2 NRC LOG WILL BE A SELLOUT!

All outstanding requests for the new 1970 NRC Log received by 9/19 have now been filled; most of the original batch went out around 9/8. Unless otherwise requested, they were mailed via 4th Class Book Rate and reports indicate that delivery time should be about 10 days or so... If you have not yet received your copy of the Log, please let us know immediately. We have now sold more than 80% of the Log pressrun and at the present rate of sale we expect our supply to be exhausted within two months. We're seriously considering a second printing but this is not a certainty at the present time; if you haven't sent in your order yet you'd best do so soon or run the risk of missing out completely...!

Please read Russ Edmund's section this issue for information on how we intend to handle corrections and additions to the Log (as distinct from Update info). We'll issue a one-time list of addenda to the Log and Update as in previous years. In addition to minor random errors that crept into the Log originally and were not caught or slipped past the proofreading, one major information deletion has been spotted: about a dozen of the Canadians on 1340 got dropped as a block in preparation. And WCBS was inadvertently given WRRZ's PSA power. When checking the Log watch especially for "Q's" that have become "O's" (inherited from the first Edition) and misspellings of French Canadian place names.

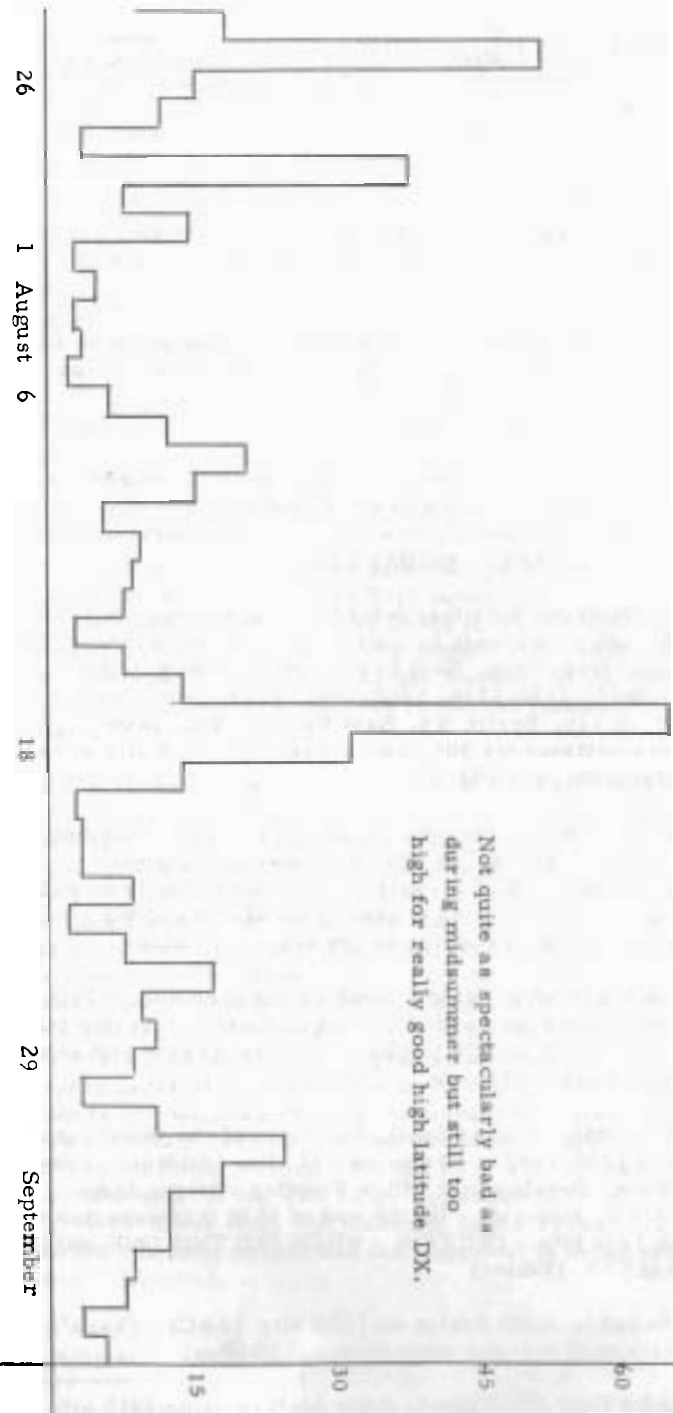
Greetings from Japan! Well, I'm about settled down in new surroundings now. I'm stationed at South Camp Drake in the NW suburb of Tokyo. I'm currently working in NX & sports on the Far East Network of AFRIS & enjoy the work very much. I'll try to get a feature on FEN written for DX NEWS before too long, so I won't elaborate about the station itself. As Glenn Hauser reported earlier, Tokyo seems to be a potentially good DX location. The noise level out here is unbelievably low & the only major problems are the many FEN spurious radiations. I have checked a couple of times in the early morning and there seem to be three local ANers in addition to FEN. However, DX efforts have been limited, as HQ-160 and World Radio TV Handbook haven't arrived yet, and I'm beginning to wonder if they ever will. Without a WRTH & a well-calibrated RX it's almost impossible to ID anything. Other than FEN & the mighty NXcast at NHK, the only EE program I've noted is the 1250 Russian that Glenn mentioned. They relay R. Moscow's Australian Service at 1130 GMT. I hope everyone enjoyed the Convention this year. Sorry I had to miss it. While I was home I renewed for my sixth year in NRC. DXing is a great hobby and NRC is a great Club. Walt Breville, Rich Eddie and Charles Wehking visited me before I left. It was good to see Walt & Rich again and meet Charles for the first time. FATHER JACK PEJZA - 3266 Nutmeg Street - San Diego, California - 92104

