It has come to the attention of your Editor that some DXers are somewhat peeved about what other DXer or DXers say about a mistake in a station list that appears in another Club's publication. To my mind this kind of a DXer who gets peeved about things like that is in the same class as those who ask for veries and forget to enclose return postage.

Let it be understood here and now that any list of stations that appear in this publication or that of any other Radio Club, is published for the DXers and that it was received from some source and believed to be correct by the Club that published it. If some DXer says that that list is incorrect and names the publication that it was listed in, I cannot see where any harm was done. Many a time I have read articles in a publication far superior to the bulletins we Radio Clubs put out, and I find that they too publish inaccurate items, though no fault of their own. However I as editor of the NRC can assure that any remark passed in regard to the accuracy of any list published in the DX NEWS, I will not even give it a second thought as I will feel that maybe the one who calls attention to it might know more about it than the one who submitted it for publication and I know that in due time it will automatically be straightened out. So to all DXers who see this, please remember that no matter in what Radio Clubs publication you see a list, it was published by that club with good intentions and if there be an error lets hope the Club's publication in which the list was published wont take it to heart and feel that they are being criticized even though they may be right. Your NRC Editor now has a Freq Check list and also a list of Cuban stations in his hands but is refraining from publishing them account of the changes already noted in Cuba as not being as accurate as this Cuban Government intended it to be. Remember changes can be made while a list is being published and of course it comes out incorrect to start with. So lastly lets not try to get peeved over petty things and let all DXers strive to make and keep this hobby of ours as it should be.

Marshall Blonchard advises that he has quite a list of up to date verie signers and requests that those who wish certain ones, send a self addressed stamped envelope along with your list wanted. Remember he hasnt all of them but he has quite a number. Also keep sending your up to date signers to him so that he can keep a permanent list. 4030 Prairie Ave., Brookfield, Ill is the address.

AL BARTHOLOMEW-COOPERS PLAINS N Y Was surprised at the reception of KTRB as conditions were good. Copied KTRB for entire broadcast and nearly solid, missed a couple selections. Last DX for me in Bradford was WAYS DX. Only veries received in ages, a duplicate from CKGB on their NRC special and that swell verie card from KWRC, thanks to Dick Cooper. It is a honey. Have sent follow ups to "Bull" of CJRL per suggestion, another letter to CJFX; KPAS has 3 separate reports from me; KGLU has 2. Any members know who to write to on KGLU in Atafford, Ariz? WAAC and KODY still out and also WHCU. Veries stand at 1347. To all NOTE MY NEW QRA.....

BOB SPENCER-BUFFALO N Y Little slow in reporting but haven't stopped DX-ing. Reports out to WSLB-WJBO final special-WKNY-KTSA-KGVO-KTRB-CKCL-WMBS-WKBN-WCLE-WHKC-WISR-KWAT. Rec veries from WBLKa blue printed card WCBI a new design card; WALL-WMAL letters and KGBS verifying on strength of few items I mentioned hrd. WMHF a dandy 2 color card; KTAR a long awaited letter; WSLB, card and letter from Mr Moor, nice of him. KTSW, radio-gram card; KRBC typed card and 2 swell printed cards from CKGB & CHEX. My first Canadian, both the same day. WJBO's special card which is something I hope none of you missed out on. WKNY fine letter but just thanks for report; What a let down from KTSW after sending them a daytime rpt. They were hrd over WSWA on Sun Mar 26th 7-7:30 AM. Just OKed report with C.E. initials and rubber stamp. WISR nice green printed card; WMBS letter also CKCL and WKBN a real nice gm and blue card and WHKC a gov card. My receiver here is a Hallicrafters Sky Champion 3-20-R without "S" meter. Veries now total 84. I have 2 different SWL cards, so if any of you fellows want one drop a line and send yours along.

