

# **EDITORIAL**



# KFI tower crashes to earth,

Tuesday, March 18, 2008, KFI tower topples, The half-built tower in La Mirada, opposed by pilots at Fullerton airport, fails during construction.

A half-built radio tower, under re-construction after years of debate over the safety of its location, crashed to the ground injuring a construction worker. The name of the injured worker was not released, but his injuries were believed to be minor, said Greg Ashlock, president and market manager of Clear Channel Radio. The reason for the collapse was not immediately clear but was believed to be construction- related, he said. Clear Channel, which operates KFI-AM radio, contracted with Seacomm Erectors, Inc. to build a 684-foot-tall tower at 16608 Trojan Way. Construction began on Saturday and had risen to about 250 feet by Tuesday when the tower came crashing down around 2:30 pm. The tower was meant to replace a 760-foot-tall tower that was toppled in December 2004 when a small plane crashed into the tower on approach to Fullerton Municipal Airport – less than two miles southeast of the tower. A couple was killed. In recent months, Fullerton airport and city officials joined with local pilots in protesting plans for the tower's reconstruction, saying it was too tall and would pose a hazard to pilots. They didn't want the new tower to rise more than 500 feet. The La Mirada City Council unanimously approved the new tower in January. KFI officials expected the construction would take about four weeks.

KFI continued to broadcast from a 200-foot-tall temporary tower on the same property, so the collapse did not interrupt the signal. The new tower will provide a stronger signal. (via IRCA)

As we do each year, we asked the question; What has improved/got worse over the past 12 months? Three members thought that the return of the Utility column had been an improvement for MWN. A couple of members thought that the print quality of MWN had improved, another member thought that the content was better balanced, whilst another thought that receiver reviews had improved. Home Front was thought to have improved by one member, and another thought that the quality of the technical articles was better. The only negative comment was that one member thought that the utility coverage was spasmodic.

Another question we asked was how many years they had spent in the radio hobby. Two members had spent 1-10 years, 0 members 11-20 years, 3 members 21-30, 10 members 31-40, 8 members 41-50, 2 members 51-60 and three members have been in the hobby for 60+ years!

Once again, we conducted a survey into member's receivers and aerials that they were currently using. Once again the AOR 7030 has finished at the top of the receivers list, and the good old reliable outdoor longwire has finished top again in the aerials section. Here are the results.

# Bangladesh

Thomson Supplies Super Power MW Transmitter for National Service Enhancement in Bangladesh

Las Vegas (National Association of Broadcasters Convention — Booths SL106/SL2120) April 12, 2008 — Bangladesh Radio (BETAR) has ordered 1000 kW radio transmitters from Thomson (Euronext Paris: 18453; NYSE: TMS) to upgrade its existing broadcast network for nationwide coverage. As a large percentage of the Bangladesh population is located in rural areas, AM radio is very often the only way to reach and inform them. #### Botswana

# Croatia

My observation were verified today by the transmitter operator OIV, that the mediumwave frequencies 774 kHz / 783 kHz / 1125 kHz and 1143 kHz were closed down. So the only remaining mediumwave frequencies for Glas Hrvatske are 1134 kHz (1250-0530 UTC) and 594 kHz in DRM (0700-1500 UTC). (Patrick Robic via MediumWave.info)

### Denmark

Public broadcaster to keep 243 kHz longwave: The longwave towers in Kalundborg will stand for at least five more years, even though regular AM broadcasting on 243 kHz ceased last year. This means that Danish public service broadcaster DR keeps its attractive frequency for digital longwave broadcasts.



A face lift [see photo] will remove the top structures that were added to the towers in 1954. This will reduce the wind load significantly and give the masts their original 1927 "slim-line" look back. Only the inner two of the eight top capacitance wires that also feed the secondary tower of the Alexanderson antenna system will be retained.

Calculations and antenna measurements made earlier this year by technical operator Broadcast Service Danmark A/S show the modification will not affect the extremely high relative bandwith of the antenna system needed for DRM (Digital Radio Mondiale) broadcasts.

The QRP measurement signal was picked up by at least two DX listeners on 25 March 2008, a testament to the efficiency of the antenna system on the "Gisseløre" peninsula. According to calculations, a 1 kW transmitter should be sufficient for covering most of Denmark with DRM test transmissions.

