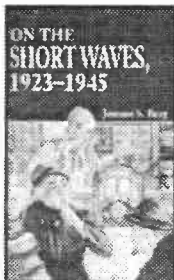




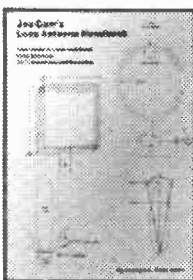

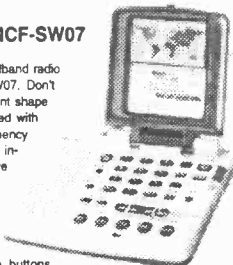

The reports must contain all useful references (frequency, UTC time, station name, language, the most important details for a good valuation, SINPO code), technical data (receiver, antenna and optional). On the same report the participant must indicate name, address and a short declaration as follow: "I take the responsibility on myself that I have listened to all the stations reported during the time of validity of contest". All details will be very important for a correct estimate of the contest results and for additional controls the Contest Manager could ask your audiotape. The scores will be computed on a base of 101 + points for each station deducting the participants percentage that listened to the same station. Decimal will not be considered. A bonus of 200 points will be awarded to all those who will report the highest number of program details for each station and not only generic terms such as news, music, comments, etc. The participation fee is 6 IRC's to be sent with your listening list to Contest Manager. Each participant will receive a certificate of participation. First prize is a copy of the *WRTH 2000* offered by A.I.R., second prize is a copy of the book *Una vita per la radio* offered by A.I.R., third prize is a copy of the book *The radio pirates aboard the offshore forts in the Thames estuary* offered by Pirate News, and fourth prize is a radio controlled table clock offered by A.I.R. From **Adrian Peterson** we learn that **Ron Killick** of Christchurch, New Zealand is the world winner in the annual DX contest conducted by Adventist World Radio. He amassed a remarkable total of more than 67,000 QSLs during the past 45 years. Ron will be awarded the 1999 Bronze Medallion and a deluxe copy of **Jerry Berg's** new book, *On the Short Waves*. The 1999 DX contest was conducted during September in conjunction with the AWR DX program, "Wavescan", and it invited listeners to submit details of large QSL collections and to describe the longest time they waited to receive a QSL. The "Longest Wait" is 31 years and that's how long Karl-Erik Stridh in Hoganas, Sweden, waited to receive a QSL card from the ship station, Radio Syd. In a strange set of circumstances, he heard the station as a youth, and received a QSL card from one of the staff he befriended 31 years later. Don Moore (U.S.A.) has a total of more than 28 QSLs exhibiting the "Long Wait". In some cases, he later visited the station in Latin America and collected the QSL personally. The other Continental Winners are Ivan Lopez Alegria in Mexico, Madan Mukherjee in India, and David Gordon in South Africa.

Loudenboomer presented "Alphonse and the Magic Christmas Tree." Ed Shaw presented his last *Shortwave Center* column for several months and introduced replacement editor Charlie Wootten. Carroll (Pat) Patterson wrote about the Karelo-Finnish SSR while Marlin Field wrote about Christian Radio Voices. Re: JENS FROST 1919-1999

As the e-mails come streaming through, I sit stunned and deeply affected by the passing away of the dearest old man I have ever touched. I have no idiom to pay tribute to Jens for what ever I say will lack in beauty and quality and fade far short of my goal.

After 17 years of correspondence as a contributor to the WRTH, I was greatly honoured to meet Jens in Stockholm at EDXC 84. If anyone fitted my affectionate mental picture perfectly, Jens did. I had never been abroad and the overwhelming DX community at its zenith then, dazzled too strong before me, but Jens held me tight and had me next to him right through that weekend. I traveled down to Copenhagen with him and met him again in 1995, in Rebild EDXC 95, and there again he clasped me to his side. The eleven years hadn't changed him and he was just as I had met him in '84. A perfect gentleman, a noble man and friend of all. In my eyes his contribution to radio broadcasting and listening through the pages of the *World Radio & TV Handbook* can hardly be paralleled. He was my personality of the millennium.

