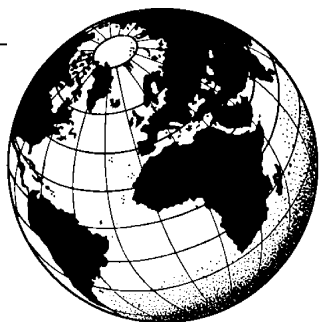
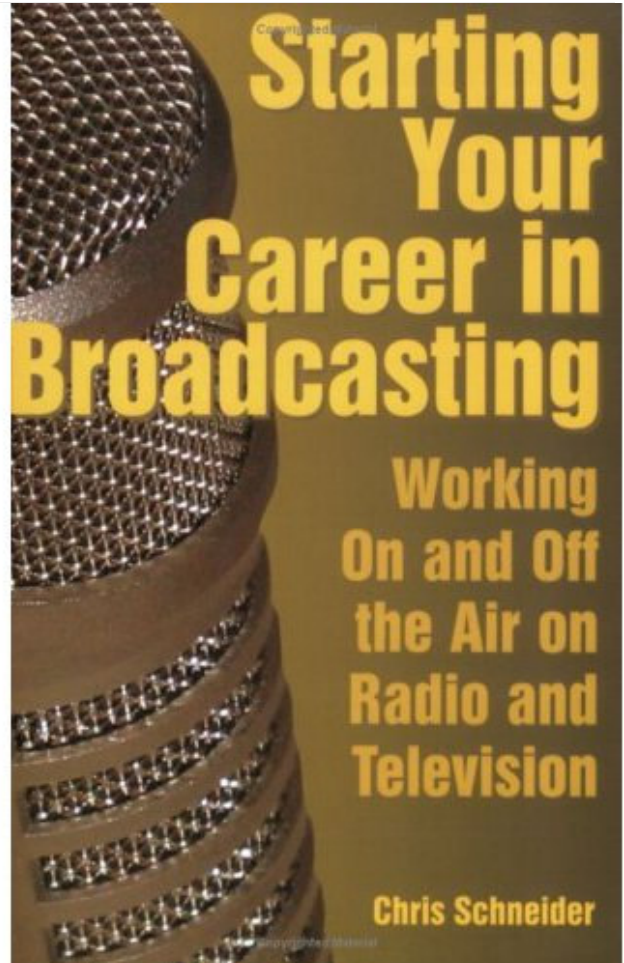

### Transmitter closures

Several MW transmitters have signed off in Europe. In Belgium, Flemish public broadcaster VRT closed down transmitters on 540 and 1512 kHz on March 30, and a day later also 1188 kHz, while only 927 kHz remains on the air. In Ireland, public service broadcaster Raidió Teilifís Éireann (RTÉ) has closed 567kHz (500 kW in Tullamore) and 729 kHz (10 kW in Cork) on March 31. Longwave service on 252 kHz will continue, airing Radio 1 for areas without adequate FM coverage.

## Thoughts on the closure of RTE MW broadcasts

With the recent closure of RTE, I picked up the following historical anecdote via DX listening Digest. Does anyone know anything more on the topic?

“During World War II (when the Republic of Ireland remained neutral) there was a problem with the Radio Eireann transmission from Athlone on 530m. This 100 kW signal was providing an excellent directional beacon to German bombers. The BBC had overcome this problem by transmitting a synchronised network using many transmitters on just two (or later three) frequencies, closing down transmitters as required when enemy planes were nearby. But Athlone stood out like a sore thumb. The solution was ingenious: the BBC picked up Radio Eireann on a dedicated receiver on the western coast of Wales, then fed the signal over landlines to Aberdeen in north-eastern Scotland, where it was rebroadcast at high power. The result – confusion for aircraft. (And puzzled Irish listeners in Aberdeen who couldn’t understand how reception of their Irish station had improved so dramatically! (*Tony Currie, Radio Six International, Glasgow, Scotland, March 25*))

## WBIX DX Test Final Report

It seems that the only DXers east of the Mississippi River who had a problem hearing the test were those like me here in Memphis who live in WBIX's protective null. Likewise, J.D. Stephens and Les Rayburn in Alabama reported no success in hearing this most desirable test.

A trend that appears to be developing is a greater international interest in trying for DX tests. This is indeed exciting, and a potentially strong selling point to station engineers and management for future tests. Evidence supporting some unrealized potential for future successes in this area is provided by comments from DXer Mark Connelly in Massachusetts:

“At 0016 EST / 0516 UTC on 24 FEB I had no problem hearing the WBIX-1060 Natick, MA test on the DXTuner receiver located in Ilfracombe, England,” he wrote. “Code ID's, sweep tones, and voice announcements came through fine. Clearly dominating the channel. (Other DXTuners) that had some signal: Edinburgh, Scotland (poor, much weaker than at Ilfracombe, bits of voice and tones) Italy and Germany (carrier evident but nil / nearly nil audio) Caracas, Venezuela (bits of Morse code ID in huge “furball” jumble).”

Thanks for sharing this fascinating info Mark. Perhaps we need to try and reach out to DXers in Latin America and encourage them to begin listening for tests. I have not received any reports from DXers in those regions on any tests this season.

As the prime BCB listening time begins to transition into nights with higher QRN levels and more hours of daylight, I am still trying to nail down just a couple more DX tests. More to follow on these as details become available.

