SK, Saskatoon 3/20 2956-2400 first time heard not playing C&W, with syndicated religious programming 2300-2359 weekdays (2200-2259 in winter; SK is on CST year-round). 30 second local playing C&W, with local near at 2359:30. (JP-AB) **CJWW** 

ID, Boise 3/25 1000 actually logged this by accident. Tuned to 740-KCBS, then intended to hit the step-up button to 750, but instead hit the step-down button to 730 just in time to hear clearly "KDBI, Homedale" through the KCBS slop. It sounded like KBBI, but that's Homer, AK on a different 730 KDBI

frequency. Later I was scanning through 730 listings and I was startled to find KDBI Boise. On radio-locator com KDBI-FM is listed as Homedale bingo! (AWP-CA)

MT, Polson 3/27 1000-1020 completely swamping all else on the frequency once they kicked in their day power. Many local references and sponsors. Even usually dominant Portland didn't stand a chance against it. (AWP-CA) 750 KERR

WA, Pasco 3/16 0030-0037 ad for nearby Kennewick business then into post game wrap up of local WHL hockey team play-by-play against 870 KFLD

Spokane, in null of CHQR-880 slop. Burying regular CKIR, so suspect KFLD was on 10kw day power for the duration of the game. (JP-AB) IA, Des Moines 3/20 0215 talk show discussing how people who meditate frequently do better with remote viewing. News break at the hour 1040 WHO

bottom, then man with single ID "WHO." Alone on the channel, very strong on HQ-180A and directly coupled capacitance tuned loop. (RB-AZ) AZ, Green Valley 3/20 0938 "On KGVY" to "Just Call Me Angel (Juice Newton) song. Very strong, sounding like a local. Not unusual to hear there, 1080 KGVY but unusual to hear this strong. (RB-AZ)

MO, St Louis 3/22 0300 break from talk show to PSI, ID, on Satellit 205, up and over KANN. (RB-AZ) 1120 KMOX

1170 **KCBQ** CA, San Diego 3/21 1000 ID to newscast, string of spots, slogan "AM 11-70 The Answer." Fair signal but steady and well over the mess after daybreak on RF-2200. (RB-AZ)

1260 KSFB CÁ, San Francisco 3/15 2000 religious talk and ID, soon faded back down and into the mush, on JRC with N-S wire. (GH-OR)

1300 KPMO CA, Mendocino 3/24 0855-0905 interview with African woman (BBC program?), TOH ID mentioned Jefferson Public Radio then into BBC World Service. Fair signal, on top of frequency. (MW-OR)

AZ, Yuma 3/26 0700 possible station coming up through Sacramento sports talk with jazz saxophone instrumental. (MS-CA) 1320 ?KOFA?

UT, Salt Lake City 3/23 weak under KIFM, no sign of KOFA. 0900 out of oldies with "It's time for another hour of continuous music on the Sound of KNIT the Rockies" along with a string of station IDs including KNIT. Needed for call change. (JCJ-AZ)

WY, Worland 2/28 0030 man gave weather and ID into ABC news. Weak and whirling in the jumble. New! (GH-OR)

1340 KWOR

CA, San Gabriel 3/28 0900 a strong KLO suddenly went off the air and KMRB appeared. ID out of Chinese programming "You're listening to AM 1430 KMRB 1430 KMRB San Gabriel, Los Angeles, a multi-cultural radio broadcasting station." Noticed KLO was quite weak that night. (JCJ-AZ)

KRKC CA, King City 3/25 0949 ID for KRKC 1490 and 104.9, talking about Warriors basketball. (MS-CA) 1490

MN, St Paul 3/1 1900 ID into sports talk, fair to poor with splash from UnIDs, on Hammarlund with E-W wire. (GH-OR) CA, Piedmont heard 3/21 at 2157 with "This is KSPA Ontario." (BB-AZ) CO, Littleton heard 3/21 at 2200 with "This is KCKK Littleton, Colorado." (BB-AZ) 1500 KSTP

MO, Hollister 3/24 finally confirmed that the talk under XERF is English, coming from the SW, and KBCV has its strongest directional lobe tightly in

my direction. (JP-AB) 1610 WPGG527 CA, Lakewood 3/25 1129 low power municipal station still going strong with mentions of Lakewood senior center, slogan/ID "You're listening to