Even though I met him personally and he wrote me and phoned me many times, he was always a mystical figure, a figure that death can not change for he was more legend even in life. Jens Frost will pass on into the legends of radio listening, yet too large for a legend and thus into the mythology of our age. If ever limitless my wireless heart loved, and loved deep and completely, then it was the silver haired genial soul of this great simple and unassuming man. Good bye Jens, Good bye my dear friend you will walk with those that death can only immortalise.

The segment of the "History of ANARC" in the October *Journal* brought back happy memories, especially of my meeting with August Balbi, "the Dean of DXers" of the post-WWII period, and of my chairmanship of the ANARC Frequency Recommendation Committee. Its offshoot, the committee to persuade stations to announce precise frequencies (rather than meterbands) was at least partly successful before it disbanded, but its major failure then and much later was Radio Moscow (and the other Soviet external services) to announce exact frequencies rather than ignoring the final 5 of those not ending in 0. Thus, announced "7.10" could be either 7.100 or 7.105. The reason for this seems to be that, in Russian, there is no simple word corresponding to the decimal point, expressed in English as point, French virgule, German komma, etc. It has to be expressed as a fraction, hundredths, thousandths, etc. Thus, moving in a list from, say, 7.10 to 7.105 would mean a move from hundredths to thousandths and back, a seeming confusion of units.

On a different subject, I'd like to explore the possible holding of a DX convention at my shack in Hawaiian Paradise Park, between Kea'au and Pahoia in the Puna district of East Hawaii. The focus would be on constructing Beverage antennas and developing Beverage switching, matching and mixing units, and experimenting with resistors at various points, ground systems (probably surface-level radials as lava rock makes digging difficult), etc.

As some of you know, East Hawaii is a superb DX location for most areas, notably Africa and Asia and even across the pole to Europe. It is probably the best spot in the United States for worldwide medium wave reception (northern Alaska is doubtless better for Europe, but may not offer the South American, African and possibly Down Under reception we enjoy here). Here in the Hilo area we receive MW stations 10 to 12 times zones away almost daily, e.g. BBC-UK-1296 kHz, Abu Dhabi-1332, Saudi Arabia-1440, and BBC-Oman-1413.

The problem would be the logistics of holding a convention at the one-room shack with its limited sleeping and bathing facilities. Much of the acre is planted in pineapples, but if participants brought tents, they could pitch them in places. The alternative, to hold the convention in a big, RFI-plagued downtown Hilo hotel, would defeat the purpose—to build and adjust Beverages all day, then DX on them all night. On timing, I am open, but March or April should be good for reception from all continents. Please contact me by mail, please, no phone calls; most of the week I am away earning a living in Kona on the other side of the island, not such a good DX location. Sooner or later I hope to retire to live and DX full-time in Puna.

## How Do We Want our Shortwave to Sound?

English is not the main language for most broadcasters we listen to on shortwave. While English is widely spoken in many Western European countries (France a notable exception), this is certainly not the case most places. As such, we can't expect as lively nor as smooth a presentation as we hear on our local public radio stations, and pronunciation, grammar, and usage won't be up to our usual expectations. Nor will broadcast styles necessarily match up with domestic content, as international services cannot assume its listeners would understand or appreciate nuances of interest to a largely domestic audience.

For that reason, I tend to focus on the actual *content* of shortwave programs, not so much the presentation styles. I'm frankly more interested in presentation styles for such stations as Radio Australia, BBC World Service, Radio Canada International, Radio New Zealand International, and the VOA—stations where English is the home country's first language. With that preamble, should we appreciate stations such as Radio Netherlands, having a very "American" sound? Would we rather hear more of a Dutch sound? That's one reason Radio Netherlands may be featuring more domestic content, specifically in the new Sunday 0053 program, *Dutch Horizons*. A review appears a bit later. What are your thoughts on how a station should sound?

