Half Of Chicago AM Time-Share To Sign-Off, By Lance Venta On January 9 2020

Migala Communications will sign-off Brokered Ethnic 1450 WCEV Cicero IL on January 20. For its entire forty year history, WCEV has operated in a time-share with Midway Broadcasting's 1450 WRLL Chicago. The two stations were born after Globetrotter Broadcasting surrendered the license for 1450 WVON in 1975 after purchasing 1390/107.5 from McClendon Broadcasting. WCEV currently operates from 1-10 pm Monday through Friday, 1-8:30 pm Saturday and 5 am-10 pm on Sundays with Spanish "The Real" WRLL operating all other hours. WCEV has not indicated whether it will just be going silent or surrendering its license to allow WRLL to move to full-time operation.

Well, only 11 days till our movers come to start packing our stuff for Albuquerque, looking forward to moving to New Mexico. Please note the new address on the top of the column effective 1/31/20. It will definitely be a change of pace from Maryland, and I start my new job at Kirtland AFB Monday 2/3/20. Hope everything goes smoothly, we leave for Albuquerque Sunday 1/26 with stops in Knoxville TN, Little Rock AR and Amarillo TX 3 nights and 4th day get to Albuquerque, home closing is 1/30/20. "VBTC is glad to announce that coverage of Radio Vanuatu will soon expand thanks to the arrival of new radio transmitters. The new 10kw Nautel Medium Wave (AM) transmitter, being imported from Canada, will arrive into Port Vila next week and will be installed by mid-November.

A new 10kw HF shortwave transmitter is currently being finalized in the Hanjin Electronics factory in South Korea. The transmitter is scheduled to arrive in Vanuatu in early December. Following the improvements to shortwave and medium wave services, VBTC will also undertake technical work to strengthen the coverage and reliability of its FM services.

The installation of these two new transmitters is part of Phase One of VBTC's major infrastructure upgrade to improve radio and free-to-air television service throughout Vanuatu. VBTC thanks the Government of Vanuatu for its support."





CANADA. 223-MCW kHz, January 12 at 0727, dash and YYW, 1000 watt NDB at Armstrong, Ontario.

CANADA [and non]. 245 kHz, January 7 at 0735, ND beacon dash and YZE, 1000 watts at Gore Bay, Ontario, mixing on same frequency but different pitches with stronger 400 watt FS, Sioux Falls - Rock, South Dakota.

CANADA, 272-MCW kHz, January 9 at 0710, dash and YQA, ND beacon, 400 watts at Muskoka Falls, Ontario, per dxinfocentre.com one of those to be decommissioned on March 26.

276-MCW kHz, January 9 at 0712, dash and YEL, NDB – have I got Yellowknife? NO, it's just ELliot Lake, Ontario, 200 watts. (Yellowknife is ZF on 356 kHz, 3800 watts - should be on lookout for that).

USA. 329-MCW kHz, January 12 at 0226, ND beacon PMV, which is 25 watts from Plattsmouth, Nebraska.

365-MCW kHz, January 12 at 0222, ND beacon HQG, which is 25 watts from Hugoton, Kansas; I was tuned to 363-USB.

420-MCW kHz, January 12 at 0219, ND beacon PK, which is 25 watts from Olathe - Herbb, Kansas.

CANADA. 335-MCW kHz, January 8 at 0712, dash and ND beacon YLD, which is 1000 watts from Chapleau, Ontario. 353-MCW kHz, January 8 at 0715, dash and NDB PG, which is 25 watts at Portage-la-Prairie, Manitoba. CCI from two USA stations, qv.

USA. 353-MCW kHz, January 8 at 0715, besides PG from CANADA, qv, two US NDBs mixing, IN and LI. Same pitch but different pitch than PG; IN and LI have slightly different periods, so if you listen long enough they are more or less alternating rather than conflicting making for "strange" Morse code. IN is 100 watts from International Falls, Minnesota; LI is 400 watts from Little Rock, Arkansas.

USA, 379-MCW, January 6 at 0712-0715, two ND beacons mixing, DL, 500 watts from Duluth-Pike Lake MN; and BRA, 400 watts from Asheville-Broad River NC. I was tuned to 377-USB.

MOROCCO. 595.9, January 5 at 0651, JBA carrier, way off-frequency from 594 as I bandscan. Exactly the same offset as in previous log; have been alert for this since but not caught again until now: "595.9, October 25 at 0608, JBA carrier. Before a bandscan, I check for this first, as the lowpower 50 kW Oujda transmitter of SNRT has been reported by Chris McWhinnie and Alan Pennington of the British DX Club, further off-frequency than usual 595 instead of 594, and there it is! Wolfgang Bueschel precisioned it at 595.896."

