Countries in which there are either no political divisions or radio divisions, will each count as one VIC. if a person has 47 states verified, plus Porto Rico, his VIS is 48. In the next issue we will give you a list of countries that are heard here in the U.S.A. the best. And will go into the full details of this plan. So start and count up your different countries and have you VIS and VIC rating ready to submit to Steve Mann-1281 Ramona Ave., Lakewood Ohio. The NRC will ADOPT this method for it's members, All DX'ers and clubs may adopt this method also. We believe it will work out OK. (More next issue)

V.I.C. stands for Verified Individual Countries. Your rating can be determined by checking the number of different countries you have received verifications from add them all to gather and you have your V.I.C. ratings.. No your V.A.C. rating is a little different V.A.C. stand for Verified All Continents. Your rating can be determined by grouping your verifications by continents: Continents from which you have received the least number of GSL's determines your V.A.C.: For example if you have 12 GSL's from Africa, 15 from Asia, 35 from North America, 30 from South America and 17 from Oceania, your V.A.C. rating would be 12. Since you have 12 or more QSL's from each continent.