Radio Lakewood 'KLWD' on WPGG527." (MS-CA)

UT, Sandy 3/1 1930 first heard "K-Talk 1640" then call letter ID, talk show. In strong then faded down on HQ-180 and E-W wire. New! (GH-OR)

1640 KBJA 1660 KBRE

CA, Merced 3/19 0930 talk show, but not the usual one targeting baby-boomers, but more of a millennial type talk program. Steady and strong on RF-2200 tuned "off-band" (ostensibly the receiver goes only to 1600). (RB-AZ)

  OH, Cincinnati 3/17 0050 noted with Urban Gospel format, "Inspiration 1050" ID read by a child, another music segment, "You are listening to Cincinnati's Urban Gospel Station, WGRI" ID at 0102 into SRN News at 0103. A poor to very poor signal was noted under CHUM. (PS-ON)

  VA, Colonial Heights 3/19 0615 noted with a nice "WDZY, Radio That Changes the Way You Live" slogan into Urban Gospel format before fading into the mess. A good signal was noted on top of WHIO and other stations. (RW-MD) (Colonial Heights is a Richmond suburb eb)

### Japan to end AM broadcasting?

3/29. From The Japan Times website: (via Karl Zuk and the IRCA eGroup)

Japanese commercial broadcasters on Wednesday proposed a revision to the broadcast law that would allow them to ditch AM radio broadcasting due to issues over cost amid a decline in listenership.

The Japan Commercial Broadcasters Association asked the communications ministry to implement a system revision by 2028 in order to allow radio broadcasters to focus on FM broadcasting. Under the law, broadcasters are obliged to broadcast on both AM and FM.

The request, made at a meeting of a panel of experts at the ministry, reflects the heavy burden placed on broadcasters stemming from updates to facilities and other forms of investment at a time when radio stations' advertising revenues are diminishing as the number of listeners falls.

"It's extremely difficult for us to renew our facilities while continuing AM broadcasting," said TBS Radio Inc. Chairman Kiyohiko Irie, who participated in the panel meeting as a representative of commercial broadcasters.

He asked for a measure to allow radio broadcasters to convert their AM broadcasting to FM or to maintain both types of broadcasting, according to their own business judgments.

Specifically, the broadcasters' association proposed a test that would halt AM broadcasting in limited areas, possibly in 2023. If no problems arise during the trial, the association would seek the end of mandatory AM broadcasting.

Some members of the panel, which is tasked with discussing ways to strengthen commercial broadcasters' operating foundations, agreed with the idea of ending AM broadcasting, while others were cautious, citing concerns that FM radio waves have difficulty reaching mountainous areas.

While AM radio waves reach farther than FM waves, they are more prone to being blocked by tall buildings and tend to have poor reception in urban areas.

In addition, AM radio base stations are often built in coastal areas and require investments to protect facilities in the event of tsunami.

As a result, 43 of the 47 radio stations making AM broadcasts also have simultaneous FM broadcasts for their AM radio programs.

The call letters are always pronounced in English, evading their cumbersome renderings, all as "foreign" letters into Spanish. WKY will also not he\$itate to run commercial\$ entirely in Engli\$h.

1000, March 21 at 1301, slow SAH vs KTOK OKC I associate with KKIM Albuquerque, but no, it's "ESPN Radio", therefore still WMVP Chicago, where official FCC sunrise was 1200, ABQ not until 1315 (April: 1115 and 1230 respectively) and today 1234 here.

1030, March 21 at 1303, "The station you can always count on for real country, always, all the time" but no real ID heard; at least there's no 6 minutes of news on the hour, whew! Obviously KCWJ Blue Springs MO, address in Independence.

1480, March 21 at 1255, KBXD Dallas, Vietnamese still audible, but losing out to KQAM Wichita in English. Jerry Kiefer, who used to work for KBXD, confirms: "Greetings, Ole famous sage! A quick check with Mike Van Hooser, still the engineer of record at KBXD, and yes, they are the voice of Vietnam around the clock in the Metroplex, not so much at night with their pattern aimed just at you" - meaning I assume, their local coverage is degraded.

