I would like to use v/tp to indicate reception of a station on tape w/call clearly heard & either frequency or location clearly stated. I re-run these onto a master tape which is kept along w/the list of stations claimed. I broke one of my own rules, & stayed up MM until 2:30 on 2/10. I have only been DXing from here since 12/1/68, but even so, I logged ten new stations. Since tape is used. all times are approximate. 2/10- KXEL-1540 in w/no sign at all of ZNS. WKBN-570 very nice signal when WFAA s/off. KCIS-600 s/off, weak but good tape; about my best for 500w. KLZ-560 had solid signal for full tape of s/off. WIOD-610 IDea while testing w/oc. Without the tape I never would have caught it. WCCO-830; I waited until now for a tape without splatter from WBAP. KRMG-740, first time here because of their wild pattern very weak, again I couldn't have caught it without the tape. KCBS-740 w/tremendous signal after the frequency cleared up after 1:30. Their pattern is a monster w/285kw. equivalent radiated bearing 147° true. WOR-710 on w/beautiful sig+ nal until MHB came back to TT @ 2. WGBS-710 on w/OC, voice ID @ 2:30. WGBS surely didn't have their might pattern in. I wrote letter to CE asking him what was being used. I have two DX setups that can be used to monitor frequencies AN. The SX-28 & loop are connected to an old TR1-A; I can get about three hours @ 3 3/4 ips with 3,600'. I also have a Fisher 90-T on a longwire w/an Ampex 750, I can get six hours @ 1 7/8 ips w/3,600'. Both setups use timers to turn on & off at preset times. On 2/11, v/tp KWHN-1320, KGKL-960 & WBRC-960, regionals on a night when things were pretty dead. On 2/12 I got WOC & KTOE-1420. The inherent deficiencies of the Musing format are in no way a reflection on ERC, of course. I wouldn't go for splitting DDXDinto sections by geographical area of the reporters, however. Such fractionalization again increases the burdens of anyone trying to retrieve a certain piece of info. Too, NRC should NOT be a carbon copy of IRCA! 

DX conditions here in the Northeast have been generally poor-to-fair on TA paths and good-to-excellent to Latin America. A fair TA opening was noted on the AM of 2/17, and a very good opening for TA's occurred on the morning of 2/24. Len Kruse in Iowa reports, "The DX on the BCB late afternoon both 2/15 and 2/16 was terrific! Stations from the South, especially Texas and Louisiana came in almost like locals..." [Classic "auroral" conditions, Len]. Glenn Hauser in Colorado says 2/11 "was a good auroral evening". Clarence Freeman in California says, "conditions here 2/12 and 2/13 were very auroral but by 2/17 conditions had changed greatly and some Canadians were noted like CBX through KCBS on 740... conditions are looking up." Out in Hawaii, Richard Wood notes some very unusual reception. "Morning of 2/17. My best night's reception ever. A distance record set by excellent reception of Zahedan, Iran, on 777, about 8000 miles. New KICY pouring in. Other new catches included WSB and 5 new Cubans; Sint Maarten excellent. burma good; Asians generally every frequency. On the other hand, Southern Hemisphere was very limited; nothing in LA southt of Bonaire; no Tahiti or other Pacific Islands except weak Fi ji, Majuro; no New Zealand; only 3 Australians, and no SEA south of Burma except fairly weak FARS-1580. India was not logged. as almost all even channels were blocked by powerful Chinese signals. Rather than Japan or Korea, the first evening opening to Asia was a Soviet on 1010, for which I suspect a quite northerly location, perhaps Magadan near Alaska." Here in Massachusetts we may have had a South or East African on 764 the same night. 2/17. (Ed)

Geomagnetic activity has fallen to a low level following the large disturbance on 2/11; as the absorption produced by that disturbance gradually died away. high latitude paths became open and "auroral" conditions were replaced by a more normal pattern. Note that the high latitude absorption had died away enough by 2/17 to permit receptions of the sort described above for that date. Judging from the TA opening on 2/27 observed here in Massachusetts, auroral activity must have been generally low 2/18 - 2/27. The following graph shows the level of daily geomagnetic/auroral activity as determined by the Fredericksburg & index measured by the U.S. Government's geomagnetic observatory at Fredericksburg, Va. Low values of A occur when auroral activity is low; highlatitude paths such as those from Europe to the West Coast and Asia to the East Coast are then possible. A values above 20 indicate high levels of auroral activity and associated high-latitude absorption of MW signals: MW reception from the south is usually enhanced during these auroral disturbances. A series of low A values is a necessary but not sufficient condition for high-latitude In propagation. "a" indicates observed "auroral nights": "l" indicates unusually good low-latitude reception (e.g., from Hawaii); stars indicate nights with relatively good high latitude conditions. Graph dates are GMT.



** GUILLA. Acclusive information on a trand-new MW country is supplied to us by our member Fob Cooper, Jr., of the Virgin Islands:

"The island of anguilla [near St. Maartin - Ed.] is now an independent 'country'. It was previously part of the St. Kitts and Nevis link up. One of my business associates down here told me today that the new Eank of America branch on Anguilla recently had a 2 mHz marine frequency radio telephone base station put in so they could communicate with the ECA branches here in the VI. One of the requirements of the Anguilla government, before they would authorize this two-way installation, was that the 60 watt Marine radio (a Fierce Simpson) be equipped to broadcast messages to Anguilla in the broadcast band. So my associate installed an end fed zepp and at their request supplied a 1500 kc/s crystal for the 60 watt set. Their schedule for sometime will be intermittent - the system will be used mainly for government messages to the people on the island and will not be used for any type of entertainment broadcasting for at least the present time. This is probably wise - the Fierce Simpson set is rated for 10% ICCS duty anyhow!"

that is an event of importance on Anguilla, we wonder? This almost inaccessible little island made headlines around the world about a year ago when they declared themselves independent and applied for UN membership. Rebuffed at the UN, they next tried to get the U.S. to annex them, but we politely declined the offer for "legal reasons". The Police Chief of St. Kitts was all set to go over to Anguilla, bash in a few heads, and put an end to the revolution but the crafty Anguillans put a couple of rocks on the island's only landing strip (like the nearby island of Saba, Anguilla is almost inaccessible by sea) and preserved their independence. After having argued the point with several Anguillans in the past, the editor agrees that Anguilla is indeed independent. Those who wish to argue the point should be advised that Anguillans are unusually large and powerful people and are used to winning arguments... Ed.