What a difference between DXing in the city and the country! I didn't know how good I had it in Ojai, where the nearest local was about nine miles away. Here I am, 2 1/2 miles from both KGB & KOGO, three miles from KSON, 3 1/2 from KSDO, 11 from KFMB & KCBQ, & 16 from the Tijuana stations. As can be imagined, many mixing spurs have been detected just in three days: 540- XETRA/XENO, 550- KSON/XETRA, 570- KOGO/KCBQ, 670- XETRA/KGB, 780- KOGO-XETRA, 1020- KSON/KSDO, 1050 XERB/KSDO, 1200- KSON/KSDO, 1210- KCBQ-ksdo, 1550- KGB-KCBQ, 1600- XETRA image (690 plus 910). Also noted have been some mixing spurs w/non-local stations: 620- KBIG/KCB, 720- KFI/KGN, 850- KNX-XETRA, & 1180- KSL/KCBQ. I am able to figure out how all these spurs originate, with the exception of the 1200 KSON/KSDO one, any help? I'll probably locate many others, since theoretically mixing spurs can occur on practically all frequencies from the 18 stations in the area. KCRL-780 Reno has been testing after midnight PDR practically every night recently. 850-Thousand Oaks is still being constructed; studios (and tower also, I believe) are not finished yet. It's good having other DXers in the area to compare notes with - Grant Manning, Dave Stroup & I have already gotten together, while Randy Seaver should also be a help (if he cranks up the rig again). Grant and John Kolb (IRCA & ASWLC) are working on pre-amp plans, using various types of FETs and ICs. It should be an interesting season ahead.