## Radio Netherlands: Review and Preview

Mondays, 0053, and Wednesdays, 2353:

*Dutch Horizons* is a new weekly program from Radio Netherlands replacing *Sounds Interesting* in the lineup. As usual, it's another interesting, well-produced effort from Hilversum. *Dutch Horizons* is a cultural magazine program featuring perspectives on Dutch opinions and current issues. Frankly, that's been one item somewhat lacking, up to now, from Radio Netherlands. One refreshing aspect in the program I sampled was that all was not rosy in Holland; the program I listened to featured a journalist who has been ostracized by Holland's mainstream media for years. I wish other stations would spend some time telling us how things could be better in their countries than they are today.

Here is a quick look at upcoming *Documentaries*, airing Thursdays 0053 and Fridays 2353:

December 9th/10th: *The transition from lawlessness to rule of law*. Most people think of modern-day Russia as a generally lawless society, in which economic and political life are dominated by corruption and mobsters. Behind the scenes, however, in a long slow process that has received a lot less media publicity than the gangland killings, Russian jurists have been trying to build a new legal framework for a society based on rule of law. Most of a new Civil Code, for example, has been enacted, in record time in recent years providing a blueprint for a free market economy in Russia. This was done partly in consultation with other countries, including the Netherlands. On the eve of parliamentary elections in Russia, Marijke van der Meer looks at how the new laws are working, in spite of the huge struggle against corruption.



Also in December, but with no dates, H el ene Michaud will present two millenium-related documentaries; the first deals with events around the year 1000, and the second, a discussion with soothsayers and scientists about the year 2000.

The year will be rounded out with the last edition of *Stories of the 20th Century*, with guest speaker Jeremy Rifkin's look at Aldous Huxley and *Brave New World*. (RNW website)

Not only was November noteworthy on **Deutsche Welle** for its coverage of the fall of the Berlin Wall, but the ongoing series *After the Revolution—the Changing Face of Eastern Europe* will continue in the second week of December. *Newslink*, *Inside Europe* (Sundays 0130), and *Insight* (Wednesdays, 0130/0330/0530) will feature special programs on how Eastern Europe has evolved since the heady days of 1989. Who were the winners and losers in the revolutions bringing down communism? Can these countries close the economic gap with the west?

*Arts on the Air* (Mondays 0130 and 0330) continues its series of in-depth profiles of many of Germany's most influential 20th century artists through the end of December, interspersed with current arts news from Germany. Visual artist Josef Beuys, dramatist Bertolt Brecht, and dancer/choreographer Pina Bausch are among the artists profiled in the series.

While one normally thinks first of the BBC's *Everywoman* when it comes to programming concerned with women's issues, Deutsche Welle's entry, *Women on the Move* (alternate Sundays, 2130; in the West Africa release), shouldn't be forgotten. While the program focuses mainly on European issues, producer and presenter Gudrun Heise includes multi-continental perspectives.

## China Radio International

*Voices from Other Lands* (Wednesdays) will sample international perspectives as we approach a new century and millennium in its December 22nd edition. [Please, no phone calls...I know the millennium and next century are still one year away...]

*Cultural Spectrum* (Thursdays) visits Guozijian, the Imperial College, built in 1306. Guozijian is the only remaining example of the unique architectural styles of the ancient government-sponsored learning activities, and will be featured on December 23rd. The ancient Chinese imperial examination system will also be reviewed.

*Music from China* (Saturdays), in its December 4th edition, will feature music dwelling on the return of Macao from Portugal to China. The fanfare will likely be less than it was for Hong Kong's turnover; the handoff itself will occur on December 20th.

## BBC Radio 4: Webcast Now Available

I hesitate opening with this because it isn't directly shortwave, but a live webcast of BBC's **Radio 4** spoken word domestic service is now available at <http://www.bbc.co.uk/radio4>. Since programs are often shared between the World Service and Radio 4, and these Radio 4 airings may give you an opportunity to hear favorites (e.g. *Brain of Britain*, *Letter From America*, *From Our Own Correspondent*) at alternate times that might better fit your schedule, I feel it's valid for mention here.

