Washington June 14-Unquestioned listeners preference in the wide open spaces for clear channels plants was established a new by the recent Federal Communication Commission postcard survey in rural areas. More than half the cards were returned, with responce by states providing a fair cross-section. From their own observations, 81.4% of the persons answering prefer clear-channel stationsprograms at night and 59.1% during the day. Stations having exclusive use of best frequencies are the first choice of more than 90% of all the persons reporting their hight dialing habits.

--DEATH SENTENCES FOR 3 STATIONS--

Persistently Forget to Remember F.C.C. Rules and Regulations. Crackdown campaign for illegal operation has cost three stations thier right to existence with the Federal Communications Commission rigidly applying its own rules and the 1934 law is condemning proposed ownership merger of two South Dakota transmitters and disqualifying both partners of a New York plant in the process of liquidation. First deletions ordered in some time. Execution of KGDY and KWTN, Watertown, was decreed by split decisions emphasizing the disregard for the government, but effective date of order was postponed untill July 4 so the disappointed parties may ask reconsideration and then seek reprieve from the courts. Case will be fought befor the judiciary in the event the Commish remains adament in its death sentence.

Third station sent to the wall WMBQ Brooklyn will be deleted with the consent of its owners, who finally decided to sever connections after period of squabbling over policies and practices. But neither of the warring partners was held fit to erect a transmitter to fill the place of the abandoned venture.

Vashington D.C. June 29- Secret "indictments" of five stations were voted last week by the Federal Communications Commission stepping up the resent scrutiny of licenses conduct while several new stations went on the list of temporary tickets-holders. At the same time, eleven operators who have been holding short-term tickets were given regular renewals.

El Paso Texas-June 14. New Station for El Paso was promised Dorrance D.Roderick over the squawks of KTSM-WDAH, existing transmitters.

NATIONAL RADIO CLUB DX NEWS July 11 1938 Short Wave News

The National Bureau of Standards gives a regular frequency check on 10.000 kc every Tuesday, Wed and Friday except on legal holidays from noon to 1:30 pm EST for listeners to align their receivers and Equipment. It is broadcast from its station W/V at Beltsville, Md. near Washington D.C.. The broadcast is mainly a unkeyed continuous whistle in the phones or speaker. For the first 5 minutes a general CQ WWV call is given. A 10,000 cycle note is used and frequency is with in one part in 5 million. Miller-Chicago.

HP5G announced their freq. as 11.78 megs (25.47 mtrs) and was hrd from lo pm to midnight. Their QRA was given as Box 1121, Panama City, Panama. A YL announced in English after each selection and asked for reports. They came in R/6 QSA/5. Miller-Chicago.

A new station TICM was heard on about 10.1 megs at 10:15 pm to 11:37 pm announcing as Radio Mundo, San Jose, Costa Rica. Not a word was spoken in english but was heard asking for reports. Their signals were R/6 OSA/5..Miller-Chicago.

In a verification received from YNLG "Ruben Dario" at Managua, Nicaragua they state that they operate on 6.610 megs with a power of 1,000 watts. They have a very attractive QSL card. I would also like to quoto a few lines received from EA9AH 14.030 megs. " We are always on the air at 9:00 pm broadcasting war news in Spanish and at about 9:30 pm in English. At 9:45pm we start relaying Radio Nacion al De Espana at Salamanca, Spain, who at about 10:30pm give the late war news for the day in English and other languages. Lundberg-Minn.

Bob Hoynes of London England sends us the following information.

It is reported that a 500 watt SW transmitter ZHP at Singapore has started its initial tests on 9.53 mags (31.48 mtrs). Experimental broadcasts are carried out between 5:30 am to 9:00 am EST. Recaption reports should be sent to "Short Wave Station ZHP, British Malaya Broad-casting Corporation, Singapore, Federated Malay Staes.

The channels allotted to the Eire(Irish Free State) for the Althone SW station are as following, 17.84, 15.12, 11.74, 9.595 and 6.19 megs.

HP5G, Panama City Panama is the call of the new station operating on 11.78 megs with a power of 750 watts. Reception reports should be sent to Senor Jose Antonio Sosa M. Estacioc HP5G, Panama City, Panama Central America.

HCIRB is the call of the new transmitter at Quito, Ecuador which operates on 7.87 megs with a power of 400 watts.

OKIMPT, Prague, operating on 58.3 mtrs provides an amazing strong signal in England untill 11:00PM GMT or later but is seldom reported or given publicity possibly due to the unconventional wave length employed or its irregular operating schedule.

VR6AV, Pitcairn Island on 20 mtrs has been heard several times in parts of England on Tuesdays and Wednesdays between 7am to 9am GMT.

According to their verie Paris has 6 frequencies in use namely 🗀 31.41, 25.24, 25.60, 19.68, 19.83, and 16.88 meters. Forestieri-N.Y.