DRM trials of Littoral Media in Brittany, France.

Since Thursday 21st February Littoral Media's medium wave transmitter broadcasting in DRM digital mode in Brittany (France) with a TransRadio 25 kW transmitter (2,5 millions potential listeners). Following an incredible seven-year adventure, Littoral Media have at last broadcast on the airwaves for the first time with theirs partners TransRadio the German company leader in the building of AM and DRM transmitters, APIC Company, IDT, the Consortium DRM (Digital Radio Mondiale) and the association for digital radio DR. Despite the authorization from the CSA (Conseil Superieur de l'Audiovisuel) being given only for these technical DRM trials, it is however, for our modest team already a victory.

The tests will now continue just until the end of April,

and during this period the teams will carry out measuring the distance of coverage for the whole of Brittany. (A process of validating the technical choices carried out for many years, and the real geographical coverage of the transmitter). If the launch of this test is already a victory, there still remains a lot of work to be done. The long awaited for next stage, is the selections of the candidatures by the CSA. President of the Society, Stephane Hamon, hopes that this will take place very rapidly. The team hope very much to obtain a frequency. Then, and only then, the team of Littoral Media could at last realize their real job: The radio.

Littoral back in AM on 1593 kHz: David Duckworth reports that Littoral R from Brittany on 1593 kHz is back in AM today (rather than usual DRM). He first heard it just after midnight. Also confirmed here with French music, weak signal around 1330 UT tune-in. David heard an announcement giving their transmission hours: tentatively 9 am to 5 pm weekdays and overnight at weekends. [UT +1] It was last heard in AM exactly two weeks ago on Sunday 29th March. Not sure if this is a planned AM test or if there is a fault with the DRM equipment (*Dave Kenny*, *BDXC-UK via DXLD*).

# Germany

Blast knocks AFN Germany off the air on 873 kHz (1<sup>st</sup> April 2008)

Armed Forces Network officials cannot definitively say when its AM radio station [873 kHz] will be back on the air in the German state of Hessen after an explosion at a transmitter site interrupted programming on Tuesday. Three Germans were injured Tuesday around 12:30 p.m. in an accident during a routine generator check at the Weiskirchen transmitter site.

"Everyone's doing OK," AFN-Europe public affairs officer George Smith said, adding that the two Department of Public Works employees and an AFN-Hessen technician were taken to the hospital as a precaution. The three were treated for minor shock, smoke inhalation and minor burns. They have all been released and are doing fine, Smith said.

As for the AM radio programming, Mark Vagnerini, AFN-Europe's executive officer, could only say that AFN hopes to have the signal up and running sometime next week. "Somehow there was a minor explosion and small fire in the power distribution panels," Vagnerini said. "The fire was extinguishedand emergency services came ... but we cannot go in there to repair it until the investigation is complete."

"The AM outage affects some 90,000 American military community members, mainly in and around Wiesbaden?, Smith said. AFN's AM 873 frequency carries "Morning Newswatch," National Public Radio programming and the "Connections" music program, according to a Wednesday AFN news release. "Until service is restored, listeners can tune in AFN's Eagle Radio service, a mix of contemporary music and top of the hour news on FM 98.7," the release read.

Other AFN AM frequencies throughout Germany are listed online at <a href="www.afneurope.net">www.afneurope.net</a>. Listeners might be able to pick up the broadcast at 1107 AM from Kaiserslautern or 1143 AM from Mannheim. (http://www.afneurope.net/ via RN Media network weblog)

The transmitter was put back on air around 16th April but with only one-third of its normal power until the repair work is completed in September.

#### India

MW coming to Lakshadweep Islands; Thomson M2W Transmitter used by All India Radio for Broadcast of First Local Radio Programs to Lakshadweep.

Las Vegas (National Association of Broadcasters Convention — Booths SL106/SL2120) April 12, 2008 — All India Radio (AIR) has selected Thomson's (Euronext Paris: 18453; NYSE: TMS) M2W medium-wave transmitters for the launch of the first local radio channels to India's Lakshadweep Islands. The new service will go on air during 2008. Thomson's M2W 10kW medium-wave transmitters, already in use at AIR stations all over India, will now be used to broadcast the first local content from Kavarati radio station throughout the Lakshadweep Islands.

