DRAKE R7 REVIEW

CHUCK HUTTON

Drake has released the R7 receiver as of late July 1979. Having obtained one immediately on a loan-to-test basis, I hope the following theory and performance review will introduce the R7 to DX'ers. Two basic models are available: the R7 and the R7/DR7. The R7 has analog only frequency readout and covers 10-500, 500-1000, 1000-1500, 1500-2000, 2500-3000, 3500-4000, 5000-5500, 7000-7500, 14000-14500, 21000-21500, and 28500-29000 kHz. Frequency coverage is in 500 kHz bands with generous PTO overlap of at least 125 kHz at the top and bottom of each band. The R7/DR7 has digital and analog readout and covers 0-30 mHz with no gaps. Otherwise there are no differences in performance. The word is that as of mid-August Drake has not sent any

R7's to dealers.

Some design features are very interesting so I will trace the signal path through the receiver in order to discuss them: (1) in the RF stage no amplification takes place unless a 10 dB gain pushbutton controlled preamp is switched in. As can be seen from the sensitivity specs presented later, the sensitivity is very good even without the preamp. It is likely that the preamp will only be needed for very weak signal DX at the top end of the HF band. The preamp is non-operative below 1.5 mHz as Drake realized the extra gain could only hurt strong signal handling. (2) input selectivity is provided by 9 broadband bandpass filters, each covering part of the 0-30 mHz spectrum. Therefore, no preselector to adjust. (3) the incoming RF signal passes immediately to a special high level double balanced diode mixer that is designed for excellent strong signal handling. (4) the first IF is at 48.05 mHz for improved image rejection. Up conversion to such a high IF is made possible by a phase -locked loop HF oscillator.

Important controls/functions include: (1) front panel diodeswitched selectivity filters. A 2300 Hz filter is standard; 300. 500. 1800, 4000, and 6000 Hz filters are optional \$2. (2) passband tuning, allowing some flexibility in selectivity. (3) Receiver Incremental Tuning, for use in varying the received frequency up or down a matter of a few kilohertz. Not of great interest to MW DX'ers. (4) a tuneable IF notch filter for reducing heterodyne interference. (5) switchable AGC time constants for best reception of any transmission mode. (6) an "AUX PROGRAM" selector switch for choosing any of 8 500 kHz bands or crystal controlled frequencies programmed into the accessory AUX? program board. This board allows quick switching to often-used bands, quick switching to any of up to 8 crystal controlled frequencies, or in the case of the R7, it allows reception of any 8 500 kHz bands between 0 and 30 mHz. This last option should allow the SW DX er to make good use of the R7. (7) main and alternate antenna switch with back panel connections for each. (8) a crystal calibrator emitting markers every 25 kHz. (9) on the DR7 model, the digital dial reads out to the nearest 100 Hz. (10) an impulse type noise blanker is optional. Installation is easy as Drake has included a front panel switch for the NB and also provided for easy mounting a la the PSR4 noise blanker. (11) a "store" switch for the digital dial. It freezes the display on the frequency you are tuned to, allowing you to tune away and remember where you were originally tuned to. Electronic scratch paper. (12) the digital dial may also be used as a 150 mHz frequency counter. (13) a tape out jack is provided. (14) an internal speaker is provided. (15) a front panel headphone jack. (16) can be operated of of either 110/240 VAC or 13.8 VDC.

Stability: less than 100 Hz drift after temperature stabilization, even with + 10% line voltage variation. Temperature variation is not defined. No time frame is mentioned for the drift.

The filters have excellent shape factors and possess good ultimate rejection. In the above two areas, I can find nothing to fault in the R7. Stability is excellent; sideband is stable within seconds of turning the rig on, making it unnecessary to chase the signal around. Image rejection is top notch. The area where the R7 really shines is the mixer specs. Third order IM figures are as good as are available at the current time. Blocking is practically non-existent with a mixer capable of

handling such strong signals.

I am able to fault the R7 in only two areas, after thorough comparison with a 390A, SPR4, FRG7 with 3 kHz filter, HQ129X with 2 mechanical filters, HQ180A, and very briefly a RF4800. Firstly, the audio rates as very poor. Before someone accuses me of being too picky about audio, let me say that I have never considered any commercial receiver to have such poor audio that I would not own it. The R7 comes close. Whatever they used for an internal speaker, it needs to be replaced. Distortion and tinniness are close to in-tolerable. The MS7 external speaker is satisfactory but still not top notch. The second criticism is their choice in broadbanding the input stage at MW frequencies. While this is OK at HF where no practical, attainable amount of input selectivity will protect the receiver from strong signals only 10 or 20 kHz away, this is not the case at INW freqs. A good preselector has enough selectivity to be of great help to the urban MW DX'er. In practical terms, this means that the R7 was able to defeat the 390A between 720 and 800 kHz where super-local WSB is a terror, if and only if the R7 was tuned so close to WSB that the 390A's input selectivity was of no use. That is, 740 was DX'able on the R7 but not on the 390A but 720, 730, 770 and 780 were generally better on the 390A. The broadbanded RF input on the R7 also led to a handful of spurs from locals that were totally unheard on other receivers. This was true only on the Beverages, so it is possible that under less severe conditions the problem may disappear.

