- 940t MÉXICO XERKS, Reynosa, Tam. JUN 7 1112 tropical music from N/S, 1114 maybe ID just at our earliest sunrise, but too much splash from local 960 KGWA. There are no US Spanish along this axis, and very likely XERKS Reynosa, Tamaulipas, 1/1 kW, with a romántica format. Some other 940s have left for FM, per IRCA Mexican log, such as XEYJ in Coahuila, but not including XEQ. [GH-OK]
- 1039.61 VENEZUELA La Voz de Carabobo, YVLB, Valencia. MAY 23 0100 Male Spanish vocal through top-of-hour. [MC-MA]

- 1230t MÉXICO XEIZ, Radio Fórmula, Monterrey, NL. JUN 3 1059 as I am hoping to ID something domestic just before our sunrise 1115 [almost to earliest 1113 in a week], instead I definitely hear in the graveyard jumble the choral strains of the Mexican NA, looping roughly south. IRCA Mexican log lists only 6 on 1230, uncertain status for some (vs 13 on 1240 which don't have to protect clear channel 1220). The closest and most likely, especially if on 10 kW day power, is XEIZ, also in the UT-5 zone where a NA would be expected at 6 am CDT. [GH-OK] 1310 MÉXICO UnID JUN 7 1103 – choral Mexican NA loops between South and SSW; 1105 announcement by super-hype voice actor, probably full ID but just
- too much QRM. From direction, timezone and power, most likely is XETIA in Guadalajara (as in tapatía), but lesser stations also in Taxco, Monterrey and Puebla if not the CP in Querétaro. Then it's overcome by another Spanish from east/west, must be Unitedstatesian, ie KZIP. [GH-OK] 1620 US VIRGIN ISLANDS WDHP Frederiksted, Saint Croix. MAY 25 0118 – noted with "It's time... on The Reef 103.5" mention by a female announcer. The
- signal was noted mixing with Radio Rebelde and an unidentified Spanish language station. [KK-VA]

*** TROPICAL BAND DX ***

- DPR KOREA KCBS, Pyongyang. MAY 25 1150 Very strong signal, and noted that both marine/tropical band and higher SW bands hot this morning at 2850 local daybreak. Dramatic sounding instrumental music, then operatic music to ToH, where they went to man and woman in Korean dialogue. [RB-AZ]
- 2940+ COLOMBIA HJNT, Radio Huellas, Cali. MAY 19 0605 - as previously IDed, carrier obviously there despite high storm noise level here. I am surprised that there have been so few reports of this second harmonic, in fact the only active Colombian (almost)-SW station. Where are the DXers elsewhere in North America, let alone Latin America? Maybe just as well, as attempts to QSL it might lead to its demise. [GH-OK]
- JAPAN Radio Nikkei 1. Chiba-Nagara. MAY 19 1130 Heard on SW-2000629, window frame antenna. Lot of excited banter in Japanese, man and 3925 woman, strong, no music heard so far today. [RB-AZ] +JUN 4 1130 – Another Japanese talk show w/two men, a woman, in dialogue. Fair. [RB-AZ]
- REP KOREA Voice of the People, Kyonggi-do Koyang. MAY 18 1130 woman in Korean. Jammed, as was //3910. Jamming not audible on //3480. 3930 [RB-AZ]
- 3945 JAPAN Radio Nikkei 2, Chiba-Nagara. JUN 4 1200 – Pop/Rock, Female presenter. As the Summer Solstice approaches, hearing this one, much past this hour in the morning, will be difficult. [RB-AZ]
- GUATEMALA Radio Verdad, Chiquimula. MAY 30 1130 Guatemalan Marimba music very good. [RB-AZ] 4055

4765 CUBA Radio Progreso, Bejucal. JUN 1 0440 - surprised to find Radio Progreso carrier still on, after nominal 0400*; maybe a trace of modulation? Something's always wrong at RadioCuba. [GH-OK]

- CHINA Voice of Strait, Fuzhou. MAY 19 1200 Pop vocal music, power love ballad (Love Hurts/Nazareth). Lubec, Maine DXpedition - May 23-28 2019

6/1. Last week I was in Lubec, Maine birding and DXing.