Saturdays, 2230, repeated Sundays, 0630: *Play of the Week* selections include:

December 11th / 12th: *Blithe Spirit*, Noel Coward's play about ghostly presences. Novelist Charles Condomine cynically invites spiritualist Madame Arcati to conduct a seance in his home, but the unexpected happens—the spiritualist produces his dead wife, Elvira. Only there's one problem: Condomine's second wife is very much alive and is not too keen to have the company.

December 18th / 19th and 25th / 26th: *The Picture of Dorian Gray*, Oscar Wilde's classic about a young man selling his soul for his beauty. First published in 1890, Wilde's novel was widely condemned by his contemporaries as an affront to Victorian society. Among the actors: Ian McDiarmid, last seen in *Star Wars: The Phantom Menace*.

Tuesdays-Saturdays, 0445: *Off The Shelf* features include:

Deborah Moggach's *Tulip Fever*, read by Emma Fielding and William Gaminara, from December 14th through 25th.

Celebrities' Yuletide favorites are featured during the week between Christmas and New Year's Day, including Laurie Lee's *Cider With Rosie*, Dylan Thomas' *A Child's Christmas in Wales*, *Baboushka*, Charles Dickens' *Christmas at Dingley Dell*, and Hans Christian Andersen's *The Snow Queen*.

Saturdays, beginning January 1st, 0130; first airing Thursdays, 1430: *Lifespan* is a new four-part dramatic series presented by Britain's Royal Shakespeare Company. The series uses literary reading to tell the story of

life, and explore the power of language and literature. Poetry, prose and drama are used to illustrate how language reflects growing up, growing old, and passing on.

### Light Entertainment

Sundays, through December 19th, 0430 and 2230; repeated Wednesdays, 1530: *Brain Of Britain 1999* wraps up the 1999 competition this month. Robert Robertson hosts the program through the finals on the 19th.

## ANARC's Early Years—Part Three

*(Editor's Note: This is the conclusion to a three part article. Part One was in the August, 1999, Issue and Part Two appeared in the October, 1999, Issue.)*

In April of 1996 details of the first ANARC convention were taking shape. It was to be held at the Muehlebach Hotel in Kansas City on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, July 29 through 31, 1966. The convention registration fee was set at \$7.50, which paid for the Sunday noon luncheon and tour transportation by buses.

In March, 1966, the NASA representative, Doug Benson, and the DXI representative, Wayne Segal, asked the club representatives to consider the subject of an ANARC country list once again. Because of the complexity of the issues involved, extra time was allowed for the representatives to vote so they could confer with their club management, if necessary. In May Don Jensen reported the mixed results on the issue. Eight votes favored ANARC adopting a country list, three opposed, three abstained, and four did not vote. A second proposition about which country list to use showed 2 votes for the ARRL list and 7 for ANARC compiling and maintaining its own list. The Newark News Radio Club indicated it would continue using its own list. Other clubs expressed similar plans. It appeared that only three or four smaller clubs would use an ANARC developed list. The feeling was that an ANARC country list would be futile given the various interests its member clubs represented. Nevertheless, based on the vote, Executive Secretary Jensen put out a call for volunteers to step forward to work on this project.

The financial report saw the association run a slight surplus of \$6.40 which included making up last year's deficit. Total receipts of \$49.00 included a \$5.00 donation as well as \$44.00 in fees. The major expenditure continued to be postage with \$25.00 spent for this item. It was proposed that the fee levels should stay the same for the coming year.

In May, 1966, John Callarman presented the long awaited code of ethics for the representatives to consider. The IRCA's Paul Kilpatrick brought up several issues designed to give BCB DX'ers greater recognition in ANARC. The first was the establishment of an ANARC Courtesy Program Committee, the second was development of booklets to teach DXing principles to the many young hobbyist getting involved in DXing, and the third sought the creation of a committee to study the particular problems of DXing and provide solutions for them. Closing out May's business, Don shared a letter from Rolf Lovstrom of Norway about a proposed European DX Council.