If you own a 390A, don't plan to dump it for a R7. With an SPR4, 180A, or FRG7, you most certainly will notice improvement when switching to the R7. Versus a 390A, the advantages will be ease of repair, portability, newness (most 390A's are 20 years old), digital tuning, better sensitivity for HF DX, and an ability to handle stronger signals as outlined above. I believe most DXers will not feel the advantages to be worth an extra \$100 however.

Stations on the other side of Frederic (WTIX-690 & WWL-870, New Orleans) are only slightly reduced in readability. In fact, reception from all directions and distances seems pretty normal. Locally, WNYY-1230 is still broadcasting but I don't expect them to be on much longer because a couple of months ago they were knocked out by a heavy rain (and Frederic is more than a heavy rain). WCOA-1370 was simulcasting with WJIQ-FM until a few minutes ago when the FM XR's coax feed snapped in the wind (the engineer refused to climb the tower to splice it, hi). SURVEY REPORT

Back in 1977, we conducted a memoer survey in order to better direct our efforts to meet needs of the memoership. A short time back we also conducted a survey. The responses, to a great degree, have helped us chart a direction for NRC. Originally, this summary consisted of 10 legal size pages. Anyone wanting a copy of the full summary should send 41¢ in postage-responses will be made within 30 days.

Question 1 related to the purpose of NAC. The majority of about 50 replies stressed that NAC was here to collect and districte LX related information. At the same time, since NAC is a hobby, a reasonable amount of socialization was favored by those responding.

Question 2 concerned changes to improve NRC. There were several catagories of replies. The largest response stressed need for memoership development, specifically to encourage inactive members to participate. A couple of members suggested an effort be made to end what was felt to be an "Eastern Orientation" of NRC by getting West Coast participation. *** Ten members offered no specifics or felt that NRC did not need improvement, indicating that the trial and error process over 46 years has resulted in a very good club. *** Four members opted for more democratic government, but not on every little issue, rather on major decisions like dues increases. *** Constructive criticism was leveled at LPC on its handling of controversy. One member noted improvement if we would eliminate bickering in the club. *** Some detailed comments were directed toward NRC publications. Rewriting and updating of publications and looking into new publications were stressed. It was noted that our pubs have always been great member-getters, money earners, and member keepers. Personal comment: This is the most important subject area for consideration over the next year or so. We in Louisville have the ability to print what is needed, but updating of current publications and implementing possible new one must be handled elsewhere. We here lack technical expertise and the time to do so. This is a constant process requiring someone of the "take charge" type who is willing to work and coordinate the technical aspects of our publications. *** A more organized CPC effort was wanted, directed at key stations.

Question 3 dealt with improving DX News. There was an awful lot of suggestions here. The largest number were happy with DX News as it is. More issues in the summer were suggested. Several members objected to tip material in Musings and still others wanted more tip material there. One member wrote: "Musings is overdone. Stricter control needs to be placed on what is acceptable. Old timers with truly interesting info or ideas need to be drawn back in..." Each column should have specific rules and these should be printed, wrote another. "Other ideas: More technical articles, more receiver reviews, a station-profile page, more information obtained from newspapers, trade mags regarding contemporary developments in MW radio, more info on radio personalities, more pictures, member biographies, more information on rule changes for MW broadcasting. Eliminate DDXD, Contests, rankings of LXers as these do not aid other DXers, filler, junk, trash and egotism which does not help members to log and verify MW stations. Consolidate AM Switch and NRC Log updates. Consolidate AM Switch with DDXD. Have color covers (we did'). And many others.....

question 4 asked if the columns were hard to read. At the time of the 1977 survey nearly one-forth of the replies indicated difficulty with LXN print size. This we rephrased the question and only 11 of 50 said they had no problem. The consensus was that print size did not have to be increased, however printing and readability had to be improved. Those columns done with electric typewriters and carbon ribbons drew no complaints. The most criticism was directed at Musings, although both DDXD and IDXD caught one complaint each. Several members said that Musings was virtually unreadable and they felt that a new typewriter was a must if the column was to have any value to the members. Personal comment: We have never been happy with print readability and hope that editors will take greater pains to ensure their copy is readable, especially by using good ribbons and cleaning the keys regularly.

Question 5 was about adjustments we would make if inflation or a postal increase required a dues adjustment. Almost every member favored a dues increase, rather than reduction in number of issues, provided it was reasonable. **** Since NRC is all volunteer, we change publishing crews periodically. LPC has been at it since April 1, 1977. Somewhere down the line a new crew will take over and we expect NRC will be hardpressed to find a printer who works as cheaply as the present one. We now pay only 75% of what was charged in NJ three years ago. But paper costs have risen as much as 40% in the last year and a postal increase will certainly be required unless inflation is magically stopped. Postage and printing for this year was more than the \$15 membership charged, so a dues adjustment will no doubt be needed. If this is done, it will be the first adjustment since 1975.