Once again, our sincere thanks to WBIX Chief Engineer Grady Moates for agreeing to conduct this test, and to BTC member Paul B. Walker Jr. for his persistent efforts to arrange it. Now to the task of processing the many requests for QSLs.

Remember to keep checking the DXTESTS.INFO Web site frequently and listen to the BTC Podcasts for news and late-breaking developments.

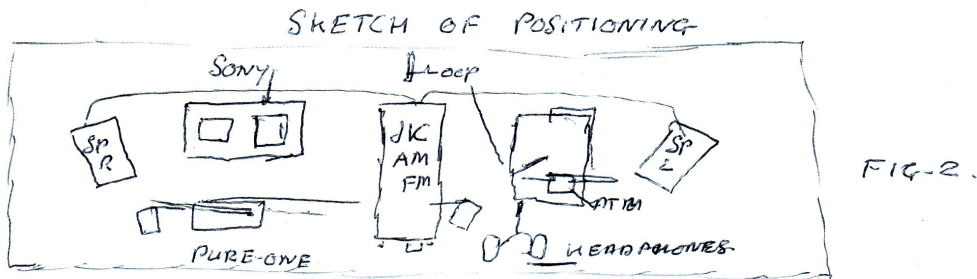
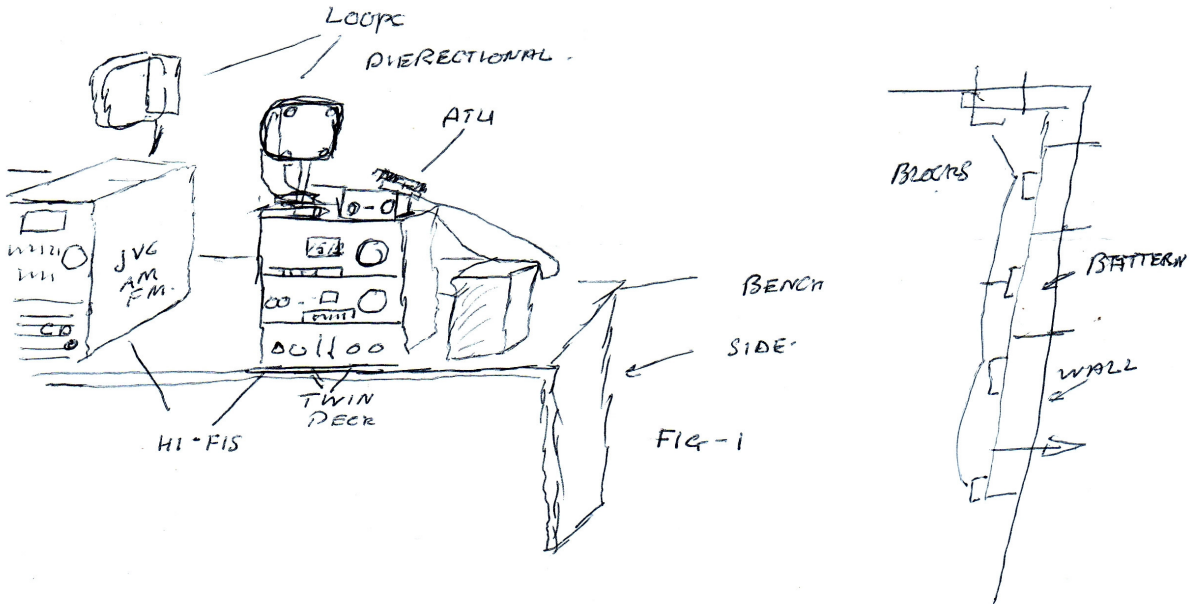

# RED SANDS RADIO

with John Williams

This summer, Icom UK is to sponsor a unique radio station on the outskirts of Kent. In fact this special station called Red Sands Radio will be 8.5 miles offshore from Whitstable on the North coast of Kent in an old WWII Army Sea Fort on the Red Sands.

The radio station, which will be on-air from early July, will be broadcasting to 1,000's of listeners in Kent on 1278 kHz and via the Internet at <http://www.redsandonline.co.uk> As part of the sponsorship agreement,

Icom UK are planning to operate an Amateur Radio special event station. Ofcom has issued GBORSR the special call sign for this occasion. Icom will be broadcasting on HF using an IC-756PROIII in the evening and on VHF/UHF in the day. Icom UK also plan to conduct D-Star transmissions into a repeater system and the Internet. A vertical antenna will be affixed to the stanchions on the Southern Gun Tower roof to support the communications.

Project-Redsand is a Registered Charity that aims to preserve the Red Sands Army Fort as they are the last complete set of its kind in the world. Red Sands Radio is part of that task but in addition has the ambition to provide real 'Local Radio for Local People'. Programme Director, Bob Le-Roi said, 'Icom have a mutual interest in what we are doing and we're delighted they're aboard. We're offering Icom UK an opportunity to broadcast world-wide during this summer transmission period.'

