DX TEST FLASH ALERT SERVICE. Tired of missing a monday morning station test that you read about in DX News that arrived Tuesday?!! Then what you need is the DX TEST FLASH ALERT Service. All you have to do is send 5 addressed (your address) postcards to: NRC Flash Alert Service, RD2, Box 44, Sand Place, Mannsville, NY 13661. When a test comes along that won't make the DX News in time for you to read, you will get one of your cards in the mail. Also you will be notified when your about to run out of postcards on hand. Its been used twice already this season for late breaking tests. If you have test information and send it to the NRC FAS Address, it has to arrive at least 7 days prior to the station test. If that won't work, you can call your test information in to: 315-387-3583. This is for Station Tests only.

A legal ID consists of the call letters and the city of license. The frequency is optional. Anything else is, well, not an ID. "Stereo 76, WXXX" is not an ID, but a slogan. And a station plugging their own fare is a promo, not an ad. Then there are the announcements for the Red Cross, Heart Ass'n, etc. Those are public service announcements or PSAs. Just wanted to clear the air on that.
- I happened to pick up CJSB-540 on the way home from work on 10/26. After the 1700 ID, the lead news story was about their being granted a license for an FMer on 106.5 (I believe). A DDXD-E scoop?

## FCC has second thoughts on calls

FCC retains K and W distinctions; lets owners assign their call letters to other broadcasters in different services

Bowing to nearly universal disapproval, the FCC, at its open meeting last week, decided against eliminating the geographical restrictions on assigning call letters beginning with K to stations west of the Mississippi Riverand W to stations to the east. Commissioner James Quello offered his congratulations on "a reasonable response to a chaotic proposal," and said he was "glad to see the docket closed." Commissioner Patricia Diaz Dennis concurred and said she was also "very pleased" to see an end to the matter. Chairman Dennis Patrick saw an opportunity to defend the FCC from critics of deregulation. "All those who think this commission is disposed to deregulate just for the sake of deregulation," he said, "should note this item."

The FCC had also proposed to allow separately owned stations in different services to freely use any call letters not used by another station in the same service (presently, only commonly owned stations can use the same call letters). That proposal was modified to allow separately owned stations in different services to use the same call letters only with the written permission of the first call letter user. The proposal originally wanted to limit the consent agreement to a given market, but the proposal was modified to extend the requirement nationally.

The only proposal in the rulemaking to succeed without complaint was the streamlining of call letter transfer when a station switches to a new frequency in the same market. Under the "first-come, first-served" policy, when changing frequencies, owners had to relinquish a call letter and then reapply for it. Now broadcasters will not have to risk losing long-held call letters when changing to new facilities.

The outcry over the FCC's call letter proposal was loud, with networks, trade associations, group owners and rating services voicing opposition. Arbitron in particular was vehemently opposed to the proposal. Its research indicated that a majority of viewers used call letters to identify stations and felt that any attempt to change the system would lead to confusion and distort ratings.

National Association of Broadcasters radio board chairman and RKO Radio president, Jerry Lyman, said the NAB was pleased the FCC chose to drop "a change we believe would have created unnecessary confusion." Lyman also said the modification of the first-come, first-served policy will also benefit audiences in retaining identification of stations. Lyman said: "We continge to believe the commission's decision to permit stations...to use the same call letters could create confusion...but at least the commission has decided to require consent of the station holding the original call sign."

The FCC said it had proposed the change in K and W distinctions to increase the number of call signs available, but decided against the change because "on further reflection the commission found that such a change would not increase the pool of available call signs, but only the areas where the existing call sign possibilities could be used." The commission also said it "recognized the value of maintaining the traditional radio station identification conventions,' and retaining the current convention "outweighed any minor inconvenience it may pose for some broadcasters."

The commission felt the modification of the proposal for conforming basic call signs was justified because "broadcast stations sell time and participate in program supply and other markets nationally and locally, and the FCC concluded that the harmful effects from mistaken identity would not be limited to any particular geogrphic area.

Some observers felt this could mean that stations with distinctive call letters would be free to sell their calls to stations in other markets. Scott Roberts of the policy analysis division, said he saw nothing in the order that would prohibit the sale of call signs, and said he expected some consideration would be involved.

■ AM-FM allocations. FCC authorized nighttime operation for 21 of 41 daytime only AM stations on 1540 khz, loreign clear channel. Frequency's nighttime operation priorily has belonged to Bahamas. However, since the negotiation of new international agreements, limited nighttime use of 14 Class I-A foreign clear channels will be allowed. Announcement of 21 stations affected will be delayed until early December when grace period for possible objections from Bahamas expires.

In response to FCC inquiry, National Association of Broadcasters loid FCC Aug. 31 not to permit FM stations to use directional aniennas under any circumstances, claiming it would lead to "AM-ization" of FM band. However, several FM broadcasters commenting in proceeding look opposite position, contending directional aniennas would benefit FM radio and oublic.