AIR is India's national broadcaster and has one of the largest radio networks in the world, covering over 99% of the Indian population. The Lakshadweep project falls under a special program driven by the Government of India for the development of the North Eastern region. The economy and infrastructure of the entire North East region is lagging far behind the rest of the country and the government is providing a booster for this. The Lakshadweep medium-wave project marks a new milestone in the successfull cooperation between Thomson and Broadcast Engineering Corporation India Limited (BECIL), who are supplying the auxiliary items for the transmitter.

In spite of recent penetration by other media such as cable TV, radio remains the most common means of gaining access to information and entertainment in India, as radio receivers are relatively cheap and affordable.

The first graf refers to 1000 kW transmitters (plural), but the rest of the story is about ONE transmitter. There is a slight difference. WTFK?! The present listed 1000 kW transmitter is Dhaka-A on 693 kHz. Is this to replace it? Something wrong with it? I don't see the name Dhamrai in WRTH listings as a transmitter site or anything else. Furthermore, the Lakshadweep Islands (a.k.a. Laccadive), are about as far as you can get from Northeast India mentioned in the release: off the southwest coast. (Glenn Hauser)

# Netherlands

Dutch commercial radio station Radio Waddenzee has comfirmed plans to broadcast from sea on 1-3 May 2008. The radio ship 'Jenni Baynton' will anchor close to the island of Griend between Harlingen and Terschelling. On Sat/Sun 2 and 3 May, the historic lifeboat Javazee will make a series of trips to carry visitors to the radio ship. Unfortunately, there are no spare places available as they have already been fully booked. Radio Waddenzee broadcasts on 1602 kHz with a power of around 1 kW. To mark Liberation Day in the Netherlands (Monday 5 May), Dutch public broadcaster Radio 5 will broadcast as Radio Oranje between 0500 and 1700 UTC on 747 kHz. Radio Oranje was the Dutch station that broadcast from London during the Nazi occupation of the country. Radio 5, which is aimed at the 50-plussers, is asking its listeners for their memories and interesting stories from 5 May 1945 to be included in the programme. Music will be played from original 78 rpm records by artists such as Glenn Miller, Bing Crosby and The Andrews Sisters, as well as Dutch artists popular at the time. Dutch broadcaster Arrow Media Group has started testing on 828 kHz, the frequency that will carry its new service Arrow Talks. The transmitter at Heinenoord, near Rotterdam, has a daytime power of 20 kW and a nighttime power of 5 kW. For the tests, it is carrying the programming of Arrow Classic Rock. According to Dutch website radiofreak.nl, Arrow Talks is scheduled to launch on 1 May. (Media Network weblog)

## New Virgin owners - Absolute Radio?

7 April, 2008

Negotiations with Richard Branson over the rights to the Virgin brand are delaying the sale of Virgin Radio to Absolute Radio, with the possibility emerging that the Virgin stations may be rebranded, perhaps as Jack, the name of Absolute's Oxfordshire station. It is understood that once an interested party reached the preferred bidder stage, discussions with Virgin Enterprises had to occur before any sale went through.

However, a source close to the sale thought Absolute Radio would buy the radio stations, regardless of whether it could come to an agreement over keeping the brand name. The source said: "Even if the two parties can't negotiate a deal over the Virgin name, Absolute Radio will buy the radio station anyway and it is considering calling it Jack FM. It owns this station in Oxfordshire and it is a big brand in the US."

Steve Parkinson, marketing director for Bauer Radio, added: "I know when other companies looked at buying Virgin, there was divided opinion over how much value the brand name. Some companies felt it would increase ad revenue opportunities, whereas others felt it was associated with too many other industries. If Absolute Radio does take over and decide to rebrand Jack FM, and they have the money to properly launch a new brand, it could be very interesting for the radio industry."

However, Absolute would be concerned about Branson, or someone else, launching Virgin-branded ventures and competing with the company that had bought the original stations. There is also the added complication that the rights to use the Virgin brand in connection to radio are limited to a UK licence only.