He added, 'preparing the Fort for broadcasting is a mammoth task. We install generators, set up the radio station, erect an antenna system and make it habitable. It will be a big job for us all.' Icom UK Managing Director Phil Hadler said, 'We very much enjoyed the programmes from Red Sands Radio last year, it was a breath of fresh air hearing something different, that was topical and local that played a wide range of music. We as a specialist organisation realised how difficult it was to pull off the initiative and are pleased to be supporting the project hereon'

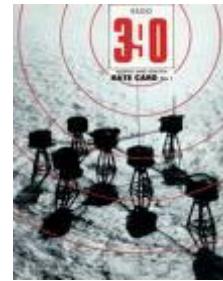

About Project Redsand [www.project-redsand.com](http://www.project-redsand.com): The Thames Sea Forts are the last in a long history of British Marine Defences. The Army Anti Aircraft forts have played a significant role in post World War 2 developments. Notably in offshore fuel exploration and drilling platforms. The successful rapid deployment of the Maunsell Forts soon after led to the construction of the first offshore oil platform in the Gulf of Mexico in the late 1940's.

Up until 2003, no serious consideration had been paid to the preservation of any of these historic structures. Now discussion is taking place within Government Agencies, which will determine the future of The Maunsell Towers. Project Redsand has been established to secure the Redsand Towers, coded "Uncle 6" during WW2 and chosen because it is the better of the two Army forts, closest to shore and clear of the main shipping lanes.

Project Redsand have, since August 2003, been in discussion with Government Agencies about this proposal. Concerns such as the stability and structural integrity of the fort have been addressed. During July 2004, a survey team inspected the fort on behalf of Project Redsand. A Port of London Authority diving team together with Taylor Woodrow materials specialists gave the "all clear" to go ahead with the Project.

Mowlem Marine, experts in marine structures, installed a new safe system for Project Redsand in 2005. Materials were donated by a number of River Thames companies. Other companies around the UK are now preparing to assist Project Redsand.

Meanwhile, the Department for Culture Media and Sport has considered an application to list the structures. A summary of their can be seen on the News page. The Project Team are seeking sponsorship and grant aid for the restoration program which will form a Charitable Trust.

The Ministry of Defence is to supply a team of Royal Engineers who, as part of a training exercise will assist working parties at the Fort. The duration of the restoration program will be determined by the availability of funding. This may take a number of years to realise. Patience, determination and hard work will be essential. To date, media support has been excellent. The Project has been covered by The Times, BBC Breakfast TV, The Telegraph and a host of local TV, Radio and newspapers.

July 2007 saw the first licensed broadcast from the Redsand Fort. A 10 day Restricted Service Licence allowed transmission on medium wave and a webcast, commemorating 40 years since the demise of "offshore radio" from the Thames Estuary forts. Red Sands Radio was sponsored by Canterbury City Council and the Lottery Fund.

Tower takes a tumble: The severe gales over recent weeks have taken their toll at the Red Sands Fort. Situated seven nautical miles out from Whitstable in the Thames Estuary, the Forts are exposed to the full onslaught of winds from every direction. So hardly a surprise that the transmitter antenna installed on the Red Sands Fort last summer has taken a tumble

Said radio engineer & overall Project Redsand Chairman Robin Adcroft "We're disappointed it's fallen but in reality it was a temporary antenna which we didn't expect to survive the winter". He continued, "We have a new and permanent replacement ready to ship out and erect for this and future Red Sands Radio broadcasts" ( Bob Le-Roi - Programme Director <http://www.redsandonline.co.uk/> via Rein Faber).



# '08 CABIN FEVER DX SPRINT

We would like to thank those who participated in the event even if they didn't officially submit a log. Paramount in planning the event, we wanted the participants to have fun and not be burdened with onerous log keeping. We think that we succeeded.

We had 13 official submissions. 8 participated in Barefoot Class and 5 in Unlimited Class. There were quite a few other DXers who intended to submit loggings, but the "real world" intervened.

Rob Ross of London, Ontario, took top honors with 150 stations logged. Rob has learned his way around the dial on his barefoot Sony SRF-T615 having logged over 400 stations on it in the past two months. He is still using the original batteries, but wore out a Lazy Boy Recliner.

Mike Tuggle of Kaneohe, Hawaii, and the multi-operator team of Allen Willie and Lorne Harnum of St. John's, Newfoundland, had staggering scores in the World-wide DX category. Mike participated in the Unlimited Class and amassed 34,706 km. For those who don't know of Mike, he is a longtime DXer who uses minimalist rigs and is widely known for his creative set design in crystal radios and simple electronics circuits. Mike's top 5 World Wide DX stations: KFAQ Tulsa, OK 6160 km; 530 R.V.C. S. Caicos 8794 km; 740 KTRH Houston, TX 6299 km; 1520 KOKC Oklahoma City, OK 6011 km; and CHWO Oakville, ON 7442 km.

Since this fall, Allen Willie has logged over 60 Trans-Atlantics with his Ultralight radios. His team's 5 station total in WW DX was 44,069 km and reads like a Middle Eastern travelogue: Radio Sawa, Arta, Djibouti 9504 km; 1575 Radio Farda, Al Dhabbaya, United Arab Emirates 9251 km; 1521 BSKSA, Dubai, Saudi Arabia 8730 km; 1548 Radio Sawa, Kuwait City, Kuwait 8446 km and 1503 R. Sarasarye, Bushehr, Iran 8138 km. The total distance of these five stations exceeds the distance around the Equator.

In the Americas DX category, John Bryant of Stillwater, OK, was top scorer with 12,334 km in the Unlimited Class, and he logged the following stations: 570 Radio Reloj, CMDC Santa Clara, Cuba 2245 km; 670 R. Rebelde, CMQ, Ciudad Habana, Cuba 2018 km; 710 R. Rebelde, CMW, La Julia, La Habana, Cuba 2052 km; R. Rebelde, CMBA, Villa Maria, La H., Cuba 2017 km and 800 TransWorldR, PJB, Bonaire, Netherlands Antilles 3912 km.