I stayed at the usual Quoddy House and some of you were able to listen on the KiwiSDR I had hooked up temporarily. The KiwiSDR and my own Perseus were connected to a 160' DKAZ at 105 deg. and the web page describing what I've pulled off wav files so far is here: http://realmonitor.com/am_logs_qh13.php

Highlights so far are South Africa on 657, 702, 729 and 828 kHz, nearly 20 Brazilians, a half-dozen Argentines and Uruguay on 770

April 2019 Hong Kong Ultralight DXpedition (detailed loggings - Gary DeBock)

6/5. For traveling DXers looking to set up gain antennas on salt water beaches, Hong Kong is about as bad as it gets. Because of the highest population density on the planet most of its beaches are either privately owned, inaccessible or overcrowded, with dubious security. The additional quirks of having loud RFI in many areas, five local AM pests and prolific mainland Chinese stations from 531-1593 kHz add to its "worst case scenario" DXing reputation. In order to make any real progress in Hong Kong AM-DXing it was necessary to "think outside of the box," taking Ultralight radios on daytime DXing trips to

Macau, and Hong Kong's Rockwork-like plunging cliff of Cape D'Aguilar (the previous British administration's chosen site for the territory's long range communications antennas). A wild and wacky harbor side sunset skip session was tried on April 7th, resulting in some awesome Vietnamese, Thai and Bangladesh signals on a 5 inch FSL antenna (as well as a pretty bizarre crowd of staring Chinese onlookers). Finally, after a complete lack of long range DX on the first five days, the desperate measure of shoving a souped-up Ultralight radio outside the security window of our 12th floor apartment building around sunrise resulted in four surprising signals from Eastern Europe, Africa and the Middle East.

DXing in Hong Kong was a crash course in overcoming RFI, ultra-crowded beaches, five Chinese dialects and six Southeast Asian languages, but after a serious assist from the Real DX language experts the results were definitely worth the effort. Multiple unusual stations from Taiwan, Vietnam and Thailand pounded in at serious strength, many of which have never shown up on our west coast. 585-LNR in Laos managed an S9 signal, along with good signals from 1413-Oman and (briefly) 1431-Djibouti. Several mysteries from Hawaii DXing were solved by this Hong Kong trip, and vice versa. For west coast DXers looking for a close range investigation of exotic Southeast Asian targets, Hong Kong has a lot to offer - once you get outside of the RFI-saturated motels.

- CHINA Zhejiang RGD synchros. Rapid-paced female Mandarin speech slowly losing out to Taiwan's music program at 1623 on 4/6; this lady's voice 531 matches that of a 531 Chinese UnID recorded in Poipu, Hawaii under JOQG, pretty much solving the mystery

6/10. File review is continuing on recordings from a very interesting trip, with 17 more Southeast Asian loggings from 603-648 kHz (for a total so far of 34 stations recorded from 531-648 kHz). The diversity of loggings was related to two daytime DX trips to Macau and Hong Kong's Cape D'Aguilar, a waterfront DXing session featuring sunset skip across Southeast Asia, and late evening apartment DXing by shoving a souped-up Ultralight outside a 12th floor security window.

DXing in Hong Kong is turning out to be a bonanza to solve Hawaii DXing mysteries, and vice versa. The excited female Chinese speaker in a 648-BCC (N) Taiwan recording was matched to the same excited voice in a Hawaii 630 UnID recording, finally solving the identity mystery. The same thing happened with a 531-Zhejiang RGD female Mandarin recording and a Tagalog-speaking lady on 666 with an identical voice to a Hawaii UnID on 954 (Philippine Broadcasting Service). With a lengthy list of exotic targets from Hong Kong DXing, the November Poipu, Hawaii DXpedition should be ready to hit the ground running

Greetings. All times and dates strictly UT. Receiver: mostly DX-398 with internal antenna only or PL-880; NRD-545 with ALA-330S inside E-W or inside random wire N-S; Nissan stock caradio as specified; or IC-R75 with E-W longwire.

May 27 starting at 1900, less than one semihour after local mean noon, bandscans on caradio from central Enid at a fairly quiet parking lot, at least so at the long end of MW/low end of MF. No storm noise now, but increasing line noise higher in the AM band. I skip over many frequencies, only some notable items:

530, 'K530AM', Vance AFB is still off and maybe gone forever, rather than inane loops of Ad Council PSAs, interspersed with occasional imaginary IDs and never heard with any traffic or emergency info. As in DXLD 18-30, it had been "off the air again for a few days" as of July 18 2018 - and never heard since despite regular checks. If it does resume, I shall be sure to report it.