This represents a new country for me, my 60th. I hope the next 60 won't take another 14 1/2 years. Although I'm far from being the best DXer, I'm proud of my 60 countries. Of course, pride cometh before a fall. Also I'm just about a dozen veries shy of reaching the 2,000 mark. Right now I'm wondering where I got all the money to spend on postage. I just received an interesting letter from a foreign station which I decline to mention, because I'm going to count it as a verie anyway. The letter reads "The data indicated in your letter correspond (sic) to the morning programme of --- Radio. --- Radio is not a radio-amateur station & we cannot confirm your v/q & the frequencies." The data I sent was correct, but the station can't confirm, because it's not a ham XR. As I said, I'm counting it. Also I received a nice v/1 from WFEC verifying a report of mine. I logged WFEC on RS & sent a report but the second-to-last line is interesting. The DOE writes "This station does not answer DX Reports from our monthly frequency measurements." So folks, don't waste your time on the r/c of WFEC - log it on RS. That's all.



This graph shows the daily values of Agy - the Fredericksburg index of geomagnetic/auroral disturbance in the Karst's magnetic field. High values of Agy occur during a heavy influx of electrically charged particles into the upper atmosphere as the result of certain types of solar disturbances. The medium-wave signal absorption produced by one of these events is strongest in high latitudes and persists for some days following the initial particle influx. Values of Agy above about 20 are inevitably associated with high levels of absorption along high-latitude TA and TP signal paths. Very high values (above about 40) are usually accompanied by E layer blanketing over North America and Europe; on such a night stations on the South will appear to dominate most channels. Long periods of low geomagnetic/auroral activity are necessary but not sufficient to guarantee excellent high latitude TA and TP reception - other ionospheric effects such as the "Midwinter Anomaly" may effectively mask what would otherwise be periods of excellent reception on high latitude paths during periods of continued low geomagnetic/auroral activity.



REPORTEDLY IN OPERATION

BARBADOS. Radio Barbados has quietly moved from 780 to 900 kHz and is now heard there with "Radio 900" ID's. This leaves 780 dominated by ZBVI once WBBM is looped out.

YEMEN. Sana Radio has begun operation of a new station, nominally on 1214 kHz. This station is located at Sha'ub, according to an announcement, and uses two 30 kw transmitters in parallel for an effective 60 kw output. This new station has been observed actually in operation on 1212.4 kHz. (Editor)

CZECHOSLOVAKIA. The 2nd Czech National Program began announcing Radio Hvezdq (Star Radio) on August 31st; a new interval signal is also used and care should be taken not to misidentify this one - this new service is now being broadcast on 1520 and 1286 kHz. (SCDX; Editor)

EAST GERMANY. "Der Deutsche Soldatensender" is transmitting daily on 935 kHz with 250 kw (although it pretends to operate from West Germany, this one is actually transmitting from Berg, East Germany) according to the following schedule: 0530-0615, 1130-1230, 1700-1745, 1915-1945, and 2230-0030. Address is, Postfach 116, Berlin W8, East Berlin. This same transmitter is used by Freiheitsender 904, now operating on 908 kHz at 0430-0515, 1800-1830 and 2000-2200. (SCDX)

LIBERIA. Radio Lamco, Buchanan, recently logged by an Arctic member onboard a ship off the African coast on 746 kHz with many programs in parallel with ELBC on 629.1 kHz. ELBC was very difficult to log here in the U.S. a couple of years ago when they were operating on 650 kHz in the clear with a full 10 kw so it'll take some real doing to get 746... (Editor)

GAMBIA. Radio Syd also heard while off the Gambian coast on 908, "This is Radio Syd, Bathurst, coming your way with 20 hours of music every day from 6 in the morning to 2 at night..." Mostly English but some French and native announcements and a few commercials noted. (Arctic)

TRUCIAL AMIRATE OF DUBAI. Saut as Sahil, the Voice of the Coast, is now using 10 kw 0300-0700 and 1200-1900 in Arabic on 737 kHz. Address is Saut As Sahil, Advertising Office, Development Office Building, Deira, Dubai. The Chief Executive is Michael E. Metcalfe. By the end of 1970 it is expected that 737 will be replaced with 1250 kHz. (WRTVH) WHEN DID THIS ONE MOVE FROM SHARJA TO DUBAI??? (Editor)

