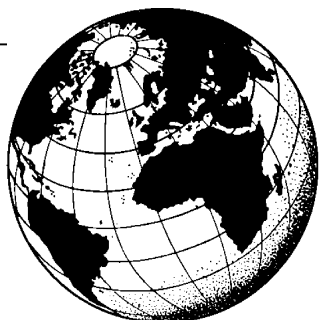
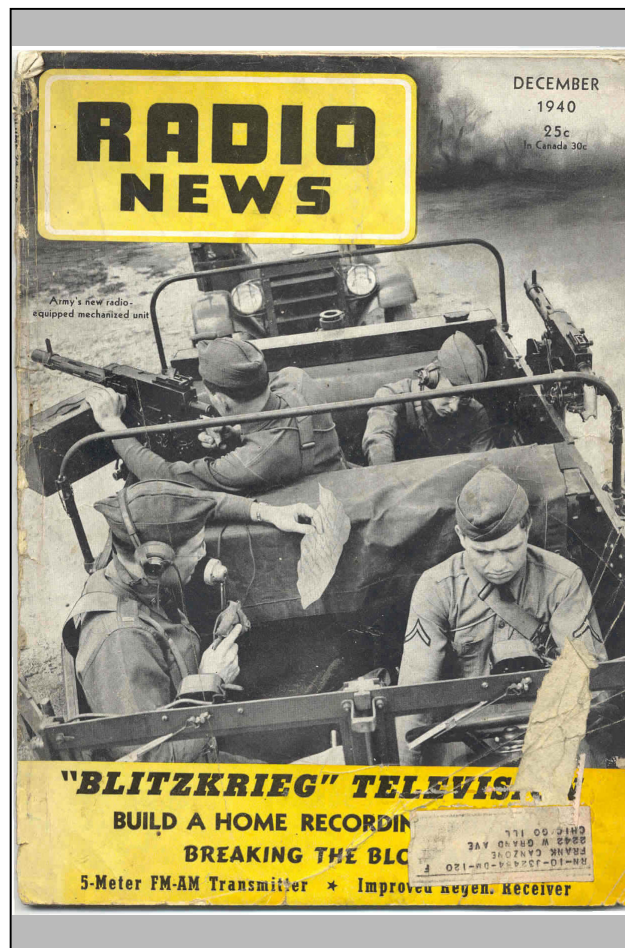

Thanks: Membership Renewal Time

Thank you to everyone who has recently renewed membership of the Circle. Without your support there would of course be no Medium Wave Circle so once again thanks. If you filled in a members survey form with your comments these will be analysed and Clive Rooms will report back in MWN as soon as that is done.

Circle Website News:

Last month I reported a variety of good news about the Circle's website www.mwcircle.org but unfortunately at the same time Tony Hudson was preparing to resign from the position of Webmaster, which he did on February 26th. Sadly, it wasn't an amicable parting by any means and was further complicated by the fact he was also hosting the Circle's website & e-mail facility.

Since his resignation Tony has maintained a daily monologue about the Circle, its website and the club officers on his personal website and sent numerous e-mails to the Circle. The Circle has so far not responded in public to Tony for two reasons. Firstly responding to every communication or communiqué from Tony would be hugely time consuming – time better spent on producing MWN or finding a new webmaster and sorting out the web hosting arrangements; or indeed getting on with life.

Secondly we would like the Circle response to reach ALL members, not just those actively using the website.

Without going into the boring detail I'll explain what has been going on. But firstly a brief reminder of how the Circle works.

The Circle depends entirely on volunteer effort to operate (apart from professional printing and the postal service for delivery). Every person named on page 2 in MWN or on the website has offered their services as an unpaid volunteer. On an exceptional and infrequent basis the Circle has rewarded individuals for outstanding effort or contributions to the Circle by giving away free membership for a year (e.g. Member of the Year). The Circle does of course reimburse volunteers expenses such as postage but some volunteers don't even bother to claim this back from the Circle! Without this voluntary & cooperative arrangement there would be no Medium Wave Circle.

Furthermore over the years contributors have always worked within the Circle's prevailing copyright policy, the current version of which was published on the website and in MWN last year. Essentially the policy says: "Generally copyright of material resides with the author but by publishing or distributing through the Circle, the author grants the Circle permission to publish and re-publish material in any form."

The Circle remains a non-profit making organisation but we do try to make a financial surplus in "good years" to ensure the long-term stability of the club. Any surplus is either held in reserve to cope with, for example, postage increases, or re-invested in the club to benefit members (e.g. paying for a new web host). Prudent financial management has meant we've had no membership fee increases for 14 years.

The current situation

Early in 2006, Tony Hudson approached Steve with the suggestions that a) he design a new website for the Circle, b) become our new webmaster and c) host the Circle website free of charge on the server that he used for his own business. We thought this an offer too good to refuse so we

accepted. Our new website was launched in April 2006. For the first 7 or 8 months of working with Tony, all went well and we appeared to have a good working relationship with him. In December 2006, the first cracks began to appear in that relationship.