A senior agency source added: "If the purchaser loses the brand name Virgin, then it will be a disaster, full stop. It will have to build up the whole brand equity from scratch, which will cost millions of pounds." Absolute Radio said it was unable to comment on the matter. (www.brandrepublic.com)

# Global Radio goes national in cost-cutting drive

8 April, 2008

Last week Global Radio - home of Heart and Galaxy - spent £375m acquiring GCap Media - the home of Classic FM and Capital Radio. The price was cheap; at the end of last year Bauer paid £450m for Emap's radio arm, a smaller group than GCap. But what will the Global deal mean for listeners, staff and creativity? Is this the big consolidation commercial radio needs to fight back against the dominant BBC?

The first staff casualty is sure to be Fru Hazlitt, GCap's chief executive. Appointed in December 2007, her first task was to defend her company from the approach by Global. She responded by ditching GCap's DAB-only stations and promising a cost-cutting regime; a strategy that failed to impress. An insider at GCap claims that Hazlitt will not hang around for long. Other staff will almost certainly follow her out of the door. Global is backed by Irish horseracing millionaire Michael Tabor, and its chairman is former ITV chairman Charles Allen. They must believe that they can run GCap better, and that includes being more efficient on costs.

The acquisition of GCap increases Global's number of stations in key markets such as the West Midlands, East Midlands and London - but brings with it the risk of intervention by the Competition Commission. There are two issues: to what

extent is ownership concentrated into the new group's hands, and is competition in the advertising market lessened? So far advertisers appear to be welcoming the news, but with Global accounting for around 43% of radio ads, plus their third-party representation of GMG Radio, they control more than half of all radio advertising spend in the UK. Whether Global is forced to divest stations, particularly in the Midlands, will probably depend on the extent to which competitors blow the whistle to the Commission.

So what will it mean for listeners? The first question is will Global retain all the brands? Capital, Choice, XFM, Galaxy, LBC and Heart will share the same parent. Heart and Galaxy look safe. The former is the commercial leader in London with other stations in the West and East Midlands, and Galaxy is the favoured child. Choice, a former GCap service, looks isolated, and is only available in London, the one big market where Galaxy is absent. It seems a safe bet that Choice in London will become Galaxy. XFM is also vulnerable having lost its way creatively in the last year, and with its sister stations in Manchester, Wales and Scotland already looking for buyers.

Most crucially of all, will the takeover change what comes out of the speakers? The answer is probably yes, and for the better. GCap Media was not in great creative shape, with the exception of Classic FM. Capital Radio has sounded lacklustre for the last three years and is still, devoid of any genuine excitement or creativity. If Global can energise their newly extended family, listeners and commercial radio as a whole may be the winners.(www.radiotoday.co.uk)

#### Global to cut local programmes

17 April, 2008

Global Radio has announced plans to cut the number of local programmes on its Heart and Galaxy stations. The afternoon show will be networked on the Heart stations in London and the Midlands, while only breakfast and drivetime will be local on the four Galaxy stations. Weekend schedules will also be heavily networked. Twelve presenters and managers will lose their jobs across the two networks, which is obviously painful for those involved.

But what's even more thoroughly disheartening is the justification given for the changes by Global chief executive Ashley Tabor: "When we started here what you heard on Heart in London was not very similar to what you heard on Heart in the east or West Midlands. They were really quite different radio stations. "That's because they're different radio stations, surely? Why would a station serving 11 million listeners in London sound like one that broadcasts across Derby?

Several years ago, Emap repositioned its Magic network of local stations to mirror Magic 105.4 in London. Magic 105.4 was the shop window through which the Magic network could be sold, except agencies still didn't buy it because it was an AM network. By the time Emap figured this out, all of the local stations had been changed beyond recognition, not to meet the requirements of their audiences or marketplace, but to fit those set by the London marketplace.

Will local and regional stations gain anything by being poured into a mould created for a different market? Will the listeners? According to Tabor: "It will be national at the right time of day and local at the right time of day, offering people local programming when they really want it." How will Heart offer relevant programming to listeners in London when they really want it, during a terrorist attack or a tube strike? How will Heart's afternoon show be live and relevant, without shunning listeners in the Midlands?

Back to Tabor: "People assume networking is about big name DJs. It's not, it's about quality presenters. If you take 50 different radio stations there cannot possibly be 50 good presenters at every station in a particular slot. Why not take the two or three quality class players and put them across the network."

