101 – "XECB, Radio Ranchito 14-60 AM... watts... Radio Ranchito, la estación mas popular."  
 1470 XERCN **MÉXICO** Tijuana, BCN. 9/29 0505 – "RCN 14-70, Grupo Uniradio." Not nearly as big a pest this year. Really odd conditions this year, not just auroral, but many California and Mexican pests were knocked down quite a bit. Relog.  
 UnID **UnID** 10/2 1058 – Very weak with high choral version of Mexican anthem. Too early for XERCN. 4 or 5 stations are possible.

1480 XETKR **MÉXICO** Monterrey, NL. 9/29 0501 – Mexican anthem, "T-K-R 14-80 AM, diez mil watts de potencia..." Still uses "la mas fuerte" as a secondary slogan. Probably also them running the anthem 10/2 0359 after the National Hour. Relog.  
 UnID **UnID** 9/29 1100, 10/1 1059, 10/2 1102 – Mexican anthem, then seemingly into ranchera music. Probably unneeded XETKR.

1490 XECJC **MÉXICO** Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 9/29 0302 – Faded up for news, still using slogan "información total." Relog.

1500 XEDF **MÉXICO** México, DF. 9/29 0457 – Over KSTP and KSJX with Mexican government PSAs, ID "XEDF, cincuenta mil watts, Avenida Universidad 1273, Colonia Del Valles, Ciudad de México... Grupo Fórmula, abriendo la conversación." 10/1 0400 – Radio Fórmula programming, "Estilo de Vida" program with familiar "I Dream of Jeannie" theme song (they obviously lifted this recording right off the television program, as it even contains the "whoosh" sound where Jeannie is entering or exiting her bottle in a puff of smoke). This program airs on both ORF1 and ORF2 networks. Relog.

YVRZ **VENEZUELA** Cumaná. 9/29 0301 – Man reading news about Cuba and Venezuela, mentioned "Radio Dos Mil." 10/1 0400 – Faded up over XEDF with Venezuelan anthem. Used to be a common catch at home 25 or 30 years ago. New.



- 1510 XEQI **MÉXICO** Escobedo, NL. 9/29 0500 – Fighting through KGA with "Radio Nuevo León" followed by Mexican anthem. Relog.
- 1520 XEEH **MÉXICO** San Luis Rio Colorado, Son. 9/29 0500 – ID "XEEH 15-20 AM, mil watts de potencia, la primera." New.
- 1530 XEUR **MÉXICO** México, DF. 10/1 0401 – Full ID by man: "XEQR, frecuencia 1530 kHz, potencia 50kW, éxtasis digital 15-30 AM, la radio que tu quiere." Relog.
- XESD **MÉXICO** Silao, Gto. 9/29 0504 – Poking through XEQR (which had run its anthem at 0457) with Mexican anthem. XEUR and XESD are the only Mexican stations on 1530. New.
- 1550 CM-- **CUBA** unknown locations. 9/29 0300 – At least 2 distinct stations, possibly 3, heard over KXEX with 9-note Rebelde interval signal, slightly out of synch with each other, //530 et al. The second station is a new catch for me.
- CM-- **CUBA** unknown location. 9/30 0400 – Cuban anthem //other Progreso stations (640 et. al). Relog.
- 1560 XEJPV **MÉXICO** Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 9/29 1101 – Mexican anthem, mention of Grupo Mega Radio, but instead of going into their new W Deportes sports format, they started relaying XHLS-99.5 FM Guadalajara "Romance FM." They seem to do this quite a bit at night since the recent half-hearted format change to sports. A few minutes later they played the "I Dream of Jeannie" theme, which is somewhat confusing as this is heard twice a night on the Radio Fórmula network as the theme song of their "Estilo de Vida" program. XEJPV is not a Radio Fórmula affiliate; they just played the song for some reason, adding to the confusion. In another confusing move, I noticed this station (and seemingly several other Ciudad Juárez stations) running the National Hour at 0300 UT (as stations in the Central time zone would do) instead of 0400 UT as would be expected for Mountain Daylight Time. Relog.
- UnID **UnID** 9/29 0502 – Mexican anthem very weak under XEJPV. This was probably XEMAS Salamanca. I originally thought it might be XEINFO México City, which apparently recently returned to the air in September after 9 years of silence, having been bought(?) by Grupo 7 who have moved their "Quiéreme" format (which is a contemporary Christian/religious format, not a romántica format as the name and logo seem to imply) to XEINFO-1560 from XEEST-1440... but a recheck of XEINFO's web site in October shows that they have changed all the "1560's back to "1440" again, so I'm not sure what's going on there. Other possibilities are XELAC and XECHZ, both of which have been known to get out well in the past.
- UnID **UnID** 9/29 1102 – Mexican anthem very weak under XEJPV, which had run its anthem a minute and a half earlier.
- 1570 XERF **MÉXICO** Ciudad Acaña, Coah. 9/29 0502 – Loud with AM/FM ID by male and female announcers and into very long Mexican anthem (at least 4 minutes long, still going when my recording stopped). I believe they still run the Himno Estatal de Coahuila after the national anthem. Relog.
- 1590 XEVOZ **MÉXICO** México, DF. 9/29 0458 – Mexican anthem fighting through KVGB, KELP and KLIV. XEVOZ is the only Mexican station left on 1590. Relog.
- 1600 XEMEX **MÉXICO** Metepec, Mex. 10/2 0359 – Weak national anthem on Sunday night, presumably after the National Hour. XEMEX is the only Mexican left on 1600. New.
- 1620 CM-- **CUBA** unknown locations. 9/29 0401 – Listening to multiple Rebelde outlets, I was able to isolate a section of the recording (female announcer saying "buenos días" with some space around and between both words) where I can clearly hear at least 3 stations ("b-b-buenos d-d-dias") and maybe even 4 ("b-b-b-buenos d-d-d-dias"). The 3<sup>rd</sup> station is new (as would be the 4<sup>th</sup> if I were a bit more sure about it).
- CM-- **CUBA** Granma. 9/30 0401 – "Radio Bayamo, transmitiendo desde..." followed by a series of about a dozen chimes. New.
- 1630 XEUT **MÉXICO** Tijuana, BCN. 9/29 0506 – Fighting through KRMD with multi-station ID for Universidad Autónoma de Baja California stations. I believe this is my closest local at home. Relog.
- 1700 XEPE **MÉXICO** Tecate (nominally), BCN. 9/29 0500 – Fighting through KVNS with ESPN programming and ID. This station has nothing to do with the impoverished town of Tecate. It is a Tijuana (San Diego) station, having been fraudulently moved here (ex-560, 550, 1600, all apparently without CPs!) over a decade ago by a local scoundrel who has improperly operated several San Diego, Tijuana, Tecate and Ensenada stations for many years. Transmitter is somewhere between Tijuana and Tecate. Relog.

