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We respectfully ask you all to support these special programs, no matter for what club they are on the air. Remember, it costs the stations money to go on the air at these odd hours, so be sure you make it worth their while by sending in good reports of reception. By good reports, we mean truthful reports. Don't exaggerate them - if the station is coming in with a wavery, fading signal, say so in your report, for oftentimes the station may be using a directional array. So, make sure you send the best report - be certain to keep the letters friendly, and don't forget that all-important item of including return postage.

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We hope you will find our new frequency check list to be very helpful. We want to thank you all for keeping us posted on them - new ones, changes, and deletions from the list. We have included the month the check was last reported in this list, and also the type of program being presented on the individual checks, and also from whence the information came. Where there is no listing as to the type of check it is, that means that that information was not supplied. At any rate, we left a little more room on the margins this time, for last time it was difficult to read the checks when they were stapled in with our log books. For these reasons, we have omitted the locations of the stations. We suggest consulting Carroll Weyrich's log for the cities of each station you don't remember. We thought it more important to give you the other details regarding the check, and also to leave that margin space. We hope you will continue to let us have the new frequency check schedules, and corrections.

Musings of the MembersSteve Mann - 125 Ward Street - Westbury, Long Island, N.Y.

Well, after a number of years' absence from the N.R.C., during which I tuned short wave only, it is nice to be back with the old gang again. Last December, I got interested in BCB again, and am really going after it now, but only for foreign stations (i.e. all except U.S., Canada, Cuba, Puerto Rico, Mexico.) At present have 42 countries verified with reports out to Tunisia, Czechoslovakia, Monaco, St. Pierre and Canal Zone. Judging from conditions so far, this should be a swell season for overseas DX. The first really good TA opening noted here was on 10/26 when SBH, 100 kw/, 1178 kc/s., Horby, Sweden, was Q5, S6 here after WHAM signed off at 12:30. I phoned Ernie and woke him up so he snagged SBH also. Many others were heard, including Monte Cardo, Monaco, 120 kw., on 1466 kc/s., who was QSA 5, S 7. The next night 10/27, was also good. Budapest II, Hungary, 135 kw., on 1187 kc/s., was QSA 4 S 6 around 12:40. Toulouse I, France, 100 kw., on 944 kc/s. was amazingly a QSA 5 S 8, from 12:28 sign on. Tunis I, Tunisia on 962 kc/s. was also good after 12:30. Since those two nights, no TAs have been heard again. Earlier in the month, ZYC on 650 kc/s. was heard, just barely loggable around 4:45. No other TAs heard here. Those of you who are 200 miles or more away from New York might try logging "Radio Jamaica" 5 kw., Kingston, through WCBS on 880 kc/s. He signs off at 11:00 p.m. Is of course impossible to hear here. TIFC, Box 1307, San Jose, Costa Rica, a missionary-operated station with 1 kw. on 995 kc/s. is very good most evenings. Best of all, usually is in English from 11:00 p.m. to midnight, and verifies with a very nice card. (Thanks, Steve, and glad to have you back again! -Ed.)

Since the last report, veries received have been cards from WTOR WWYO KASI WBRD VSIR WMMP and letters from WJIV WLIN WFUR WETO KBTA WGNI WVOP WOHI WLOW WOND WMDN WAAA WHCC WSNW KFTV VMCC WENE WFCB WGBA KSTN KIVY WORZ. Both WAAA and WCSI said my report was the first one received. KFTV said Gene Allen had won the \$5.00 for the most distant report. WSNW said an all-morning test program soon, but gave no date. WGBA was for a report of three years ago and C.E. William R. Atkinson said he had inherited hundreds of unanswered reports and would answer them as time permitted. 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Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors of the N.R.C.

The annual meeting of the Board of Directors of the National Radio Club met at the home of Joe Brauner, Williamsville, N.Y. on September 3 1950 at 4:30 PM EDST. Those present were;- Pat Reilley-Lefty Cooper-Eldon Addy-Ray Edge-Hal Wagner-Ralph Johannis and Tom Carberry, the latter not attending the meeting, this were members of the 1949-50 Bd of Directors and Joe Brauner the newly elected member of the 1950-51 Bd was present.

A proposed DX contest as submitted by Member Hunt was brought before the Board for its approval or dis-approval. A lengthy discussion was had and it was decided to vote for this contest, not as a whole but each item seperately. However this contest was set aside later because of a motion of Member Kruse that the NRC again have the same contest as last year with the exception of 1 item pertaining to milage. This was finally adopted by the following vote.

For the same contest as 1949-50 were Reilley-Edge-Herz-Addy-Kruse-Wagner Against having the same contest were; Johannis-Brauner-Lefty Cooper. Not voting was Maguire, whom I believe is on a months vacation. However the above finally being carrier 6 to 4 and Maguires vote not being able to make a difference, the above was carried.

Exec Sec Wagner brought up the matter of Editing DX DOWN the DIAL by Edge effective with the first bulletin in October 1950. This was approved by the entire Board attending.

Member E Cooper suggested that the Servicemen's Fund be re-instated as was the case during World War 2. Board unanimously approved the same and without hesitation each Board Member present donated \$1.00 each toward beginning the fund. A total of \$10.00 being given. Sully Sullivan our V.P. was on hand too and he made the 10th member at the meeting.

Telegrams were received at the NRC Convention from Steve Walbridge and Leo Herz. They were read in appreciation and filed.