1640, March 31 at 0610, KZLS "Enid" is dead air; by next check at 1400 has added a big hum, but still no programod.

UnID. Trans-Pacific JBA MW carrier search, March 21 at 1236-1245: 594, 774-NW and WSW, 828-NW, 882-WSW, 972-NW, 1098-W, 1422-NW, 1548-WSW, 1566-NW. Very likely sources of all these from Australia, Pacific and East Asia should be obvious. Should have started earlier before LSR 1234, while I was trying to get back to sleep, but finally upgave and intuned.

2097.3-CW, March 24 at 0310, beacon A clearly audible, one Morse letter every dekasecond. Based on some references, we have been attributing this to Quartzsite AZ, but Steve McGreevy in the Mojave says it definitely is not, unknown exactly where but in Q. only a skywave signal is received.

COSTA RICA [and non]. 2859.812, March 21 at 1153, JBA carrier, suspected the known active second harmonic of 1430, Radio San Carlos, as IDed recently by Jay Novello, NC, but without a precise measurement. In \*2017y\* I reported:

"COSTA RICA. 2859.82, January 18 at 0049, JBA carrier on the signature off-frequency of Radio San Carlos, Ciudad Quesada, 2 x 1430v as previously identified".

Now at 1155 I have no signal on 2940+, indicating that harmonic is considerably east from here even though our sunrise is not until 1234; and a carrier on 2960 as if Mobile 1480 x 2.

2940.132, March 25 at 0609, trace of modulation, vs static crashes, second harmonic of something on 2940.066v. I've already mentioned the likeliest, but no reports received from anyone who can ID it for sure, and the spring storm season is no help.

2940.14, March 28 at 0540, harmonic with the most modulation yet but still too weak, seems woman talking but can't tell language. At 0548 an man instead. Have been presuming it's 2 x 1470.07v, but since 2+9+4 = 15, a multiple of 3, this could also be a third harmonic of 980+. http://mwlist.org/mwoffset.php?khz=980 shows a few remote possibilities.

WORLD OF RADIO 1975 contents: Angola, Antarctica, Australia, Bangladesh, Congo DR, Cuba, Denmark, Equatorial Guinea non, Indonesia, Kuwait, Laos, Mali, New Zealand, Oklahoma, Philippines non, Romania, Suriname, UK and non, USA and non, Zambia, Zanzibar, unidentified 12031; and the propagation outlook.

Larry Will wrote: "On 3265 via WBCQ at 0223 March 30. First airing?" Must be; thanks, Larry! Ad-hoc, confirmed here at 0242 check on 3264.9, recognizable but JBA and vs increasing line noise level bothering here; it's always something.

JAPAN [and non]. 3945, March 21 at 1159, Radio Nikkei 2 in Japanese and a second signal about 8 Hz apart making SAH with some modulation. Could it be Vanuatu? NO, per Aoki, if that were active, the hours would be 0700-1015. Instead now Echo of Unification, North Korea is also on 3945 at 12-14, overlapping RN2 at 10-14 M-F. 3945 is now much stronger than 3925, presumed RN1 on a 10 kW. But WRTH 2019 shows both as 10 kW, 3925 being Sapporo, while NK is 100 kW.
ALASKA. Caught the last part of Amanda Dawn Christie's experimental transmissions via HAARP, Wednesday March 27, after referring to the

schedule at: https://www.ghostsintheairglow.space/transmissions which confusingly refers to this day as "March 26+1"

At 0239 and still at 0240, 4500 to the east is S9+10 with CODAR QRM, SSTV; noting heard on 4400 to the west. This is contrary to her sked for Section VII at 0233-0239 which said 4500 would be "NATO phonetic alphabet x 3", and 4400 would be "counting to one hundred".

The same frequencies continue for Section VIII, at 0239:30-0245:30. Retune to 4400-AM at 0245 just in time to hear the fonetik letters; I think the last three were TAY, and off at 0245.5. Considerably weaker than 4500 as to be expected, which at 0246 has been restored to CODAR only. 0246, frequencies have changed for Section IX, "Spy Cameras from the Sky, and a Mystery Box in the Woods": 6900-AM to the east is S9+10/20

with somewhat muffled and lo-key female narration, mostly unreadable with possibly local device QRM, but I pick out a few bits, describing an object: "On Sunday December 1"; "who gave you the authority?"; "RCMP". Also some music in background. At 0254 it suddenly switches to SSTV, and then find it sounding the same as on S9 5100 to the west. Both stop before 0256\*.

