John Perry, owner of WCOA and a string of Florida newspapers, has been granted a construction permit for a station in Jacksonville, Florida. The new station will operate on 1280 kes. with a power of 250 watts and unlimited hours. Construction will start immediately after FCC approval of a projected transmitter site.

Hawaii gets another station. This time the commission have decreed that the city of Lihue, located on the island of Kanai shall have the right to erect a station to use 100 watts night and 50 watts days on a frequency of 1500 kcs.Looks like we will have to drop a bomb on WJBK in order to hear this one. (The calls will be KTOH-Ed.)

Power jump has been granted to Sheboygan Wisc.and to WEMP Milwaukee The former will jump day power from 250 to 1000 watts, while WEMP will go to 100 watts nights. It is exspected that WTAG Green Bay will also increase power to 5 kw days.

Among the new applications to the FCC we notice one that we are sure would be granted if the FCC were composed of DX fans. WEXL Royal Oak, have applied for a change in frequency to 1300 kcs, and have asked to increase power from 50 to 250 watts. Wouldn't it be nice if all the all-nighters were put on one frequency.

A letter to CMHX, Cienfuegos Cuba was unanswered but we learn from Enrique Hidalgo that CMHX have closed. Perhaps they are not permanently off the air, otherwise they would be deleted in the Cuban Radio Commission listings.

WHOM, Jersey City N.J. are at work on a new antenna. The tower is to be some 387 feet up in the air and should be completed this month. Watch for tests.

Wonders never cease...We'd given up hopes of ever receiving a BCB report from Larry Lundberg again since his apparent interest on SW.But 15 and behold, the Minnesota Marvel came through sure enough. It all goes to show that the greatest thrills in DX are in the BCB..or are we taking too much for granted. The for the report any way, Larry and come again. Also Cy Will and Leo Herz and Bob Hoynes and some more of you SW fans ... why not give you BCB coils a workout once in a blue moon
