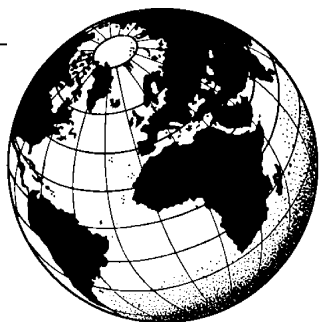

There's always a doubt as to whether it will go ahead as the project is funded by sponsorship from transmitter operator Nozema Services and antenna company NOVEC, and by private donations through a special foundation. Chasing Beacons

Andy Robins KB8QGF; Kalamazoo, Michigan USA wrote on the NDB reflector on the internet; "Hi All, I recently got a nice e-mail message from Steve Dove W3EEE in response to one I sent about his very interesting LF radio page (the one Joe in Chicago mentioned recently; see www.w3eee.com/). The NDB section is well worth checking out, as is the rest of the site.

Steve and I share an interest in the odd practice of actually trying to visit NDB transmitter sites. As they say, "Everyone needs a hobby..." In his message, Steve related an experience he had while on a recent business trip. Among other things, it goes a long way toward explaining why beacons at smaller airports sometimes disappear for periods of time, or forever. That part of his message is copied below.

"A couple of weeks ago I hit up a few new beacons on the way down to (and back from) a client's in North Carolina. (I'll put them up on the site when I get around to it.) One, in rural Virginia, was in the back yard of what from all appearances was a puppy mill - legged it away from there "really" fast with the 'Deliverance' banjo-tune playing in my head.



Another was on the other side of an airfield; far side of the runway. Got a long shot, shrugged, and was about to leave when a rather fierce looking woman snapped "Is there anything I can help you with?". Went into an oh-so-polite English-accented (easy when you are - don't even try it at home if you're not) arm-waving soliloquy on beacons in general, and, ahem, that one over there in particular. Head on side, quizzically, she said "Well, you're weird, but don't seem like too much of a threat to civilisation to me. Hello, I'm Terry, airport manager".

And so we spent the best part of an afternoon chatting about this and that, she telling me all about the local dramatic society of which she was director, how actors were such PIGS to work with et directorial cetera; she waved me across the runway to have a look and take pictures, and had coffee brewed up when I got back. Asking me if I knew anything about transmitters and such, she showed me the beacon's remote monitor in the office, which was floundering in and out of 'Fault'. "Been like that a few months, funny though, it's OK for awhile after it's been raining". I pointed out that the keying is a bit irregular, as well. "Oh, yeah. It sticks on sometimes, too. Al goes over and belts it with his elbow and it goes again."

Apparently - and this is partially the point of this saga - service rates for nav-aids, including NDBs, are egregiously high; frankly her response if it stopped working altogether would be to shrug, and let it rot. And so the market economy is whittling away at NDBs, and we're steadily losing them to indifference. 'Collecting' them seems almost a bit noble now; posterity and all that. In response to 'A Derbyshire Oddity' in the December issue of Medium Wave news Roger Bunney would like to relate a similar experience:

Interference hunting

“The whole of MW extending up to about 12MHz or so had dreadful crackling interference rising to S9 at 2MHz, not unlike continuous static. I first checked out the nearby industrial estate including a check by the DTI with their measuring van. Everything was clear and the problems was radiating from much further afield. I also sought the advice of the RSGB ECM committee who confirmed from the off-air recordings that it sounded like an unscreened data line on a BT trunk circuit, this had been heard and located before, once the earth is off the whole line is radiating.

Eventually a Wellbrook loop confirmed a direction along a NW/SE line. To my South East is residential and no source was found in that direction. To the North West however is another industrial estate about 1/2 mile distant (1.2 km approx). With a portable receiver I found a road where there was a massively high level of interference, it was so strong that it took over the receiver's AGC and was impossible to actually make a bearing on the interference. The whole road was just a mass of high level interference, similar to continuous static crackling and many unsuppressed electric drills! I withdrew to sort out better equipment, one with an S meter or where I could actually measure the AGC. However during this rethink period the interference just ceased !

I would suggest therefore that the interference is most likely from an overhead or underground data trunking circuit and the best course if our members experience this problem is to check out with the local DTI and they may be willing to appear and both confirm and suggest a source. No charge was made as the problem was actually heard at my home but the engineer was unable to locate the source, it was coming from quite a distance. Since the interference that Bernard has experienced runs along the road it could be overhead lines, underground trunking, overhead mains distribution with data, unlikely however to be a nearby electric fence that usually makes loud splats, unless we have digital electric fences!

The nightmare disappeared and MW is now clear. Well it is until a nearby house hangs and lights up a mass of B and Q flashing, flickering outside lights, including Father Christmas which are extended across the front of his house, up to the gables peak, down, along his fence and then along their car parking area. This radiates right up into 10MHz+ and makes odd buzzing popping noises in time with the lights pulsating etc. So what do you do, kick up and be told you're a miserable sod at Christmas time or I opt to put up with it until early Jan.”