TOGO. Lome recently heard in South Africa on 1394 kHz (ARC) There's never been the slightest trace of this one over here... (Editor)

MALDIVE ISLANDS. Radio Gan, Gan Island, Addu Atoll is using 1215 kHz and has been by Arctic's cruising member from a distance of about 500 miles. The programming is from both RAF and U.S. Air Force components of the base but they play a lot of BBC transcripts. (Arctic)

ICELAND. Andy Rugg of Toronto recently visited Iceland and reports that Keflavik on 1484 is now ID'ing as "AFNI - American Forces Network, Iceland" or "Armed Forces Radio, Keflavik"; sometimes they add "Broadcasting from the NATO Base". This one has not been logged in North America to the best of my knowledge. (Editor)

GREENLAND. Andy also visited Greenland and reports hearing a very weak AFRTS station in the "low 1500's" - probably in the 1500-1540 kHz range. He says it was definitely higher than 1484; at that time he was in Kulusuk on the Eastern coast near Angmagssalik, due East of Sondre Stromfjord, southwest of Scoresby Sound, and equidistant from both. (Probably Sondrestrom, listed as 1420 kHz but this channel listing may well be out of date. Editor)

PIRATES, CLANDESTINE, AND BOOTLEGGERS

INTERNATIONAL WATERS (NETHERLANDS)

Radio Capital officially began fulltime operations September 1st on 1115 kHz but have not been heard since September 12th. (Ken Brownless) This one is located aboard the ship King David anchored near the Dutch island of Pem. They are using a 10 kw RCA transmitter and transmits soft and MOR music only; no rock. Unlike Veronica and Nordsee at the moment, this one will QSL if 3 IRC's are enclosed; address is Capital Radio, P.O. Box 270, Bussum, Holland. (Bengt Ericson)

Radio Nordsee is now operating NSP on 1367 kHz with announcements in Dutch, English, and German. (Being heard with good signals on 1367 here in Watertown as I type this 2200 on 9/20 - Editor) On Saturday, August 29th around 1230 a tug with 20 persons aboard, among them a woman and child, tried to take possession of the Mebo II and to take the ship in tow. They used a welding torch to cut the anchor chain and sprayed the antenna with seawater. This party was led by a Dutch nightclub owner, Kees Menders, who claims to be a creditor of Nordsee. The DJ on duty aboard Nordsee transmitted an SOS to other boats in the area and once Radio Veronica (pirate on 1562 kHz) and a Dutch Marine Police vessel arrived on the scene. At 1430 it was all over after heated discussions and fights aboard the Mebo II; supporters of Menders captured parts of the ship in the meanwhile. The captain of Mebo II locked all doors and windows and kept broadcasting the whole time. Listeners could follow the affair over the air and thousands of listeners called the Dutch police. RNI thanked Radio Veronica for the help later in the evening by beginning the newscasts with "A tug with 20 persons aboard tried earlier today to take possession of our ship, but thanks to Radio Veronica..." The crew is now reportedly heavily armed and the argument is being resolved through the courts. (Arctic)

September 3-7, 1970 marked the largest N.R.C. annual convention ever held, and it proved to be one of the most successful as well. The convention opened Thursday afternoon, with informal sessions, which also were the order of the day on Friday. Most of those attending arrived Friday evening, although Thursday saw some 22 arrivals. Saturday morning a small group toured WRKL-910 in New City, N.Y., about an hour away from convention HQ, and Ernie Cooper and Jerry Starr guested on the station's talk show briefly during the tour. Saturday afternoon brought a technical discussion which covered mainly the effects of geomagnetic phenomena on DX'ing and reception conditions.

Saturday evening, the official banquet was held, following which we heard a short address by guest David Popkin of the New York F.C.C. field office. Mr. Popkin then answered questions from the audience. DX contests followed with Frank Merrill winning both the multiple-questions foreign & domestic quiz, and the call letter contest. In the call letter contest, Vin Cavaseno listed 62 correct calls made from the words "New York Area" without an incorrect call, although Frank had 98 correct and 3 incorrect calls for higher total score.