Early in December, Tony received a request from one of our members in Thailand who owned a hotel which was equipped for DXing. The member wished to advertise these DXing holidays on our website. It was suggested to Tony that even though we were not willing to have general advertising on our site, as this particular advert was from a member and would be of interest to other members, it would be suitable to put it on our site. Tony replied with a long rambling answer as to why he would not accept the advert on the Circle site. In fact, his wording was a thinly disguised ultimatum to us so we had to agree with Tony's wishes.

In the following weeks, Tony threatened to withdraw the Win receiver connection on the website if more members didn't use it. He also threatened to withdraw the facility for hosting members own websites on the Circle website if more members didn't take advantage of it. He actually carried out this threat. Tony acted unilaterally without discussing matters with Circle officers.

During Tony's spell as webmaster, he often came up with good ideas and there is no doubt that he developed and transformed the Circle's web presence. He also came up with some ideas that the officers didn't think were as good as he thought them and so they were not carried forward. Tony seemed to take exception when the Circle didn't act upon all of his suggestions. So, during December, January and February, the relationship between the Officers and Tony continued to gradually deteriorate until on the morning of 26th February, Tony abruptly resigned over something that was really trivial. He stated, "I have no confidence anymore in the Officers of the Circle and therefore resign as webmaster with immediate effect." Later that day, he sent us an email with 5 reasons for resigning. However, Tony did offer to continue to host our website but it would no longer be updated. When Tony first became Webmaster he generously offered to host the website free of charge in perpetuity.

On March 7th, Steve contacted Tony and asked him, given that he'd had some days of reflection, would he be prepared to reconsider his resignation. Tony replied that the only way he would remain as webmaster would be if we met certain conditions that he wanted. These included editorial control over web pages that he created for our site, he wanted the Circle Officers to put recent decisions and policies to the membership for ratification, and he wanted us to completely rewrite the Circle constitution. It was at this point that we realised there was absolutely no chance of a reconciliation with Tony, so we began to make plans for life after Tony.

Notwithstanding the Circle's copyright policy Tony has continually tried to prevent the Circle re-using the website design he developed. He has repeatedly said that we must not use his website styling and coding on the website when we move it, but on March 13th he said he might be willing to assign the copyright on the Circle website design to the Circle on a commercial basis. On March 15th, we made a "token" goodwill offer of £100 to Tony. We had no obligation whatsoever to do that, but we thought that a goodwill gesture of appreciation for the work that Tony had willingly undertaken on our website would help to smooth over any difficulties between us.

On the 19th March, Tony informed us that our £100 offer was not acceptable and he "would be prepared to negotiate around a figure of £500."!! Naturally, the Circle had absolutely no intention of handing over such a sum of members funds, as it is worthwhile pointing out that when Tony asked us if he could become our webmaster, there was no written or verbal commercial agreement between the Circle and Tony, neither was there any special agreement on copyright – it was all on a purely voluntary contribution basis.

Epilogue

The Circle has made no payment to Tony, and we have re-hosted the website and circle e-mails. Tony's action and attitude has resulted in considerable disruption and extra work for the Club

Officers and Remy Friess and Herman Boel. Despite the breakdown in relations between Tony and the Circle, Tony remains a member of the Circle and the Circle has as yet taken no action to terminate his membership.

One lesson we've learnt is just how important our website has become over the last 12 months; it has helped attract many new members for instance. And with that level of importance it becomes too risky to leave all aspects of the website and e-mail service in one person's hands, no matter how good their initial intentions. We also discovered that having all club e-mail traffic (anything leaving or arriving a xxx@mwcircle.org address) (including private & confidential messages) passing through Tony's own personal server was not a good idea whilst relations were breaking down. For that reason the Circle has moved to a commercial hosting service for web and e-mail facilities.

I hope I haven't bored you with a résumé of the details. Were it not for Tony's public on-line megaphone tactics we would have simply accepted his resignation, found a new webmaster, written a few paragraphs in MWN and moved on. In the mean time the website continues to be developed and in particular we are improving the site navigation, since its rapid growth over the last 11 months had resulted in quite an untidy site structure. We are looking forward to continued growth and development of the website. If you have ideas or suggestions for the website, or are willing to contribute to it, please do let us know. Thanks.

Past members – reappear

This month we were very pleased to make contact with Robert Ronai a former member from the 1960s. Following an exchange of e-mails Robert decided to summarise a few of his memories.

CIRCLE MEMORIES

by Robert Ronai in Australia

Ah, ghosts from the past. Yes it was indeed me who joined all those years back when I had hair etc.

I haven't been actively DXing since I think the late 60s, not long after I handed management of the club I created, the Australian Radio DX Club, to Bob Padula of Melbourne. I believe that in more recent times there's been some acrimony between him and the guys running the club now.

