I recently asked George Jacobs of CQ Magazine and Ed Tilton of the 4.R.R.L. some questions on TV reception. Many people have different opinions on these statements.

Men it was summarized, this is that they had to say:

1. Some attribute the cause of sporodic E to a poculiar ionization, some to the sun, others to the auroral or meteors, and still others to cartain meteorological phenomena. Their exact nature is not known, and the reason for their movement is unknown except possibly that turbulence or wind affects the ionosphere might be responsible.

2. There is little difference between FM and AM if best possible receiving equipment for each mode is used. Multiputh propagation sometimes results in phase distortion on FM, but this is a minor matter. Reflection of a signal depends only upon the frequency used, the engle of fire on the entenna, the degree of tentgation of the layers of the ionesphere, and the transmitter power.

3. During sunspot maximum, the F2 layer has been known to reflect signals as high as 60 magacycles. Channol two is from 54 to 60 magacycles.

4. Neither one knows how the sunspet influences sporedic E.
5. Keep unterna at a low angle for nost sporedic E reception.

(Thanks Don for the illuminating conclusions summarized in your report. Thile on the subject, here is an item from Conley that sheds more light on this puziling question.)

Transmitted long distances, radio and television waves are scattered in part and turned down to earth by invisible disturbances in the atmosphere. These disturbances are known to be mainfied by high-speed winds.

By studying the severity and length of signed faces, the obstacer can obtain a much broader picture of the winds aloft, depends and widdle point out. This new correlation between wind velocity and the properation of radio waves also about assist the meteorologist in weather forecasting.


