### MEDIUM WAVE ramblings

■ Wsiter Nissen of Silver Spring, Maryland scanned his National Geographic World Atlas to lend a hand with an unID. Although he uses a White's Radio Log for station references, it's good to hear from Silver Spring. From Charles Reh...In the DX/EQUIPMENT TESTS section of DDXD-E in Issue 12. Phil Boersma asked about WYGR [I goofed up CLs-Ed.]-1530 in Wyoming, MI testing after normal hours. Well, here's the FCC regulation concerning ETs:

73.1520 Operation for tests and maintenance


(a) Broadcast stations may be operated for tests and maintenance of their transmitting systems on their assigned frequencies using their licensed operating power and antennas during their authorized hours of operation without specific authorization from the FCC.

(b) Licensees of AM stations may operate for tests and maintenance during the hours from 12 midnight local time to local sunrise, if no interference is caused to other stations maintaining a regular operating schedule within such period. No AM station licensed for daytime or "specified hours" of operation may broadcast any regular or scheduled programs during this period of test and maintenence operation.

(c) Licencees of AM stations may obtain special antenna test authorizations, and operate under the provisions in 73.157, to operate with nighttime facilities during dautime hours in conducting directional antenna field strength and antenna proof of performance measurements.

In short, it is illegal for a daytime station to test after normal operating hours except during the experimental period (local midnight to LSR) unless (here's the loophole) the station is operating under an experimental work assumed by the FCC (as provided for in 73.1510) which specifically states that the station may operate at times other than normal operating hours and/or the experimental period (local midnight to LSR).

■ Steve Francis on Alcoa, Tennessee comments on the 1240 GYDXA list in Issue 13, concerning his record catch of WSBC, Chicago... I have heard WEDC...(the all-nighter and most commonly heard of the three) and submitted it as part of a long list ten or 12 years ago...must have gotten the calls mixed up... before you took it over... DX'ing 'smart', with shared tips and requests by NRC members

The most recent communication in my mailbox is from Jeff Kitze, who has recently joined the NRC, although he has been DXing on different bands for 20 years. Welcome, Jeff! Jeff is currently in Charlottesville, but expects to return to Rochester this spring.



Jeff wonders about DX to the west coast and the mid-west. Along with every DXer that I know he comments, "I've noticed in the past few years that conditions have not been too good due to the large increase of stations on the clear channels." As evidence of this Jeff notes how 640 is now covered by CFGM, ending easy access to KFI in Los Angeles. I also lament the new interference on 640, as KFI was my most consistent west coast reception, always offering the hope that others could one day be heard with enough persistence! Other good possibilities, according to Jeff, were KSL-1160 and KOA-850. These sometimes came through on his car radio while driving around Rochester. KOA used to be an occasional visitor for me, but now that I've started sending reception reports I haven't heard them once in the last five vears!

I remind Jeff and others that congestion actally provides some new opportunities, although we do lose out on long-distance. Last season I was frustrated by the confusion now reigning on 1580 and 1570 kilohertz during the sunset period. I liked the old days, when the daytimers would sign-off in order moving west with sundown. I've returned to these frequencies this winter for another try. Many stations now stay on until 6:00 pm or later, with lower power. There's a lot of hash to sort through, but I've been rewarded with several unusual receptions. The best was WNZT, Columbia PA, heard in December at 6:00 pm, operating with 8-10 watts. Others heard with post-sunset programs include WANB-1580, WCCF-1580, WTTN-1580, WEAM-1580, WYTI-1570, WFEL -1570 and WPMO-1580 (IDs as K-99). The WYTJ OSL shows 486 watts, not 440 as shown in the NRC Log. Sunset sign-offs, in accordance with the old sunset chart, include WPGC-1580, WTCL-1580 and WWDF-1580.

With Jeff's letter we come to the end of the letters that I have received in response to the request for tips and strategies. Your response has been more than I expected, as I originally projected to run this column once per month during the season. Thanks for the support. I welcome whatever you might wish to contribute in the future.

In the late 1950's and 1960's, WPRO-630, Providence, RI, rocketed to the top spot in its ratings. It aired non-stop the latest rock music, quickly building a huge and appreciative audience. Today, with the rock format history, and sharing its talk format with at least five other local broadcasters

on the AM band, WPRO has not moved from its top slot. WPRO's long history and commitment to excellence continues to give it honored guest status in thousands of Massachusetts and Rhode Island homes daily.

