Legendary KLIV 1590 San Jose CA isn't dead, it looks like it's going to sputter back to life. KLIV will be getting an STA for 500 Watts from a wire antenna to be located at 556 N 16th Street, San Jose, a residential neighborhood. One end will be attached to a temporary portable tower, the other end is going to be attached to a tree. This is to keep the license alive while a sale is in the works to Pham Radio Communications which also owns KVVN 1430 Santa Clarita CA (Santa Claria CA, Santa Clarita is near Los Angeles-ye ed) (ADDITIONAL NOTE: I USED TO LIVE IN SAN JOSE FOR 36 YEARS FROM 1966-2002, I KNOW 16TH STREET AREA VERY WELL NOT FAR FROM WHERE I WENT TO SJSU 1978-1983)! Great they're coming back on the air after a year off the air!! They may run a DX test soon with as little as 24 hour notice per some other information sent from Mike Sanburn-ye ed).

Legendary Pittsburgh Radio Station KQV Returns To Air, by Fern Siegel, December 26 2019

Radio stations change formats and even call letters. But it's something else to be resurrected. Pittsburgh's KQV-AM, the former news-talk station that reigned as a pop-music giant in the 1950s, '60s and '70s, is back. KQV remained an all-news station from 1975 until its sign-off 42 years later. Now, KQV, 1410 AM, is running a beautiful music-easy listening format under owner Broadcast Communications. What's interesting is that KQV, one of the oldest radio stations in the US, is airing at all. The station went dark on December 31 2017. Broadcast Communications Inc. – which owns several AM and FM stations in Western Pennsylvania – purchased the station from Calvary Inc. for \$55,000, debt-free, a month later. At the time, Robert Dickey Jr, KQV's departing vice president-general manager, whose family owned Calvary, cited declining advertising revenue and increased labor costs as reasons for the closure, according to the Pittsburgh Tribune-Review. BCI owners Robert and Ashley Stevens have since transferred KQV to their not-for-profit 501(c)3 organization, Broadcast Educational Communications.

The sale of KQV did not include the broadcast towers or the site property in the North Hills. Instead, equipment was moved and updated at BEC's WKGO (88.1) broadcast tower in North Versailles, Pennsylvania. A diplexer allows KQV to simulcast its easy-listening programming with sister station WKGO.

WYPC, 1330, Wellston OH latest to go silent around here. No sign of 'em the last two days. Don't know about their 105.3 FM repeater in Jackson. WYPC is owned by the same company that owns all three Jackson area FMs, 96.7 in Jackson, 97.7 in Wellston (nor apparently licensed to Oak Hill), and 98.7 McArthur. They also owned the old Jackson AM on 1280, but took that off the air 25 years ago. WYPC joins WJEH, 990, WLYQ, 1050, and WHNK, 1450, all silent. WLYQ may have its carrier on but I can't be sure. Getting a barely readable signal from WLUX, Dunbar WV, (Charleston) on 1450. Positive ID @1300 EST.

I can't say I'm too surprised the Parkersburg stations are in trouble. The Marietta-Parkersburg area is served, when everybody's on, by 6 AM and 21 FM signals, and that for an area with less than 100,000 people.

Mike Sanburn sends along the following from Paul Walker Jr. (original contribution from Dennis Gibson of Salinas CA) via the IRCA IO Groups dated 1/24/20:

The Nebraska Rural Radio Association has turned in the license for KOAQ-AM 1320 Scottsbluff NE (it was formerly KOLT). They bought several stations from Legacy Communications and had to divest themselves of two stations... they sold one of the FMs. The AM license was turned in because it was in poor shape and needed way too much work to be financially viable and brought back up to NRRA standards.

