+Heard 11/20 at 1959 with "KUBE Riverside," ex-KTDD. (BB-AZ)

590 KSUB UT, Cedar City 11/20 0100 "Newstalk 5-90 KSUB" to Fox network news, report that Charles Manson finally died. Solid, S-9 signal covering the 740 KRMG OK, Tulsa heard 11/20 at 0809 with "KRMG Morning News" way under KCBS. (BB-AZ) NV, Reno 11/22 0133 ID during black of local ads, all alone and so strong there was no CHQR-770 slop amid poor DX conditions that saw no 780 KKOH WBBM (normally all alone) and nothing on 800 but RFI. Nothing on 780 the next night, but 11/24 0123-0135 began with C&W dominant, probably KCEG, then KKOV faded up during a block of local ads with mention of call letters and soon was all alone. (JP-AB) 880 KRVN NE, Lexington 11/23 1850 Nebraska Cornhusker basketball play-by-play in progress. No sign of KHAC which had been cheating with day power

and pattern at night. (RB-AZ)

UT, Richfield 11/23 1905 ID by both man and jingle. Local spots and weather. Good signal, and came up out of nowhere. (RB-AZ) KSVC

990 **KRKS** CO, Denver 11/22 0700 ID by man "Denver's All New 9-90," religious lecture after SRN news. Steady, good, but tangling with XECL a cupla times. (RB-AZ)

NV, Las Vegas 11/24 1000 ID slogan, promo for Jim Rome, going into talk show. Fair but steady, clear. Well after sunrise. (RB-AZ) 1140 KXST

AZ, Golden Valley 11/19 at 1900, 1980's pop country before and after man with "KYET Golden Valley." Over KLOK and KFAQ. Good with sunset 1170 KYET enhancement on SW-2000629, Terk loop. Intrastate logs count for me due to the sheer size of Arizona. (RB-AZ)

CA, San Jose 11/19 at 1858 woman with ID, South Asian music. Good over KYET until right on the hour. (RB-AZ) **KLOK**

NM, Santa Fe 11/18 0715 break from "Ring of Fire" to ad spots, promos. Good, dominant. (RB-AZ) 1260 KTRC

1330 KGAK NM, Gallup 11/30 1640 a mix of Christmas music and country. Steady and no co-channel interference. (RB-AZ)

1350 **KRLC** ID, Lewiston heard 11/21 at 1955 with "KRLC Home Town Radio" then country music. (BB-AZ)

ID, Nampa heard 11/20 at 1900 with a very weak "KTIX." (BB-AZ) KTIX

UT, South Salt Lake 11/22 2330 live p-b-p sports (Utah Grizzlies hockey), post game interview. Very good, but with some long deep fades on 1370 KSOP Panasonic RF-2200. (RB-AZ)

1460 KUTI WA, Yakima heard 11/18 2022-2046 with football play-by-play. West Valley Eagles vs ?? Vikings. Spot breaks at 2024 and 1045, possibly others as station was fading in and out (on car radio) and mixing with a second station with music. "1460 ESPN Yakima" IDs at 2022 and 2045. (pb-WA)

1470 KYYW TX, Abilene heard 11/21 at 1932 with "Newstalk KYYW." (BB-AZ)

1520 KQQB TX, Stockdale 11/23 1910 that Texas station again, that was all the buzz a while back. I was waiting for the fade-in of KOKC. I thought I was hearing it when suddenly I recognized the tape loop from KQQB at about a quarter past the hour. KOKC did come in mixing with KQQB at 1920, which was dominant. Still there on subsequent rechecks, including at 2020. (RB-AZ)

1690 KDMT CO, Denver 11/23 at 1830 first medium wave band DX to come up before sunset. Fair and steady with man and woman in talk radio program. (RB-AZ)

[EB-MO] 1270 WCGC NC, Belmont. 11/19 fair signal over WKBF. 0420 noted with Family Talk, promos, feature from Calvary Church in Charlotte NC, "Heaven radio" ID.