MW DXing from Sydney was always very different to you guys doing it in Europe. Here we have the one country the same size as Europe, so you heard so many more counties than we did. If in Sydney I heard a station in Perth, I suppose about the same distance as London to Moscow, the announcers were speaking our language even with an almost identical accent as we don't have very definable regional accents. So Perth was no big deal. Nevertheless as I recall I QSLd some 70 countries on MW, including Radio Caroline, and of course Luxembourg and Monte Carlo which were booming in before sunrise almost daily. But then the Australian stations all went 24 hours and that was the end of MW DXing here. A few have moved to FM but in regional areas some retained their AM frequencies too, so the band is still very crowded with Aussie stations.

I don't think I was a member of the MW Circle for very long, I suspect only 2 or 3 years. Unfortunately all my old logs, QSL cards etc long ago found a home in a garbage bin when I was doing a clean up while moving homes in about 1975. It's funny that while I often curse my failing memory for names, I can still recall stations and frequencies from the mid 60s.

So here are some recollections that spring to mind:

I remember that at one time I used to have an 8 transistor radio with a rotary dial but the best thing was its long 6" ferrite rod with great directional effects and sensitivity. I was out in the backyard late one afternoon listening to a station in Adelaide on 1200 KHz when I turned the radio 90 degrees and there was a station in the USA, WOAI San Antonio.

Some late afternoons I could sit out in the yard with my trusty 8 transistor and pick up many USA stations almost like they were locals, before sunset until when the Australian stations would start blanketing them out.

At one time the US Air Force, I think as a front for the CIA, was running an experiment with a university in the country area about 500 km from Sydney using a circularly-polarised aerial firing vertically a signal on about 1529 kHz after the Australian stations on nearby frequencies closed down for the night. It used massive power and took its electrical feed straight from the high voltage lines feeding the university. The intent was to transmit at the resonant frequency of the ionosphere and try to have this impose a modulation on some other signal. Amazingly when I contacted the USAF section concerned they actually sent me their technical notes.

I believe that this theory of the resonant frequency also explained a signal on 1529 kHz which everyone in Europe thought was Radio Peking broadcasting to Russia from China. In fact as I recall I was able to convince everyone that you guys were hearing it from the side of their beam as they were transmitting from Albania to Russia and so we only heard it when Europe was coming in from about midnight onwards here. If it had been in China and we were hearing the back or side of the beam then it would have been in from about a couple of hours after sunset. Or was that all the other way around?

- Radio Caroline listed me on their QSL as their furthest listener at that time.
- There was many a morning when Luxembourg on 1439 and Monaco on 1466 would boom in until just after sunrise.
- I heard a Hawaiian station having what they called a "teeter-totter" marathon contest so I suggested the idea to a local station in Sydney who did the same.
- I made a great tunable loop aerial about 1.5m per side and it sat in the middle of my bedroom to the dismay of my mother. It pulled in great signals though and was highly directional.
- The toughest ones I heard & QSLd were Radio Natal in Brazil and Radio Niger 1511 with 1kW.
- The one that got away was ZCO in Nuku'alofa, Tonga on 1020. I was setting up to target them one night with my directional aerial, only to discover it was that night the local Sydney station on 1020 decided to go 24 hours for ever more!

I found that the best DX was up from about 1300 kHz but I remember Novisad in Yugoslavia on 1268, Balatonszabadi in Hungary on 1250, VoA on 1168 and 1140 in Asia, Khabarovsk on 1250. The best challenge was the lower frequencies which seemed to be covered with Radio Pyongyang sitting on splits like 685, 735 etc, Indian stations ditto and Radio Peking too. Europe and USA were rarely heard down there.

I'm sure that other memories will come to me now, and I hope that I've got most of those frequencies correct. I hope that these might be of interest on your side of the world.

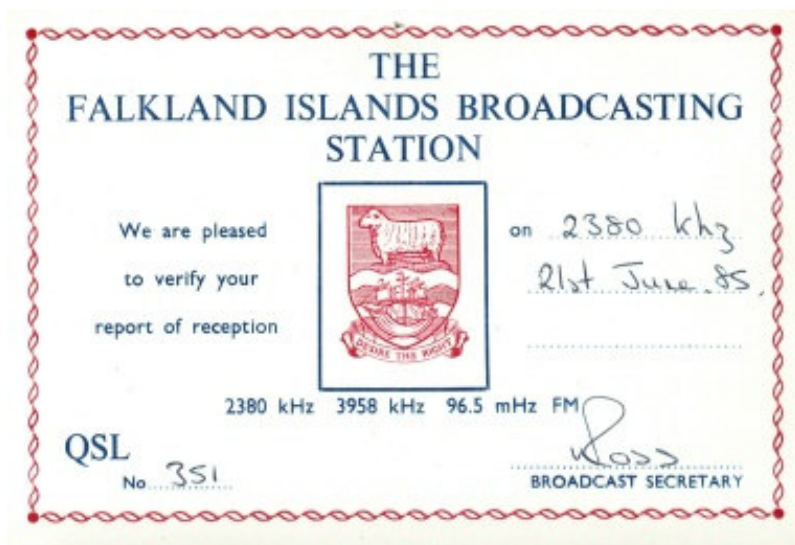

FIBS ECHOES 25 YEARS ON

Twenty five years ago the Argentinean invasion of the Falkland Islands started, following an apparent incursion by Argentinean scrap metal merchants onto the Island of South Georgia.