WPRO's prominence comes from stimulating local programming, in depth regional and local news and sports reporting....and Walter Leslie Brine, known to generations of WPRO listeners as "Salty Brine". Salty has broadcast behind a WPRO microphone for over 48 years - an incredible feat in an industry which changes announcing staffs or formats almost every time a program director is faced with a "bad book". A most successful morning man, Salty is in countless kitchens and autos from 6am to 9am, with his partner for eleven years, Larry Kruger. Only WTIC-1080's Bob Steele has been on the same station for a longer period of time at least in New England. Although he has "retired" several times in the past years, Bob has broadcast for the 50,000 watt Hartford station for over half a century.

Salty Brine has been an institution in Rhode Island for decades. Generations of families have grown up listening to him. Salty's infectious smile, enthusiasm, friendliness, and sincerity are as obvious on the air as when he is talking with you. The folksy, down to earth personality on the air is the genuine Salty, He is a man who loves life, people, and his job.

This remarkable man took oratory courses at the Staley College of the Spoken Word in Brookline, MA. Ignoring the advice of one teacher who suggested that he go into politics, back in 1941, he bought a stenography machine and began a course in court stenography. While learning how to use the machine, he spent his spare time around Boston radio stations searching for opportunities to read commercials. Here he began his radio career on WMEX-1510, in radio dramas. He quickly moved over to 50,000 watt WNAC-680, where he aired the 9am Sunshine Krispy News, a popular daily dramatization of the day's events, complete with sound effects, an organist, and even a band. (News on the hour was not a staple of radio in those days!).

From WNAC, Salty moved to a staff announcer's job on WESX - 1230, Salem, and then on to WPRO and Rhode Island, in 1942 while still making payments on the stenography machine.

At WPRO, Salty's down to earth delivery and enthusiasm, especially in selling his sponsors' products have kept his ratings high. In an interview with the <u>Providence Journal</u>, he noted that he takes the commercials very seriously, as he empathizes with the fact that they pay for a good persuasive job. His popularity and dedication have earned him a place in the Rhode Island Hall of Fame, in 1979, and back in 1972, his listeners staged a two day celebration of his 30th anniversary of his joining WPRO, at Rocky Point, a popular ocean park.

In 1967, Salty ran for Congress, but his campaign lasted exactly one week. He failed to get the Democratic Party endorsement, which went to elder statesman Robert O. Tiernan. He loves politics, but his many public appearances are not political. He loves being with and helping people, and, if the cause is a good one, he will happily make an appearance promoting the cause.

Salty also loves music. He serves as organist at St. Mary's Church in Narraganset. In the 1940's and 1950's, Salty took singing lessons, but he has never sung commercially.

Salty's dedication to people comes from circumstances in his early life. He grew up in Arlington, MA, where his father, a carpenter, became disabled. Salty's mother began to work to help the family. A month after his dad's injury, Salty was hanging around the Boston and Maine Railroad freight yard, and as kids thought was adventurous in that era, he tried to hop onto a moving freight train. He slipped, and fell under the car, losing a foot.

As he grew up, gradually accepting his impairment, he began to help other amputees. Today he is an inspiration to others who are physically impaired. Many of his appearances are to promote organizations who help impaired persons. Salty has served on the Governor's Conference for Hiring the Handicapped. His first artificial leg was paid for by the Sunshine Clubs, and he has expressed his appreciation by helping many such organizations.

Salty and his wife Mickey have a son, Walter Leslie Brine, Jr., who followed his dad into radio. At a very young age, Walter, Jr. had little turntables and a microphone in the house. He worked in radio at WPRO, and in Maine while attending St. Francis College in Biddeford. Today, he is a WVBF-FM announcer, in Boston.

In the 1960's, Salty also hosted a very popular kids' show on WPRO-TV. "Salty Brine's Shack" aired five nights a week at 5:30pm, much to the glee of thousands of kids who would gather in front of the television set before dinner.

### A salute to sailor of the airwaves

Rhode Islanders turn out to pay tribute to radio's Salty Brine

In 1987, 3000 listeners gathered at the Warwick Music Theatre to celebrate Salty's 45th anniversary on WPRO. In the style of the television show "This is Your Life", many dignitaries from Rhode Island's political and civic circles paraded across the stage to congratulate Salty and tell their favorite "Salty Stories".