June, 1966, saw a formal call for the Executive Secretary position. Nominations were scheduled to be received through August 31, 1966. Executive Secretary Jensen stressed he would not serve under any circumstances, therefore it was important that the club representatives get nominations in by the end of August. The future of ANARC depended on it. Doug Benson (NASA) was appointed chairman of the new country list committee. Wayne Segal (DXI) and C.M. Stanbury (ASWLC) were also appointed to serve on this committee. Richard Wood's Frequency Recommendations Committee reported continued success working with broadcasters. The Manufacturer's Liaison committee, un-

der C.M. Stanbury reported good news about the new Drake SW-4 communications receiver. Tom Guglielmi, Chairman of the QSL Committee, was seeking volunteers to serve on that committee. In July he reported three committeemen were now serving and Trans World Radio in Bonaire sent a letter expressing the desire to cooperate with ANARC in QSL matters.

No unfavorable comments were received regarding the code of ethics drafted by John Callarman. In fact, there were words of praise

and several clubs had already published the code. The European DX Council was making slow progress in forming. They were facing many of the initial problems ANARC faced in getting off the ground back in 1964. Don Jensen expected the ASWLC to return with a mimeographed bulletin in the near future. NASA was holding a referendum about a format change to all shortwave broadcast. In July, it was reported that the club was switching to all SWBC. The Canadian International DX Club elected new officers: Lorne Jennings, president and new ANARC representative; Earl Peters, treasurer; Ed Burridge, editor; and Ralph Grace, Jr., public relations. By August, the International Radio Club of

America solved its problems with the publisher's position with Bill Lipis in El Cajon, CA, taking over the task of mimeographing the bulletins. Joe Johnson informed Jensen that the Worldwide Monitors Radio club's recent problems had been resolved and a full explanation will be made to the membership next month.

After many months of anticipation, the first ANARC convention was held in Kansas City, MO, from July 29-31, 1966. Despite the small attendance, estimated at only 12-15 people, it was a definite success. The following ANARC clubs were present: American Shortwave Listeners Club, Canadian DX Club, North American Shortwave Association, National Radio Club, Newark News Radio Club, and the West Indies DX'ers Association. It was felt an airline strike may have contributed to the small number of DX'ers present. At the convention, Jim Howard awarded an engraved plaque to Don Jensen for "service to the hobby" during his tenure as ANARC Executive Secretary.

By early August, no nominations for the soon to be vacant Executive Secretary position had been received. Jensen encouraged the club representatives to consider the position as they were the best-qualified individuals to continue ANARC's work. In September, 1966, the club representatives were informed that Gerry Dexter and Gerry Klinck were candidates for the executive secretary position. Information about each candidate was passed along to the club representatives and ballots were to be returned by October 15, 1966. The new term was expected to commence by October 21st.

Country list committee chairman Doug Benson indicated that his group was making progress toward a basic approach to the list criteria. Richard Wood of the frequency recommendation committee reported a breakthrough in co-operation with the BBC, Norway, the Vatican, and Cairo. QSL committee chairman Tom Guglielmi reported that the International Committee of the Red Cross planned on developing a suitable QSL based on reports from the committee.

Bill Sparks, American Shortwave Listeners Club representative, was appointed to officially canvass the ballots of the Executive Secretary election. He reported the following results: "I certify that I have canvassed the 14 ballots cast for ANARC Executive Secretary. Result is Dexter 8, Klinck 6. Winner is Dexter." With the results official, Gerry Dexter was elected as the association's second Executive Secretary. As Don closed out business in October, 1966, Fred Woodley, the Canadian DX Club representative asked, "Any plans underfoot to re-open the 'DXer of the Year' bit that we all went through last year? CDXC still has the plaque available... and eager to see this project get off the ground... if some of the other clubs are interested."

Thus, slightly over 2½ years of ANARC activity closed with the end of Jensen's first elected term as Executive Secretary. Many of the recurring problems faced by the association over the past 35 years have their roots back to the beginning. simply put, it is the nature of the hobby beast that a loosely organized, voluntary federation of independent hobby clubs would experience these problems while attempting to band together for a common purpose. Perhaps the most interesting aspect of this 32 month odyssey was the question of how was ANARC going to attract more listeners into the hobby, and therefore the clubs, back in 1965. This unanswerable question almost pulled the association apart in the late 1980's.