On 17th March 2007 BBC Radio 4 remembered this historic event with its Archive Hour programme based around recordings made off air of the Falklands Islands Broadcasting Service and interviews with Patrick Watts the indomitable radio presenter who stayed on air alone to report the events of the invasion

Archive Hour's Michael Nicholson recalled the night of the Argentinean invasion of the Falkland Islands in 1982 with the help of some astonishing radio archive from the Falkland Island



Broadcasting Service. When radio station manager Patrick Watts turned up to present his weekly 60-minute music request show, the programme turned into a marathon 16-hour broadcast as islanders phoned in with their sightings of the invading army.

The amazing recordings used by the Archive Hour were made on the night of 1-2 April 1982 (the night of the invasion). The Daily Mail newspaper reported that the

recording was made by "A Port Stanley woman who had been following every word from her kitchen [who] even captured it on her tape recorder." Apparently it was the only recording made and it was rebroadcast for the first time on the Archive Hour. Where has it been for the last 25 years?

That night, Patrick Watts kept the station on the air single-handed for more than 12 hours, taking phone calls from listeners reporting what was happening, relaying BBC WS and putting Governor Rex Hunt on the air regularly, right up to the moment when Argentine soldiers forced their way into the studio, announced that it was now "LRA Islas Malvinas Broadcasting Station" and Patrick almost in tears was forced to play the Argentine national anthem.

The recording revealed the tense nature of the invasion and became quite an extraordinary phone-in show as islanders taking cover phoned in to report what was happening.

But the programme was not without touches of humour. Patrick Watts switched the regular programming to playing light instrumental music such as James Last and Mantovani between the news and information. But quite by accident (remember there were no computerised play lists then!) Patrick found himself playing "Strangers in the Night" and "Spanish Eyes".

The saga began the day before the invasion when Patrick Watts went to Government House to see the Governor, Sir Rex Hunt, who showed him a Foreign Office telegram warning them to expect an invasion early in the morning and ending with the words: "You will wish to make your dispositions accordingly."

Patrick Watts said: "Rex was quite calm and said he would have to put a message together for the islanders - to warn them but not frighten them too much. When he finished writing it, I recorded it. I rushed back to the studio and it went out at 8.13 pm."

The Governor had asked Patrick Watts to keep broadcasting for as long as possible and he did just that. While the islanders remained in their homes, and the 60 or so Royal Marines on the island prepared to try to repel the invaders, Patrick Watts stayed in the studio.

Every so often the Governor called with an update and Patrick Watts would simply hold up the phone receiver to his microphone and turn up the volume. At around 4 am the Governor said the invasion was expected around 6.30 am.

Patrick and his audience was kept abreast of the invasion by his phone callers and fully expected the Argentineans to make his radio station one of their first targets.

Sitting in his tiny radio studio, Patrick Watts heard the thud of soldiers' boots in the passage outside and took a deep breath. James Last and his Orchestra were on the turntable and Patrick Watts - headphones around his neck, a flask of tea at his side - had just finished eating a cheese-and-pickle sandwich. The door opened and he was surrounded by six Argentinean soldiers who pointed their rifles at his back. It was around 9am on April 2, 1982, and outside, in the hills around Port Stanley, the battle for the Falklands was just a few hours old.

Patrick Watts had manned the station all night long, relaying events to the outside world. "I knew they would come, and I had been feeling nervous. But when the moment came, I was feeling rather bullish," he recalled. "The captain spoke good English and was quite friendly, but the others were shouting at each other and waving their guns about."

Such was Patrick Watts's indignance, he summoned up a bulldog spirit he didn't know he possessed - and made a lion-hearted stand while live on air. "I told them it was my studio and I couldn't broadcast with guns pointing at my back," he said.

"I also told them I couldn't broadcast while they were making such a racket. And for good measure I said I didn't allow people to smoke in the studio." To Patrick Watts's surprise, the soldiers stopped shouting, and left the studio leaving him briefly free to continue broadcasting.

Eventually after a length and emotional soliloquy Patrick Watts broadcast messages from the Argentinian armed forces and was forced to play the Argentinian National Anthem.

After a well deserved rest, Patrick Watts returned later that day and continued broadcasting through the war. "We used to broadcast Dad's Army but the Argentinians were convinced it contained war messages." On one occasion he got a vital message to the British. "I let slip that the Argentinians were still using Port Stanley airport. "This was important because the British thought they had bombed it."

He got into frequent trouble with the occupying force and after the war was awarded the MBE. "I will never forget that night," he said. "But it wasn't heroic - I was just doing the job Rex Hunt asked me to do."