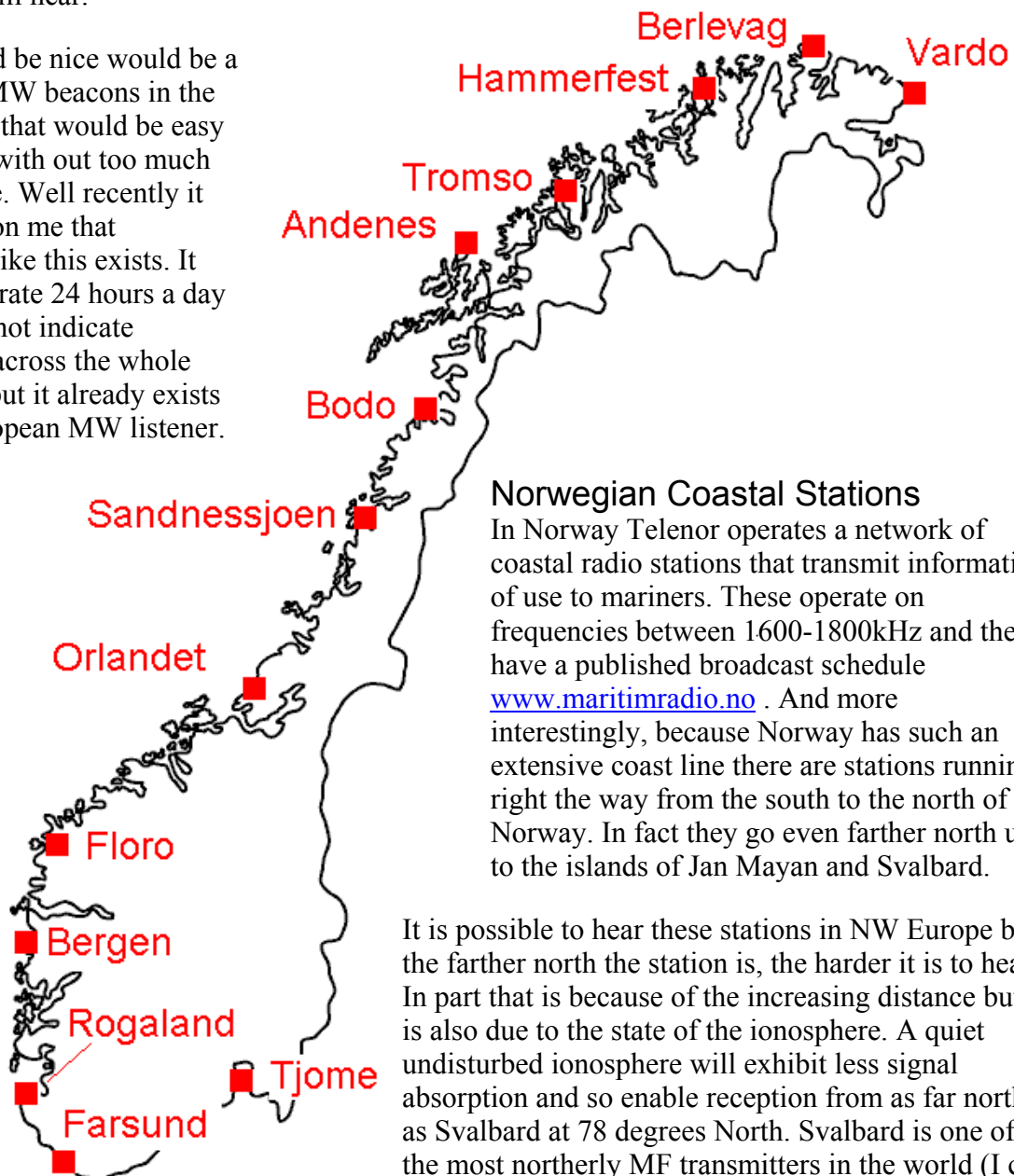

CHECKING ARCTIC MW PROPAGATION

I've often wondered how to check MW propagation through the arctic region since that will usually determine what sort of MW DX will be heard from across the Atlantic. Of course one can monitor solar A/K indices and terrestrial magnetograms. But these need interpretation to indicate what propagation will be like; in addition there is no absolute correlation between the numbers and what one will hear.

What would be nice would be a system of MW beacons in the near Arctic that would be easy to monitor with out too much interference. Well recently it dawned upon me that something like this exists. It doesn't operate 24 hours a day and it may not indicate conditions across the whole MW band but it already exists for the European MW listener.



Norwegian Coastal Stations

In Norway Telenor operates a network of coastal radio stations that transmit information of use to mariners. These operate on frequencies between 1600-1800kHz and they have a published broadcast schedule www.maritimradio.no. And more interestingly, because Norway has such an extensive coast line there are stations running right the way from the south to the north of Norway. In fact they go even farther north up to the islands of Jan Mayan and Svalbard.

It is possible to hear these stations in NW Europe but the farther north the station is, the harder it is to hear. In part that is because of the increasing distance but it is also due to the state of the ionosphere. A quiet undisturbed ionosphere will exhibit less signal absorption and so enable reception from as far north as Svalbard at 78 degrees North. Svalbard is one of the most northerly MF transmitters in the world (I can only think of the NDB "LT" on 305.0kHz at Alert in Canadian Northern Territories Lat: 82.50N, Long: 62.33W that is closer to the North Pole).

When the ionosphere is disturbed one might not hear anything from the more northerly coastal stations, so giving the listener an immediate insight into the state of the ionosphere.

The Network

In the table below I've listed stations, their locations and good listening times. Stations are listed in order from North to South.

Transmissions are maritime weather broadcast first in English then Norwegian except those marked in *italics* which are traffic lists.

I have no data on transmitter powers but I would expect them all to be similar as they have to cover similar areas of sea; a radius of about 200km. The stations probably run about 400W PEP (remember they are using J3E mode of transmission – i.e. upper sideband suppressed carrier.)

Timing

The timing is quite useful for the European MW DXer who can check whether a good night of MW DX lies ahead. If one cannot hear anything farther north than, say, Bergen it might be a good idea to go to bed. On the other hand if Andenes on 1659kHz is good and Svalbard on 1731 is audible then it could be a worth stocking up on the coffee and staying up to see what trans-polar DX might be possible.

Remember that in the mid-summer stations north of the Arctic Circle will be in permanent daylight and long distance reception will be unlikely.

Example

From my location near York in England (53.97N) I can always hear Rogaland Radio on 1692kHz because it is only 623km away and the path is non-Arctic. I also can fairly reliably hear Sandnessjoen on 1710kHz. But hearing stations farther north is much less predictable. In fact hearing Svalbard at the greatest distance of 2772km is really a challenge. (*see DX log*)

If you try monitoring this network of stations please share your thoughts and observations with the rest of the Circle.

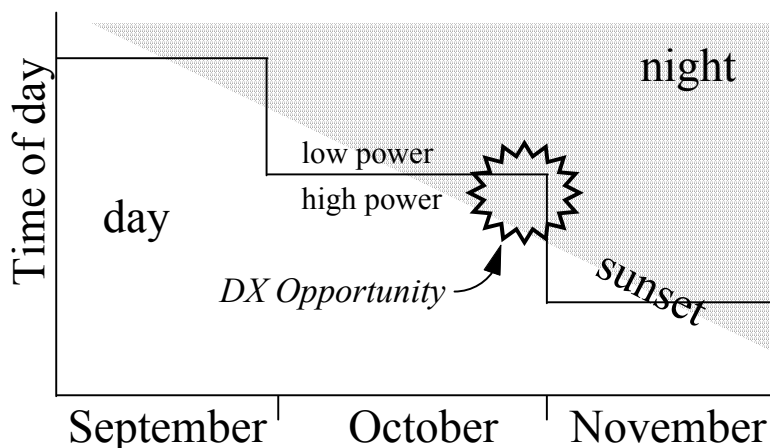
CATCH A U.S. DAYTIMER

Many American MW stations only operate during local daylight hours in order to reduce night-time interference to other stations. Or if they operate after dark it is on much lower power or with a more directional antenna pattern. For the DXer in Europe catching American daytimers is tough and not many have been heard. However, if one is to have any chance at all one needs to be well informed and listening at the right time. The window of opportunity may be 15 minutes or less!

The FCC sets the rules for radio in the USA and defines the official sunset time for every station. In reality sunset time changes every day but to simplify operations at stations, the FCC calculates the sunset time for the middle of the month and this time is used for the whole month. Around the spring and Autumn equinoxes, sunset time can change by as much as an hour in one month (see diagram). This means that a station signs off at the end of September at the same time as it did in mid September even though darkness appears as much as half an hour earlier! The extra half hour of darkness improves the chances of the signal crossing the Atlantic. Conversely at the start of

September the station would actually be leaving the air as much as 30 minutes before real sunset. This means that the clever MW DXer will choose the best end of the month in order to maximise his chances of catching American MW daytimers. To summarise, in Autumn the best time to look for "daytimers" is the end of the month, whereas in Spring the best time is the beginning of the month. In mid winter there is no advantage to be had.