The first annual N.R.C. auction followed, with total proceeds from a wide variety of items exceeding \$100. Sunday afternoon was the business meeting, during which the problems of publishing bulletins and the log were discussed along with other B.P.C. problems. Following that, a spirited discussion was held on the proposal of several members to officially recognize the legitimacy of taped ID's as "proof-of-reception" along with verification, but whenever the two might be listed, they would not be either equated or combined so as to favor one over the other. The proposal would in no way affect veries, as they are still the only "verification" and are also a valid form of "proof-of-reception". Discussion pro centered around time and money needed for reports, automatic verifiers, poor Latin American mail service, the fact that many veries are obtained on basis of tape anyway, and the preferability to many individuals of playing back their DX as opposed to looking at veries. Arguments con involved fakery, the fact that a tape is not "verification" per se, and the expense of taping. A final resolution was put before the assembled membership which would recognize the legitimacy of tapes of ID's as a proof of reception which would be listed alongside verifications in all totals and Supremacy Ratings at the discretion of the editor (s) thereof providing that the tape contained two of the three accepted items of identification: Call or slogan, frequency, and location. The membership present indicated by a significant majority that in all fairness to all points of view, the N.R.C. should accept this proposal.

The business meeting was concluded with the bidding for and selection of the next year's convention site. A bid was received from the San Francisco area from Pete Taylor and Frank Kennedy, and was read by Convention Committee Chairman Russ Edmunds, and a bid for Portland, Oregon was presented by Mike Northam. There was brief discussion of whether or not the tradition of East-West conventions alternating was binding, however no conclusion was reached and no further bids were offered. A vote was taken, and the site for the 1971 N.R.C. convention will be SAN FRANCISCO.

We then broke for dinner, and a large group prepared to go the to DX-pedition, which was held in a barn on the grounds of Ringwood Manor State Park, in Ringwood, N.J., near the New York State Line, and some 45 miles northeast of New York City. Several members had receivers and loops, and, although conditions were not outstanding, several interesting stations were heard (see DDXD & IDXD for details). We returned to the motel around 4 a.m., and the Monday saw departures.

The Voice of Prophecy is one of the most easily identifiable and widely scheduled commercial religious broadcasters on the air. It's Spanish language counterpart, La Voz de la Esperanza, can be useful for identifying Latins for those who lack basic Spanish; the L. V. Esperanza List will also appear here in DX NEWS in the near future. And for those who spend a few hours on Sunday mornings contemplating a little daytime DX, the Voice is a useful tool to increase your totals heard, as their trumpet calls at the opening are distinctive in the toughest pileup on the dial.

The close is standardized. Though the closing poem, "Have Faith in God" is rewritten for each broadcast, the "Have Faith in God" lines are rarely changed. Here is the script, as provided by Milton Carlson, President of the Los Angeles advertising agency of his own name that handles the placement of schedules. The program is presided over by H.M.S. Richards and his son, H.M.S. Richards, Jr.

RICHARDS: We hope this program has served to give you spiritual strength for the coming week. Now we invite you to join us next week for another broadcast brought to you by the Voice of Prophecy. Then our subject, "The Vicar of Christ" will be presented by my son, H.M.S. Richards, Jr.

As we leave you now, remember this: God loves and cares for you and me. So let us keep looking up... ever going forward in faith!

ORGAN: Organ bridge.

RICHARDS: Have faith in God - He who creates may recreate;
Have faith in God - for a new life, none need to wait;
Have faith in God - Whose love and power we celebrate.
Have faith, dear friend, in God.

This is followed by a short Benediction and then organ fill to close.