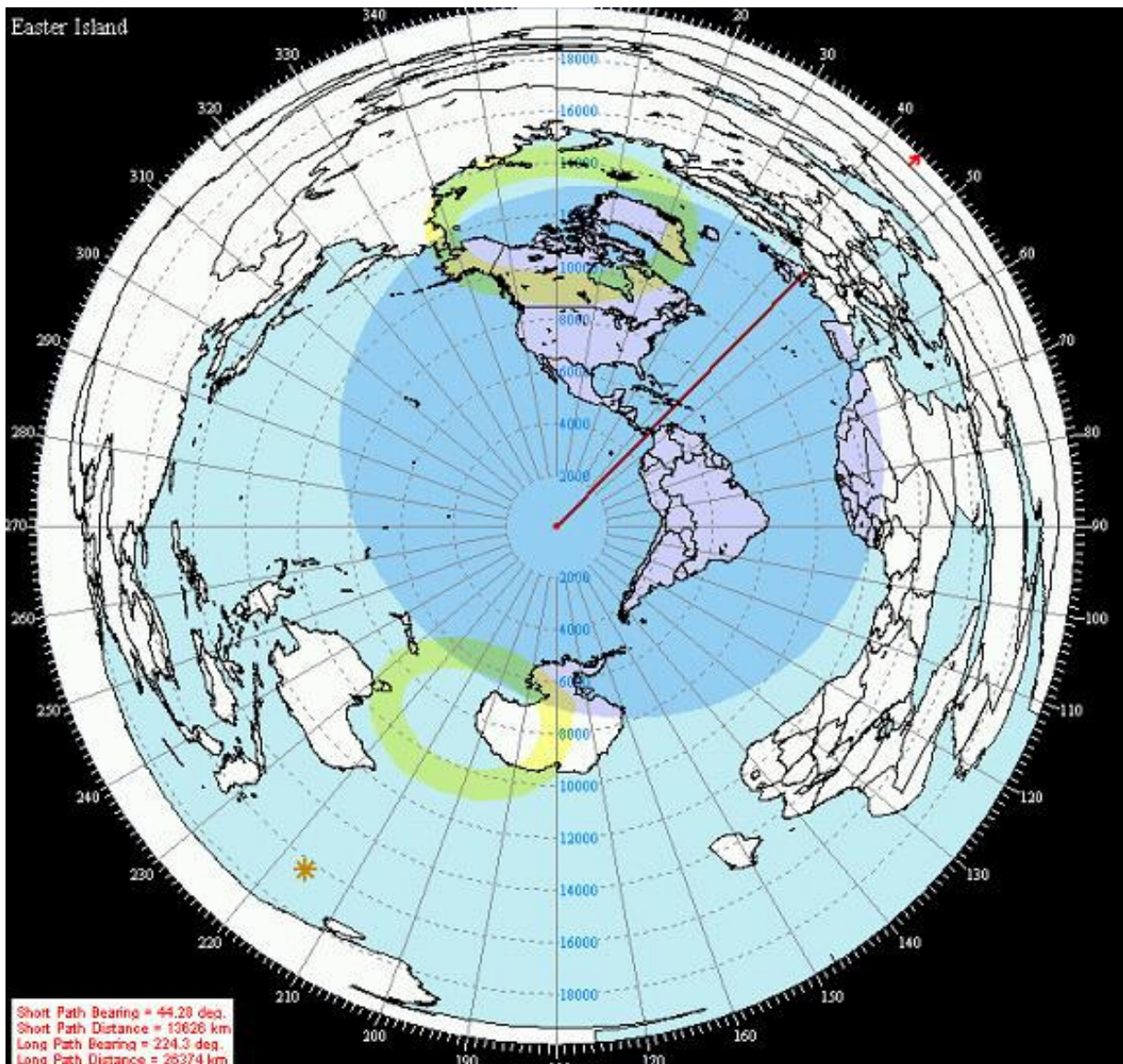

EASTER ISLAND REPORT

by John Bryant visiting Easter Island

This month we bring you news from a unique MW DX-pedition. After extensive planning, John Bryant has been on these remote islands in the Pacific famous for their ancient statuary. In future they will be known for their DX potential!!

At publication date John has barely landed back in the USA but he has reported some exceptional DX from Easter Island. No doubt he will be preparing a full report for publication in due course once the lack of sleep and the jetlag wear off.



Great Circle map from Easter Island. Red line shows path to London at UK sunrise. Note how Easter Island can “see” most parts of the world without signals needing to pass through polar absorption zones.

In the mean time let’s find out what sort of DX John heard. After his first day John wrote

“I’ve found the mother-lode of DX locations. **In one night, I logged all continents, 22 countries and 122 stations...** all but a few were IDed by station ID or by parallels. Logged 15 IDed DUs in 45 minutes. Wasn’t trying for a record, but since I’m not going to report for QSLs, all I gotta do is

ID them. Absolutely fabulous conditions. In two nights, I've logged from Egypt to India (YES). Have 70 DUs. Best receptions so far are the full formal sign off of a Peruvian, Radio Intercontinental, Lima and hearing 1566, AIR Nagpur for 20 minutes, including a full EE ID and the 5 minute EE news.