Must have been on day power. First time heard since a December 19 1993 DX Test. [EB-MO]

MI, Holland. 11/18 fair to poor, mixing with other stations. 0359 poked through with "14-50 AM, 99-point-Seven FM, real news now." [EB-MO]

KS, Topeka. 11/20 fair to poor signal, mixing with KDMO and other stations. 0415 poked through with "Sports radio" mention. [EB-MO]

NC, Charlotte. 11/19 good signal in WQLR null. 0403 noted with Southern Rock format, "Now that this smoke is paid for, here's a little more. 94-**WBCN** 1660

Seven Smoke" ID. [EB-MO]

990 WCAZ IL, Carthage - 11/21 2124 noted with what sounded like a high school football game mentioning the Central Panthers and Norfolk(?) Chargers and a player named Jackson Porter, "WCAZ, Your Homestown Station" ID at 2140, ads for Homestead Hardware, Marine Bank and Trust and Westfield Augers, another "WCAZ" ID at 2205. A fair and quite audible at times to very poor signal was noted, mixing with WDCX and WNTY; no sign of CBW. Confirmed via Web stream at WCAZ AM 990-dot-com. (PS-ON) (The NRC Log notes that the license for this station has been

canceled, although it's still listed in the FCC's AM Query. The Chargers may be from Niota, across the river from Fort Madison IA – eb)

KY, Madisonville – 11/22 0030 noted with a Classic Hits format, including a selection from Toto, "Classic Hits 103.5" ID at 0035. A poor signal was 1310 WTTL noted under CIWW, but audible at times. (PS-ON)

1390 WEGP

ME, Presque Isle – 11/22 2028 noted with *EWTN Live*, promos for EWTN On Demand, *The Journey Home* and the EWTN Religious Catalogue, "This is 89.5 WWTP Augusta, WXTP North Windham... WEGP Presque Isle" legal ID at 2100 into *The Holy Rosary*. A fair and dominating to very poor signal, mixing with WNIO and other stations; confirmed via Web stream at The Presence Radio-dot-org. (PS-ON) KY, Irvine – 11/17 0645 noted with "True Oldies" mention, "V-99.3" ID by a male announcer into a song by The Monkees. The signal was noted mixing with CBEF, WITK, WKBA, WMRE and unidentified stations broadcasting in Spanish and an unknown Asian language (probably Vietnamese). (KK-VA) (The only Asian language stations listed on 1550 in the NRC Log are on the West Coast; one is in San Francisco CA and the other in Ferrades WA: vow resemble may be WBPIC Corel Carle Carle (PA) and the control of the co 1550 WIRV

the other in Ferndale WA; your Spanish may be WRHC Coral Gables FL – eb)

TN, Bristol – 11/19 0001 noted with Bluegrass music, "1550 WIGN Bristol" legal ID at 0004 before another music set. A good to poor signal was WIGN noted, dominating 1550. Probably on 35,000-watt day power. (PS-ON)

MO, Macon – 11/17 0611 during a slight pause in music on WFME, hearing a male announcer with what sounded like "KFBI... listen to all the time." There is no KFBI on 1560; there are three "K??I" stations; KABI, KLTI and KTUI. I listened to the Web streams of KABI and KTUI; I don't 1560 KLTI believe I heard either one of them. Unable to listen to the Web stream of KLTI. On 11/23, I listened to a recording of the reception, and I'm definitely hearing "KLTI... listen to all the time." A new station in the logbook. The signal was noted mixing with WFME, WKIK, WYZD and an unidentified station with vocal music. (KK-VA) (KLTI must have been running 1,000-watt day power instead of their authorized night power of 41

watts. KABI operates 250 watts days and 58 watts at night, while KTUI is a 1,000-watt daytime-only operation – eb)

NC, Dobson – 11/17 0701 noted with this sign-on announcement by a male announcer: "This is WYZD Dobson beginning another broadcast day."