**Postscript:** Fred Woodley's DXer of the Year concept did eventually get off the ground and continues to prosper. In 1967, ANARC took over bestowing the Man of the Year award, which was initially won by Don Jensen at the 1966 Kansas City Convention, with Arthur Cushen becoming its second recipient. He was followed by Bill Eddings (1968), Gordon Nelson (1969), Roy Waite (1970), Don Erickson (1971), August Balbi (1972), Bruce Elving (1973), Al Niblack (1974), and Hank Bennett (1975). In 1976, the award was renamed the North American Shortwave DXer of the Year with the following indi-

viduals scooping up the honors: Don Johnson (1976), Glenn Hauser (1977) and Ian McFarland (1978).

In 1979 the award was once again renamed, becoming the North American DXer of the Year with Bob Zilmer coping top honors followed by Larry Magne (1980). After a year of no award, it was decided to split the award into two categories. The title of North American Shortwave DXer of the Year reappeared with Steward MacKenzie (1982) being the honoree. He was followed by Roger Legge (1983), Ralph Perry (1984), Larry Lunberg (1985), Gerry Dexter (1986 and 1987), Tom Sundstrom (1988), Mitch Sams (1989), Jerry Berg (1992), Rich D'Angelo (1993), John Bryant (1994), Don Moore (1995), Tom Bryant (1996), Mark Connelly (1997) and Dan Ferguson (1998).

The other award recognized the medium wave, longwave, and public service band DXing through the North American Specialty Band DXer of the Year Award. Its winners have been: Don Moman (1982), John Clements (1983), Mark Connelly (1984), Nick Hall-Patch (1985), Bruce Elving (1986), Ernest Cooper and Bob French (1988), Greg Monti (1989), Ken Stryker (1992), Mike Hardester (1993), and Daryll Symington (1994). In 1995, the North American Shortwave DXer of the Year and the North American Specialty Band DXer of the Year awards were combined into the DXer of the Year Award.

In 1976, the International DXer of the Year Award was created. The following have been the recipients of this prestigious honor: Harry van Gelder (1976), Clayton Howard (1977), Arne Skoog (1978), Mike Hardester (1979), Arthur Cushen (1980), John Campbell (1982), Victor Goonetilleke (1983), Juan Carlos Codina (1984), Ralph Perry (1985), Jens Frost (1986), Finn Krone (1988), Arthur Ward (1989), Arthur Cushen (1992), Gabriel Ivan Barrera (1993), and Harry Weatherly (1994). In 1999, ANARC renamed its top award after its first Executive Secretary, Don Jensen. John McColman was the first recipi-

ent of the Don Jensen Distinguished Service Award for his contributions to the listening hobby. There are no known award winners to be found in the association records for 1981, 1990, and 1991.

ANARC conventions grew from the modest turnout of a dozen or so dedicated hobbyists in Kansas City in 1966 into mass media events with attendance in the neighborhood of 300 people. The Kansas City convention was followed by Chicago (1967), Omaha (1968), Toronto (1969), Chicago (1970), Indianapolis (1971), Boston (1972), San Diego (1973), New York (1974), Montreal (1975), Los Angeles (1976), Chicago (1977), Montreal (1978), Minneapolis (1979), Los Angeles (1980), Thunder Bay (1981), Montreal (1982), Washington, D.C. (1983), Toronto (1984), Milwaukee (1985), Montreal (1986), Toronto (1987), Irvine (1988), Tampa-St. Petersburg (1989), and Virginia Beach (1990).

During the 1980's, it was not unusual for between 200 and 300 listeners to attend one of these affairs. Unfortunately, too much success may have been the prime reason for the convention's ultimate downfall. Organizers had to overcome a number of problems to stage a successful event including a set of bureaucratic convention guidelines, which were about an inch thick. Somehow the fun must have left these once special affairs causing the crowds to dwindle. For whatever reasons, after the 1990 ANARC convention, the association got out of the convention business.