WPRO management has demonstrated its affection for Salty. As one enters the WPRO building, the sign "Brine Broadcasting Center" greets each visitor, in a tribute to WPRO's most endearing personality. For decades, Salty's booming, cheerful voice, along with sidekick Larry Kruger, has entertained Southern New England with news, weather, time checks, school closings, and other local items. They are members of thousands of Rhode Island extended families.

### WPRO History.

WPRO signed on the air in 1923 on 630 khz, from studios in the Metropolitan Theatre Building in downtown Providence. Salty tells the story of how, in the early 1940's, he would do a station break, put the network on the air, and sneak down into the 4000 seat theatre to watch the big bands perform. The station was financed by department store owner William Cherry, Sr., and his son, William Cherry, Jr. managed it. As Rhode Island's first radio station, WPRO shared time with the first WPAW, Pawtucket. The first transmitter was on Barrington Parkway (now Wampanoag Trail). The studios moved to the present location in 1939, about six miles southeast of downtown Providence. After the original transmitter was destroyed in the nameless 1938 hurricane with its up to 150 mph winds, two self supported towers were built atop two concrete platforms 800 feet apart, in the salt marshes of the

Barrington River. The 5000 watt signal was - and is - non directional days, and at night, the primary lobe is easterly, to protect WMAL - 630, Washington, DC, WSKQ - 620, Newark, and several Ontario stations.

In the 1940's and 50's, WPRO carried CBS and broadcast mostly network feed such as Arthur Godfrey. The only major local production was Salty's wakeup show. In the late 50's, as the network audience slipped away to television, WPRO switched to a very successful Top 40 format. Cresting the ratings for years, its only significant competition was from cross town rocker WICE - 1290, now WRCP, the US's only Portuguese format station on the AM dial.

In September, 1954, both towers were blown down by Hurricane Carol. WPRO's engineers rushed the station back on the air in three days, by putting up a long wire antenna between three telephone poles. Two new guyed towers, each 290 feet high, were raised on the concrete platforms for the older system. The signal is fed into the array from the station's Harris MW5A transmitter.

WPRO aired Top 40 and then adult contemporary music into early 1989. Successfully being its market's news and information source, the station carries ABC news on the hour, and local and regional news every 30 minutes.

The Brine Broadcasting Center is a two story building. the first floor houses WPRO-FM, a contemporary hits station, and the transmitter room. WPRO's AM headquarters is upstairs, with a control room, plus production room, news and sports offices, and studios, and the traffic offices.

After Salty Brine's show, long time local talk show host Sherman Strickhauser tackles issues of interest to the region. His lively show is deluged with calls from a dedicated group of listeners.

WPRO also features sports, a commitment which translates into airing Boston Red Sox games, Providence College basketball, and CBS sports. Each evening from 6:00pm to 8:00pm, Chuch Wilson's sports talk show commands a 10% share, and Chuck's knowledge and enthusiasm prompts hundreds of armchair experts to trade opinions with him over the air. ABC talk is broadcast at night.

Right on, Roger Winsor - I think you have hit the nail right on the head as to why there is so little support for Musings in these latter days. Editor Al Muick asks "Then what is the purpose of DXDD-E/W and foreign? (deja vu!!--ajm). DXDD, then known as "DX Down the Dial," was established as a column to publicize "hot" tips on when a certain station might be logged - like a 1:05am sign-off, or a 5:55am sign-on, for example - when said station might be clear of most others for a few moments. It was designed to help members log new stations, to contain tips on otherwise hard-to-hear DX catches - not as a listing of all one's DX for the past couple of weeks. (I would like the DXDD editors to comment on this issue as soon as possible, please..ajm) Those day by day catches were set forth in Musings. Reading Musings a few years ago was like receiving 20 to 25 to 30 letters from other DXers, telling of their latest accomplishments. Some members had private friendly rivalries or races with others in the same general vicinity, and it was fascinating to pick up DX NEWS, and read what those fellows had heard over the last few days. All that clubbiness and cameraderie are gone under the present system, which, let's face it, is a carbon copy of the IRCA policy. For example, it doesn't help a DXer one iota in DXDD to mention "This is my 18th catch on this frequency." But some who report to that column list the names of sponsors and DJs, and give enough information there for a dishonest DXer to write for a verie - and get it! I know you wouldn't do that - but there have been others in the past who have. One even did it just to prove it could be done - obtain a verie without ever having heard the station in question, just from info contained in DXDD. Not everybody is as honest as Abraham Lincoln!.... I now have my two Hammarlunds hooked up to the SM-2 and working, but once again, I'm being troubled by a terrible buzz or perhaps, buzzes. I traced one down to a store 1 1/2 blocks from me, but there is another not quite as strong, coming from somewhere else, and it is not from that high-intensity lamp that ruined all twilight DX for me last year in the house across the street. It's been just too cold to go around with the portable Superradio to track it down. What was for 13 years a great DX spot has done a 180 degree about face of late. Reports out so far this season to 13 AM stations, with ONE verie back; WYST-1010-TEST. Forward - March!