The signal was noted mixing with WFME, WKIK and an unidentified vocal music station. (KK-VA) **WYZD**

1570 WCCM MA, Methuen – 11/17 0602 noted with vocal music in Spanish, "This is WCCM 1570 AM Methuen... station" legal ID by a male announcer in heavily accented English. A new station in the logbook. The signal was noted mixing with WECU, WNCA, WPGM and WYTI. (KK-VA) (This station also broadcasts in Portuguese: it has served as the Portuguese language outlet for New England Revolution soccer. Spanish and Portuguese are somewhat similar-sounding languages – eb)

NC, Cherryville – 11/17 0600 noted with "You're listening to The Boss, WOHS in Shelby, WLON in Lincolnton; Your Beach, Oldies and Sports Station" legal ID by a male announcer. The signal was noted mixing with WAKR, WHPY, WKTP and unidentified stations with Christian talk, vocal 1590 WCSL

music and Spanish language programming. (KK-VA)

NC, Clayton – 11/17 0700 noted with "...and on WHPY 1590 AM, located in Clayton, North Carolina" legal ID by a male announcer. It wasn't a sign-on, just an ID being given. The signal was noted mixing with WAKR, WCSL, WKTP and unidentified stations with Christian talk, vocal music and Spanish language programming. (KK-VA)

Although that's also the opposite bearing for WIBW Topeka in English; then SAH of 64/minute between them = 1.07 Hz. [GH-OK] 770 CUBA CMCW, Radio Artemisa, La Salud. NOV 24 0125 – Spanish immediately mentions "nuestro comandante en jefe, Fidel Castro Ruz", so suspected Cuban. Then a calendar of events to do with various Revolutionary anniversaries; on E-W, not N-S antenna also making Mexico unlikely. Radio Rebelde, as listed for Victoria de las Tunas (named after a music competition?)? No, not //5025 or 1180. Finally resumes PBP of a partido estúpido de pelotas, and lucky me, Radio Artemisa ID in passing, the only other Cuban on 770. In fact, CMCW, La Salud, Artemisa is much closer, just SW of Habana, than Tunas way off to the Orient. [GH-OK]

11/21. During exceptional propagation my August Rockwork 4 DXpedition partner Tom Rothlisberger was able to record a bonanza, including 64 New Zealand MW stations (once again surpassing the all-time Grayland record), 35 from Australia (including such obscurities as 531-6DL, 558-6WA, 558-7BU and 1161-7FG) as well as the huge signal from 558-Radio Fiji One, for a total of 100 DU stations on MW. In addition he also came away with multiple Longwave NDB and DGPS stations from the South Pacific, including several that had never been reported from North America. Congratulations, Tom - you have turned into an exceptional "Cliffhanger DXer!" http://www.qsl.net/k7wv/RockworkDX4.htm

11/22. From November 12-18 I was on a DXpedition in Lubec, Maine sharing time between Quoddy House [QH] and Lubec Bay Cottage [LBC].

I had 2 DKAZ antennas at QH - one pointing 45 degrees and the other at 100 degrees. At LBC I had one DKAZ at 90 degrees. All antennas were 160' DKAZ with Vactrol termination resistance [Rt].

I'll be going through Perseus .wav files for awhile but have a webpage up and a decent start: http://realmonitor.com/am_logs_qh10.php

Highlights so far are South Africa on 846 kHz, IDed by Ralph Brandi and a parallel webstream, and CRI on 1521 kHz from Xinjiang province, China.

Another highlight was getting a KiwiSDR receiver going at QH. To make sure it was working without totally overloading a slow internet connection a few lucky souls tested it while I was still at QH and dug out some amazing DX – like South Africa [thanks again Ralph Brandil]. The KiwiSDR will be up, all going well, over the winter from QH on a 1000ft. BOG at ~75 deg.

During the few days I had the DKAZ connected to the KiwiSDR and since on the BOG Andy Robins took the set up for a spin DXing NDBs - non-directional beacons - on LW. His excellent write-up of the experience is here: http://realmonitor.com/qh10/Quoddy%20House%20NDB%20Logs%202017.pdf

You can give the KiwiSDR at QH a try here: http://qhkiwisdr.proxy.kiwisdr.com:8073/

Be gentle and patient. It's on a slow RF-link wifi connection assisted by a beta proxy server hosted by the KiwiSDR folks.