In the Americas DX category, Barefoot Class, Rob Ross of London, Ontario, was top scorer with 17,502 km and logged the following: 750 Radio Caracas YVKS Caracas, Venezuela 3863 km; 800 PJB3 TWR Bonaire, Netherlands Antilles 3649 km; 1060 XEEP Mexico City, Mexico 3108 km; 810 Caracol HJCY Bogota, Colombia 4313 km; 530 Radio Vision Cristiana Grand Turk, Turks/Caicos 2569 km.

These catches by John and Rob are noteworthy because of their landlocked locations, demonstrating that great DXing into Latin America can be had with simple equipment from non-coastal areas of North America.

### The recovery of Radio Surco 930 kHz

The signals of a Cuban of medium wave transmitter were put back in the air by local telecommunications specialists, thus benefitting more than 56 thousand inhabitants of the North zone of the province of Ciego de Ávila. Engineer Ramón Mayea Burgos with his four colleagues, repaired the 25 kilowatt transmitter of Radio Surco on 930 kHz. It was necessary to modify the power modules, to improve the technical state, to replace the circuits and to mount new aggregates and components. The transmitter was installed in the city of Morón and it serves as a provincial transmitter, whose signal is can be listened by more than 95 percent of the province. Conexion Digital via finndxer

## Australia

From the ABC website: This is official confirmation of the sale of the majority of Tasmanian commercial radio stations to an unknown outfit, Grant Broadcasters. As the news item states, no major changes are expected in the short term. This leaves Macquarie with the two Hobart FM licenses. Here in northern Tasmania, 7LA and TAB radio are on 89.3 and 90.1 and simulcasting with their existing AM channels of 1098 and 1008. TAB radio has already indicated they will be switching off 1008 very soon. 7LA will have a 60 day period before they finally dim 1098 but no indications when that 60 day period commences.

Nine Tasmanian radio station licences have been sold by their owner, the Macquarie Media Group. Grant Broadcasters has bought the licences for an undisclosed sum. The licences are: 7LA in Launceston; Sea-FM and Heart 7BU in Burnie; Sea-FM and Heart 7AD in Devonport; Aus-FM and West Coast 7XS in Queenstown; and in Scottsdale, Sea-FM and Heart 7SD. The sales were ordered by the Competition and Consumer Commission, and the Australian Communications and Media Authority, after Macquarie bought the Southern Cross Broadcasting company late last year.

Macquarie retains its two Hobart-based FM licences, Sea-FM and Heart-FM. Grant Cameron from Grant Broadcasters says his company will keep existing staff, and is not planning any big changes to existing formats. "We're continuing with the current programming that people are familiar with and used to, so I think we'll be seeing a lot of the same sort of thing, and we're not planning to come in and start pulling rugs out from anything and upsetting apple carts," he said. (*Robin L. Harwood, via DXLD*)

## Belgium

Flemish public broadcaster VRT closed down its transmitters on 540 and 1512 kHz on March 30, and a day later also 1188 kHz, while only 927 kHz remains on the air.. Radiovisie says that the

VRT will save 2.5 million kWh of energy, and produce 1850 tons less of CO<sub>2</sub> per year. The decision was reached after management decided not to invest further in mediumwave. The mediumwave sites are about thirty years old, and without new investment it is impossible to keep them all operating (*Radiovisie.be by Andy, Media Network blog via DXLD*)

The 540 frequency is excellent for International Broadcasting. When situated in SW Flanders and with the assigned power (more than it is running on now) you will be able to cover the whole of Belgium, but also the Netherlands and a major part of the UK including London (!) and NW France (Lille). I guess a 30 Million pop. coverage. 1188 ca also be used with much more than the current 5 kW in Kuurne, and situated on a good location will cover the whole of Flanders. Yes you need a new site and with limited costs (do it yourself, never hire a state operator) I see a business case. 1512 is quite local, its current location you can just cover Brussels and Antwerp, and a major part of Flanders with say 20-50 kW. During night-time this is a rather clear channel for International broadcasters. Maybe some reli party might be interested. Note that the Belgian government MUST put the channels available to commercial broadcasters due to European (Brussels hi hi) regulations (*Ruud Poeze via DXLD*)

Further to my earlier message and according to Radiovisie, the VRT has decided to stop broadcasting on 540, 1188, and 1512 kHz as per 30 March 2008. Only 927 kHz, broadcasting the first Flemish channel 'Radio 1', will be maintained. (*Herman Boel*)

Yes, it (1188kHz) was officially switched off at 0930. In fact, there is an amusing story - the transmitter went off the air at 0923 because a senior official of VRT who was present for the switchoff accidentally pressed a button too early. The engineer switched it back on for another 7 minutes :-). If you're wondering how I know this, Herbert Visser of 100%NL is a friend of the VRT engineer, and spoke to him on the phone a short while after it happened. Then Herbie came and told me :-). *Andy Sennitt via dxld yg (31/3-2008)*

## Denmark

DRM tests on Kalundborg 243 kHz --- See forwarded message below. Right now I can't spot any signal on 243. 13 kbps? Wow, then why not just sticking with AM for the same audio quality, with the slight difference that it can be pulled in with any ordinary radio that includes longwave (Kai Ludwig, DXLD)