560, fast SAH, maybe 20 Hz, presumably KWTO MO and KLZ CO at the limits of their groundwaves 300+ and 400+ miles. But MWoffsets has KLZ at .0000 and KTWO only 0.3 Hz away at .9997 - nothing anywhere near 20 Hz away.

630, JBA talk, presumably KHOW Denver with far better Ogallala Aquifer conductivity than KYFI St Louis beyond the Ozarks.

650, JBA talk, presumably KGAB Orchard Valley WY (Cheyenne) as previously under optimum GW conditions, like the Denverites.

670, "Call to Freedom" program with Denver address: KLTT Commerce City CO (Denver), a regular at the margins with 50 kW; no WSCR today.

1070, KFTI Wichita KS, country, is OFF! Very unusual; Memorial holiday break? Hope they are fixing their off-frequency-minus transmitter; yeah, sure. KNX beware. But this allows weak 1080 KRLD Dallas to be heard without splash. KFTI still off at 1948 check.

1090, weak religious talk, no doubt 10 kW KEXS Excelsior Springs MO (Kansas City); highest frequency daytime GW from that area, 300+ miles, continues to amaze me. 1130, KLEY Wellington KS, still OFF as has been for some weeks now.

1190, medium SAH, presumably our two closest but also too far: KVSV Beloit KS, and KFXR Dallas TX.

1230, WBBZ Ponca City OK, is OFFI Very unusual for this semi-local which has not been noted with any techdiffs. Another holidayer? Still off at 1949 recheck. Nothing else audible, like the only other Okie, which I *need*, KADA, where else but, Ada?

1460, KZUE El Reno OK, still on unlike off, knocked by previous tornado. Spanish talk, and PSA in Spanish for "The Marines"! So not plugged into Mexico City yet.

Re the name of the hmotel in El Reno hit by tornado, I finally got a glimpse on KFOR of their sign still standing, American Budget Inn, I think. Then

reporter verbalized it: American Value Budget Inn, or Budget Value per the graphics. Confusing. 1580, KLTR [sic] Blackwell OK, now it's 1909, dead air, while sibling 1020 KOKP Perry OK is nominal. I think there has been flooding in Blackwell. Now to other logs in frequency order first, rather than date:

770, June 7 at 0533, WABC ID in passing amid adstring. Not often makes it here, 1300+ miles from NYC, with the KKOB Santa Fe 230-watt filler

more likely. WABC soon fades out completely as music fades up, matched to Rebelde, Cuba. 1070, May 28 at 2115, and May 29 at 1333, KFTI Wichita KS is still off the air. Nothing about this at website https://www.classiccountry1070.com/ which even still refers to its old call KFDI!

1069.977, May 29 at 1925, shortly after my last report, I find that KFTI Wichita KS has come back on air after several days; why off, storm damage or flooding? "Classic Country 10-70" [sic]. Meanwhile did nothing to correct its off-frequency, re-measured as above at 1535 May 30. MWoffsets had it: 1070 1069.9793 USA KFTI (Wichita KS) [-1070.0045 range] 2018-01-02 which means an annoying 21.2 Hz SAH or LAH against KNX: 1070 1070.0005 USA KNX (Los Angeles/El Nido CA) 2017-10-31 i IBOC when both are audible, though KFTI night power cuts from 10 kW to 1.

1230, trying to get some DX while semi-local WBBZ Ponca City is off; at least KADA. Best times will be circa SR/SS for nearby skywave but not full of graveyard QRM. May 28 at 1408 is really too late, but I do detect two or three JBA carriers. May 29 at 0058, vs storm noise from SE OK, have some music looping NW/SE as Ada would be; NRC AM Log says format is rock as "Pirate Radio 102.3"; at 0102 end Fox News theme from N/S. Guess what, there is not a single 1230 in Kansas. Two in Nebraska, neither listed as Fox. Texas? Ten, of which two are Spanish and the only TX Fox in the Log is KWTX Waco, but that's hardly enough to go on.

1230, May 28 at 2115 and May 29 at 1333, WBBZ Ponca City still completely off the air, probably due to flooding. This is supposedly the website, with nothing about it, forwarded here after clicking on a 1230 link! https://www.poncapost.com/sunny-104-7.

1230, May 30 circa 2225, WBBZ Ponca City is still off the air; due to flooding?

1230, May 31 at 0155, looking for DX in absence of WBBZ Ponca City, but now it's after sunset when there is plenty of other QRM: briefly atop is a Rangers silly baseball game, 0156 break for ad, but if local cannot copy it. DF seems NNW/SSE.