In the following table Barry Davies has collected data on target stations to look for. They are listed approximately in order of their official sunset time (utc), which is when the station should cut power or sign off. But a few stations on the east coast are allowed to stay on for a while after sunset with their daytime configuration. This is because the station they are protecting from night time interference is considerably farther west. Callsigns in bold indicate a station has been heard in the UK. An ↓ arrow indicates major power reduction whereas • means closedown. When a station closes you should hear an official detailed announcement and the Star Spangled Banner.

Thanks this month to :- IRCA, ABDX, Radio and records.com, NERW, North American Radio Logbook, DX-midAMERICA, Upper Midwest Broadcasting and Distance (UKVK).



- 770 WABC** NYC NY. This talk station will run its oldies "Musicradio" format from the 60s and 70s. The oldies format, complete with 60s/70s jingles, will run each Saturday from 2300GMT to Sunday 0300 GMT. No news of similar by move by 1010Wins!
- 1270 WXYT** Detroit MI. This is still "The Sports Station" but it dumps its ESPN affiliation and joins the Sporting News Radio (SNR) network.
- 1280 WJWK** Seaford **DE**. The station returns to air simulcasting 103.5FM WJKI. The format is soft oldies. They are running 840watts until 2200 in January. SW has heard 500watts from MS so a real possibility for this hard to log state!
- 1320 WARL** Attleboro MA. Format flips from talk to sports from Sporting News Radio. (SNR)
- 1350 WSMB** New Orleans LA. The station continues in // with 870 WWL for the time being.
- 1470 WLAM** Lewiston ME. The station has put away its nostalgia songs and switched to sports talk from the ESPN network.
- 1470 KLBB** Brooklyn Park MN. New call letters here. (ex KLBP) Format remains soft oldies.
- 1490 WDNA** DeLand FL. This news talk station was owned by 1150 WNDB. WDNA has been sold and is currently silent. When 1490 is reactivated it will have a SS format. (ed)
- 1580 WSRF** Fort Lauderdale FL. This reggae music station is currently silent.
- 1590 WHGT** Chambersburg PA. The station has been donated to the Emmanuel Baptist Temple and is due to return to the air shortly. They will have temporary set up of only 100watts pending construction of a new antenna. The new calls have been registered. (ex WCBG) The format will be contemporary Christian music.
- 1650 KCNZ** Cedar Falls IA. The station has dropped the talk show elements of its programmes and gone 100% Fox sports radio. The new slogan is "16-50 The Fan." Their website still shows the "Coast to Coast" programme overnight? (ed)

Albania

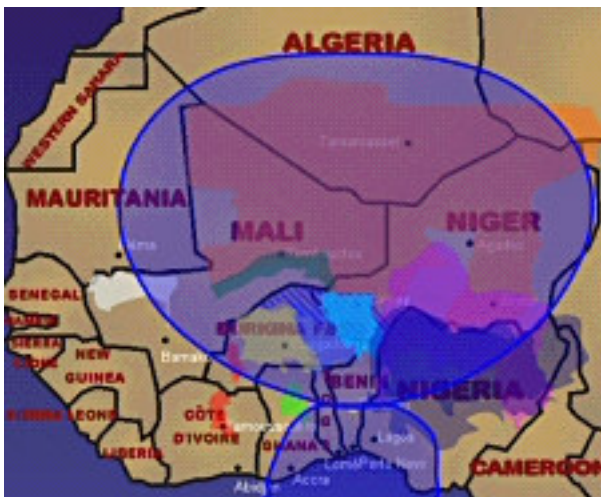
Wolfgang Büschel advises us that the mediumwave transmitter on 1089 kHz that carries the 1st domestic network of Albanian public broadcaster RTSH is now on a reduced schedule, and currently operates only at 1500-2200 UTC. The External Service of Radio Tirana has been suspended since 5 Dec until further notice. However, relays of Trans World Radio and China Radio International will continue to operate as scheduled. The situation also does not affect other international broadcasters operating in Albania: Deutsche Welle, VOA and BBC. (*Media Network weblog, c 08 Dec 05*).

Radio Tirana external service seems back on their usual registered service..... This morning I woke up too late. RT Albanian 0730-0900 UT on 7105 was in progress, but couldn't trace it on 1458 kHz due to long distance, but 338 degrees azimuth would fit towards Germany. And on air again at 0901-1000 UT on 1395 and 7105. On \ 7105 there is a phone-in program in progress interviewing some Albanian nationals abroad. The next RT ext sce broadcast today, is at 1500-1630 UT on 1458 kHz in Albanian, Turkish at 1630-1645, Greek 1645-1700 UT, all non-directional. Maybe somebody in Austria, ex-YUG, Italy and Greece can check the latter mediumwave service. (*73 Wolfgang Bueschel, mwdx, 21 Dec 05*).

Benin

According to TWR the shortwave tower is up and the transmitter building mostly complete. But judging by prayer requests there is quite a lot still to do before broadcasts on MW start! "Please

pray for the Higher Authority of Audio-visual Communications (HAAC) and the Department of Communications in Benin to issue the medium wave and shortwave radio licenses. This is needed to put the Benin station on the air. Give thanks for the arrival of the heavy equipment needed for several aspects of the building project in Benin. Pray for the funding still needed to produce programmes for the various people groups in Niger. TWR-Ivory Coast is preparing to produce programmes for Benin. Pray that the producers may be moved by the Holy Spirit to produce programmes that will reach the people living in West Africa. Give thanks for the team that spent two weeks at the building site setting up the tower



for the antenna for the medium wave transmitter in Benin." Here is planned coverage map of the new Benin tx. Looks like it is beaming north with 100kW so should be heard here I guess (*Steve Whitt, 16 Dec 05*). Today 18 December TWR Africa says that "The medium wave tower in Benin is up and everyone is rejoicing." (*Steve Whitt*).

Croatia

The transmitter in Osijek on 594 was moved to 1143 earlier this autumn, in order to free this frequency in Croatia for the DRM test. The DRM transmitter is located in Deanovec. It is a new transmitter purchased from the Croatian manufacturer RIZ and provides a power of 10 kW in DRM mode. It is fed to the same antenna as the 100 kW AM transmitter (Glas Hrvatske) on 1125 kHz on

the same site. The program feed for 594 is Croatian Radio's Hrvatski Radio 1 and Glas Hrvatske. This is a long-term DRM trial, conducted by the Croatian national transmitter operator OIV (*Bernd Trutenau, Dec 16, DXLD*). Can this DRM really be just 10kW? The noise now swamps Germany and bleeds over onto 590kHz making VOXM much tougher to hear. (*Steve Whitt, 19 Dec 05*). Note: 10 kW actual output, interference-wise equivalent to an AM signal with 7 db more power. Last evening the DRM noise on 594 was prominent here. Hessischer Rundfunk modulation was still readable, but actual listening hardly possible anymore. A just posted message indicates that last night a white noise in the background was present even at Wiesbaden, 45 km away from the 250 kW transmitter serving southern Hesse. I can hardly imagine that Hessischer Rundfunk will see no problem in this situation (*Kai Ludwig, Germany, Dec 16, DXLD, via Steve Whitt*).