The most fun that I've ever had with my clothes on.... almost better than sex and it lasts for 14 hours at a time. More detail tomorrow. People very nice... food unimpressive, archaeological sites and general scenery is stunning."

The final body count

EUROPE, NORTH AFRICA and the MIDDLE EAST Spain: 9 stations, Egypt: two stations. One station each for Algeria, Bosnia, Holland, Ireland, France, Portugal, Morocco, Saudi Arabia, UAE, Oman and, tentatively, Qatar.

NORTH and CENTRAL AMERICA: USA: 41 stations, Mexico: 4 stations. One station each in Aruba, Caicos and the Amer. Virgin Islands.

SOUTH AMERICA: Argentina: 10 stations, Peru: 9 stations, Ecuador: 4 stations. One station each in Chile and Brazil and, tentatively, the Falkland Islands.

AUSTRALIA, NEW ZEALAND and the PACIFIC: Australia: 36 stations, New Zealand: 43 stations. One station each in Tahiti, Fiji and Hawaii

EAST and SOUTH ASIA: China: 38 stations, Japan: 18 stations. Three stations each in the Philippines and South Korea and one each in North Korea, Thailand and India.

That is a total of approximately 243 logged stations in 36 countries on all continents except Antarctica.

New features

I will be introducing 2 new areas of listening and they will feature the 136kHz and 500kHz amateur bands. Many signals will be found mainly CW or slow CW known as QRSS. More on this in later columns. I would appreciate your reports.

136kHz band

Basement Band listening can be both rewarding and frustrating as weak signals appear in ARGO or the constant noise of a seemingly dead band causes listening fatigue.

I add the UK 136kHz bandplan to indicate the areas of activity.

136 kHz	<i>No rigid bandplan is proposed for the 136kHz band, but amateurs are asked to work within the following conventions, giving long distance communications and experimentation priority.</i>
135.7 - 136.0 kHz	Station Tests and transatlantic reception window 135.900-135.980 kHz preferred transatlantic window for Europe to North America transmissions of very slow telegraphy (QRSS)
136.0 - 137.4	Telegraphy 135.980 - 136.050 kHz preferred transatlantic window for Europe/North America contacts.
137.4 - 137.6	Non-Telegraphy digital modes
137.6 - 137.8	Very slow telegraphy centred on 137.7 kHz 137.700-137.800 kHz preferred transatlantic window for North America to Europe

LICENCE NOTES: Secondary User: 1 Watt (0 dBW) erp. Available on the basis of non-interference to other services.

Most receivers will cover these frequencies but may lack sensitivity or suffer intermodulation from broadcast stations and pulse interference from the LORAN signals active on 100kHz.

Aerials for monitoring this band are mainly Loops or Active Short Whips, whereas for transmitting, Long Wire aerials or Vertical Whips with large loading and matching units are called for.

Several amateurs operate “grabbers” so that operators can then transmit and monitor their signals on a local or distant “grabber” and they also record band activity showing active areas.

This also means that if your receiver or aerial cannot cover this band you can at least go online and check activity if only to satisfy your curiosity.

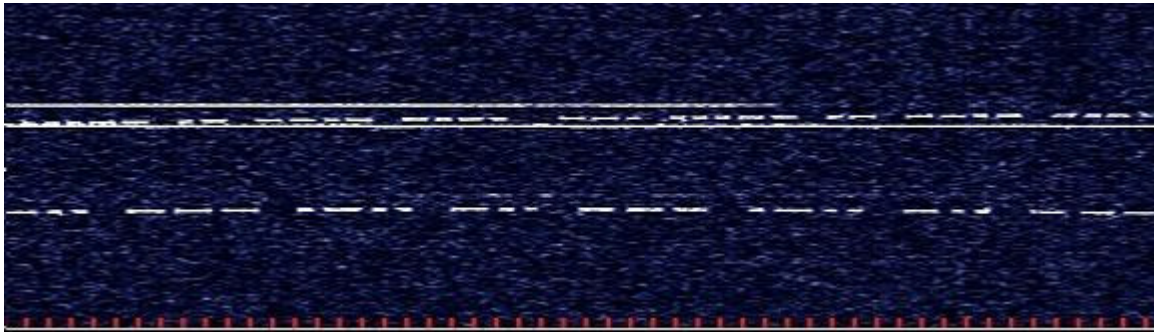
QRSS is a mode that uses very slow CW and is derived from the Q Code for “please lower your speed”. Use is made of a PC soundcard and one of the many software packages freely available that will provide QRSS decoding.

CW is transmitted with an extended dot length that can vary from 3 to 60 seconds.

This is very useful for weak signal capture and does on occasions allow signals from US to be heard in Europe and vice versa.

Political turmoil hits Mexican AM and FM bands

Striking teachers supported by students and leftist organizations in Oaxaca, Mexico, hijacked and operated 2 AM stations in the second half of 2006, XERPO on 710, La Ley del Pueblo (ex-Radio Variedades) & XEUBJ on 1400, Radio Universidad, "mil watts de potencia proletaria y popular". Earlier, the striking teachers had been making their voices heard on an FM station, Radio Plantón, "poniendo ideas en tu conciencia", on 92.1 MHz.