JOE BRAUNER-WILLIAMSVILLE N Y DX seems to be over as far as new stations are concerned for me, until another season, nothing new logged since KFBC and no veries from new stations since last report. The jam broke briefly on April 3rd, when 5 cards arrived in one mail. All duplicates on club specials. Typed card from KRBC a fair QSL card from KTSW; nice ones from CHEX and CKGB and that dandy special WJBO card. Aside from these, nothing new in BCB veries except letter from WSAP confirming daytime reception, and signed by John G Maupin, pro dnr. instead of C.E. D Pulley who usually signed the veries. Had a variety of luck with club specials, missed many of them lately, due to needing the after midnight sleep, some because static made it impossible to hear em like the latest KGBS, tried both dates on this one, no chance either time as noise was blocking WEXL-WITH etc. KTRB was one of the few heard, that came in well/ Believe DX program season should close March 30th. Sept often brings very good DX in fact have found even August to be as good if not better than April and May. Usually find May and June the worst months here, for static, with slight decrease noted already late in July. Half of recent mornings have been hopeless for DX, with even the strong signals of WITH-WJBK badly cut up by noise and often unreadable. Tuned in the Police Band and promptly hrd WIUM in Angola, Ind on 2490 kcs. Received a long letter from the Ham who built it, was for his own use but due to war ending ham activity he converted it to its present use. (Yes Joe I hear WJNY, but not often, guess they do not have much business and they are weak here and at the station.)

GORDON STEARNS-CHESTER DEPOT VT Veries in from WISH-CKGB-KOAM-WHIS-WMBG-WALL WALL. WJBO's card in and they sure do have a very nice layout there. BCB DX has sure been noisy here. There is a buzzing noise almost like a 60 cycle line noise only on all the bands. I do not have a power line so it is not a bad filter. Who has trouble with 4 toned warbling tones on the 6MC band about 6-7 PM. They cover up all that is under them, are R-9 most always. Would like to see the SW page built up. Would be glad to QSO with anyone by mail about SW or anything at all. I always answer prompt so you can be sure of an answer. (No Gordon you dont need a \$ but have really enjoyed the let down and have been trying to get caught up on it all.-Ray)

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RONALD BURSON-MANSFIELD O DX slow here. Too much static. I believe this 10 days before full moon stuff. Been working here for past several months. Week before full moon from dark to 12PM. SA's were good HJ CZ on 1040 better than WHO; 4/5 2UC 950 coming thru from 4-6AM. Several other Aussies but too weak to identify. That was on 200 ft antenna N-S. Now have between 500-600 ft running all directions. WHO-WBZ-WABC-WEAF-WBM readable at 1PM.

MARSH BLANCHARD-BROOKFIELD ILL Latest veries are in from WRW-KICA-KROY-WCOV-WGAC. I had planned on hearing my first TP this season but it surely dont look like I will any more. This weather sure is terrible, so changes able. One day its beautiful out and the next we have a snow storm. I have a list of Aussies SWLs which was received from Tom Johnson of Perth. They may not all be still swapping but if anyone wants a copy (there are abt 20) just drop me a post card. I want to thank all you fellows for the swell cooperation you have given me in compiling the list of verie signers. I have received over 45 lists and some of them are over a block long-hi. In other words.. pretty big. Magazines from Radio Nacional de Rio de Janeiro have been received here (PRL-8) Tnx again for nice lists.