In July, NAB filed comments supporting FCC's proposal to allow most AM daytimers (1,600 of between 1,800 and 1,900) to provide nighttime service at or near lowest post-sunset power already granted these daytimers by FCC. However, NAB said FCC should authorize new night-time service on interim basis until if completes compretiensive review of AM interference standards in separate proceeding launched last month Others said FCC should defer any action until review is completed and new interference standards are adopted FCC hopes to have final order by fail.

Loacted 30 miles west of Atlanta, Dallas retains the ambience of a quiet agricultural center - complete with a town square. The rural character of the town is slowly changing, as the area is becoming a bedroom for Marietta and Atlanta. This county seat community of 2500 residents, plus the rest of




Paulding County, has been informed and entertained by WKRP since its air date of August 15, 1979.

At 1500 khz, 1000 watt WKRP has operated from its inception from a control room in its small yet comfortable grey wooden building at 362 West Memorial Drive, just outside downtown Dallas. The station's directional signal is broadcast south from a two tower array a mile and a quarter north of the town square. WKRP operates at 500 watts during critical hours, and has no PSA.

WKRP's construction permit was executed amid two storms of protest. The original owner applied for the call WDLS (for Dallas), but the attorneys for Atlanta's WKLS-970 objected, because WDLS sounded like this rock station's I.D.

The station wishing to achieve instant recognition, applied for WKRP, the call used for the ratingless, ill-managed Cincinnati spoof. The station management, and the FCC received letters of protest from Mary Tyler Moore Productions, producers of the T.V. series. However, the FCC overruled the protest, on the grounds that WKRP was not a real station. From its begining, WKRPaired a country music format.



However, "Paulding Country" 's format was changed in May, 1986 to rock. Amid a mixed listener reaction, the rock format was toned down, oldies, exclusively, were aired on Saturday, and on Sunday, half of the broadcast day is devoted to country gospel music, and the other half is given to more traditional southern gospel music.

"AM -1500, WKRP", mindfull of its heritage in the distant Queen City of the Ohio River, was sponsoring a Lonnie Anderson look-alike contest when the Profiles editor visited the station in August. (It is a safe wager that many National Radio Club members would volunteer at their own expense to act as judges for this promotion!!) It is not known which local lassie was the lucky winner of the contest.

WKRP is a member of the Georgia Radio Network, and carries, often taped, night play by play of local high school football and basketball games. WKRP informs its listeners through many local newscasts, with an emphasis on Paulding County events. Locally oriented programs, like the "Front Porch" have kept WKRP listeners in touch with their community.

The station building contains the control room, (which, like the T.V. set, is cluttered and decorated with posters), offices, and space for the news and sales staff. The station employs six air personalities, three sales people, and a full time local news reporter.

Early in the summer, the station was robbed, and the burglers made off with over \$4000 worth of equipment.

Today, WKRP is a very vital force in growing Paulding County, as it remains the means for residents to keep up with events in their community.

We thank WKRP announcers Ray Patterson, WKRP afternoon D.J. and WKRP announcer Charles Camp for their assistance in the preparation of this Station Profile. As a footnote, Cincinnati station WKRC-550 was initially quite upset about the WKRP I.D. However, the adult contemporary formatted station enjoyed a surge in listeners and higher ratings as a result of the success of the T.V. production.



In the past I have urged each of you to write to the FCC if you are AMerican or to the CRTC if you are Canadian about the problem of stations severely over modulating. Well, the very thing I have been warning you about has finally happened. A station has gone off the air because of what they call not being able to cope with the problem of FM being better than AM.

AM can be just as good as FM if the stations on AM would just stop overmodulating and go to AM stereo. If you have never been to Europe I urge you to spend just a week there and hear what a true AM Stereo station is like without the over-modulating that is so prevalent on stations in the United States and Canada. The problem of over-modulation is even worse in Mexico. Before another station is forced off the air, I once again urge each of you to write to either the FCC or the CRTC or both. We are neighboring countries and must cooperate fully with each other if AM broadcasting is not to go out of existence. Our very hobby of AM band DX'ing is about to disappear forever unless we all act now to preserve it once and for all. Get off your rear end and stop DX'ing for just long enough to write a letter to the FCC and the CRTC before it is too late to do anything and you can't DX anymore! Phew - off the soap box. (Albert, I can't agree that "our very hobby of AM band DX'ing is about to disappear". I still feel that economics are the determining factor. ### Some Suggestions to Alleviate AM Band Congestion