Closing a chapter about ANARC's past would not be complete without recognizing the fine gentlemen that served in the difficult role of Executive Secretary, now Chairman of the Executive Board, over the years: Don Jensen (1964-1966), Gerry Dexter (1966-1968), Gray Scrimgeour (1968-1970), Wendel Craighead (1970-1972), Al Reynolds (1972-1974), Dave Browne (1974-1982), Terry Colgan (1982-1986), Don Hosmer (1986-1987), Bob Horvitz (1987-1990), Sheldon Harvey (1990-1991), Rich D'Angelo (1991-1995), and Mark Meece (1996-Present).

Today ANARC continues as an alliance of North America's finest DX clubs devoted to serving the hobby. Its goals are modest and manageable. In recent years, it has managed to avoid the unanswerable question about how to attract more people to our hobby and eventually to our member clubs. The result has been a mending of some fences and lots of great hobby activity. Don Jensen discovered the magic formula, during the low point of his tenure as the association's first Executive Secretary, with the establishment of various committees to get projects moving along. After many years, ANARC has come full cycle in the 90's with its focus on its committees. The ANARC Shortwave Listeners Net meets every Sunday at 10:00 eastern time on 7240 kHz LSB (until the summer of 1999) to share logs, news, and information about the hobby of radio monitoring. The Committee to Preserve Radio Verifications (39 Eastern Avenue, Lexington, MA 02173), chaired by Jerry Berg, preserves QSL collections of hobbyist no longer active in the hobby. The Contest Committee (2 Whits Court, Newport News, VA 23606), chaired by Harold "Dr. DX" Cones, organizes and administers the popular North American DX Championships each March. Finally, ANARC went electronic a couple of years ago with the establishment of a first-class web site under the guidance of Ralph Brandi.

This retrospective on ANARC's early years has given me a much greater appreciation for some of the concerns that plagued the hobby over the years. Despite the many projects and activities ANARC has undertaken over the years, probably the association's greatest contribution to the hobby has been opening and maintaining the lines of communications between the clubs. The association came into being as I first discovered the medium wave and shortwave DXing hobbies. In those days, I marveled at the efforts put forth by the many different individuals who gave unselfishly of their time and energy. Those teenage years are long gone, but my appreciation for all the people that created the association and served in a number of different capacities through three decades, remains the same.

**CLANDESTINE—AFRICA** What began as this logging: 9517.44 UNID station in Arabic from \*0400-past 0500 with mideast music interspersed with several low-key commentaries by M and W, possible mentions of Iran. Complete ID, frequencies and sked @0459, chewed up by RFE/9520. (8-Nov/Quagliery-NY) has turned out to be *Voice of Sudan* (National Democratic Alliance, broadcasting from Eritrea to Sudan). First speculation to that effect came from Tony Jones, then it was verified in recordings made by Mahendra Vaghjee of Mauritius. Station is //8000 and 9000 kHz. A check at 1340 confirmed as operational 6020, 9610 and also 9870, by means of some modulation characteristics probably indeed from Kopani but if so not by far running full power. Very likely off air was 7420, 11720, 11825, 13590 and 15520. The next check after 1700 confirmed just 6020 and 9870 as operational, and at 2200 I found only single 6020 anymore, strong but suffering heavy co-channel interference. Especially 4820 and 5905 are quite definitely off air as these channels are empty here. So the current situation of Ukrainian shortwave broadcasting needs further monitoring, but anyway it looks rather distressing. (31-Oct/Ludwig-GER/EDXP/Padula-AUS)