In their opposition of the local government, the strikes were joined by Zapatistas and other leftists in a group called APPO, Asamblea Popular de los Pueblos de Oaxaca.

On Oct. 26, the El Financiero newspaper reported the appearance of an FM station on 99.1 supportive of the governor of Oaxaca state. The station, called R Ciudadana, La Voz de Oaxaca, was using a news format resembling that of the oppositional station on 710, said the news report.

By that time the 710 station had been returned to its legal owners. The University station remained on the air with its inflammatory speeches until local jamming made reception impossible.

By early January it seems that things in Oaxaca are back to normal. La Voz de Oaxaca, Radio Universidad and Radio Plantón, can be found on their usual web sites, but not on the band. And there is no longer any Radio Ciudadana on the dial apart from one in the nation's capital, which is operating on 660 kHz with 50 kW. It supersedes La Candela, sabor tropical (WRTH 2006 has the name and slogan wrong). *Henrik Klemetz (using internet information and an audio file submitted to the RealDX yahoo group by Jim Pogue)*

Netherlands Antilles

New status of Netherlands Antilles delayed till December 2008

The Dutch Minister for Administrative Reform, Atzo Nicolaï, has agreed that the new status of the Netherlands Antilles will only come into effect at the end of next year. Previously it had been agreed that the islands would assume their new status in mid-2007. Now a new date has been set: 15 December 2008.

The island of St Maarten will then become a country, and Bonaire, St Eustatius and Saba will acquire a special status as Dutch municipalities. No decision has yet been made on the status of Curaçao. The Island Council previously rejected a new agreement on the political relationship with the Netherlands. Mr Nicolaï expects that the island will eventually join in with the reforms and also become a country within the Kingdom of the Netherlands at the end of next year. The Netherlands has reserved almost half a million euros to support the changes in status. A large part of the money will be spent on debt reduction.

- After being off for two weeks, Loisirs AM is back on the air on 1314kHz (WRTH Updates and various direct reports).

- On March 12th, 2007, Industry Minister, Mr François Loos, issued a ministerial decree for the transition to Digital Radio in France based on a multi-standard approach. The AM band (short, medium and long wave) will experience a renewal through the adoption of digital standard, DRM. In addition, the T-DMB implementation of the DAB standard will be used in both Band III and L-Band, with the likely incorporation of the recently announced DAB+ standard. Over the past 3 years, RadioScape has pioneered the development of multi-standard radio receiver technology to support both DAB and DRM standards. RadioScape is now shipping the RS500 module, which provides reception for DAB (Band-III & L-Band), DRM (LW, MW & SW), FM-RDS, AM (LW & MW) including AMSS, automatic alternative frequency switching (AFS), EPG (DAB), SD-CARD Recording (DAB/DRM) and playback of MP3/WMA files. RadioScape's Broadcast Systems product line already supports multiple implementations of the DAB standard including DAB audio, T-DMB and DAB-IP, with DAB+ coming later this year. Over 85 broadcast systems are 'on air' at major broadcasters and network operators around the world to support DAB audio as well as DMB based multi-media and mobile TV transmissions. The announcement this week in France follows a year of close collaboration between Radio France, RMC, RTL, SIRT (regional radios), NRJ and the Lagardere group radio stations who joined forces with the objective of obtaining statutory regulation for the introduction of

broadcasting standards, which would give the green light to the adoption of digital radio.

India

The Indian Minister of Information & Broadcasting and Parliamentary Affairs, Shri P R Dasmunsi, gave the following information about state broadcaster Prasar Bharati in a written reply to a question in Lok Sabha today: Doordarshan [the TV network] has 64 studio centres and 1398 transmitters whereas All India Radio has 225 stations comprising 361 transmitters all over the country. All the 64 studio centres in Doordarshan Network are functional. Two additional studio centres at Calicut (Kerala) and Rajouri (J&K) are technically ready and these are yet to be operationalized. These two studio centres can be operationalized after the requisite staff is sanctioned and deployed. 53 transmitters, out of total 1398 transmitters in Doordarshan network, are presently relaying partial transmission due to non availability of adequate manpower. Staff for operation and maintenance of a large number of Doordarshan stations has not been sanctioned and these have been operationalized by providing limited staff by way of redeployment. In case of All India Radio, all the transmitters/installations are functional except for 1000 kW Medium Wave transmitter at Rajkot which is expected to be replaced by September, 2009 and two 250 kW shortwave transmitters at Aligarh are shut for want of spares which are expected to be provided by November, 2007. The Government is considering a proposal for expanding the coverage of All India Radio and Doordarshan during the Eleventh Five Year Plan. However, Eleventh Plan is yet to be finalized. The extent of terrestrial TV coverage is 79 per cent by area and 91 per cent by population of the country including rural and backward areas. Similarly, the extent of coverage of AIR is 91.78 per cent by area and 99.14 per cent by population of the country including rural and backward areas. The whole of the country except Andaman and Nicobar Islands is also covered through Doordarshan's free to air DTH service. The DTH service was launched primarily for providing AIR/TV coverage to uncovered backward and rural areas. Some more FM radio stations in such areas will also be considered under the Eleventh Plan subject to availability of funds. (Source: Press Information Bureau, Government of India)