Eric Bueneman - 836 Lamplight Lane - Hazelwood, MO 63042-3407

I totally agree with Bill Hale's comments in his DDXD-East column in V-55, #2 of DXN. The finger of blame can be pointed partly at the FCC for allowing the AM band to deteriorate, no thanks to deregulation. In the last five years, AM has lost over half its audience to FM because of this madness. FM pundits like Bruce Elving have put down the senior radio medium for what they think is "virtual technical bankruptcy". The facts are that FM sounds scratchy and very fake, while AM captures as much of the audio signal FM does, but with a much fuller sound. As to my suggestions for alleviating AM band congestion, AM band expansion to 1705 kHz will help solve the problem, but not completely. The long-term solution will be reallocating the 120 meter (2300-2500 kHz and 90 meter (3200-3400 kHz) bands to broadcasting in the U. S. and Canada, with 2500 kHz (WWV/WWVH) being a U. S. Clear channel and 3330 kHz (CHU) being a Canadian Clear channel, as well as 225-240 mHz (FM2). The newly created bands, if approved by the proper authorities, should have a maximum power of 250 kW on 120 and 90 meters (25 to 50 kW for WWV/WWH-2500 and CHU-3330, 1 kW on proposed local channels 2340, 2450, 3230, and 3240), and 316 kW for FM2. The same interference protection rules for 530-1700 kHz should also apply here, with a minimum power of 500 watts, and the Class I, II, and III rules also should apply. Class I's should have the 50 kW limit, Class II's 10 kW maximum, and Class II's limited to 5 kW. A shortwave signal test was made using a Realistic DX-60 and a car antenna driving through downtown St. Louis at night shows that shortwave signals suffer from absolutely no multipath interference, unlike FM signals, and can penetrate through tall buildings, like AM in some cases. Sound quality is comparable to FM, as European AM modulation standards are used. 125% modulation on AM is just too much. On FM, maybe, but not on AM. Please write to the FCC at your earliest convenience, and while you're at it, send a photcopy of your letter to the ITU. Your letter will make a difference.

Also, I must emphasize ownership rules. One company shouldn't own an AM, AM2, AM3, FM, and FM2 station in the same market. Owner ship patterns should be AM/FM (ex: 630 kHz/97.1 mHz), AM/FM2 (ex: 1320 kHz/229.5 mHz), AM2/FM2 (example: 2420 kHz/227.3 mHz), AM3/FM2 (example: 3230 kHz/225.5 mHz), AM2/FM (example: 2370 kHz/95.5 mHz), or AM3/FM (example: 3380 kHz/100.3 mHz). The same company cannot own stations on 600 kHz, 2320 kHz, 3280 kHz, 106.5 mHz, nor 226.7 mHz simultaneously in the same market. Radios should be manufactured to tune continuously 530-1700 kHz, 2300-2500 kHz, 3200-3400 kHz, 88-108 mHz, and 225-240 mHz without a band switch, but with audiophile circuitry (as featured in the Carver TX-lla AM/AM stereo/FM/FM stereo tuner) and all bands capable of receiving stereo. As I have suggested earlier in this Muse, please write to the FCC detailing this proposal, and send a photocopy of your letter to the ITU in Geneva, Switzerland. 73 and good DX. (Eric, you've brought up some good points, but nowhere have you considered the economic practicality of such a plan ... the cost of radios equipped to tune and tune continuously these bands, the ability of a company to make money with only two stations on the air, the PR, etc. My seat-of-the-pants judgment is that the economic liability to both consumer and medium would rule out such a plan, as you've presented it. But it's worth discussion ... any other comments? -pls)

Hi, everyone, here's my first Musing done with my new AT system and Wordstar which I am trying to learn. A million control codes and they tell me Volkswriter is easier, now that I am learning this at last. Hope to become active in accessing some DX'er bulletin boards soon when I get the modem installed. DX-wise, I have the SP-600 going in the cellar with a longwire and check for TA's and have found signals and activity from Europe somewhat reduced from last year, but yet some good occasions of reception. They cycle is definitely upward for

I remember several nights last winter driving around just listening to Kvitsoy-1314 for entertainment with 1310 and 1320 pushed off to the side, on the radio in the car (original Toyota equipment). So far I've heard only a het on 765 10-29 at 6:50 am and again 11-2 at 5:34 am, with a possible signal a few minutes later on 819, but that's more than zip! I had to take a quick trip to LA 10-23 to bring the rest of my junk back, and just before sunrise 10-25 I heard several hets from 700-900 kHz from Kingman, AZ, and the next morning from Moriarty, NM (just east of Albuquerque) even more, from 600-900 kHz. So inland reception of TP's is quite possible. I can recommend the Melody Ranch Motel in Moriarty as a good DX motel, as it is fairly isolated, and they turn off the fluorescent lights after 9 pm!

I also heard what probably was CUFT-530 11-1 11:00 pm, but went to sleep before it

faded in for any talk or ID's. No stereo detected on SRF-A100.

A.- Apparent Tuning Deviations charted here are relatively minor - 7KHz max. (1200 KHz 10/18)- compared to 10 to 15 KHz. Last December which awakened me to this phenomena. Only 3 others reach 4 KHz. deviation on this chart.

B.— Magnetic compass used is 3 feet long, suspended on hylon condeand has once registered 3 1/2 degree horizontal deviation from magnetic north.

C.- Remember that I am right on top of a branch of the New Madrid Fault - about a mile below the surface here.

D.= Automatic 24 hour frequency monitoring and recording, if evera means to do it is found, it will be the answer to accurate continuous stress measurement. Multiple monitoring stations along a fault will indicate probable centers of probable quakes...and perhaps how soon.