Denmark

Just a reminder that time is running out to hear news in English from R Denmark. The station is easy to receive (almost all day long here in north west England) on 1062kHz and 5 minute English news programmes can be heard at 0930, 1605 and 2100. However, the medium wave transmitter is due to close on 31 December. (*Regards, Paul Bann, BDXC-UK, 20 Dec 05*). Thanks Paul for the reminder about this. Here are some further details from Erik Koie: Foreign language broadcasts will cease at the end of this year, except Faroese (Saturdays at 18 UT). The 6 5-minute broadcasts are aired Mon-Fri at 09.30-10.00, 16.05-16.35 and 21.00-21.30 UT on 1062 kHz. English is heard the first 5 minutes. The web site, including audio, is: <http://www.dr.dk/Nyheder/Andre+sprog/English> The very last broadcasts will be on Friday, Dec 30. Furthermore, plans are to stop the 243 and 1062 kHz transmitters by the end of next year. But no final decision has been made. Finland

France

Chanced to look up the power of FIP/585 and found that you indicate times as 0700/1500. I don't think this is correct. I can hear them until far in the evening. Don't remember until what time, because I only hear them underneath RNE/585 quite regularly (though fragmentarily). (*73, Frank van Gerwen, Castricum, Netherlands, via emwg, 19 Dec 05*).

Germany

Deutschlandradio considers for Zehlendorf 177 a return to AM operation, with the exception of three hour DRM tests at night, since it is now clear that no DRM receivers will be available for Christmas as was promised at IFA. This according the Radio-Kurier magazine, already quoted in advance at <http://www.satnews.de/mlesen.php?id=1303> (*Kai Ludwig, Germany, Nov 16, DXLD 5-198 (17 Nov 05) [http://www.satnews.de/mlesen.php?id=1303] via Steve Whitt*).

Berlin 567 to go dark by yearend! I just received word that Berlin 567 will be shut down on December 31. Error excepted for the moment, but actually the only news here is this deadline. Herewith the mediumwave operations from the Stallupöner Allee site are to cease after 59 years. The last fittings there consisted of two 5 kW transmitters from 1972/1973 (replaced the original rigs from 1946) for 810/1449 and a 100 kW PDM transmitter (Telefunken, so should be an S4002) from 1980 (replaced the old 100 kW from 1960) for 567. 1449 was the second mediumwave outlet of Sender Freies Berlin and shut down in 1994. 810 was the Berlin frequency of the BBC who

abandoned it by the end of 1988; afterwards a relay of Deutschlandfunk on this frequency started in spring 1989 and was kept until Deutschlandfunk came on FM in Berlin in the early nineties. Last 810 activity from Stallupöner Allee were DRM demonstrations during the IFA 2001. And the story of 567: In the early nineties the output was reduced from 100 to 50 kW and in a second much more dramatic step to a mere ca. 2 kW in spring 1997, reportedly first from a 5 kW running at reduced power but later from a new transmitter. The Radio B2 program carried on 567 was discontinued in August 1997, since then Radio Multikulti is used as modulation on 567. I assume it went by widely unnoticed that between Christmas and New Years Eve 1996 the Ostdeutscher Rundfunk Brandenburg program Radio Brandenburg was carried for one night on 567 for a very special program. The 50 kW still in use then were sufficient to produce a feedback on air from near Cottbus. I bet this was the first and last time a telephone on a railway signal tower went on air live. It was a really ancient one, with a carbon microphone of course, and unfortunately it was gone when I three years ago visited this signal tower again. That's my personal 567 story. (*Kai Ludwig, Germany, Nov 14, DX Listening Digest 5-197 (16/11-2005), via Steve Whitt*).

The new 1179 kHz program of Saarländischer Rundfunk will be launched on Monday (Dec 12) at 0700 UT. It will be called SR Antenne Saar, reminiscent to a commercial station that shared FM frequencies with Deutschlandradio Berlin but had to give up after some time, allowing Deutschlandradio to go 24/7 on these frequencies. SR Antenne Saar will most of the time relay SWR cont.ra, the remainder of the service will be relays of SR 2 and SR 3 plus French news from RFI (however, RFI's German service will not be relayed). Own programming will be limited to occasional live coverage (Saarbrücken parliament, other events via Phoenix TV audio) and SR's Italian programme. <http://www.sr-online.de/as> And while checking this out I find a news item about Berlin's senator of finance (the one who considers Brandenburg as ``landscape management of Berlin``) demanding the wind-up of Saarland and Bremen: <http://www.sr-online.de/nachrichten/30/445444.html> This is broadcast-related in as far as some observers think that sooner or later SR and Radio Bremen will be swallowed by SWR and NDR, respectively. (*Kai Ludwig, Germany, Dec 10, DX Listening Digest 5-212 (10/12-2005), via Steve Whitt*).

Is this news? I'm hearing load DRM on 1269kHz for the first time today 16 December at 0850utc. Is this DLF? (73, Steve Whitt, 16 Dec 2005). 0925utc DLF Germany is now off air; I presume they are working on the transmitter. The only thing audible on 1269 is weak Spanish signal. Something weakly on 1270 from across the pond. (73, Steve Whitt, 16 Dec 2005).

Germany (and non)

Dear Wolfgang/Glenn, do you know something about the future of closed IBB mediumwave site at Ismaning near Munich, Germany. The site was closed in March 2005 (Thales 300 kW transmitter operated on 1197 kHz VOA & RFE/RL programs for the Balkans). Will it be moved somewhere in the Middle East, or somewhere else? Best regards & many 73s! (*Dragan Lekic from Subotica, Serbia, Dec 15, DX LISTENING DIGEST*).

Dear Dragan, I phoned Mr. Schott at IBB Munich Ismaning transmitter plant on Dec 19th. VOA 1197 kHz - the Thales mediumwave unit is dismantled already and moves/moved to Near East / Middle east area. [Kuwait? Bahrain? wb.]. More details not available! Same discreet confidential procedure like in the 1593 Holzkirchen unit restitution case, [RFE/RL unit which moved to Kuwait IBB MW plant later in 2004]. By all accounts the MW unit will not go to Tajikistan, where another Thales unit will be [or has been] erected on 972 kHz, replacing an old USSR era unit by IBB facilities. Two older RCA 150 kW tube type MW units have been dismantled/ shredded at Ismaning - at least by 1994, when the Thales unit came into service. IBB staff in Germany wanted to replace the Thales unit by a latest fashion allmode/DRM-mode mediumwave installation, with lower main power consumption, but higher ranking dept. units declined that matter. All four MW masts from 1949 are still standing. Chief technician Mr. Peter Stefke is already in retirement. He was a keen technician and had a lot more knowledge of the French made Thalès unit than engineers

from Paris headquarters. I asked Mr. Schott about IBB USA licenses of 1197 [Ismaning] and 1593 [Holzkirchen] kHz channels in Germany. He doesn't know anything about disposition or restitution procedure to German department authorities, like Bundesnetzagentur (FCC) or Landesmedienanstalt (Bavaria - or North Rhine-Westphalia the former 1593 kHz location at WDR Langenberg). IBB Holzkirchen-Oberlainedern site has been officially closed on Dec 31, 2003. Word is that the station grounds have been sold for 7 million Euro to the municipality of Valley the Oberlainedern settlement (situated about 3 km east of Holzkirchen). It was intended to establish a golf course there. (73 wb (Dec 19)) (Edited JPW).