From Coastal Breeze News On Facebook:

The building housing transmitters for two Marco Island Christian radio stations burned to the ground Wednesday morning forcing both off the air. Firemen were called to Curcie Rd between Marco and route 41 at 12:23 am Wednesday to find the building engulfed. No persons were present when the fire occurred. Cause of the blaze is not known. WCNZ AM 1660 and WVOI AM 1480 were using the building at the time of the blaze. WVOI was Marco's first station beginning in 1984 as WWWO and operated with 1,000 watts during daylight hours. Later the station received permission from the FCC to operate day and night and change

call letters to WMIB. Later in 1993 it became WODX and finally WVOI in 2002. The station was home to many radio personalities including Joe Klimus, Steve Reynolds, Paul Lethbridge and Bob Ladd all heard at one time or another on the morning shows with Klimus and Ladd also broadcasting high school football and basketball, WVOI operated from studios at various locations over the years including South Collier Blvd next to the theater, Manatee Road, Elkcam Circle and RT 41 between Marco and Naples and at Bonita Springs. As of late the station was operating from studios at Green Bay Wisconsin. WVOI suffered damage during Hurricane Irma and was operating at 250 watts when the fire occurred. WCNZ was operating with 10,000 watts daytime and 1,000 watts at night. Both stations were broadcasting programs from the Relevant Radio Catholic network. The current owners of both stations, Immaculate Heart Media Inc have not decided the future of the stations as yet.

Greetings. All times and dates strictly UT. Receiver: mostly DX-398 with internal antenna only or PL-880; NRD-545 with ALA-330S inside E-W or inside random wire N-S; Nissan stock caradio as specified; or IC-R75 with E-W longwire.

USA. 245 kHz, January 22 at 0709, ND beacon FS, which is 400 watts from Sioux Falls-Rock, South Dakota. I heard it first, tuned to 243-USB, where it seems not a single station is listed by **dxinfocentre.com** nor at **classaxe.com**.

329 kHz, January 22 at 0717, ND beacon PMV, which is 25 watts from Plattsmouth, Nebraska.

CANADA [and non]. 392 kHz, January 21 at 0734, ND beacon ML and dash, which is 500 watts from La Malbaie-Charlevoix, Quebec, and not to be confused with the listed dashless 25-watt ML on 392 from Monroe, Louisiana; and mixing with FMZ, which is 25 watts from Fairmont-Beklof, Nebraska. Similar pitches but slightly different periods helping to unravel them. Note that Beklof spelt backwards is Folkeb.

USA [and non]. 379 kHz, January 21 at 0737, ND beacon RUE, which is 25 watts from Russellville Arkansas; and mixing with DL, which is 50 watts from Duluth-Pike Lake, Minnesota. Same pitch but different periods. Also at 0739 mixing with BRA, which is 400 watts from Asheville-Broad River, North Carolina.

400 kHz, January 21 at 0731, ND beacon AHQ, which is 25 watts from Wahoo, Nebraska.

408 kHz, January 21 at 0730, ND beacon JDM, which is 25 watts from Colby-Wheatfield, in the NW corner of Kansas.

CANADA. 406 kHz, January 23 at 0711, dash and YLJ ND beacon, which is 40 watts from Meadow Lake, Sask., and the only one listed on this frequency, a clear-channel!

CANADA [and non]. 530-CLSB, January 21 at 0726, Asian language with much more modulation on LSB than USB, i.e. CHLO Brampton Ont., 250 watts night, ethnic. AM 530 provides only 4-year-old program sked!: http://am530.ca/AM-530-Program-Schedule-February2016.pdf with generic "South Asian (Punjabi/Hindi)" overnights. But LSB! I don't recall anyone ever noting this anomaly before, as most MW DXers are not alert for it, like on certain stations in AZ/NM/CO we have monitored before. The effect of this, on longwire with no antenna manipulation, is that tuning USB, Cuba is on top; tuning LSB, CHLO is atop. Now if Enciclopedia would suppress its LSB, we'd have a more equitable share. Later chex indicate not so much of an LSB/USB disparity from CHLO; try it and what do you think?

USA. January 24 at 0216+, I quickly scan the entire MW band, and hear not a single station broadcasting live coverage of something rather important in the US Senate! Not even talk stations whose format would be disrupted the least, but most of them are secretly if not overly controlled by the Far Right, as obvious from their entire daily schedules. And golly, how are you going to fit in 20+ minutes of commercials an hour? Somehow, major cable TV networks manage to do it. But radio listeners should also be able to hear the Trump Trial. Will it be any different for the Republicans from January 27? How about FM, public radio? KOSU has been airing from NPR the first parts in the afternoons, but not in evening prime-time, still owned by sub-station The Spy with OK/indie music, far too vital to pre-empt. So The Spy wags the rest of KOSU. I also know better than even bother to check US SW stations – No public service sentiment there! Just leave Brother Scare all over the dial.