The Communications Commission of Kenya - CCK has stopped issuing analogue frequencies for applicants for licences in the broadcasting sector. Information Minister, Mutahi Kagwe said the role has now been transferred to the Kenya Broadcasting Corporation - KBC that will be the sole digital licence provider. Speaking in his office during the inauguration of a digital broadcasting taskforce, Kagwe said the government also plans to phase out terrestrial analogue broadcasting by 2015. All broadcasting stations are now required to begin relinquishing all analogue channels while new broadcasting applicants will only be granted digital frequencies. Kagwe said introduction of digital broadcasting would increase Internet access and increase audio and video quality. He said the digital services would be expanded to rural areas in order to increase socio-economic development. The Regional Radio Communication Conference on Digital Broadcasting agreed on 2015 as the cutover date for the transmission to digital broadcasting. (Source: Kenya Broadcasting Corporation)

Phone-in row hits radio stations

12 March, 2007

Premium rate phone lines regulator Ictis is to hold a further meeting on the row engulfing the sector, this time with radio broadcasters, after two stations were pulled into the controversy.

Ictis said it was looking into allegations surrounding Virgin Radio, owned by SMG, and Chrysalis-owned LBC in London over separate complaints.

Virgin has admitted listeners were encouraged to call into a pre-recorded request show, while Ictis said it was looking into an allegation that callers to an LBC phone-in weren't told how much the calls cost. A Virgin Radio listener told the Mail on Sunday yesterday that he had called Suggs' Saturday night request show from his car but when he got home he switched on the TV to find the Madness singer appearing live on Ant and Dec's Saturday Night Takeaway. Virgin admitted the show was sometimes pre-recorded but said all requests were still used at some point.

An Ictis spokeswoman said it had also been made aware of another allegation surrounding LBC over "price and clarity" which will be examined. The spokeswoman said that even though radio companies attended last week's meeting of broadcasters and programme makers over the phone lines controversy, another seminar would be held specifically for the sector. John F comments: “This month I can report something I thought was completely out of my reach due to my location – my first ever west coast North American DX from home! I had all but given up on this after 30 years of medium wave DXing. 1000 KOMO and 1470 CJVB were both heard on the 27th of February but KOMO was peaking at S9 on the 7030 which was a BIG surprise. Local Gem AM 999 from Nottingham had to be reduced to hear KOMO otherwise neither the ewe or the ALA1530 by themselves would have picked this out. I reduced Gem AM by about 50% which enabled KOMO to be heard word-perfect for several minutes. CJVB was a little harder though. Despite these two I feel this has been a poor DX season, considering, this has been the solar minimum. I am not disappointed with my personal firsts but I expected to hear more”. Couldn’t agree more – this season has not been as good as last, here in Clashmore, despite some interesting catches. I hope to do an analysis in due course - mah

To paraphrase **Ronald**’s comments on conditions: On 27th of February I listened from 05.40 until 07.45 UTC and was surprised to find good conditions, giving some highlights from Western Canada, east coasters, and one Puerto Rican.

Thomas Berner tells us: “This DX-pedition had a bad start with 2 of the 3 participants becoming ill a few weeks before and a curious end: We had to wait for a big snow plow to rescue us from a 4 day capture in a snow storm. Radio conditions were quite nice but not as excellent as I expected them to be seeing the low Ap- indices of that week. My personal highlights were the reception of some west coast stations from CA and BC and of 2 daytimers from the east coast.

Wolfgang tried his new SDR-14 for the first time and we both were impressed by the results. The main advantage of this radio is its ability to record a 190kHz segment of the band on hard disc. It is ideal for digging out details which you missed in a short opening and for listening afterwards to all those channels that you didn’t find worth staying on.

Thomas Knauf-Lapatzki writes: “I have as usual spent two weeks from 24/2 to 9/3 on the Danish North Sea island of Rømø for MW DXing in a private holiday house approximately 2500 m from the sea. Altogether I caught 51 TA stations (compared with 60 stations last time, in November 2006)”. Unfortunately the first 2 pages of your fax came through blank, so I only have logs above 1130 kHz; and sorry I haven’t had time to type in all the details you sent – mah.

No comments on propagation from Clashmore this weekend, I’ll let the logs speak for themselves. I’m rather pressed for time at the moment, fitting the completion of the log into a day and a half at home, between commitments elsewhere.

The **deadline** for the May/June DX Loggings is **Tuesday 24th April**. I look forward to receiving your logs by then, preferably electronically/via e-mail using the Word pro-forma, which I can supply on request. Please remember that I don’t automatically include loggings sent to the MWC e-List, so please copy me separately if you would like them included in DX Loggings.