A surprise move the long wave transmitter in Kalundborg on 243 kHz -which ceased operation more than a year ago on Feb 15 2007 - is now on the air again. I first noted it back yesterday afternoon. It is broadcasting a 1 kHz tone in DRM (with 13 kbps compression) and ID'ing as 'DR DENMARK'. Signal strength here (in Jutland) is lower than when they used AM. (Stig Hartvig Nielsen)



The power of the DRM test is currently only 35 watts, but it may be increased to 100 watts. The antenna will soon be shortened, and the test is to compare the signal strength before and after. I have not been able to decode the signal here in Copenhagen. As said, the "program" is a 1 kHz tone and the ID 'DR Radio Denmark'. (*Erik K ie via DXLD*)

## Eritrea

A coalition of Eritrean opposition groups backed by big supports in Exile launched anti-Isayas Radio broadcast. The Broadcast which has been on trial since January is based in northern Ethiopia Tigray region's Mekelle city. Recently some 11 Eritrean opposition groups have launched

TV broadcast in Ethiopia's Capital, Addis Ababa. "The target of the new broadcast is to brain wash the ill-ideology Eritrean regime has inflicted over Eritrean people against the Ethiopian people" the man currently in charge of the Radio station, Hagos, who refused to tell his second name, told Sudan Tribune Today. "We are trying to bring together the two brotherly people and bury their enmity one the other and make sure no more blood shed is repeated again as the result of rouge [rogue?] propaganda of Isayas Afewerki-led regime", Hagos said, adding "we, on behalf of the people are assuring the Eritrean people that Ethiopia is in-foe only with the Eritrean leadership and not with the Eritrean people at all."

The new radio station named WEGAHTA (Tigrigna translation- dawn) airs programs twice a day, for 3 hours beginning 6 Am in the morning and for 7 hours beginning 5 Pm in the afternoon for a total of 10 hours a day. [assuming UT+3, that's 0300-0600, 1400-2100 UT]. "The program is a major bridge to bring back on track the historic ties of the two brotherly people" Twelde Abai, a historian and resident in Mekelle town said. Currently the radio station airs programs to Ethiopia, Eritrea and partly to Arab nations. Hagos denied any Ethiopian Involvement on the broadcast: "Neither the federal government of Ethiopia, nor the regional government of Tigray has hands on the broadcast, he said, adding "But it is on the best and mutual Interest of the two neighboring people." More news in: <http://www.sudantribune.com/spip.php?article26287> . (Zacharias Liangas via DXLD)

It's on 909kHz only. Definitely no shortwave (at least, at present). It's the same station that was operating from eastern Sudan two years ago, also on 909 (see WRTH 2006, page 525, and WRTH 2007, page 505). At that time, it was being referred to in the DX press as "Eastern Radio". In Arabic, Al-Sharq can mean East or Dawn. It now appears that the intended name is "Dawn" rather than "East". (Chris Greenway via DXLD)

## Finland

## France:

I have mentioned that the station has been logged in Scandinavia, in England and Scotland as well as in Canada.

## Kuwait

The US Broadcasting Board of Governors (BBG), International Broadcasting Bureau (IBB), intends to negotiate a competitive contract for the construction of three equipment shelters, installation of Radio Frequency (RF) transmission line, and related tasks for a new mediumwave three-tower antenna array at the IBB transmitting station in Kuwait. The transmitter site is located 40 km NW of Kuwait City. (Media Network Weblog)

## Mauritania:

783 kHz, R. Mauritanie, Nouakchott, 1019-1120 (!) (fade-out later on), 15 Mar, Arabic, Arabic music, phone-ins; adjacent QRM de España. Neither 4845 nor 7245 were audible at this time, but the latter surfaced later as it was well audible around 1300 (*Carlos Gonçalves, SW coast of Portugal, via DXLD*)

## Netherlands

The winners of the five regional Dutch mediumwave licences advertised in November 2007 have been announced. Two have been awarded to Crosspoints BV, the company that owns Arrow Classic Rock and Arrow Jazz FM. This has caused great surprise in the Netherlands, given that Arrow recently relinquished the high power channel of 675 kHz. The company isn't saying what it plans to do with the frequencies, but a spokesperson told the website RadioFreak.nl that "internally we do have an idea what we're going to do with them, but I can't yet say anything."

The frequency of 1485 kHz has been awarded to Radio Marina, an oldies station. The frequency was advertised for a single transmitter in The Hague, but on its website Radio Marina says it plans to operate two transmitters serving South Holland and Flevoland. The first transmitter is scheduled to start broadcasting on 9 March.

Almere 1224 kHz has gone to Stichting Radika, which currently broadcasts on FM from Rotterdam under the name **Radio Amor**. Finally, Amsterdam 1557 kHz has been awarded to Stichting BKB3, which currently operates Magic FM in Amsterdam and Alkmaar.