India

The tropical cyclone named "Fanoos" is now active in the Bay of Bengal. Due to this there is a threat to the Indian East coast. Our local station AIR Hyderabad is now operating with special transmission round the clock on 738 kHz (200kW) and on 7140 kHz (50 kW). The SW frequency will change to 4800 kHz from around 1130 UTC. I have contacted the station and got information that tonight they will operate continuously. So watch out 738 kHz and 4800 kHz (and any other AIR stations of Tamilnadu/Andhra Pradesh States). (Jose Jacob, dx_india, 08 Dec 05, via hcdx).

Italy

Hi, heard at the moment 6.00utc an unid 1620 with Italian program (religious). No ID heard at toh. I know WDHP has BBC px and elevator mx px but never heard Italian from them. Pirate or only WDHP?? Any ideas (Andree Bollin, mwc, 17 Dec 05). An Italian pirate on 1620 is unlikely Andree, unless you're having to do with one of those strange FM relays in the maritime MF band which have been reported in the past. Any recording? We could check if it was Italian or Greek. I'm not sure if other NA ethnic stations carry Italian on 1620. Rete Italia was reported in Finland on 1629 from Australia, of course not at 6 UTC. (73s, Andy Lawendel, mwc, 17 Dec 05).

Ciao, an Italian station is on air on 1620 kHz. It is broadcasting all the time (or it is what it seem to be) a catholic religious program, talking about the Pope Giovanni Paolo II. You can hear his voice very often. I heard this radio on 19 December at 0015 UTC. Several Italian Dxers reported it before. At 0044 I heard an id by a woman: "Radio Giovanni Paolo II", but I can't say if it is the name of the program or of the radio. I didn't hear it again! I believe the station is broadcasting from North Italy. I can confirm: the religious radio that some dxers heard in these days in Italian on 1620 kHz is Radio Giovanni Paolo II, I recorded, after hours, this announcement: "Ascolta anche tu la radio dei giovani, ascolta radio Giovanni Paolo II" (listen you too to the radio of young people, listen to Radio Giovanni Paolo II" (73 Giampiero Bernardini, Milano, Italy, 19 Dec 05).

Looks like the station has acquired the old MW tx operated by Radio Verona International in 1982. According to Fabio planned power will be 6 kW as per a phone call to the station (+39-045 7595763). Reported email is: video75@libero.it. Not a pirate, after all (or at least not a completely unauthorized station), but from what I've been hearing on 1620 here in Milan, even considering my noise floor and electrical pests, testing power sounds far lower than 6 kW. (Christoph Mayer, via Andy Lawendel, mwc, 19 Dec 05).

Ciao, here are more Info about Radio Giovanni Paolo II on 1620 kHz: This new radio is a private one. It has no links with Vatican or the Italian Catholic Church. The owners have 2 radios: Radio Happy Days on FM 91.5 and 94.7 MHz and the new Radio Giovanni Paolo II on 94.9 MHz FM and 1620 kHz. The Radio is based in Veneto, not too far from Verona, close to Garda Lake, North Italy. The owners in 1990 got Radio International on 1620, so they have registered this frequency since many years. Then So they told to me by phone. President Eliseo Mischi told me that this radio has a young people target, now they are testing the frequency. In next weeks they are going to increase power. Reception reports can be sent to video75@libero.it (attention of Eliseo Mischi, president) (73, Giampiero Bernardini, Avvenire, Milano, Italy, 19 Dec 05).

Could be John Paul II's voice. During tests heard in recent days the station on 1620 carried a sort of audio biography of the late Pope with long excerpts from radio commentaries of his pastoral trips. Fabio Tagetti says he was listening to same kind of content, plus some local soccer coverage in the weekend, but on 1602 kHz. It really looks like it's same 1620 kHz station identifying as "Radio Giovanni Paolo II" reported by Giampiero here on MWC and elsewhere. Affiliation to Radio Happy Days, an FM station, as mentioned by Fabio is unclear, but two stations operating on two separate frequencies so close with each other with almost the same programming wouldn't make much sense. At the same time, Radio Verona is much stronger in Milan on 1584, obliterating radio Studio X (which Fabrizio Magrone reports as active) on same frequency. Don't ask me why on earth an FM station covering a densely populated area would also want to try extending its audience in a band which nobody, at least in Italy, cares about (in the case of 1620 I'm not sure of how many radio sets could actually tune up to that). Unless they plan to leverage their potential "new listeners" as a selling argument to their advertisers (given that it would be so difficult to extend one's FM coverage). I'm not even sure our national regulatory Authority can actually license any private station operator on the MW band, which as far as I know has the state operator, Rai, as an exclusive license holder (but the situation could be different now). Latvia

Radio Marabu Caroline 25 and 26 December on 945AM Riga relay 18.00 - 24.00UTC. (Raimonds (Radio Nord), via HCDX, via Steve Whitt, 25 Dec 05).

Exciting news for listeners in Latvia, and adjacent countries. From Friday, January 6, 2006, we'll be heard every weekend on 945kHz (317m) Medium Wave. The transmitter in Riga will radiate Radio Six International programmes on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays between 20:00GMT (22:00 Local Time) and 21:00GMT (23:00 Local Time). Radio Six International, PO Box 600, Glasgow, G41 5SH, Scotland. <http://www.radiosix.com/> (Steve Whitt, 29 Dec 05).

Lithuania

1386kHz is occupied by Pipeline Radio from somewhere in the UK at 2255utc. Strong signal but very tinny audio. Mentioned pipelineradio.org (73, Steve Whitt, mwc, 30 November 2005).

Its a relay via a 7kw transmitter in Bubiai, Lithuania, started today, Wednesdays for 5 weeks 2200-0000, studio@pipelineradio.org or Pipeline Radio 1386, 52 Derwent Close, Seaham, Sunderland SR7 7BT. Only fair signal in Letchworth Garden City. (Mike Barraclough, BDXC-UK, 30 Nov 05). The earlier planned Xmas test transmission of the UK-based netradio Radio 390 via a 50kW transmitter in Klaipeda on 1386 will not take place. Instead, Radio Baltic Waves International will provide a relay of Pipeline Radio via this facility. The schedule will be 24 December 2200 to 25 December 0200 UTC. (Bernd Trutenau-LTU, via mwdx, 23 Dec 05). 1386 khz: Yesterday at 2300UTC Radio Pipeline via Lithuania. Today I hear Radio Svoboda in Russian since 2250UTC and still going on after 2300UTC. I suppose, they also use a Lithuanian transmitter? (Max van Arnhem, The Netherlands, 01 Dec 2005).