0256.5, the only and final frequency is 3200, for Section IX, "Not with a bang but with a WSPR". This is the weakest, S5-S7 and is, as not specified, a CW message, which I am not recording and not up to speed to copy live, seeming repeated a few times until off at 0259:30\*.

There have been many other running reports of this from WOR ioGroup contributors, which I have not digested before writing my report. I assume most or all will be posted audio visually.

UnID. 4774.975, March 31 after 0600, romantic? song at S7 vs double-CODAR swooshes. I seldom pull any modulation here. First thought is Brasil

or Perú which insist on colliding with each other; but if you believe Aoki sked, neither would be on between 04 and 07. Instead, TWR English is on 4775 until 0700 - but Manzini sunrise was already at 0403 today, surely too late for them. So I refine the frequency (and maybe there is a second carrier almost the same), which points to South America. I found one report of TWR only 8 Hz low, while here's a typical comparison of Brasil and Perú by Carlos Gonçalves from June 2016y: "PERU 4774.946 Radio Tarma, Tarma, 2232-2240, 02/6, canções índias; 34433, QRM do Brasil [Congonhas] em

SURINAME. 4989.983, March 21 at 0229-0240+ open carrier at S4-S6, and still at 0544, S6-S5 when measured. This has already been identified as reactivated Radio Apintie, first reported by Arthur Delibert, Maryland at 2315 March 20. Something must have changed, as it had always been a struggle to get even a JBA carrier from it here. But Art also noted the modulation //web had been intermittent. Perhaps they would resume for the morning broadcast, audible by sunrise 0944 per Ron Howard. Manuel Méndez, Spain was already hearing songs again by 0601, very weak modulation but strong carrier. Yet he says, "from 0640 to 0728, only carrier, no audio, but now, at 0733 audio goes on and off various times, some minutes on and some off". WRTH 2019 has it as irregular.

4990-, March 22 at 0127, presumed Radio Apintie about S5 with undermodulated music. Various chex 24 hours later detect a JBA carrier, far too weak to evaluate modulation, and lighting storms are closing in on us from the TX Panhandle.

UnID. 5002-5003, March 18 at 0500, UTEhash is again far too close to 5000, QRMing WWV/H, so beyond an anomaly. What is this?? And there it is

AUSTRALIA. 5055, March 22 at 0950 weak music at S2-S4 from 4KZ; unfortunately awake now, I also check 5045 for Unique Radio during a scheduled airing of WORLD OF RADIO. All I can get there is a JJBBA carrier, but at least that implies mode is reduced carrier LSB rather than straight suppressed carrier LSB, a distinction Tim has never explained. Now on Sat and Sun there will be plenty of chances to hear WOR on stronger stations. [Later: Tim says LSB no carrier, but from April 1 switching to USB no carrier.]

### Ultralight shorts (from via Gary DeBock via IRCA eGroup)

3/22. Transplanting a 7.5" replacement loopstick into an ultra-crammed CCrane Skywave Ultralight is one of the most technically challenging modifications in the hobby, and certainly not recommended for beginners. Although those with close-order professional soldering experience, great eyesight and steady nerves can survive the experience, the entire process is a severe test of confidence, patience and determination. When you consider the \$89.95 price of the basic Skywave and the \$169.99 price of the SSB model, the fact that you will be terminally violating the manufacturer's warranty doesn't exactly provide much reassurance.

Because of the nightmarish nature of the modification and the need to fit multiple sub-assemblies together like pieces of a complex puzzle during final reassembly, the procedure has never been written up in a construction article, and probably never will be. Despite this there really is a straightforward method to the madness, and the undeniable fact is that the "Supercharged" CC Skywave has become the obvious standard of superb performance on exotic ocean beaches during "Frequent Flyer" DXpeditions. No other modified Ultralight has its unique combination of high quality, compact size and thrilling performance. As such, my three DXpedition partners for the November Kauai DXpedition deserve one of these for their best chance of success.