In summary, these are the new stations: Heinenoord 828 kHz 20 kW (day) and 5 kW (night): Crosspoints BV (Arrow): not yet in operation. Echt 1035 kHz 10 kW: Crosspoints BV (Arrow): not yet in operation. Almere 1224 kHz 40 kW (day) and 20 kW (night): Stichting Radika (Radio Amor): not yet in operation. Location unconfirmed 1485 kHz 1 kW: Radio Marina (due to launch 9 March) Tilburg 1485 kHz 1 kW: Radio Marina (future plans). Amsterdam 1557 kHz 1 kW: Stichting BKB3 (Magic FM): not yet in operation. (*Andy Sennitt, Media Network weblog*)

DutchMedia reports that it has learned directly from Arrow that it plans to use one of its newly acquired mediumwave frequencies for a station called Arrow Talks. No start date has been decided. Arrow hopes to find a business partner for the project, probably a newspaper publisher. Arrow owner/director Ad Ossenrijver told DutchMedia that the frequency, 828 kHz, can broadcast from the existing transmitter site at Heinenoord near Rotterdam, so can be quickly brought on the air. The other frequency, 1035 kHz, is intended to be used as a "gap filler" for Arrow Jazz FM, which does not currently have satisfactory coverage in Limburg. For this station, a transmitter site still has to be found. (*DutchMedia via Andy Sennitt, Media Network weblog*)

Dutch commercial radio station **Radio Waddenzee** has confirmed plans to broadcast from sea on 1-3 May 2008. The radio ship "Jenni Baynton" will anchor close to the island of Griend between Harlingen and Terschelling. On Sat/Sun 2 and 3 May, the historic lifeboat Javazee will

make a series of trips to carry visitors to the radio ship. Unfortunately, there are no spare places available as they have already been fully booked. Radio Waddensee broadcasts on 1602 kHz with a power of around 1 kW. Source: Radio Waddensee)

## South Africa

Last week The Independent Communication Authority of South Africa (ICASA) granted Radio Pulpit permission to replace its existing radio transmitter. Currently Radio Pulpit broadcasts on the 657 kHz mediumwave transmitter while ICASA is still in the process of considering the station's licence application, lodged last year September. The existing transmitter is 26 years old and the station is experiencing countless problems in maintaining the old technology. After recent lightning damage the transmitter was also unable to broadcast to listeners on a number of occasions.

In the light of these circumstances, Radio Pulpit brought an application to ICASA last week for the urgent replacement of the transmitter. The station bought a transmitter more than a year ago to be installed once the licence application is granted. It is however impossible to wait any longer due to damage to the existing transmitter.

Dr Roelf Petersen, CEO of Radio Pulpit, expressed his satisfaction with this decision and also confirmed the positive attitude Radio Pulpit is experiencing from the broadcasting authority. He said that the first building blocks will now be laid for the establishment of the future broadcasting platform of Radio Pulpit. He also emphasised the fact that the replacement and installation of the new transmitter was made possible by the contribution of financial supporters and listeners of the station.

The uniqueness of this new transmitter is also very significant. This will be the first radio transmitter on South African soil that will also be able to broadcast digitally. It is also capable of broadcasting simultaneously in analog and digital should it be necessary. The station foresees that digital test broadcasts will be conducted in the future, after the necessary consent has been given by the authorities. Listeners will be informed of how they would be affected during the installation process and on which frequency they will be able to listen to their favourite programmes.

VOA reintroduces shortwave for Urdu service. Starting 30th March the Voice of America reintroduces 2 hrs of broadcasting on SW for its Urdu Service after it was discontinued from 28<sup>th</sup> January: 0100-0200 UTC on 7145 11805 kHz and 1400-1500 UTC on 9580 15255 kHz. This will definitely improve reception in Northern and Eastern parts of India. The MW channels 972 and 1539 kHz will continue to broadcast for 12 hours a day at 1400-0200 UTC. *(DXAsia via RN Media Network weblog)*

## Interesting conditions continue

The advent of spring usually heralds a sharp decline in LF listening conditions as atmospheric noise begins its seasonal upswing. However, despite this, listeners on both sides of the Atlantic reported a number of very interesting catches last month. See the “Logs” section below.

## Amateur LF beacons

Alan Gale G4TMV of the NDB List provides a list of experimental amateur beacons operating in the new 500 kHz band:

“With the exception of the German beacons, which are only allowed to operate in beacon mode, it's difficult to say when the others will be active (and which mode they will use—*AR*). Walter, the operator of DI2AG, also operates a beacon on 440.044 kHz.

“Below is a list of known operators. There are probably a few more UK stations but since OFCOM seem to view these details as some sort of state secret, I can only speculate as to the actual number. There may also be several more Belgian stations active now, but since they've just obtained this band, full details aren't known yet.”

“Belgium: ON7YD; Czech Republic: OK0EMW; England: G0MRF, G0NBD, G3AQC, G3DXZ, G3JFS, G3KEV, G3KZU, G3LDO, G3OLB, G3ROO, G3UNT, G3VTT, G3WCB, G3XAQ, G3XIZ, G3XVL, G3YHV, G3YMC, G3YXM, G4GDR, G4WGT, M0BMU; Germany: DI2AM, DI2BE, DI2BO, DI2KA; Northern Ireland: GI3PDN, GI4DPE; Scotland: GM4ISM; Shetland Isles: GM4SLV; Sweden: SM6BHZ; USA: WD2XFX, WD2XSH/1, WD2XSH/2, WD2XSH/3, WD2XSH/4, WD2XSH/5, WD2XSH/6, WD2XSH/7, WD2XSH/8, WD2XSH/9, WD2XSH/10, WD2XSH/11, WD2XSH/12, WD2XSH/13, WD2XSH/14, WD2XSH/15, WD2XSH/16, WD2XSH/17, WD2XSH/18, WD2XSH/19, WD2XSH/20, WD2XSH/21, WD2XSH/22, WD2XSH/23, WE2XGR/1, WE2XGR/2, WE2XGR/3, WE2XGR/4, WE2XGR/5, WE2XGR/6; Wales: GW3UEP, GW4HXO.”