Texas Rangers provides map and station list on one page as of 5.21.19! https://content.mlb.com/documents/5/4/8/302771548/ 2019_Map_Rangers_Radio_Network_Coverage_Area.pdf

On 1230, there are two: KSEY Haskell TX, near Wichita Falls, SSW of here, West of Arlington KSST Sulphur Springs, in NE TX, SE of here, East of Arlington (but in Waco not on KWTX), so KSST is more likely by DF. I am no station-counter so less than 100% certainty is no problem. It is what it is.

1230, June 5 at 0017, WBBZ Ponca City is still OFF, so I try again to ID some DX on this graveyard. At the moment there is a heavy 2.0 Hz SAH, between a music station, suspected my closest KADA Ada, and some talk station.

1230, June 7 at 0031, music segués on strong signal, must be semi-local WBBZ Ponca City reactivated, as of June 6 since it was certainly not on the day before. First noted off May 27 following storms and flooding so that's 11 days lost, during which I did not gain much luck definitely DXing on this graveyard. Yes, at 0048, "Thanks for staying with us, Sunny 104.7 moved to 1230, with Delilah on the air every evening" – that change happened quite a while ago as I previously commented; while sibling station really on 104.7 is now something else. Continues with some PSAs.

1240, June 2 at 1301, Wichita, "Sports Radio KFH, 1240 AM, 97.5 FM" and join ESPN. 97.5 is a mere translator, K248CY, per NRC AM Log, yet misquotes ID as with 98.7 FM. WTFDA FM Database shows 98.7 as KNSS-FM, News/Talk, CoL Clearwater not Wichita, and not //1330 AM although that is now KNSS, since 1330 and 1240 swapped calls several years ago. I slid up here after another attempt to ID anything on non-WBBZ 1230.

1310, June 7 at 1106, noticias and La Caliente ID in passing, looping E/W, just faded up over a real Mexican [qv]. NRC AM Log shows it's our closest to the west, KZIP Amarillo TX, U1 1000/88/500 watts PSRA, where they know how to spell hot.

1310, June 8 at 0631, Colorado Broadcasters Association PSA, guess who? 0632 refers to KFKA.com, and Colorado Army National Guard PSA. Last logged presumably on October 18 2011. It's U2 5/1 kW, ie ND day, tight slightly clockwise from N/S night pattern not good for here to the SE of Greeley CO, making me suspect they are now on 5 kW ND day pattern.

1450, June 5 at 2035 near Perry OK on I-35, two stations mixing, one of which is certainly closest KGFF Shawnee OK, making a SAH of about 190/minute or slightly over 3 Hz. In Enid it's KGFF vs KSIW Woodward, but now we are out of range from Woodward, so what could it be? No 1450s in eastern OK, but the next closest must be KQYX Galena KS, named for the wonderful lead mines in this SE corner of Kansas, but address in nearby Joplin MO. IIRC, call KQYX used to apply to some genuine Joplin station.

1580, May 28 circa 1400, KOKB Blackwell is still dead air on open carrier. At least it is on the air, although accomplishing nothing. In previous report under USA daytime bandscan, I called it KLTR! It's really been KOKB since – 3/20/84, 35 years ago. Oops. Fixed:

1580, KOKB Blackwell OK, now it's 1909, dead air, while sibling 1020 KOKP Perry OK is nominal. There has been flooding in Blackwell.

But why? Somehow the program feed from Stillwater studio has been cut. Why not turn off the transmitter in the meantime? Maybe site is inaccessible by flooding, and/or there is no functional remote control - now or never?

Still on with dead air at 2115 check May 28, and at 1333 May 29. Nothing about this found on the website https://www.eteamradio.com/. Flooding in Blackwell is still reported May 29.

1580, May 29 at 1925, shortly after my previous report, KOKB Blackwell has finally resumed modulating //1020 KOKP Perry, with Stillwater ad, whence both of them originate. Flooding may be abating now if that was the cause of modulation loss, though carrier always stayed on.

1640, June 5 at 0520, KZLS "Enid", really east of Hennessey to put more signal into OKC with its NNW/SSE directional pattern, unusual for an inland X-bander, in dead air. So I try nulling it for access to WTNI or anything else, but still too much KZLS, which makes me wonder if it's still on 10 kW instead of 1, while WTNI may be on 1 kW instead of 10! By 0540 KZLS has resumed talkmod.