USA. 1090, January 22 at 0703 as I tune in, KAAY Little Rock ID and into its ToH dead air, presumably for another 2 or 3 minutes as usual. Someone else reported DA atop another hour, 0400. It seems multi-station owner Cumulus is incapable of running this to minimal expectations.

USA [and non]. 1090, January 24 at 0702, ToH dead air from KAAY LR causes minimal interference to XEAU Monterrey in Spanish, and almost 800 kW from 1089 Talksport UK het.

1090, January 25 at 0301.5, "AM 1090 KAAY" illegal ID and dead air until gospel music resume at 0305.0; meanwhile nothing but XEAU and 1089 UK het can be heard. So does KAAY provide a dead air news hole at top of every hour? And no one cares or notices at 700 Wellington Hills Road.

UnID. Just noticed a typo 12 days later to this report before anyone else bring it to my attention. In the frequency list should read 1017, not 2017; fixed: Trans-Atlantic JBA MW carrier search January 12 at 0006-0013: 531* strongest; 558(2), 576, 585, 639, 657, 693(2), 711, 729, 738, 774(2), 801, 819, 837, 855, 882, 891, 909, 936(2), 999, 1008, 1017, 1044, 1089, 1098, 1107(2), 1125(2), 1152, 1179, 1215(2), 1296, 1305(2), 1422, 1485 and 1539. UnID. Trans-Atlantic JBA MW carrier search, January 25 at 0251-0259: 531, 549, 576, 612, 621(2), 639, 693, 711, 774(2), 783, 819, 837(2),

UnID. Trans-Atlantic JBA MW carrier search, January 25 at 0251-0259: 531, 549, 576, 612, 621(2), 639, 693, 711, 774(2), 783, 819, 837(2), 855(2), 882*, 891, 909, 999, 1026, 1053, 1089, 1098, 1107, 1116, 1125, 1215(2), 1305, 1341, 1413(2) and 1575. *882 strongest with some audio, singing, probably BBC Wales. (2) = at least two carriers beating.

UnID. Trans-Pacific JBA MW carrier search January 20 from 1343 to 1354, local sunrise being 1341, now 3 minutes earlier than our yearly latest a biweek ago, first on the R75 with E-W longwire so no DFing, starting at top end: 1566, presumed FEBC Jeju Island, Korea South, the strongest up here and I am carefully listening for it to go off between 1344 and 1345 at scheduled beam change from Japanese to Chinese – almost at 1344.5, but it's still there! past 1345 and the next 5 minutes, when finally at 1354 I DF it on the handheld DX-398 as definitely from the NW, not WSW. So was it so strong (I almost heard some audio at first) that remained incoming after beam-switch, or did not change it on time today? Just yesterday, my neighbor Richard Allen said it did: "Oklahoma TP DX 1/19/2020, Richard Allen, January 19 #5906 IRCA Except for hearing HLAZ closing down its transmission to Japan, TP DX was non-existent here this morning. 1566, HLAZ barely audible signal at 1337 (LSR 1339); barely audible talking and some music at 1341-1342: poor Japanese language talk before close at 1344. This was the first trace of a TP signal here is nearly a fortnight. Usually audible JOUB was last heard on 1/6. Receiver: Skywave with ALA1530LNP aerial. Richard Allen, near Perry OK USA." Meanwhile a quick check of some other 9-kHz channels: also carriers on 1593, 1557, 1548, 1143, 1044 and 972 but lower ones are just about gone after sunrise here. AND at 1349, 1206-, off-frequency-minus. What could that be? MW offsets has a very good choice: "1205.96, CHN, Yanbian RGD Korean News General (Yanji/Longjing), 2000-1600, 2016-08-09" That's right next to Korea North, and at 200 kW is by far the strongest PRC station, or any east Asian, on 1206. The only other significantly below 1206 is an Indonesian, 1205.4, too far in more ways than one.

KOREA SOUTH [and non]. From a few km away, Richard Allan, IRCA independently matched my observation of January 20 under UnID about 1566 being heard beyond 1345: "Oklahoma TP DX 1/20/2020 Richard Allen January 20 #5927 – Like yesterday, only HLAZ provided any audible signal again this morning. 828 JOBB? weak het at 1330. 972 HLCA? carrier signal at 1320; still heard at 1358. 1566 HLAZ trace of a signal noted at 1319; barely audible talking at 1320 and 1332; poor signal from 1341 until close of Japanese broadcast at 1344 (LSR 1339). Surprisingly heard with barely audible signal at 1348 deteriorating to a trace by 1355-1400. Receiver: Skywave with ALA1530LNP aerial. Richard Allen, near Perry OK USA." DXers in NW USA/SW Canada also reported that was a banner day for TP MWDX which they were still getting a bihour later.