JACK FORBES-CREAMERY ROAD-ALBERNI B.C. As you see I have moved and so ends my DX activity for the season and possibly for the duration. Wound up in great style in Victoria on the morning of the 15th with 8 new ones, 5 of them testing on 1340 a wednesday morning when KCKN is off for maintenance from 3-7 AM EWT. Total new ones for March was 19 as follows, 3/2 WITH-KSD-KFBI-WSJS; 3/8 KGHF-KHBG-KNOW-KTUC; 3/12 WLOK and Spick batteling it out about par. This was definitely a Mexican but I'm not sure if it was XEFY or not. Another Spick on 1250 from 4-4:30 believe a S.A. 3/15 WSKB-WHMA-WAML-WSOY-WJPF-WLBC-WTEL, also another Spick from 5:30 on testing with American records on 1460. Just received a card from the c.e. of a station that is a notorious non-verifier. In it he states that it is against the stations policy to verify any reports, that he has made several exceptions in the past against his boss's orders only to have these DXers blab the news all over the country in a week. The one line that is of interest to me is quoted herewith, "Your report is correct, but I cant verify it" Now according to my standards, when a station tells me that my report is correct, that constitutes a verification of reception, whether the word verify is used or not. I have many verifications, both letters and cards, in which the station merely says your report is correct, and I've never hesitated to consider these legitimate verifications. Now, would it be right for me to count that particular card as a verie in view of the fact that they acknowledged the accuracy of my report? I know for a fact that it is the nearest thing to a verie that I can get out of them, and feel that its darn lucky to even have the card to show for my efforts. I'd like some neutral reactions on this before making any decision, and would appreciate any comments. You can all probably decide for yourself what station I'm talking about, but I wont mention them openly as the c.e. is leaving himself open by even answering me and I wouldnt want it to get back to him. Also a prepared card verie from VLBJ verifying my reception of their NRC-DX Program several months ago. Sent them a letter a few weeks ago asking them what they intended to do with all those reports that were laying arou around since January. They made no mention of these, merely signing my prepared card and returning it to me. (Well Al to me that would be a definite verie. I believe he worded it that way so it would be a verie but to his boss it would look as if he wasnt verifying your report. Any station that says my report is Correct is plenty for me and I would just as soon have that as the word verify. I believe that I know what station you are talking about and I was only hoping that he would answer me that way but he just said that it was against the stations policy to verify and that he is sorry to dissepaint me. So to me your card is a DEFINITE VERIFICATION and I would count it as one under any circumstances-Ray)

MEL OLIVER-BELLAIRE TEXAS This will about clean everything up here for the season as DX is gone now until fall--we've had one 90 degree day already. Veries since last report are from WJBW-KPAB-KGFJ-KTSW-KWBU-KXBL-KTAR-WNR-WMBG-KGHF-XEQ and an elaborate Certificate from WKAC via Air-Mail, sent 3/25/44 for a 1/23/44 report. Total reports sent out this season was 103, and my total veries on hand now about 255 from 40 states, Canada-Cuba-Mexico-Hawaii and Puerto Rico. Overdue reports sent out this season include WALA-KTEM-WTMA-CFRB-WDSU-WBLJ-WLOP-WBIR-KYCA-WDRW-KTOK-WSPA and several Mexicans. Did anyone ever hear from their follow up to WBLJ?? Had bad luck to miss WJBO's March DX as a tube went on my receiver the previous day, and I had trouble getting it replaced. Incidentally my receiver is a 1937 model 11 tube Zenith all wave with no special antenna or other equipment. It's also been suggested that we mention our occupations etc. I am an accountant for an oil company in Huston, of which Bellaire is a suburb and besides my DX hobby, I am a member of the volunteeel fire department in Bellaire. I have been DXing for a little over 3 years now and this past season has been my best so far. 223 reports have out and 180 of them have been verified with about 20 that have not had very much time to answer. I now have 279 stations verified and hope to have enough to trickle in to reach 300 mark. I have 44 states verified, lacking only Idaho-Nevada-New Hampshire and Rhode Island. The following is an item from one of the outstanding SHORT WAVE DXers of this country and he writes as follows,

"It appears to me that a number of short wave reporters are doing too much "Assuming" of the identity of stations, looking in an old station list to see what is listed on or near a frequency, with the result that stations not on the air at present are being reported. More careful listening for station announcements would seem to be the remedy. I have in mind particularly the following; HILS-6420 kcs off since last year-- probably heard HILH on 6430 kcs; in San Cristobal;; XECC-7380 kcs off for 5 years or more; LRA4 on 12290 kcs--doubt if on, probably heard Punta Arenas, Chili on 12270 kcs;; CP2 on 6110 kcs--not heard here, doubt if on; ZNB on 5890 kcs, this is ZRK on 5885 kcs, Capetown;; "roll on 7220 kcs--off since last year-- heard DXR2 in Berlin; VLQ4 on 7220 kcs in Sydney--this is VLQ2 on 7215 kcs in Brisbane."

Now the above is not a slam to anyone, it is just a little dope on what is being reported. In reporting like this, some DXers may be losing a chance to log a new station or even a new country besides reporting the wrong information that would lead others astray. It is regrettable that no up to date short wave logs are available but that is just one of the things that the war is making us do without, so by heeding the advice given above I, your Editor, believe that you will be helping yourselves just as much as others by being a little more careful and exact.