SPAIN [and non]. 684+, 0531 January 1, significantly off-frequency TA carrier, compared to eg 693.00; such variations are very obvious when tuning 9 kHz steps with BFO at 1-kHz offsets, my usual method. RNE is the 200 kW bigsig here and have had it before; off-ness confirmed at mwoffsets, this time relatively recently: "684.074 E RNE Radio Nacional (Sevilla/Los Palacios) 24h 2019-02-11 sometimes on 684.07" – no other 684 is anywhere that far above. The 693 for comparison is probably 150 kW BBC Radio 5 Live, although three low-power Spaniards are also listed.

UnID. 693, January 5 at 0659, two JBA carriers beating. Major station is BBC Radio 5 Live, with multiple synchros; a few in Algeria and Spain no more than 20 kW. MWOffsets shows the Spaniards are more spread out than the Brits almost all spot-on. If I have any TA carrier on 774, such as 0102 January 2, it's at least two of them, making a beat among the multiple RNE outlets. In this case, mwoffsets shows none more than 3 Hz low; Egypt is way off high, 774.17 or 774.8.

SPAIN. 774, January 5 at 0650, usual two carriers beating, 0653 Spanish talk from RNE1 synchros, headed by 100 kW València and seven others down to 10 kW. Does anyone know which be off-frequency? MWOffsets shows Valencia only 0.2 Hz low and no others more than 3 Hz minus. Iran and Egypt both have high-power 774s considerably off-frequency+plus, but would not expect them to be involved this late into their daytimes. Only other Europeans are very low powers in Italy and UK. 774 is the #1 audible TA frequency here; just as it is the #1 audible TP frequency later from Japan. Someone pointed out that around 0700 both of these could propagate midwinter to North America; not tonight when I also checked from the NW. Nor was there much from NHK an hour before sunrise.

ALGERIA. 891, January 5 at 0649, woman in Arabic; best heard yet, the reactivated Ouled Fayet 600 kW transmitter of RA-1 near Algiers.

Wolfgang Bueschel thinks these superpowers are running about half to save costs. Mostly separable from WLS by USB tuning.

USA. 980, January 12 at 0009 amid my JBA TA carrier bandscan, I notice an open carrier upon this TA/NA frequency, still so at 0014. DFing makes it NE/SW, and surely my nearest KMBZ Kansas City MO which normally dominates at night here, and of which there is no other sign. Main QRM is Spanish music NNW/SSE, making SAH of 204/minute = 3.4 Hz, very likely KQUE Houston market TX. Can it be that no one is paying attention at one of KC's major(?) radio stations? Transmitter site is east of Stateline.

UnID. 1060, January 12 at 1445, two notes looping over and over, accompanied by a constant bassier note. Loops WSW/ENE, suspected KIJN Farwell TX.

USA. 1090, Saturday January 11 at 0702, KAAY Little Rock with series of jokes to a laughing audience, stand-up? Not the usual gospel-huxtering; XEAU Monterrey at right angle needs to be nulled instead of vice-versa; 0705 ads; 0708 opening the NBC-TV Today show hour with Hoda and Jenna for January 10! but no video here. Seems a drastic format change. Maybe this is not 'Beaker Street', but a related story sent on by Rick Barton, AZ; very vague about when BS would be on: "Beaker Street," Clyde Clifford's pioneering late-night radio show, is back on the air. The program debuted on 50,000-watt AM radio station KAAY in 1966 and established itself as an underground dispatch – and as an antidote to commercial radio's milquetoast formulas and penchants for repeating the same 100 classic rock tracks on a carousel. Clifford favored deeper and longer album cuts than daytime mainstream radio had patience for, and because he broadcast the show from KAAY's Wrightsville location, where the station's transmitter was located, he set his mellow narration to a backdrop of freaky space sounds to muffle the transmitter's hum - a trademark that so defined the show that it had to be kept, even when "Beaker Street" found life in other, more noise-controlled studios. Now, with Clifford's (real name: Dale Seidenschwarz) retirement from a decades-long day job in the rearview mirror (barely), the beloved rock radio bulletin is slated for a revival on Arkansas Rocks, a coalition of veteran radio talent that, like Clifford, skews less toward stuff like "Hotel California" and more toward the likes of "Traveller in Time." Stay tuned for more on Clifford's return to the airwaves, scheduled for February 2020. Until then, here's Arkansas Rocks' air talent Tom Wood bringing the good news... https://arktimes.com/entertainment/2020/01/07/beaker-street-is-back