#### TRANS-PACIFIC

- 567 UnID **UnID** 9/29 1300 – NHK/KBS-style pips. Probably Japan but there is a KBS station listed on this channel too.
- 576 UnID **UnID** 9/29 1300 – Two stations, one with NHK/KBS-style pips, the other with slightly higher-pitched pips almost 1 second behind.
- 594 JOAK **JAPAN** Tokyo. 9/29 1300 NHK/KBS-style pips, barely audible.
- 747 JOIB **JAPAN** Sapporo. 9/29 1300 – NHK time pips. Weak but fairly solid signal, probably the strongest one this morning. Relog.
- 774 JOUB **JAPAN** Akita. 9/29 1300 – NHK time pips. Relog.

#### TRANS-ATLANTIC DX (AKA Wishful Thinking ☺)

Carriers (or spurious noise sources?) noted on 891 and 1152 in the early evening hours, just like last year.

**Receiver:** Perseus SDR-IQ v4.1/Lenovo W540 laptop with eSSD drive (a very small drive, but also very fast and quiet).

**Antennas:** Beverages on ground, as follows:

1. **NNE** (~20°) 810 ft terminated (2<sup>nd</sup> night only). Broke at 185 ft, but this probably happened the next morning when the winds kicked up. Took down this wire (and most other northern wires) due to extremely auroral conditions; combined it with antenna #10 to make antenna #9.
2. **NE** (~44°) 1130 ft terminated (2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> nights only).
3. **NENE** (~61°) 1180 ft terminated (2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> nights only).
4. **EENE** (~78°) 1540 ft terminated (all 4 nights). Very difficult wire to set up. It crossed the highway at a long slow diagonal, requiring a whole roll of duct tape! Was hoping this one would net some good eastern clear-channel catches, but the aurora was too strong and the long skip was not coming in well from most directions.
5. **EESE** (~98°) 1260 ft terminated (all 4 nights). Broke at 710 ft the first night (or possibly the next morning). This wire was the star of the show. It brought in great catches from Texas, Cuba and Venezuela all 4 nights.
6. **SESE** (~124°) 1160 ft terminated (first two nights). Didn't seem to be picking up much, so I moved it to become antenna #7.
7. **SE** (~137°) 1160 ft terminated (3<sup>rd</sup> night only).
8. **ESSE** (~146°) 1200 ft terminated (all 4 nights). Finally pulled in a few Mexican signals when conditions improved the 4<sup>th</sup> night.
9. **SSE** (~154°) 1490 ft unterminated (3<sup>rd</sup> night only).
10. **SSE (NNW)** (~160°/340°) 680 ft unterminated (1<sup>st</sup> 2 nights only). Combined with antenna #1 to make antenna #9.

Wires #1-3 were severely impacted by the aurora. Even wire #4 was pretty bland. Wire #5 was incredible. #6 through 10 had some success.

In only 19 nights of DXing at this location (between 2002 and 2017) I have logged 1367 stations, only 39 shy of the 1406 I have logged from San Diego in over 41 years of DXing. By the time I finish reviewing this year's recordings, my Border Inn totals will hopefully surpass my San Diego totals.

This was my 7th visit to this location. Once again this year's visit was timed to combine the end-of-September sunset/sunrise conditions with the so-called "high school football STA." This was largely nullified by very poor and auroral conditions the first 3 nights. I still need to be more careful planning my pre-sunset and post-sunrise recordings.

Once again I used an unterminated wire to aim in two directions at once (SSE and NNW), and it worked as planned, bringing in a few stations from the northwest states and even a few TP signals despite the poor conditions.

The noise problem did not return this year. The power station and/or power lines on the north side of the highway apparently were not activated this year.