KOREA SOUTH. 1566, January 25 at 1348, JBA carrier looping NW, so FEBC Jeju again seems no longer to be making beam-switch by 1345 from Japanese to Chinese; is there no longer a language change either?

UnID. 2097.3-CW, January 21 at 0153, single-letter beacon A is JBA again although I could not hear it last night; from somewhere in SW USA.

CANADA. Re my 2598-USB mystery, marine weather from NL area on the air before 0700 when none is scheduled, sent my last report to Bill Hepburn of dxinfocenter.com and he replies: "Warnings are broadcast on receipt. I'm guessing they included amended forecasts at the same time. The official Canadian information can still be found at https://www.ccg-gcc.gc.ca/publications/mcts-sctm/ramn-arnm/part1-eng.html pdf version here... https://www.ccg-gcc.gc.ca/publications/mcts-sctm/ramn-arnm/docs/RAMN-ARNM-2019-eng.pdf who I replied: "Bill, I searched on 2598 in each file, and it is only mentioned once each in the tables of frequencies for something or other, NO details about stations. I already hunted for that at the site referred from section 1.1.1 without finding it. Glenn" "Part 2 is loaded with station information https://www.ccg-gcc.gc.ca/publications/mcts-sctm/ramn-arnm/part2-eng.html as is the .pdf which contains the entire publication. wrh" "Bill, Thanks, that's what I was looking for — I wasn't getting any hits on "2598" because every entry is "2598J3E". 39 of them, and not one accounts for any broadcasts just before 0700, my original question. Other than your previous comment apparently meaning they could show up at any time. 73, Glenn"

CANADA. RE: unscheduled weather on 2598-USB before 0700, Rick Wald, Taber, Alberta, Canada, replies January 20 on the ptsw iogroup: "Canada USB Broadcast 2598 is marine weather station. Labrador and Newfoundland just had a Winter Storm of epic/historic proportions; eclipsing every historic record they had. All in the last 96 hours!! Any chance the 2 are related??" – that may well explain extra broadcasts. I was merely wanting to find out from which of the six possible stations without being able to hear an ID.

CUBA. 4748 and 4782 approx., January 25 at 0236, wide spurblobs +/- ~17 kHz out of 4765 Radio Progreso which itself is overmodulated/distorted at S9+30. In FM mode tuning the spurs, there is a trace of the music as on 4765. Both spurs are QRMing CODAR!

UnID. 4930-USB, January 21 at 0716, JBA 2-way in Spanish with talkovers, cambios. Available now after VOA Botswana at 03-06.

CUBA. 5025, January 21 at 0715, Radio Rebelde is splattering plus/minus 10 kHz.

USA. 5085, Sunday January 26 at 0119, theatre organ music starts on WTWW-2 after a long string of ham news adding up to variable lengths, so woe betide any precise scheduling to follow, like on WAORCR. I quickly switch to stereo webcast. No intro or name of program given, and Bob Heil does not speak until 0127; 0148 wrapping up before "real music", still no name for program since is no longer in the Ozarks, and "Mister Sandman" until 0151.5 switch to the real (rock) music. Oh2, must be replay of last week's show concluding with same deprecating remark and tune, but which started circa 0100. Frankly, although I do enjoy theater organ music, after a while it all begins to sound alike, especially in the rather limited repertory he plays.

USA. 5830, January 21 at 2048, WTWW-1 night frequency is on in the daytime with PPPP. Continued on air whenever checked into evening and still at 0648 January 22, S9+10 but undermodulated.

5085, January 21 at 2048, WTWW-2 night frequency is also on in the daytime, but open carrier S9+20, even stronger than 5830. Parasitic spurs are also JBA carriers circa 5072.1 and 5097.9. 5085 still on with dead air at 2110, 2208, 2354, why such a waste of watts? Probably started modulation circa 0200 as usual. At 1845 January 22, neither is on the air again, yet?


