The only interference was expected to come from 250-watt WCAM in Camden, New Jersey, all-nighter on the same frequency, 1310. WBFD has been on the air about four months, and this, of course, will be their first DX-Test ever. WBFD is non-directional, and we feel they should get out all across the country. Musings of the MembersSteve Walbridge - 196 Lakeview Avenue - Pointe Claire, Quebec

My old Hallicrafters has just been returned from the "sick ward" where it has been for many weeks, and I have had two morning sessions with it. It feels like old times to get the earphones back on. The last entry in my log was made on June 4th. The only items of interest gleaned from among the crop of all-nighters was: KFJZ on 1270 Sept. 24 1:25 a.m. weak but clear. CFDA on 1380 in nearby Victoriaville, Que. with a program in French, off at 1:50 a.m. XESM on 1470 with a clear signal. The second session, Sept. 25th, brought exactly nothing. Had a pleasant surprise a few weeks ago to run into Stan Stanbury on the street in Montreal quite by accident. My holidays in late August were spent on a trip around the Gaspé Peninsula in eastern Quebec, and I took particular pleasure in seeing several radio stations I have heard down in that direction: CJBR, Rimouski, 900 kc/s. and CHNC, New Carlisle, 610 kc/s both located in salt water flats, which probably explains why they get out in this direction so well. CKBL Matane, 1250, which I have not heard at home. CJFP Rivière du Loup 1400 kc/s. which I visited, and met an old Air Force friend who is one of the owners. CJEM Edmondsdon, N.B. 570 kc/s. which I have not logged at home. CJQC Quebec City, 1340 kc/s. one of the few English stations in that direction. CHGB Ste. Anne de la Pocatière 1350 kc/s. Was sorry that I hadn't taken a log book with me so that I could have checked on some of the others in that direction, especially the satellite stations of CBA located in Northern New Brunswick. It amazes me that so many stations do not identify their transmitter sites with a sign at least. I hope that my work load this winter will not again be so heavy that I can't afford to spend at least Monday mornings at the dials. It appears that that will be the only morning when any real DX can be sifted out of the mob of ANs. Am anxiously awaiting receipt of the "DX NEWS" of Sept. 24 to read about the Convention.

I was very pleasantly surprised on Sept. 30 to receive a letter from Elbert Tewell Carey, Ohio with a souvenir from the Colony Inn at Amana, Iowa, autographed by 36 members and friends of the NRC, nine of whom I have met personally, namely, Bob Gorsuch, Len Kruse, Hal Wagner, Eric Bristow, Peter Hansen, Alex Mackenzie, Ken Maylath, Peter Bretz and Harold Schrock. It certainly was nice to be so remembered by the swell NRCers even though many miles away! We are trying to get back to some kind of normal life since the disastrous flood of August 19, but it is slow work and will take a long time. DX here has been rather on the minus side on account of extra duties and being laid up with a virus infection for over a week. Here are the ones that I have logged since my last report: 9/19- WTIK (1310) Durham, N.C. one of the many North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia stations on AN with hurricane news. WTIK was the only new one logged but a third report was sent to WGBR (1150) Goldsboro, N.C. 9/20 - WDVM (540) Pocomoke City, Md. was on hurricane alert and they were logged for the first time but are now heard daily 6:00-6:15 p.m. s/off. 9/24- A real surprise - WBRV (900) Boonville, N.Y. s/on at 5:45 (will be 6:45 when DST is ended). They were at S-5 and good for about 12-15 minutes. 9/30- WBOB (1360) Galax, Va. (ex-1400) ETing 1:00-1:30 QRM'd by WKAT. Just two veries have been received. On 9/19 a mimeo card from WLLY (1320) and on 9/29 a letter from KTOE (1420). This was a handwritten letter from the CE for my report of a ball game heard early Monday morning. Let us all support the various editors in their endeavors to keep the NRC as the top BCB DX Club. I know that I have rather "fallen down" of late but I will try and get back "on the ball." 73 till next time.

The September 24th bulletin received here on AM of 9/28. This is very good service across the states. DX has been rather poor the past three AMs, however, I've heard the following stations in past week: JOKP, 990 kc/s., Kitami, with S-8 signal at 4:50 a.m. EST on 9/26. JOQB, 1030 kc/s., Niigata, fighting it out with WBZ at 4:55 a.m. on same AM. The North Korean station at Pyongyang on 785 kc/s. was S-3 steady with group singing at 5:55 to 6:05 a.m. Same ID as always on half hour - woman speaks followed by beautiful chimes, then a slow marching type music plays for about 30 to 45 seconds. Heard on 9/27/55. KILA, 850 kc/s., Hilo was DB10 over S-9 playing "Sweet Leilani" at 6:10 a.m. 9/27. "Radio Progreso" on 690 kc/s. was DB30 over S-9 at 6:20 a.m. same morning. VOA Okinawa, 1180 kc/s. booming in at 6:25 a.m. in Russian. He IDed at 6:30 a.m. JOQC, 770 kc/s., Moriaka was weak (con'd on P.4)

(Hank Wilkinson, Con'd from P. 3) but clear at 6:36 a.m. 9/27. JOQK, 850 kc/s., Niigata was S-7 with Oriental singing at 6:43 a.m. on same date. As of this date (inot the new season) I have reports out to one Aussie, one Hawaiian, one Puerto Rican, one Japanese, and one Alaskan. I see where the "Sleeping DX" of Issaquah" got a verie from South Africa. DXingly yours.