Since Alan's report, another Belgian beacon operated by ON4KTJ has appeared on 502.704 kHz. Belgian regulations restrict these beacons to CW mode. QRSS is allowed. (*NDB List*)

## Logs

European and North American listeners are still hearing quite a few distant NDBs in exotic locales. But they don't have a “lock” on interesting DX. In Western Australia, David Isele VK6DI reports the following beacons were heard there last month: UP 414.0 kHz (+1034 Hz) Rayong/U Taphao, **Thailand**; OK 385.0 kHz Kupang, **Indonesia**; OB 427.5 kHz Overberg, and UR 485.0 kHz Margate, both in **South Africa**. Meanwhile, Fred Mooney KA1DGL based in Seoul, South Korea, has been having good luck with beacons in **China** – DS 250.0 kHz (+40 Hz DAID) Heliushui; RO 249.0 kHz (-1200 Hz) Sanjiang; HG 254.0 kHz (+1016 Hz) Wuhan; ZW 260.0 kHz (-1033 Hz) Chengdu; JN 275.0 kHz (-1004 Hz) Yantai/Laishan - and **Japan**: KA 238.0 kHz (+1020 Hz DAID) Kanoya; GT 253.0 kHz (+1010 Hz DAID) Niigata; CI 257.0 kHz (-1017 Hz DAID) Chichijima; and FU 263.0 kHz (+/-1010 Hz DAID) Fukue.

NDBs in the Caribbean and South America are still being heard in Europe. Peter Conway G3UFI in England and Dominique Kremp in France both heard CVL 365.0 kHz Caravelas, **Brazil**. Dominique and Ian McCabe G0FYD in England heard STM 350.0 kHz Santarem, also in Brazil. Dominique and Peter report hearing TAB 323.0 kHz (+410 Hz) **Trinidad and Tobago**. Russian

DXer Victor Puzanov caught several mediumwave beacons: R 687.0 kHz Dnipropetrovsk; O 795.0 kHz Donetsk; DN 820.0 kHz Dzhankoi (all **Ukraine**) and ShW 832.0 kHz Olenya, in **Russia**. Peter Conway in England also heard several Ukrainian and Russian beacons in March: DN 390.0 kHz (-1042 Hz) Bolshoye Savino/Bakharevka, and DR 335.0 kHz (-1049 Hz) Dnipropetrovsk. Roelof Bakker PA0RDT in Holland logged two beacons from far-off **Kazakhstan**: KT 512.0 kHz (-351 Hz and +398 Hz) Narimanovka/Kostanay; NA 512.0 kHz (-399 Hz and +403 Hz) Narimanovka/Kostanay; and in **Belarus**: M 511.0 kHz (+1015 Hz) Gomel.

A beacon from the Russian Far East *may* have been received on the west coast of the USA. Steve Ratzlaff AA7U in Oregon heard "ShM" (---- --) on 469.0 kHz. Substituting "dits" for "dahs", this may have actually been HI 469.0 kHz Khabarovsk, **Russia**. Steve says LW broadcast signals from that area were unusually strong at the time. Steve and many other North American listeners report hearing SPP 387.0 kHz (-1021 Hz and +1019 Hz) on San Andres Island, **Colombia**. SPP has apparently been reactivated after a four-year silence and may be using fairly high power as its signals are said to be quite strong. It was even heard in Hawaii by Mike Tuggle using a crystal receiver! Dave Tomasko K9QU in Illinois has logged his second NDB in **Alaska**: ALJ 233.0 kHz (-408 Hz) Orca Bay/Johnstone Point. That is quite a feat from the Midwestern US. Vernon Matheson VE1VDM in Nova Scotia logged CW 359.0 kHz (zero offset) St Laurent du Maroni, **French Guiana**. Beacons in **Cuba** tend to have rather strange ident offsets and this is reflected in the following report by Doug Springfield in Texas: UPB 250.0 kHz (+897 Hz) Playa Baracoa; UCF 212.0 kHz (+1056 Hz; miskeying "UCU") Cienfuegos; UNV 256.0 kHz (+673 Hz) Nuevas; and UZG 283.0 kHz (-882 Hz) Zaragoza. Joe Farenholtz in Ohio also heard several Cubans: UHG 353.0 kHz (-1296 Hz) Holguin; and UCY 380.0 kHz (-855 Hz and +863 Hz) Cayajabos. Joe also reports hearing POP 363.0 kHz (+1045 Hz) Poptun, **Guatemala**. Doug and Steve Ratzlaff logged another Guatemalan beacon: REU 340.0 kHz (-388 Hz and +411 Hz) Retalhuleu. (*NDB List*)

## Equipment and software

From Alan Gale G4TMV we have a look at the new *NDBfinder* program:

"The program is produced by COAA, which stands for "Centro de Observação Astronómica no Algarve", a well known astronomical holiday centre located on the Portuguese Algarve. As well as offering holidays for amateur astronomers, the owner, Bev M. Ewen-Smith, is also a well known software writer who creates astronomical software. Bev also produces many useful radio related programs such as the excellent *DSCdecoder* used by many DGPS enthusiasts, as well as programs like *Sondemonitor*, *PlanePlotter*, *ShipPlotter*, and *Beacon See*, to name just a few.