Question 6 was the computer question. Most people responding recognized that a computer would allow us to handle the huge amount of data we collect, principally the Domestic Log, with far less effort and in a shorter time. The practicality of an annual edition was suggested. At the same time, others noted that volunteer labor was cheaper. Two main reservations to a computer system were raised. The first was simply how could NRC afford

the system and software, and later the maintenance of the system? The second was logistical. With NRC's workload divided among volunteers across the country, how could we effectively make use of such a system for other than a special project such as the Log, short of centralizing the operations of NRC once more? *** Several people suggested buying time as an alternative. *** Among the uses for a computer: (1) Maintaining the mailing list, (2) Maintaining the Lomestic Log (3) Updating the Log (4) Addition of new logs using information taken from computerized columns (theoretically); such as a new version of the Latin American Log or a commined TA/TP Log. (5) Computerization of the CPC program, involving a systematic, large scale approach to test arranging. (6) Storing data for certain columns of repetative nature. (7) Bookkeeping of receipts and expenditures, publications inventories, income tax preparation, etc. To these many new uses would no doubt be added. Personal comment: We as a club were reluctant to change to offset printing in the early '60s. There is, naturally, hesitance to take such a big step (and costly if we were to go the new equipment route). If, I repeat if, we were able to get past the obstacle of paying for the equipment initally, we would make more money than required for cost of annual operation. For example, our publications would be more sellable, useful and possibly more marketable through commercial outlets to a greater extent than at present. The bottom line is money. Several suggestions were made to get the needed money, but all deserve detailed study. Should we ever get to the point of being able to buy, we will, of course, call on every member and outside source for help, to get the best equipment and

Question 7 inquired about getting more technical articles. One member replied: "Good question--ask for more to be written?" This was a very sound response and I feel we at hQ are guilty of ignoring the simple approach. "Request specific people to provide specific articles, based upon their expertise. Find someone 'fresh and clean' (one who's made no enemies) and is willing to do club work, who will make contact with those members who have demonstrated a capability for technical articles." *** The point was raised that technical articles should not be written only for others of equal technical background. "Although the technoids in the club would probably disagree strongly, I have to think that interest among the total membership in deeply involved tech is pretty small. On the other hand, practical application tech probably has a wider appeal (simple construction projects, receiver hot-rodding ideas, antenna construction and BASIC propagation). The tech with the foot-long math formulae and intricate schematics would probably be better offered through monographs and reprints...At times, there might be articles from outside publications that could be reprinted or condensed.."

<u>Question 8</u> was about how NRC stacked up against other clubs. Almost every member expressed an opinion similar to the one which follows: "Are you kidding? Just compare DXN with any other Mw club, we're obviously the leader. Not to say that other clubs don't have good points, but NRC offers the best overall."

Question 9 asked how to gain new members, how to make NRC better known. Some few members questi ned need for growth. "I am not sure whether bigger is better. Our club was very successful, and the bulletins contained greater musing participation in the late '50s and early '60s when our membership was slightly less than 300!" *** There were a lot of little things suggested to attract members. These included use of NRC stationary, the "Broadcaster's Guide to LX" with all reports, going after former members, working with equipment manufacturers to give publicity to the houby. *** A good number felt we should advertize. Suggested magazines included Broadcasting, Broadcast Engineering, Popular Electronics, Radio Electronics, Ham Trader Yellow Sheets, QST and the like. *** We were also urged to get exposure over international SW stations on a regular basis. *** A suggestion was made to "adopt" a clear channel station, buying a DX News subscription and making periodic visits to the station to transcribe potential member's names and addresses. *** Inother memoer thought we could write and edit a "third opinion" on the clear channel situation that many radio and electronics magazines could print as a public service. Perhaps some clear channel stations would be interested in airing it, as a public service, to help fulfill their agreement with the FCC to serve the public interest. There were several suggestions relating to Public Service Announcements, writing a bigger and better book on the hopby, and my favorite-going on one of those TV "news magazines" as a weird group!!!!

<u>Cuestion 10</u> was about possible elimination of the new meber fee. There was no clear answer to this one. Of 48 replies to this question, 16 said to keep the fee; 11 said to drop it completely; another 11 said to offer the new member kit thru regular publications channels and 10 had uncertain replies. A couple of members suggested revision of the NMK to make it less costly, but still keeping the basics. They reasoned if cost was reduced, we could eliminated the fee. A couple of other replies indicated that we would end the problem of collecting the extra dollar for the new member fee by merely listing new memberships as "First Year Membership \$16, renewals \$15". No real conclusion to this questions was ascertainable, however.

That's it. Thanks for bearing with the smaller type. My electric is in for a well deserved cleaning.