N.R.C. 1970-71 FOREIGN CONTEST RULES

- The object of this contest is for the entrant to conclusively log as many stations as he is able, within the format of the reporting system and in as many of the regular contest divisions as he wishes, assuming his eligibility therefor.
- The regular contest divisions are as follows:
 - Division A - U.S. & Canada (excluding Alaska & Hawaii)
 - Division B - Carribbean Area (includes C.A., Mexico, all Carrib. islands)
 - Division C - South America (excludes all Caribbean islands)
 - Division D - Europe
 - Division E - Africa & Middle East (includes Turkey, Crete, Arab nations, Israel)
 - Division F - Asia (excludes countries listed under Middle East above)
 - Division G - Oceania (includes Alaska, Hawaii, etc.)
- The term of this contest will be 0001 EST 10/1/70 to 2359 EST 5/31/71.
- The contest fee will be 50¢ per division entered.
- No entrant may enter Division A unless he lives outside of it.
- No entrant may count stations from his home country in this contest.
- In the case of Hispaniola, entrants living thereupon will be unable to count stations from either country.
- Deadline for entries will be 11-15-70, the new members may join within 30 days of membership.
- All contest forms will be due no later than 6-15-71. All late forms will be discounted.
- SCORING: Each contestant will receive an initial contest logging form allowing for four (4) entries per division per frequency block: (525-599; 600-699, etc.). 525-599 will require only three (3) loggings per form. Contestants completing a form will send same to the contest manager, who will, in turn, send the entrant additional forms as needed. No entries made prior to the closing date on the previous form may be used on any subsequent form. Points will be awarded as follows:
 - Four (4) points for all stations in excess of 1000 miles from the DX'er's location.
 - Two (2) points for all stations between 501-999 miles.
 - One (1) points for all stations between 0-500 miles.
 - Minus three (-3) points for all spaces not filled on any form.
 - No point deductions on the final form will be made.
 - Bonus of twenty-five (25) points given foreach totally completed form.

An entrant need not totally complete any form if he is not able to. He may elect to start on another form at any time, providing he turns in the previous form.
- Call or slogan changes will NOT count as separate loggings.
- Where any change in frequency occurs during the term of the contest, no station may be counted twice unless it has moved a minimum of 5 kHz. from the point at which it was previously logged.
- Winners will be announced at the 1971 convention, and prizes will be awarded either then or by mail afterward.
- No entrant may receive prize monies from more than one division.
- The contest manager will be ineligible for prize monies.
- The contest manager will have exclusive authority for decisions regarding amounts of prizes, distances of stations, or disqualification of loggings should need arise.
- This is a fun contest, and it runs on the honor system, so please act accordingly.

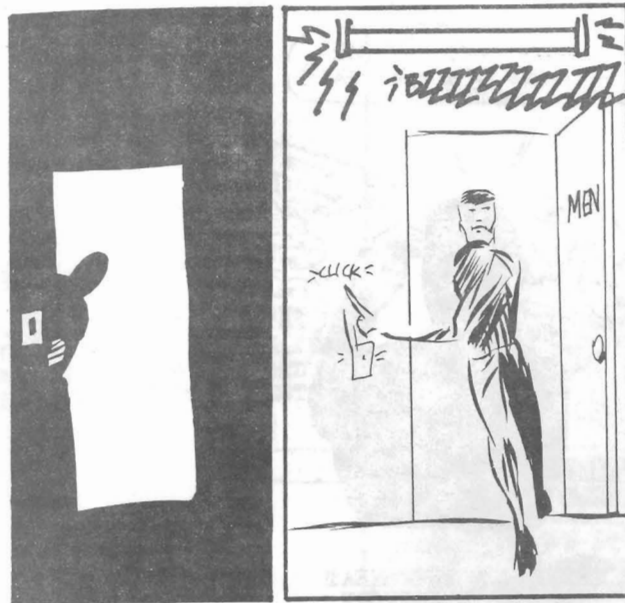