"Bev has now come up with the interesting new program called *NDBfinder* that allows listeners to use their PC's and soundcards to receive, identify and log NDBs too faint to hear. The program exploits the fact that almost all navigation beacons send their idents at precisely regular intervals. Using a unique combination of two Fourier Transforms and a Boxcar Integrator, *NDBfinder* superimposes many successive idents to retrieve signals buried in noise. This makes it possible for NDB DXers to detect beacons far beyond their normal reception range.

"Many NDB enthusiasts have tried this out and, once you get used to the concept, the results can be quite impressive.

### **Revenues up at Commercial Radio**

**4 March, 2008**

Profits are up for the third quarter in a row across the commercial radio sector, according to figures released today by industry body RadioCentre. Figures for the Q4 period reveal an increase year on year to 7.1 per cent with total revenue for the period reaching £150, 949,721.

Andrew Harrison, chief executive of RadioCentre said: "This is the third consecutive quarter of revenue growth for the Commercial Radio industry and the first full year of growth since 2004 – this really is good news for our industry. Despite reports that the traditional media sector is facing challenging times, these figures confirm that our sector is bouncing back as advertisers recognise radio's valuable role in a multi-media schedule." ### **DJ forgets to hit 'live' button**

**6 March, 2008**

Not an AM station – but just to point out how things can go wrong in Radio! A radio DJ spent an hour talking on his breakfast show without realising that listeners could not hear him. Andy Greener, a volunteer DJ at Radio Teesdale, forgot to press a crucial button to make his show live. Instead of his show, listeners heard 60 minutes of music and jingles as an automated back-up system kicked in to prevent radio silence.

He was alerted to his mistake when his station manager, listening at home, tried to call in. Peter Dixon repeatedly tried to alert his DJ to his mistake. But the former police officer, known to listeners as Mr Andy, was too busy presenting his show to answer the phone. Eventually, Mr Dixon got through and Greener began broadcasting again.



"I've been involved with community radio for about four years and I've been doing this three days a week for 10 months and have never done it before," Greener told the BBC News website. The independent station, which broadcasts to 25,000 people in rural County Durham from the market town of Barnard Castle, has a community licence to broadcast locally. ### **Global Radio given three weeks to seal GCap deal**

**9 March, 2008**

Global Radio, the owner of Heart 106.2, has been given a further three weeks to agree a deal with GCap Media, the owner of Capital Radio. Talks were expected to start immediately after Global made a 225p-a-share "final proposal", worth £371 million, for Britain's largest commercial radio group on the eve of the Takeover Panel's "put up or shut up" deadline of 5pm yesterday. After an approach from GCap, the Panel said in a statement issued to the market yesterday that the deadline had been extended to March 26. Global had been seeking an extension until April 2.

Ashley Tabor, chief executive of Global, added: "We are delighted that the GCap board has made it possible for Global to work towards finalising an offer that will create substantial value for GCap's shareholders. "Global Radio strongly believes that a combination of its brands with those of GCap will create a strong and vibrant company that will be able to breathe new life into Britain's commercial radio sector." Global first approached GCap in December last year, when it proposed a deal at 190p a share, a move revealed by The Times. Last week it tabled a second proposed bid of 202p a share.

Richard Eyre, the chairman of GCap, and Fru Hazlitt, his chief executive, have spent the past two days in discussions with fellow board members and leading shareholders. They were told that some leading institutional investors wanted to see the company enter takeover talks, while one source

close to the process said last night that all the leading shareholders were “comfortable” for GCap to enter talks, suggesting that a formal offer would receive shareholder backing.

**John F** comments: “**Very** disappointing conditions this month, despite quiet conditions. How can this be so? I still listened regularly but there was nothing to inspire me to activate overnight recordings. I hope to be in receipt of a Perseus SDR receiver in the weeks ahead. For me, this has to be the way forward for domestic medium wave DXing. I am one of those people who needs nine or ten hours sleep at night and any overnight listening seriously disrupts my daytime life”.

**John W** also found similar conditions: “Not many logs from me - a very poor month”

**Paul C** writes: “The most notable feature of the last month were the very good conditions to the Caribbean, particularly during the first two weeks of March. I managed to log quite a few personal firsts, thanks largely to the combination of the Perseus 800 kHz recordings and the ability to programme these recordings with the software produced by Mattias Zwoch”.

Another Perseus user is **Jack**, who adds: I've been settling down to using Perseus in earnest this month. As a result the quantity, if not the quality, of loggings has gone up. However, I did get one new one in the form of 1330 WRCA which I've not managed to ID before, and I'm sure that I wouldn't have stumbled on it without having a wideband recording that can be tuned through at leisure. It will be interesting to see what impact it has on DX Logs overall as more people start to use this kind of receiver”.

**Hans** tells us: “Another month with "personal first" signals.. Last week brought 2 days with very interesting stations, including several new ones. Even the whole month was in good shape, days without any trans- Atlantic signals where rare. It seems a not too quiet Kp-index helps make this happen. For instance I got good North American signals while Kp was at 4! In addition to my 3 fine antennas I will build a standard EWE in the garden towards 300 degrees. It should be ready within the month of April, weather depending”.

Here in **Clashmore** the band has been quite variable, with Caribbean area stations and east coast North Americans coming in well at times. Since CKEC left 1320 kHz I've been spending a lot of time monitoring the channel and have been rewarded with a number of personal firsts - mah