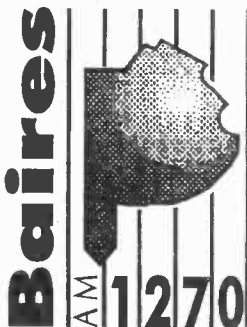

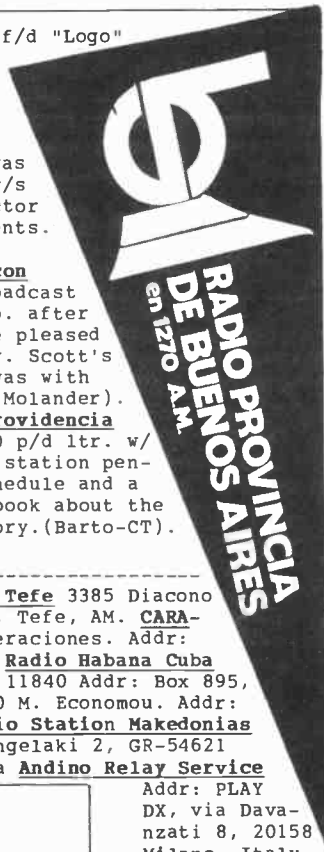

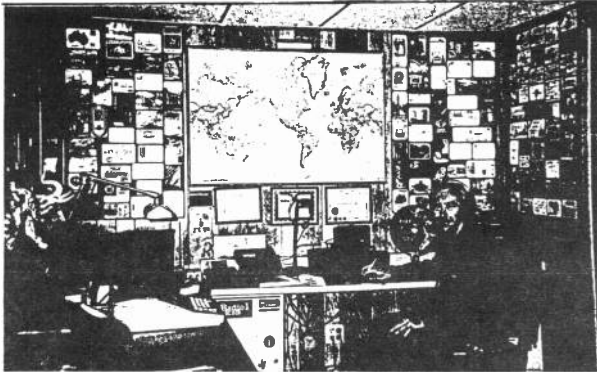

Thank you very much for your letter. We are happy to know that from time to time it is possible to receive our programs in your part of the world.

Our station started to work in March 1993. It was created in order to tell Europeans and Americans about the situation in Pridnestrovye as we see it. The recognition of the Moldavian Republic of Pridnestrovye is our main purpose. Besides, it is always better to know more than one point of view on any issue.

Pridnestrovye is the eastern part of Moldova. Before the collapse of the USSR, it was part of the Moldavian Soviet Socialist Republic. After 1990 some republics of the former Soviet Union have been facing ethnic problems and Moldova was not an exception, unfortunately. Moldova tried to solve its ethnic problems by force in favor of its native population at the expense of other nationalities living in Moldova.

Pridnestrovye, whose population is multinational, has proclaimed human rights to be above ethnic ones. Inevitably, it led to self-proclaiming of the independent Republic of Pridnestrovye on September 2, 1990 in order to provide equal rights for all nationalities. In summer 1992, Moldova attempted to suppress our republic by military force. The war, as any civil war, has led nowhere.

We are happy that by listening to our programs you have found out more about our young republic, our proud, independent and free people which has held with thousands of human lives for its freedom.

Dear Gene,

I am a freelance journalist who sometimes produces and presents "Calling The Falklands" for the BBC World Service. Your letter of June 13<sup>th</sup> came across the programme's desk while I was working there last month. As far as I can make out, it was faxed to me by the Falkland Islands Broadcasting Service (FIBS for short - though I've always thought that a most unfortunate acronym for a radio station).

I can confirm that your report of the edition of "Calling The Falklands" which you heard on 11<sup>th</sup> June is correct and can verify that the programme is broadcast at that time and on that frequency every Tuesday and Friday. I'm afraid I don't know what a QSL chart is but I hope that this letter meets your requirements. Frankly I'm amazed that you picked up the programme at all.

It might interest you to know about the mechanics of the programme's transmission. These days we have a satellite link to the Islands from 18.40 to 19.00 London time, Tuesdays and Fridays. We send 1KHz tone for the first 45 seconds, then do the programme as if it were a live broadcast from 18.41 until 18.56. The programme is recorded at FIBS which puts it out on its own local-frequencies a couple of hours later. We also do our own recording in London. That tape is played out from an automatic playback channel in Bush House at 21.30 on the short wave frequency which you picked up. Most listeners tune in to the local broadcast - as you can imagine the reception is much better.

I hope you continue to enjoy your listening and pick up plenty more curiosities. Please give my love to New York, where I have spent two very enjoyable holidays.