Thought I had better drop a few lines letting you know what has been doing in Lansdale recently. Occasionally during August I'd twist to get a peep from the TAs. The BC-344 is my DX Barometer for when I can hear 'em on 164 kc/s., 173 kc/s., and 200 kc/s., I know DX is good so I tune in my SX-71 to the BCB. No luck until August 25 when I heard Russia, France, England on long waves. No luck on BCB, however. The following week DX was fair until Sept. 1 when everything was washed up. The fruits of that week on BCB was PCJ-2 on 864 kc/s. Kept twisting dials and listening at various times during September. No luck! Was complaining to John Tweedie, while writing on the evening of Sept. 26. The time was 10:55 p.m. EST and I had the SX-71 tuned to 845 kc/s. when what should come out of the ether but Roma II with male and female announcers giving ID etc. from 11 to 11:03 p.m. News in English followed and this in turn was followed by opera selections until 11:30 p.m. By this time I was aroused and began hunting. Found Nurnberg 1302, Oldenburg 1582, OAX4A 854, Roma II 845, Rennes 674 kc/s. Copied them all well with good signals. Haven't yet acquired the knack to log 30 or 40 stations per hour and get verie information at the same time, but I'll bet they were there! DX was gone the next night, so I guess I was lucky to get them. Heard 'em till 1 a.m. only. The standing of the verified log on BCB is now 1194 stations, 184 of which are foreign BCB from 45 countries excluding U.S.A., Hawaii and Puerto Rico. Total, 48 countries. Have a few BCB reports out from last season and a few new ones just recently reported. Best country verified last year, Pakistan. 73s.

Since this is my first letter to "Musings of the Members" I want to say how much I have enjoyed the first few copies of "DX NEWS" and express my special thanks to Howard Perkins, who first introduced me to your fine organization. My DXing on the BC began in earnest during the 1954-55 season, and since that time, I have logged in the neighborhood of 550 stations in 43 states, 8 Canadian provinces, and five foreign countries. All my listening is done on a Hallicrafters S-72, coupled with a 15' whip and preselector, and a National NC-125, hooked up to a 20 meter folded dipole. Although the location here is in a densely populated residential district, I have noted that under only fairly good condx a certain amount of DX will get through, particularly in a southern direction. Canary Islands---"Radio Atlantico" FET34, Las Palmas, on 1500 Kcs operates from 0630-1030, 1400-1900 with 2 Kw. QSL-card signed by Jose Garcia Diaz, Director Adjunto. Asks for pendant from the reporter's town. (SD)

The Mailbag was quite full this week with in addition to the following letters, the July and August issues of the New Zealand DX Times, and the October 10th issue of the DX Bulletin of Deutsche Welle. All kinds of information. Now for our members.

KEETH ROBINSON, Invercargill, New Zealand--*Since my last report I have written Craiova (1457), KORT (fc 1st Sat 0500-0515), WSPD, Italian networks on 1448 and 656, WBIG, VOA-Munich (1196), WKOT (ET), and XBOX. Verics are in from 6WH, HJAL, CFUN, KANN. Have listened regularly for Europeans the past month, but they have been very poor, even though the equinoctial period is supposed to be the best time for them. Notice one on 1430 with the same program as Craiova on 1457, and too many Russians to even bother counting. Most of the Russians have nothing but a man talking all the time, so how can one send a good report when they don't know what is being said. Have been busy here for the last month with lambing 1000 ewes, but will have a spell now until shearing time. Hope to have my Hallcrafters working off batteries by the time the new season starts, as the old dry bottery set is getting full of whistles and images. (Thanks, Koith, for the kind words about our little girl-FV)

KEN BROWNLESS, Clifton, England--*Many thanks for International Log received safely. Pacific Section arrived yesterday. I have taken over the editorship of the ISWL Medium Wave News. Will send you a copy each month for your use. With my new 680X receiver (15 tubes) I have frequently logged VOA on 1140 from sunset, best around 2200 GMT. Also YVMH Radio Populares, Maracaibo on 700 Kcs. (This was listed in IL at 1250 Kcs.) Conditions over here were not very good during September, also poor at beginning of October. It seems that they are beginning to show an improvement just now. (Congratulations on the ISWL editorship, Ken, and I'll try the American Embassy for that information-FV)

STAFFAN DANELL-Tidaholm, Sweden---Conditions have been rather good. Managed to hear VOA Manila (920) for the first time. For some reason or other I have great difficulties with Asia, except VOA Okina and San Fernando only two QSL, APL and FBS Cyprus. Sent another report on VUJ (710) this month. Others heard WKAC, HJST, WAPR, HJDO, HJGZ, HJDK(?), CMJL, CB118, R. Popular Maracaibo on 700, TAW, CMCX, LV10, FBS Fayid (Still active), HJBY, FJG2, LS4, LS5, YVNL, most of these new for me. An unknown one with music on 600 and at 2215 a Portuguese (Brazil) on 1010. Still Radio Rolcj on 1530 or 1525. I'm reporting Europeans now to get a higher number of countries. Verics in from CW45 (1390, heard on 1385), WKNE 1290 first Swedish, JGTH 1410 and some Europeans. Bernc and Monaco verified in 6 days only. (Thanks for letter and report, hope to hear again soon-FV)