While breakfast shows can't be networked because of regulations, the steady erosion of locality at other times will slowly unravel the loyalty of listeners. They probably won't bother holding their head in the hands, lamenting at the injustice of it all. They'll just re-tune to the BBC. (http://blogs.guardian.co.uk/)

### **RAJAR** to test an Online Diary

29 April, 2008

RAJAR has abandoned its trial of an electronic alternative to its diary-based ratings system after spending over three million pounds researching the scheme. Instead, RAJAR is looking to investigate the introduction of a new online digital survey. It was hoped by many in the industry that electronic meters would offer a more accurate system for recording listeners. Instead, RAJAR has hired Morag Blazey, former chief executive officer of PHD Media Ltd, to undertake an industry-wide consultation and oversee the possible introduction of an online diary system. Plus, future requirements for podcasting, programming information, time-shifted listening and event response.

Following a review of the first year's research it was felt that the pace of change and innovation



within the industry needed swifter action than electronic measurement is able to offer at this juncture. The Board has concluded that electronic measurement will not form part of the 2009 RAJAR contract due to significant concerns regarding issues of panellists' behaviour and the feasibility of meter measurement to deliver a credible UK currency for the entire industry, at an affordable cost.

Andrew Harrison, chief executive, RadioCentre said: "It is therefore great news that steps are being taken to move the survey online which provides an opportunity to keep RAJAR relevant to its valued respondents in a digital age." (<a href="www.radiotoday.co.uk">www.radiotoday.co.uk</a>)

#### Digital radio embraced by third of listeners

1 May, 2008

One third of radio listeners now tune in digitally, new figures revealed today.

Thirty-one per cent of radio listeners use 'digital platforms' which include digital radio, cable television and the internet at least once a week, the statistics show. New figures from industry monitor RAJAR also showed a quarter of 15- to 24-year-olds now listen to the radio on their mobile phones. The number of 'digital listening hours' increased by nine per cent to 184 million per week.

The total weekly radio audience has also increased year on year to almost 45.4 million, or 90 per cent of the UK population. The increase in digital listening figures can partly be explained by the 40 per cent jump in ownership of DAB digital radios.

The figures appear to vindicate the BBC and Channel 4, which criticised commercial radio leader GCap in February when it announced it would pull out of the medium. Digital radio is facing a difficult point in its development, as it has not proved as popular as hoped and its backers begin to look for a return on their investment. (www.telegraph.co.uk)



**Paul C** writes: "The last month has been hard work! I shifted the ewe around to the SW but it wasn't a success - too much splatter from Spain so I moved it further round to the west.. I've been looking out for Latin America and have logged a few new stations but conditions haven't been good. Perseus has come into its own though, and the I have managed to find the odd jewel amongst the dross!". Another Perseus user is **David** who says "Here (are) some logs received with my much loved new toy - Perseus. Still struggling with antennas, but the old problem is space".

Hans tells us "Once again some logs. Rather poor conditions the week April 12 - 17 with no observations. Good conditions towardsLatin America on April 20 and 21. Earlier in the month some of the standard NAm signals appear with fair signals. My new EWE still waiting to be hung up. I have only a very small property with a K9AY already on place. The EWE will be around 1 1/2 m away from the western loop of the K9. I hope this will not reduce the gain of the EWE. I will test this out during May, weather & work permitting. Because of my work as a seller of tools and machines I will have limited time to DX during May. Let's see how it goes. After finishing the EWE I will make a comparison test with the K9 (the west loop). The EWE will be directed at around 300°. I will let you know about the results".

**SW** adds; "trans-atlantic DX from North America (and elsewhere) seemed to die around 10/11<sup>th</sup> April with barely anything heard since; not even Latin American signals."

Here in **Clashmore** other commitments have left little time for DXing since the middle of April. However, I continue to experiment with perseus, and have a number of recordings which have yet to be checked. If I find anything out of the ordinary, I'll report in in the next issue of MWN – mah.

The **deadline** for the July-August DX Loggings is **Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> June**. I look forward to receiving your logs by then, preferably electronically/via e-mail using the Word pro-forma, which I can supply on request. I regret that I am unable to accept logs of more than 20 stations in manuscript, paper or fax copy.