Eleven new high-resolution photos of the technically demanding modification are posted at the following links, detailing the transformation of a modest stock Skywave into a "Supercharged" thriller. This model is destined for long-time frequent flyer Craig Barnes, who was the first to demonstrate the awesome potential of Kauai, Hawaii transoceanic DXing during his April 2017 trip. All of these photos (and the original ones) are planned to be uploaded into an album on the Ultralight Experimenters site.

While going through the checkout tests of newly "Supercharged" (7.5" loopstick transplant) CCrane Skywave portables I noticed that the audio amplifier in the newer (2017 and later) versions of the non-SSB models has been significantly upgraded to a much more powerful version, correcting one of the weak points noted in the detailed review contained in the 2015 Ultralight Shootout article (posted on SWLing.com) after the Skywave was first introduced. The CC Skywave was acclaimed as having an innovative design, but limited by its wimpy audio amp https://swling.com/blog/2015/03/gary-debocks-2015-ultralight-radioshootout-review/

After this latest improvement the CC Skywave's audio amp is not only competitive with that of the XHDATA D-808 model, but the 1 kHz DSP audio has also been improved, so that fewer high frequencies are clipped off because of the narrow DSP filtering. The compact Skywave's speaker does a superb job of delivering the improved audio amp power, so that DXing for weak stations in noisy areas is still a viable option (maybe as on an exotic ocean beach? :-) Of course the limitation of the stock Skywave is still its midget loopstick, which can be outclassed in MW sensitivity across the band by that of the longer XHDATA D-808 model, as well as the classic portables like the Sony ICF-SW5W and Panasonic RF-2200. But this is a congenital issue in compact Ultralight radios, and can only be solved by upgrading the loopstick with a larger external version, or boosting up DX reception by an inductively-coupled signal transfusion from an FSL antenna or air core loop.

Unfortunately, wimpy audio amps are still being manufactured and deployed in Ultralight radios, most notably by the Radiwow Company in its new "no guarantee" R-108 model. If you purchase one of these Chinese-made models (with come with no manufacturer's warranty) you will discover that the MW sensitivity is good enough to get you a wispy signal on weak stations, but not good enough to give you much in the way of identifying details. You can advance the volume control all you want, but it will only leave you with a broken knob (which Radiwow does not guarantee, by the way). It is a poster-child situation for one of the newly rejuvenated CC Skywave models, or any of the compact FSL antennas.

3/25. Two more of the compact AM-FM-LW-SW-AIR-Weather Band portables were received here on Saturday, both of them purchased from "hlhl2014" on EBay at \$49.98 from the following listing https://www.ebay.com/itm/RADIWOW-R-108-Radio-Digital-AM-FM-Portable-Stereo-AIR-Band-LCD-Display-Receiver/173793532305?hash=item2876e6d991:g:esMAAOSw1YRcZTng

So far 5 of the new R-108 portables have been received here, and the quality control record is pretty much all over the map. Only one of the models has a completely noise-free volume control on MW - the others have varying amounts of spurious noise when the volume control is increased (this sounds somewhat like a motorboat). Three of the units have (or had) severe intermittent oscillations on X-band frequencies (1650-1700 kHz), although this issue was completely corrected in one of the models by transplantation of a 7.5" replacement loopstick (go figure). These oscillations are unpredictable, loud and irritating - something that I've never encountered in testing any new Ultralight radio over an 11 year period. The combination of the lack of any manufacturer's warranty and a dicey quality control record is a disaster, in my opinion.

Besides these haphazard Q/C issues and the lack of any warranty the R-108 models do have other limitations, such as a relatively wimpy audio amp which maxes out too easily on weak stations, a small rechargeable battery which seems to wimp out after relatively short operating time and a digital display which whines when it is grasped by the palm of your hand.

I have transferred two of the dicey R-108 models to my long-term tech buddy Steve Ratzlaff in Arizona, where he is running further tests on them. There is some initial indication that the desert heat may be snapping the models into better shape, although Steve is doing all the testing on them (his radios) from now on. Unless you have some serious Navy training in electronics repair (like Steve and I) my recommendation is that you pass on the R-108, and purchase a quality radio with a good manufacturer's warranty.