The planned test transmission of the UK-based netradio Radio 390 (<http://www.radio390.org>) - which was indicated in recent releases from the station - will take place in the Xmas night from 24 to 25 December between 2200 and 0200 UTC on 1386kHz. The relay will be provided by Radio Baltic Waves International, the transmitter will be a 50kW outlet in Giruliai near Klaipeda, leased from the national transmitter network operator LRTC. (Bernd Trutenau-LTU, mwdx, 04 Dec 05).

Reporters to the BigL and Anorak Nation forums noted this message at <http://radio390.bravehost.com/> earlier this week: "Our Backers In Dallas Have Pulled Out In Funding Radio 390 At 18.21pm Today Tuesday 20th December 2005." Paul Francis's claims of full

time operation next year including shortwave to North America and operating from a boat were being increasingly challenged on the forums. His website appears to be being altered several times each day. Tom McKenzie of Pipeline Radio, among those who were challenging Mr Francis's claims, posted to Anorak Nation today that they would now be using 1386 with 50kw 2200 Christmas Eve 2200 to 0200 Christmas Day, this booking has been confirmed by Bernd Trutenau on the Yahoo MWDX group. Pipeline Radio say they have also booked another transmission on 1386 on 28th January from 2200, the initial booking was for the 7kw transmitter they have been using on Wednesdays I believe. *(Mike Barraclough, BDXC, 24 Dec 05).*

Papua New Guinea

Just to let you know I reckon I've found a new PNG station. Last night while starting my tuning session at 6pm local or 0830 UTC I started at 531 kHz as per usual and was about to quickly tune past the regular NBC 585 but I stopped because something wasn't right. There were two stations. NBC Port Moresby had music programming // 4890 but there was something in English underneath. I hung around thinking maybe the local ABC Radio 8GO in Gove was overloading the radio - but no. There were local news items in English which was heavily accented like a Pacific Island station. Over the next 30 minutes this station was actually equal to or even stronger than NBC Port Moresby. I'm yet to go through last night's recording to give more detail but basically on December 14 on 585 kHz from 0845 - 0915 UTC I heard in Pidgin English Radio Sandaun with local news items mixing with NBC Port Moresby who were having a music show. At 0900 both stations had NBC News // 4890 with a slight half a second difference between the two. Once I realised the ID's for Radio Sandaun I checked 3205 and it was //. After news 585 had separate programs again. Both were heard through the next few hours. I last check Radio Sandaun around 1145 and it was there but gone (just like 3205) at 1208 UTC so I presume it is 1200 sign off. I arrived in Nhulunbuy last week and stated listening from Sunday evening December 11. On December 11, 12 and 13 585 only had Port Moresby. I can't think why on earth PNG would commission two stations on 585? This is very weird and I'll monitor this over the next few nights. *(Craig Edwards, Nhulunbuy, Northern Territory, Australia, via HCDX, Vol 36, # 16, 15 Dec 05).*

OK the mystery is not so much a mystery. Again I began monitoring 585 kHz at 0815 UTC last night and only NBC Port Moresby (which is audible all day here) was there // 4890 as per usual. At 0824 UTC the second station on 585 kHz began to appear under NBC Port Moresby and again it was // 3205. It clearly ID'd as Radio Sandaun during a fade up. Out of interest I checked 1593 kHz to hear a station which from the language is probably the Micronesian but there wasn't an ID and the signal was almost on the noise floor. It certainly wasn't // 585 or 3205. I couldn't get an ID on this because by 0905 UTC the NHK2 outlet on this frequency carrying Portuguese was causing interference. I heard enough of the songs to recognise 70's C&W song titles in English, but the talk was muffled and during fade outs - as usual! Later in the evening CNR wipes 1593 out totally. But back to 585. Again like previously evening they had their own programming until 0900 when they both carried NBC News with a slight echo delay. Then it was back to their own programming and Radio Sandaun on 585 and 3205 signed off at 1205. So I'm convinced that this is Radio Sandaun on new 585 kHz. *(Craig Edwards, Australia, via HCDX, Vol 36, # 17, 16 Dec 05).*

Well another active PNG station was noted for the first time for me last night. On 900 kHz at 0930 noted PNG accented Pidgin English. My old 2004 WRTH has basic NBC listed // 4890 and PAL has Radio Eastern Highlands // 4890 listed. However this was carrying local music show called Pacific Beat with programming from Radio West New Britain // 3235 and not // 4890. PS Radio Sandaun has still been heard nightly on 585 //3205 sharing 585 with NBC Pt Moresby // 4890. *(Craig Edwards, Nhulunbuy, Northern Territory, Australia, via HCDX, Vol 36, # 20, 20 Dec 05).*

Russia

A legal dispute has knocked the BBC's Russian service off the air in Moscow, officials said on Thursday, although the corporation insisted all its licences were in order. Konstantin Eggert, Moscow bureau editor for the BBC's Russian service, said the company which broadcasts the corporation's programmes had lost its licence, causing it to lose its medium wave transmission in the Russian capital. "We officially have a right to broadcast. We were not the ones who lost the right to broadcast, it was the service provider," he told Reuters. Grigory Kliger, head of the Oktod operating company, told Moscow's Ekho Moskvyy radio that the license for the frequency had run out and that the documents needed to renew it had not been ready in time. Russian news agencies reported that the service provider, which broadcasts the British Broadcasting Corporation's news in Russian along with English-language programming, did not have a licence from the federal agency that regulated programming. A spokesman for the agency (Rosokhrankultura) told Interfax news agency that the BBC made its broadcasts without a broadcasting license. "The BBC only had a technical license from the Communications Ministry, but it did not have a licence from (our agency)," the spokesman said. But other officials said the problem arose from a mix-up rather than from any desire to halt the broadcasts. (*Paul, via HCDX, Vol 36, # 23, 23 Dec 2005*).

Radio Netherlands news, quoting German news agency DPA, is reporting that, in addition to the BBC, Deutsche Welle has also had its mediumwave transmitters in Russia switched off. The Russian authorities are claiming it's due to a difference of opinion about the licence, but German members of parliament are talking of an attack on freedom of speech. Deutsche Welle, which broadcasts in German and Russian via the transmitters (10kW on 693 kHz in Moscow and 1188 kHz in St Petersburg), frequently carries items critical of developments in Russia. However, it seems more likely to be a problem with the licence of the Russian transmission provider, as with the BBC. The editor-in-chief of DW-Radio, Miodrag Soric, says he hopes that the interruption will only last for a few days. The German Foreign Office in Berlin is involved in intensive contact with the Russian authorities to work out a solution. (*R N Media Network weblog, 23 Dec 05*).

Since today, Thursday, DW is silent on mediumwave in Russia because of license problems but BBC is again on air. (*BBC, via Paul Gager, BDXC-UK, 22 Dec 2005*).

