I thought I had WMNI or 920 CFRY WKVA; the stream didn't match WMNI; no stream is available for WKVA. A fair at times to very, very poor signal was noted, mixing with CKNX; confirmed via Tune-In Web stream. (PS-ON)

1080 WNWI IL, Oak Lawn - 1/13 2058 noted with choral Christian music, "WNWI" ID at 2100 with contact information and a "Super Ethnic Station" mention into Asian music. A poor to very poor signal was noted, mixing with WTIC; confirmed via Tune-In Web stream. (PS-ON) NY, Newburgh – 1/13 0220 noted with Oldies format, PAMS-style jingles, "WGNY, It's a Blast!" jingle; later with ID as "Fox Oldies 1220 and Fox

1220 WGNY Oldies 98.9". ABC News at 0230, followed by a weather forecast for the Newburgh area. This reminds me of the old 77 WABC with Dan Ingram in the 1960s and '70s; great format! A good signal was noted in a WHKW null. (RW-MD)

+1/13 2314 noted with Oldies format, "WGNY" jingle into a tune by The Rivieras. A good to poor signal was noted, mixing with WHKW; coming in very well. I suspect this is on day power. (PS-ON)

NC. Tabor City - 1/13 0210 noted with a promo for the Swap Shop, "WTAB" ID into Country format. A good signal was noted atop the frequency 1370 WTAB before fading out under a bunch of stations. (RW-MD)

IN, Knox – 1/15 2250 noted on after sunset with Country format, "Country KVI" slogan at 2255, local spots including one mentioning Indiana, "AM 1520 WKVI 1520 Country KVI" at 2257. Waited for the legal ID at 2300, but was obliterated by WWKB's legal ID. A poor to very poor signal was noted, mixing with KOLM, WWKB; confirmed via Tune-In Web stream. (PS-ON)

IN, Shelbyville - 1/14 2257 noted with a Contemporary Hit Radio format; confirmed via Tune-In Web stream. A good to poor signal was noted, 1520 WSVX mixing with KOLM, WWKB and an unidentified Country station. Poipu Kauai Hawaii DXpedition part 2 - Gary DeBock

As reported previously, from November 3-8 I had the awesome opportunity to chase exotic TP-DX from the patio of a beach side condo in Poipu, Kauai - the Hawaiian island closest to Asia. Despite the fact that I was using only a modified Ultralight radio and a 5 inch "Frequent Flyer" FSL antenna the Asian propagation

was outstanding, causing the detailed file review to take some time. Previously a list of 37 transoceanic DX stations received from 531-702 kHz was posted, and in this message there is another list of 38 stations received from 711-954 kHz (along with their MP3 recording links). DXing highlights among this group include English news receptions from both 927-AIR (South) and 954-AIR (North), reception of a 10 kW Egyptian station (918-ERTU), a 10 kW Chinese station on the Kazakhstan border (909-Xinjiang), reception of 729-Myanmar and multiple S9-level recordings from 918-Kampuchea. Quite a few of these exotic recordings would have remained Unidentified except for the awesome language identification skills of the Finnish DXers Mauno, Mika, Jari L. and Jari S., who solved quite a few of the linguistic mysteries stumping a west coast DXer. Thanks to you all, and to the other DXers who gave their suggestions and assessments.

REP KOREA HLKA, Sorae, 500 kW. One of the strongest Koreans on the band, but it had co-channel issues with Voice of Kuanghua and Voice of Vietnam. Greetings. All times and dates strictly UT. Receiver: mostly DX-398 with internal antenna only or PL-880; NRD-545 with ALA-330S inside E-W or inside random wire N-S; Nissan stock caradio as specified; or IC-R75 with E-W longwire.

198 kHz, Jan 15 at 0709, beacon DIW which is 2 kW from Dixon NC (not DIX); instead of BBC Radio 4. I am having no luck with Euro LWBC DX, unlike my neighbor Richard Allen with his setup. Dixon is too insignificant to make the Rand McNally atlas, but coördinates place it around Jaxonvil/Camp Lejeune near the coast.

1140, Jan 15 at 1348, plugs for a Relevant Radio app, interview someone about March for Life, and many more mentions of Relevant Radio, which is a Catholic network. Loops roughly NE/SW, but mainly need to null KRMP OKC which is SSE. NRC AM Log has no RR on 1140, but that's because it is not a network covered in the book at all, not on the list page 291.

Own website has two lists of RR stations, neither with any 1140! https://relevantradio.com/listen/affiliates/ https://relevantradio.com/listen/ stations/. The latter being O&Os. Too bad Relevant HQ is unaware of all their outlets. So:

NRC AM Log does not have many possibilities, ie Christian if not necessarily Catholic, in English. Of course, Protestants and Catholics are unlikely to coëxist on same station. One is WVEL Pekin IL, 5 kW daytimer, "Central Illinois Christian Voice" but sked does not mention RR:
 http://www.wvel.com/wvel-programming-schedule/. Could certainly be propagating as WHAS and WLW are still in at 1400 UT.
 Second possibility is WVHF, Kentwood MI, 5 kW directional daytimer, with EWTN. That makes it Catholic, but a competitor to Relevant, unless there

has been a flip. WVHF is "Holy Family Radio" and its program this hour is 'Catholic Connection', from Ave Maria Radio, yet another Catholic competitor. http://www.holyfamilyradio.net/show/catholic-connection/. Maybe someone knows which 1140 around here be really Relevant?

Answer: 1140, Jan 20 at 1429, looking for Relevant Radio UnID as heard Tue Jan 15 before 1400: dominant is KXRB Sioux Falls SD, "Great Country, 100.1 and 1140 AM". Not much from my nearest KRMP OKC until 1431 plug for a 405-AC church. I struggle to split the difference nulling both as much as possible, and at 1435 fades in from NE/SW another Christian conversation, but no Relevant heard.

Although not listed as REL, another station I need to check out is KCXL, Liberty MO (Kansas City market), U1 4000/6 watts. And guess what, their rogram schedule besides far-right extremist secular talk shows, includes at 6-8 am (CST = UT-6) Mon-Fri, "Relevant Radio"! http://www.kcxl.com/shows.html. Nothing shown before 8 am weekends, but after 8 on Sundays now it's "The Jesus Christ Show". So my UnID is now ID as KCXL

1470, Jan 20 at 1422, Mexican music before and after "La Nueva 14-70 AM" ID, loops NNE/SSW. Prime suspect is KAIR Atchison KS, which per NRC AM Log had been off the air since October 2017, was classic country. Current searches lead only to its FM 93.7 http://www.kairfm.com/historyof-kair.html. The AM is licensed as U3 1/1 kW, with tight directional lobes toward SW (good for us) and NNE. https://transition.fcc.gov/Bureaus/ MB/Databases/AM_DA_patterns/313975-22117.pdf deadline for KAIR to resume after silent-STA extension was Nov 1, 2018; no later correspondence in FCC file.

1480, Jan 15 at 1352, Banda 13 promoting that it is somehow "digital", and greeting someone in or from Querétaro, ie KBXD Dallas TX.

1640, Jan 14 at 0417, KZLS "Enid" (-OKČ via Hennessey site) in dead air with fast SAH, facilitating copy of ESPN, no doubt WTNI Biloxi MS, the only sports format on 1640, which always QRMs at night and apparently stays on 10 kW day power ND.