The 1000ft. BOG is not as good as the 160' DKAZ at 45 deg. but there is no way a DKAZ - as I erect them for DXpedition use - would survive a cold, wet, windy winter on the Maine coast. Based on my experience at QH in 10 trips over the past several years, any antenna not already on the ground would eventually end up there anyway.

We heard many rare stations from the Pacific, including Radio Tuvalu (621 AM), never before heard in Finland. Also Gold FM from Fiji (990 AM) and V6AH from Micronesia (1449 AM) were identified. A couple of good mornings to Latin America resulted in a major load of stations from Argentina and Brazil, and North American stations were picked up every day during the two-week DXpedition. In the report you can also enjoy photos of aurora borealis, the northern lights, for which Lapland is an ideal travel destination.

Exactly ten years ago some unlikely TP-DX receptions on a humble (\$15) Sony SRF-59 pocket radio kicked off a series of unlikely events which resulted in a major new development in the AM-DXing hobby - the creation of the Ultralight Radio Enthusiast Group. Fueled significantly by nostalgia for the pocket transistor radios that introduced us to DXing as teenagers, the suddenly-formed group has been thrilled to discover a new generation of digitally-enhanced pocket radios that can run circles around last century's models in sensitivity, selectivity and search capabilities.

After writing a detailed review of the overachieving SRF-59 (including its reception of 594-JOAK, 747-JOIB and 972-HLCA) in late November of 2007 I was very fortunate to have my article published by Colin Newell on his innovative **DXer.ca** website, and suddenly the dirt-cheap SRF-59 was being purchased all over the US, and becoming the talk of the IRCA list. In appreciation of Colin's generosity I offered free SRF-59 radios to any Canadians who wanted one, and one of the 15 models sent out ended up with Rob Ross in London, Ontario - who promptly received 300 AM stations in 30 days with it. Pocket radio DXers soon discovered amazing digital models like the Eton E100, the Sony SRF-T615 and the Sangean DT-180V, and by January of 2008 there were private complaints that the IRCA list was being "hijacked" by the new, wildly enthusiastic Ultralight Radio group.

Traditional DXer John Bryant was apparently persuaded to ask our group to move off of the IRCA list and form our own Yahoo group, but when I offered him a free Sony SRF-T615 radio to try out if he would only keep an open mind about our niche group, he suddenly became as hooked as any of us on pocket radio DXing! Not only did he help us set up our own Yahoo group, but he used his superb organizational skills to ensure its success. John and I also started the wacky experimentation to modify pocket radios into transoceanic DXing wonders, transplanting both enhanced loopsticks and IF filters, as well as coupling powerful external antennas to increase their long-range DXing prowess on ocean beaches.

Although we lost John to an accident in February of 2010 the foundations he laid have enabled the Ultralight Radio group to not only survive but thrive. Shortly after John's passing Graham Maynard of the UK introduced a strange antenna composed of multiple ferrite rods, wrapped by a tuned coil. This "ferrite sleeve' antenna was at first regarded as a curiosity, but three experimenters in our group (Steve R, Kevin S and me) quickly devoted some serious resources to optimize it. We promptly discovered that this new antenna was an ideal gain booster for Ultralight Radios and other portables, providing the unique capability of high gain performance from an extremely compact size. Within a few months this new FSL antenna would be tested at an all-new location where DXers had never attempted a major DXpedition before - a wild ocean side cliff.

After these 10 years our Ultralight Radio Yahoo group now has well over 1,500 members on all continents, and has become a major force for antenna experimentation and creativity in the MW-DXing community. The spectrum-capture DXers have followed us to the ocean side cliffs, and the FSL and broadband antennas now complement each other during major DXpeditions each year. Rob Ross, Allen Willie and Richard Allen have all received over 1000 stations on Ultralight Radios, and Allen has amazed the entire MW-DXing community with his reception of multiple TA's with his unmodified pocket radios. Congratulations to all who contributed to our exciting first 10 years!