Saudi Arabia

Reports from Saudi Arabia say that Radio Jeddah has launched the seasonal Pilgrimage Enlightenment Radio (PER) to serve Haj pilgrims and observers. It will be transmitting religious programs in 14 languages during the Haj season. Besides Arabic, the programs will be in English, French, Persian, Turkish, Hausa, Indonesian, Urdu, Bengali, Pashtu, Turkistani, Somali, Swahili, and Bambara. The last four languages have recently been added to the list by the Ministry of Culture and Information as part of its efforts to ensure a wider audience for this seasonal radio service. We do not have confirmed details of the frequencies, but last year, PER broadcast on mediumwave 594 kHz for listeners in Makkah, the pilgrimage sites and Jeddah, and on 1017 kHz for Madinah and its vicinity. It was also available on FM 94 MHz for the entire area covering the Holy Sites, and on 101 MHz for Mina and vicinity. (*Andy, RN Media Network weblog, 22 Dec 05*).

South Africa

Ikwekwezi FM, 1098 Khz, the 50 Kw TX in Garankuwa (near Pretoria) has been off air for the last week. This TX is often heard by East Coast N. American DXers and DXer's in Europe. (*John Plimmer, Montagu, Western Cape Province, South Africa, via mwdx, 13 Dec 05*).

Vatican

At last the Vatican broadcasts of DRM on 1530 have been listed on www.drm.org 2310-0100utc daily; 1530; ND; Europe; 60kW; various languages; Santa Maria. (*Steve Whitt, 05 Dec 05*).

Ofcom awards seven community radio licences

15 December, 2005

Ofcom today announces the award of seven new community radio licences. This brings the total number of community radio licences awarded to date to 62. However only 4 stations will broadcast on the medium wave. Forest of Dean and Tormedia in Cwmbran both previously announced and the 2 "Access Stations" currently broadcasting – and detailed below.

Capital's former management blamed for slump

25 November 2005

Capital Radio's former management failed to recognise a catalogue of problems at its flagship London station and lost half its audience in five years, according to GCap Media operations director Steve Orchard. Mr Orchard, a former executive at GWR, which merged with Capital Radio to form GCap, listed the station's shortcomings as being "too cheesy", DJs "waffling", the same songs played over and over and too many commercials.



As a result the station is undergoing a "root and branch overhaul" and will institute a "less chat, more music" policy that will see every aspect of the station - including all of its DJs - going under the microscope in a bid to regain its listeners.

Mr Orchard said the arrival of GWR executives, following the merger with Capital Radio, has allowed the company an "outside perspective" on the problems at Capital, combined with a last set of ratings figures that were so bad that an overhaul could no longer be put off.

"[Capital] tries too hard. Every time there's a DJ on, they're trying to push something or sell something. It stopped connecting with people on the issues they really care about and DJs were waffling. We've got to get back to what Londoners really care about," he said.

"The last Rajar was the point where we said 'this cannot go on'. The station lost market leadership but had a bigger marketing budget than everyone else, a bigger heritage than everyone else and a

bigger presenting budget and we are now number three. It was a case of 'Do we all now accept the station needs fixing?'. Mr Orchard said that the previous Capital management was too close to the problem to realise how much the rot had set in.



The station will relaunch on January 3 to urgently combat the four biggest problems outlined by Mr Orchard: the station being "too cheesy, too hype-y; DJs talking too much; playing the same songs over and over and playing too many commercials". "We're going to have a more disciplined DJ style and play more music. We will improve programming and adopt a new music position as well as inventory," he said.

Mr Orchard refused to name DJs who will be leaving the station, but said every aspect of Capital - which is to be rebranded Capital Radio - was being reappraised, including DJs' styles and what they say and do on air. (<http://media.guardian.co.uk/radio/story/0,12636,1650138,00.html>)

Ted Allbeury founder of Radio 390 dies

5 December, 2005



In 1965 Ted Allbeury's company was involved in promoting a pirate radio station, King Radio, which broadcast from a disused fort in the Thames Estuary.

Allbeury decided that a different approach entirely was needed, so he bought out the shareholders, changed the format to sweet music aimed at women and named it Radio 390, from the wavelength on which it broadcast. It was immediately successful, as was Allbeury's own weekly programme of nostalgic music, Red Sands Rendezvous. This he compiled in the living room of his house in Chelsea, and despite the King's Road traffic clearly audible in the background he received many fan letters saying how brave it was of him to go out in all weathers to the fort.



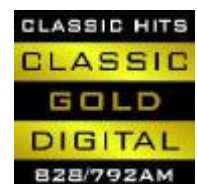
Radio 390's last broadcast was on August 15, 1967, when, along with all the other pirate radio stations, it was closed under the Marine Offences Act. UBC request Changes to its Classic Gold

5 December, 2005

UBC Media Group has asked Ofcom to permit changes to its Classic Gold stations, which would regionalise presentation across part of their network. Currently, the 18 Classic Gold stations broadcasting on the AM band serve the licence areas as set out in each individual station format.

UBC propose 'regionalising' 13 of their 18 stations by creating clusters of two or three stations based on geographical location. This could see the joining of Bristol and Swindon, in the West, Ipswich and Norwich in Anglia, and so on. Five Classic Gold stations are to remain stand alone and unaffected by these proposals.



In addition, UBC are requesting a change to all Classic Gold formats that will allow them to broadcast their four-hour local show at any time during "weekday daytime". Currently all requirements for locally produced/presented output must be during 'peaktime', generally understood to be 'breakfast' or 'drivetime'.

Ofcom has the ability to consent to such changes under conditions included in the Classic Gold licences, in accordance with the Broadcasting Act 1990. Before deciding whether to consent to this

change, Ofcom is required to consult those likely to be affected. This consultation is therefore seeking views on the proposed substantial Format changes to the Classic Gold services. It will also seek views on how Ofcom should approach requests for change on AM stations generally. (www.ukradio.co.uk)

Capital launches “no more than two ads in a row”

When Daily Mail and General Trust (DMGT) launched a new radio station in the competitive Sydney market promising "no more than two ads in a row" in 2001, it was not only the local players who sat up and took notice. In London, GCap Media boss Ralph Bernard - then in charge of GWR - was also paying close attention to how the fledgling station, called Nova, fared with its novel strategy. And when Nova knocked the market leader, Austereo, off its number one perch, Mr Bernard was even more intrigued. He toyed with introducing a similar concept in Britain, possibly piloting it in Leicester.

But it was not until six weeks ago, when Rajar figures revealed that GCap's flagship London station Capital had slumped to third place in the ratings, that Mr Bernard made up his mind. With Capital's audience half that of four years ago, it was clear the station could no longer justify the premium it had been charging advertisers. Rather than cut Capital's ad rates, Mr Bernard decided to follow DMGT's lead and halve the amount of advertising played instead.

"The premium value of Capital's inventory was massively under threat and we had to do something to protect it," GCap operations director Steve Orchard said. GCap hopes Capital's promise of "never more than two ads in a row" which went on air yesterday will also woo back listeners from the commercial-free BBC. Rather than charge advertisers more for the fewer ad spots, it is relying on audience growth to boost revenues.