USA. 1090, what in the world is going on at KAAY Little Rock? Even more strangeness than heard last night: January 12 at 0655, woman and man discussing: pizza! But audio is continuously breaking up severely like internet buffering. Then mentions "see it", a smokeless grill, so this is audio of a TV infomercial (taking a cue from co-channel XEAU Monterrey which does the same thing in Spanish at these hours). Sound is horrible. "Exclusive TV offer" runs past ToH 0700, 0702 ending disclaimer and NO ID, but from DF and usual dominance, I am sure it's KAAY. At 0704, still breaking up, starts 'Judge Judy' TV show! (Yesterday it was NBC-TV Today Hoda Koth hour.) 0724 recheck, still JJ breaking up.

OKLAHOMA. 1530, January 12 at 0718, Spanish ID mentions Tulsa and FM. So Spanish at night isn't necessarily KGBT. KXTD Wagoner OK is a 5 kW directional DAYTIMER. NRC AM Log shows its FMs are on 104.9 and 100.3. Could this explain it? Should not; Paul Walker reported last November 7: "OK, this has to be one of the oddest explanations I've ever read for requesting Special Temporary Authority. KXTD-AM 1530 Wagoner OK is requesting permission to operate at lower than its licensed 5000 watts and to do it Non directional after a trampoline flying through the air during a tornado toppled one of their towers".

UnID. Trans-Atlantic JBA MW carrier search January 12 at 0006-0013: 531* strongest; 558(2), 576, 585, 639, 657, 693(2), 711, 729, 738, 774(2), 801, 819, 837, 855, 882, 891, 909, 936(2), 999, 1008, 1017, 1044, 1089, 1098, 1107(2), 1125(2), 1152, 1179, 1215(2), 1296, 1305(2), 1422, 1485 and 1539

USA. 1860-AM, Saturday January 11 at 1611, WA0RCR in full daytime is S9+20 with ham news; unfortunately my local noise level on 160m is also S9+20. But it does achieve wide coverage, especially wintry.

USA [and non]. WORLD OF RADIO 2016 monitoring: confirmed Saturday January 11 at 2058 on WA0RCR, 1860-AM, my intonation barely recognizable in hi noise level for the 2030v broadcast. Also confirmed Sunday January 12 at 0431 on WA0RCR, 1860-AM, Wentzville MO, about 2 minutes into so started circa 0429.

USA. 2097.3-CW, January 7 at 0728 the single-letter beacon A is back! ID every dekasecond. Also January 8 at 0220. Have included this in bandscans despite last reported by Steve Zimmerman, WI on August 20. It was so regular that I did not always log it but noted October 11 that it was no longer to be heard. Last time I did log it was August 3. Originally thought to be in Quartzsite AZ, but then denied to be there, yet presumably somewhere in SW USA.

CANADA. 2598-USB, January 8 at 0655, marine weather in English by roboyl, with slight reverb: could there be two transmitter sites emitting the same feed? S7 vs S5 noise level and hard to copy. 0658 mentions "northern Grand Banks" i.e. off NF "storm warnings in effect". 0701 " – radio, out". But none of the three references checked show any broadcasts on this frequency just before 0700! Placentia NL VCP supposedly starts at 0737. Nothing was on sibling frequency 2749-USB.

OKLAHOMA. 4600, January 10 at 0332, SBG //1390, i.e. a mixing product from local KCRC ESPN, but how? It's almost always weakly audible as transmitted rather than receiver overload. The only formula I can come up with for a combination with our other local, KGWA 960, is: 4 x 1390 = 5560; 5560 minus 960 = 4600!

CUBA. 5040, January 7 at 0721, Radio Havana Cuba English still on here with squeal, //6060 stronger than 6145. 5040 needs to get out of way for Vanuatu from 0630.

USA. 5130, January 10 at 0345, WBCQ is on with an 'Allan Weiner Worldwide' but very poor, rough copy; referring to some story Artie sent him, mentioning local origination and city of license; an old repeat; 0400 sign-off theme from the "family" at WBCQ. Schedule shows 5130 on air Friday at 0200-0400 with 'Christian Missionary Radio Evangelism' and 'Radio for Peace International' at 0300 – but now that presumably in French is apparently gone. Own website https://www.rfpi.eu/nous-ecouter/comment-ecouter-radio-for-peace-internationale.html shows both summer and winter schedules. Summer had 5130 from unknown station at 0200-0300 but only on the first Thursday [sic] of the month, while winter eliminates that completely.