In a letter from Member John Curgan, he suggested revision of the present report forms. However, Exec Sec Wagner informed the Board that an adequate supply of present forms was on hand and consequently such a revision should be held off for 6 months. The Board un-animously agreed that such revision be held off until the present supply by used up or approximately a period of 6 months.

Exec Sec Wagner requested the club secure information regarding forms of the ARRL for all members. It was decided instead of purchasing such forms, that a future copy of DX NEWS carry the same information as contained in such forms and thus serv the same purpose because the ARL forms contain much info that would be useless to BCB DXers.

Member Hunt sent to Wagner a lengthy letter in regard to the editorship of our Club bulletin. Wagner stated that this letter was received at the Convention headquarters and that he had not had sufficient time to go into the matter thoroughly and there-fore it should be brought up sometime in the near future.

The Board approved the Contest Managers awards for the 1949-50 BCB & Foreign Contests. All winners were mailed their prizes. All Board Members heartily approved the awards and thanked him for his good work during the season.

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The Board of Directors was informed by Board Chairman Edge(1949-50) that he had received a letter from member David Thomas which told about a certain NRC member who had written to a certain named Radio Station in regard to a verification. The Station and members name was mentioned. Also was a report from David Thomas (but was a carbon copy and headed for the NNRC bulletin) The entire thing was returned to Thomas by Edge with a letter trying to dismiss the entire thing. Edge's reason for doing this was;- (As you can see Edge cut the stencils for the March 25 1950 issue of DX NEWS for Lefty because of illness) This letter and carbon copy of an NNRC report was received by Edge on March 24th a day after Edge had sent the stencils for the March 25th bulletin to Wagner. As Lefty was cutting the stencils for the next bulletin, April 8 1950, I returned it all to Thomas saying that he might have made an error sending me the carbon of his report to the NNRC and that if not he could sent it back to Lefty for publication. This he never did.

Then in the May 1 1950 issue of the NEWARK NEWS RADIO CLUB(bulletin) under the heading of David F. Thomas-Proctorville, Ohio this appeared.

"Quote" The General Manager of a station which has been heard from Coast to Coast, received this letter the other day from a very well known National Radio Club Member and he may possibly be a member of the Newark News Radio Club also. A similar letter was written by a former NNRC vice-president a number of years ago. When a station answers a report, acknowledging their letter, but because of vague details says so in their letter, that they cannot verify that shows that the station is very friendly towards DXers, and even goes out of their way to answer non-verifying reports which do not even have postage. I will now quote from Mr. -----'s letter to the Gen. Mgr. for sending him a non-verifying post card.... "I received your non-dated, non-signed post card today. You card states that I sent you a report that was vague and not definite. This can be excused in that I am only an individual and not in the radio business etc etc. On the other hand you are supposed to be a radio station and I doubt whether it is good business to write anyone on a totally sloppy postcard, which is undated, unsigned and has the appearance of being written by a two year old infant who cant speak ~~English~~ the English language. All a hobbyist like myself asks for is to either verify the report or not. If you dont, especially for your reason of vagueness, then have the sense of either ignore my report or write a half decent looking letter which will be anything but the disgrace which the one I received from you was like etc etc. .... The fellows all had a laugh about this one, for after his intelligent lesson in letter writing, he wrote the letter on scrap paper(plain, no letter-head or anything) the letter was full of overstrikes and his typing, other letters blocked out in ink and written in over them and his misspelled words were filled in with ink. Any typing student would have refused to turn in a work sheet like this letter, yet he was setting an example for this friendly station. Letters like this are being sent by more than one person-perhaps not as raw as this one to stations like WMRC-KTKT and others for their non-verifying cards or letters. (He then goes on telling (Thomas) about reporting etc.

The above was read to the Board Members present and it was decided that Edge write Thomas asking him for proof and the following letter was sent; The reason, when that appeared in the bulletin of the NNRC it became a public item, and being made public by Thomas, he should furnish proof. The letter;

Dear Mr. Thomas;

At the request and by authority of the Board of Directors of the National Radio Club, I am writing you in regard to the DXer and NRC member who is charged with violating the regulations of the NRC in respect to radio station relations.

The Board of Directors were informed as to you writing me and the returning of that letter to you by myself.

The Board of Directors is determined to get the facts in the matter and to take the necessary steps within its power to remedy the situation and to forestall future trouble of this nature. Fine relations must be kept between the dxer and the radio stations. The Board shall faithfully prosecute any member who knowingly violates our rules governing this matter.

However, the Board should not and will not take action against an alleged offended unless documentary evidence is produced by the person or persons making the allegations. No member has to prove himself innocent when the charge is unsupported by documents. Therefore, no action against this member will be taken until the Board is in possession of the evidence to support the charges.

Furthermore, since you are the one who has brought the charge, the Board requests that you send to them forthwith any and all documents or photostatic copies of those documents that support the allegations that you have made, by your own statement, these papers are in your hands.

In addition, since you have made this charge public by reporting the matter to a DX publication, the Board of Directors of the National Radio Club demands that you substantiate these charges immediately. Your failure to comply with this demand by October 1 1950 shall result in an automatic suspension from the National Radio Club.

The National Radio Club may at its discretion publish the full findings of this matter.

Quote from your letter since you are the one who has brought the charge, etc" I just wrote to you the facts, and I made no charges or asked that any formal action be taken, but I did say that such letter writers should be given a candid rebuff from you as editor. 