But analysts warn that simply slashing advertising will not bolster Capital's flagging ratings. Rivals Heart and Magic (owned by Chrysalis and Emap respectively) play the same amount of ads (10 minutes an hour), and their audiences have grown. The programming changes need to deliver a 30% increase in audiences at Capital to offset the cut in ad minutes. It also wants to double the proportion of revenue it derives from sponsorships, promotions and online services.

But GCap shareholders will have to endure a fair bit of financial pain before the new strategy starts to bear fruit. GCap has given itself three years to make "never more than two ads in a row" pay, and has warned it will cost £7m in lost revenue in 2006. (www.mediaguardian.co.uk)

This one is something of a mystery! KUMA is only scheduled for 1330-0800 UTC as per KOJE and the NRC AM Radio Log; however, the C2C website lists it as carrying that programme Sa 10p-3a (i.e. Sunday 0600-1100 UTC), and on other days 1a-5a (0900-1400 UTC); the DX183 report below corroborates this view. KKSL is listed as 24h with REL/UC/GOS format. My reception was on Sunday morning UTC, after the C2C slot has ended, so presuming it continues to broadcast throughout the night, KUMA is the strongest possibility, since TalkJohn doesn't seem the kind of programme a religious station such as KKSL would carry. Thanks for help from fellow DXers, Patrick Martin, of Seaside OR, and via the RealDX Group Bjarne Mjelde, Jan Alvestad and Bruce Portzer for suggestions, information and support.

Steve writes; "The MW band was in very strange shape overnight 27-28th Dec following an ionospheric disturbance. Between 2300-0030utc the band could be best described as schizophrenic; below 1000kHz I was hearing Atlantic Canada and amazingly good Greenland, whereas above 1600kHz I was only hearing Caribbean (WDHP, WGIT, Juventus don Bosco). Nothing much between 1000-1600kHz; just weak traces, but 1470 had weak Spanish. All winter I have been disappointed with the x-band, rarely more than 2 stations audible at once. Often lots of buzz like noise here. I haven't done thorough investigation but seems to affect x-band at night rather than day – don't know if local or distant though". Steve, let me take this opportunity to thank you for checking many of my audio clips over the last month - mah.

Stefan writes: "I did some listening, but no TA, too far away, insufficient aerials, so nothing spectacular from my side... I 'll be at DX183 end of Jan and look forward to have some catches there, let's see".

In a note with his log, **Paul C** says: "This is my first log for a couple of years - sparked by putting up a new antenna with which I am very pleased. Apart from a few days in the second week of the month when conditions were very poor I enjoyed using my new EWE antenna. It pulled in many Mid-West stations which had previously been very rare or were new ones for me. For example 1300 WOOD and WERE were pretty much regulars whereas I had only heard them a couple of times previously". Good to see you're active again, Paul! - mah.

Peter (G1FGC) is another one returning after a break: "I'm back to the fold after a break from the hobby. Just brought an Icom IC-7400 transceiver so here's my first log. I need to set up a MW antenna system. Currently I'm only using a random wire which gets me out on 40mtr, although my fave band is 75mtr. Also the tuner only goes down to 1.6MHz. I planned to buy the nrd 545g but looking into needs the icom caught my eye for transmitting as well as first class receiving. I still have an aor7030 which has just had a 3kHz filter fitted this evening. As I type this there seems to be excellent conditions on 80 with talk of QSOs to the Philippines this evening. I've always tried to see if good propagation on 80 ties up with medium wave?" With regards to his amateur radio interests, Peter adds "I'm looking to get a beam up for 6mtr". Welcome back, Peter, and thanks for your contribution. I'm very active on the 6m (50MHz) band over the summer months, so maybe we'll have a QSO some time - mah (GM8IEM).

John W writes: "Herewith my logs for the past month. Nothing exotic - but managed 50 different stations over that period! The conditions have generally been quite good with always something coming in most days (even it was the same stations! (1010, 1510,1390, 1400) Better than nothing though!"

Jack W notes: "An unexciting log this month I'm afraid. I didn't have much time for listening and, when I was able to, the conditions were quite poor. Hopefully, January will bring some improvement".

Paul L commented: "Highlights this month were the openings on the mornings of the 23rd and 24th. Kansas on 1660 a very welcome signal especially mixing with North Dakota!. Changed receiver to an NRD 545 this month, after initial misgivings (mostly user error!) I've concluded this is the best radio I've ever owned. Also erected an EWE and its working out well too - amazing for such a compact design".

Along with his tape of 1450 kHz, **Martyn** sent a superb recording of his reception of Yola, Nigeria on 1440 kHz at 0455 on 28 Dec 03. I passed a copy of the recording to **Steve**, and he comments: "I'm impressed by the Nigerian recording, ID including date etc. I wonder why hearing Nigeria is such a problem? But not much chance of repeating this log on 1440 anymore due to Luxie DRM".

Giampiero: "I went some days, from 23 to 28 (morning) October, to Bocca di Magra (La Spezia - Liguria - North Italy) with Dario Monferini. We made several DX on medium wave. Propagation was good to North America MW on 23-24 Oct. and good to very good to La Plata area and Brasil MW on 25-27 Oct. less good on 28 Oct".

Once again I've only included a selection of the less common stations from **Wilhelm's** 13-pages of typed logs from DX183, some of which were made with guest **Hans Pammer** from Austria. As you can see, your logs up to 25 Dec reached me in time to be included, Wilhelm. Another fine log, and once again very interesting to me personally how similar reception in Fjerritslev is to that in Clashmore - mah.

There were some very good openings to the west coast and Alaska during the period covered by this month's log. In particular 27 Nov, 8-9 Dec, 13-16 Dec, 20-26 Dec had some fine DX conditions, the last one happily co-inciding with the holiday period. Days of good reception continue to correlate well with runs of low A and K indices, and it's been interesting that Alaskan

stations have continued to come through for a day or two after a disturbance at the end of a quiet spell, here in Clashmore. As I complete the checking of DX Loggings on New Year's Day I can say that conditions have been quite poor for the last few days, so at least for this bumper log I haven't had to tear myself away from the receiver.

IMPORTANT: Please remember when sending logs that for a logging to be definite you must have heard unambiguous programme detail, such as a station identification, slogan, or unique programme material; otherwise, loggings should be marked "presumed", or "tentative". Please include sufficient detail in each log report to make it clear that you've correctly identified the station you are reporting and to make the log of use and interest to other readers of MWN. This is particularly important for unusual or rare loggings. In these circumstances getting a second opinion on a recording is also a good idea as it will reassure readers of the accuracy of the reported logging.

The **deadline** for the February DX Loggings is **Tuesday 24th January**. I look forward to receiving your logs by then, preferably electronically/via e-mail using the Word pro-forma, which I can supply on request. If you don't use the pro-forma, please keep the format as close as possible to that used above, since it saves me from having to re-type your contributions. Those without access to a PC and the internet should note that I am still willing to accept contributions via the regular postal service, or by fax to the telephone number at the head of the column (but please phone before faxing). Please note that logs posted to the e-List are not automatically included in DX Loggings. I'm also interested in learning what equipment/software you use for recording your DX, and will include it in the contributors list.