DAN K. PHILLIPS, N4NU, 109 Breckenridge Road, Franklin, TN 37064 It has been a real long time since I have mused. I have just rejoined for the 32nd year. Began DXing in 1958. I have been enjoying the NRC Ham Net for the last few months. It meets on Sunday Night from approximately 8pm to midnight. We would welcome other NRC members. The frequency is 3.84 MHz and some of the call letters that you should listen for are N4PGE, K8GVU, WB4ATX, N8IRL, KK4FV, K4RUC, KB9IV, N4NU, and K4QDE. The reason it is important to kow the calls is that sometimes DX is not the main topic and one would not know if it is the right bunch. In renewing my membership, I could not find the cost of membership in the bulletin. It would be helpful to add this. In reference to the Musings section. There seems to be some misunderstanding of the historical nature of this section. For over thirty years it was the main place for listing DX catches. The question has arisen "but why have DDXD?" The reason for DDXD, which by the way was called DX Down the Dial, was to list "last minute catches" heard by DXers. It had a much later deadline, thus allowing last minute tips to surface. These catches stoof out when they were in this column. Now, no catches stand out above others

I am a fairly conservative-middle-of-the-road type of person, willing to listen to anyone's point of view on a subject, evaluate it, and then make a decision based on my experiences and values. My training as an educator has taught me that there are indeed times when more than one solution to a problem is possible and that it is always useful to listen to divergent points of view. 

I'm back in the MW DX hobby after about a 10 year absence caused by marriage and family-raising responsibilities, plus being seduced by scanner and Sw utility listening. But seen the error of my ways, and have returned to the most satisfying form of DXing in the world! My QTH is about 17 miles NE of Cleveland and 3 miles S of Lake Erie. Local WELW-1330 is not really much of a pest, their towers are about 1 1/2 miles due north o me, and I think they direct most of their pattern due N. In fact, the Cleveland stations are less trouble than CKLW-800 and WJR-760 as far as keeping me from "wanted" DX. Some of the Canadian stations across the lake seem to splatter much worse than US stations of comparable distance and power. Equipment is a Drake R7A, JRD NRD-515, Palomar loop, and 60' lw. I used to have an HQ-180A but foolishly dumped it when I lost interest in MW After going through an FRG-7700, IC-R71A, and NRD-525, I had the good fortune of coming across a used R7A and 515 last year. Both of them are superb. I like the 515 for general bandscanning, and for freqs without a lot of adjacent channel splatter. The 515's AGC seems to be a bit more pleasing to the ear. But for tough catches with a lot of splatter nearby, the R7A beats the 515 hands down. If I had to choose, I'd keep the R7A. In my opinion it even beats the HQ-180A. 681 stations have been heard so far from the Cleveland area, including 41 states, 30 countries, and 3 continents. Farthest DX is Monaco-1466. I still need WA, ID, MT, NV, NM, ME, NH, VT, AK, and HI. Provinces needed are NF, NS, BC, YT, NWT. Boy, things sure have changed on mediumwave in the last 10 years. Has the FCC turned into a sardine cannery? What is this? I thought everyone was listening to FM nowadays! The QRM is much worse than it was 10 years ago. Oh well, it just makes a good catch all the more satisfying. Does anyone know where I can get a Sanserino loop? Radio West doesn't sell them anymore. Does anyone know if the excellent Night Pattern Book will be revived sometime in the future? (although it would probably take one of NSA's supercomputers to keep up with all the station changes!) I'm probably exceeding the limit (no way!--ajm), so I'll s/off for now.
