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GRANT BATSON-WESTFIELD N.Y I regret very much that I missed a grand time at the convention but an incident came up that entirely upset all of my plans. Thurs nite 8/29 the company I work for sent me on a hurry-fast-trip to Springdale Ark and Sat AM was there. Notice WWRN used varied music on test, before used only 1 selection R-9 here; 8/31st WTNB on test 2:45 AM on; XEAI 1320 kc easy 3:15-3:45, carrier hrd often on 1570 kcs. WHHM & WCCP both r-9 on tests this AM, both use tone only with occasional identity. Carrier on 1320; 1400 past few AMs, no identity given. KFAB testing 4:15-4 AM. The veries in from CJOC-KFOR-WLAN-CJBQ-WWRN-WOHS-CMBF letter sent in English-WCMW-WCNT-XEJP-XEQ-KLIZ-WPIK-WHHT-KPDR-WHHM-WJOI-WARD-WLOL, 19 in Aug, not bad, eh? THESE stations can be heard on reg sked till 2AM. CJOJ-1060; CFCN 1010; CFRN 1260 kcs; CBC news 1:55-2; CBC program 1:45-1:55 and plenty of data on s/off. KVEC on 920 on 1st program 8/30 till 3:30 AM. NEW STATIONS HRD TESTING WERE;- 8/28 WHUM-1240 kc Reading Pa; 8/29 KANA 1230 kc Anaconda, Mont and WMOA 1490 kc in Marietta Ohio and 8/31 WTNB 1490 kc Birmingham Alabama.

Jean Carrie former CE is leaving to go to Iron Mountain and be CE of WIKB. Plan to have it on the air Sept 15th. Jean is going to let me know when they are to begin the first test. Wm Morris former CE of WTCM is now CE at WSOO and I had to set him straight about veries, he had never heard of such things when I first talked with him, but I think we wont have any trouble from him in the future. WSOO tests the 4th THURS 2:30-2:45. While on this trip I reported to WTOD-WSAM-WMPC-WMAM. Will not count these veries in my reg list until I receive them here. WDBC & WARD hrd testing 8/21; WDBC was r-9 plus while WARD was pretty well down in the mud. WHUM hrd testing 8/28; WPUV on 8/29 as was WMOA on 1490 who said it was their initial test; WLIB hrd on top of WOWO from 8-9:15 PM. Have been hearing several stations on various freq broadcasting in some language that I have been unable to identify. Barry Gray WOR's alnite man says his alnite show is definitely going Network this fall with Chigago-Philadelphia-Detroit already signed up and others on the way. (OK S⁺an and lets hope they confine it to all 50 KW stations on MBS)

DEREK WHARTON-CHICAGO ILL WSBT state they have already rec their new 5KW xmtr and expect to start testing it around Nov or later. Veries in from WBSV-WHAI-WMEX over riding WLAC-WTHT-WJTN in daytime-WIBW in daytime-CBK all day so it would seem that the east is good on rare occasions. In this city of many dead spots, reception East & Northeast of here is very rare. Some info for members which may be of some help;-I have found it a partialy successful in receiving outside stations right uder WJBK & WEXL. The average antenna & ground system is used very satisfactorily for real good DX-ing BUT the ordinary person does not know that they very strong local carriage blotts out the other stations because the length of the ordinary antenna bring it in full maxium. The following I hope will show whan can be done and I would appreciate your letting the boys know. Not every set will work on this system howefer a little experimenting will help. First use only 15 ft of antenna hanging up over the window frame or tucking it under the rug, making sure it is stretched all the way out. Set owners will have to try both ways-This short ant cuts down locals and permits others to come thru. 2nd experiment with the ground, when tuning for the special you will have to determine whether disconnecting the ground causes a decrease on the local carrier or not, on the 15 ft the average set works better without a ground and in most cases reception is better with the reg antenna without the ground. For best ground the rod has to be 8½ ft in length so that it hits the wet level when driven all the way in. Copper is best but steel can be used. Hope this will ~~xxxxx~~ be clear and I believe that the results will be quite good. Another fellow in the country has tried it and found it successful. (OK Derek and about WCRW-Also the correction on WCTA. A new list out soon)

NATIONAL RADIO CLUB DX NEWS

Rules for Broadcast Band Contest for the DX Season of 1946-1947.

1. Credits to be given as points on the following basis, the object being to verify as many different geographical divisions as possible:

United States and Canada:

For each first station verified in each state or province, 1 Point
For second station verified in each, 2 Points

Other North America:

For first station verified in each country or colony exclusive of Mexico, and for first verified in each Mexican state, 2 Points

For second verie fulfilling above qualifications 5 Points

South America, Europe, and Australia (New Zealand)

For first station verified in each country, except in Australia and for first verified in each Australian province, 3 Points

For second verie fulfilling above qualifications 7 Points

For all Other parts of the world,

For first station verified in each country 5 Points

For second such station, 10 Points

Continents mentioned are assumed to include any island within 500 miles of their coasts. Bermuda is to be included in North America.

Each NRC special shall count a bonus of three points in any category. It if first verie counts the score for first plus three, and if second, counts the score for second plus three, and if additional, simply counts three by itself. Only one special from any one station may be counted in the contest.

2. Contest will run from October 1, 1946, until March 31, 1947, for reception. Contestants will have until June 30, 1947, to get their veries from the stations for the contest.

3. There will be an entry fee of 25¢ from each member, which must be mailed to the contest manager before October 31, 1946. New members will be allowed one month from the time of joining to get their entry fee in. Members in service will be allowed one month after the date they get home.

4. The contest manager will be Sid Steele, 3815 Michigan Drive, Louisville, 12, Kentucky, unless he is unable to handle it, in which case another manager will be appointed.

5. Contest is open to any member of the club in good standing. Any member living outside the United States and Canada who wishes to enter should apply to the contest manager for a special set of points which will be applicable to his location.

6. The contest manager may call in any veries that are deemed improbable by at least three contestants, or at his own discretion. The decision of the contest manager will be final in any disputes.

7. No prize will be given of more than \$2.00 cash, and only five prizes are to be given. It is expected that entry fees will cover the cost of the contest, so no money prizes are needed. Any member wishing to donate a prize other than money may do so.
