Station Test Calendar

KXTO NV 1550 July 1-15 0300-0700

KXTO-1550 ... Reno, NV will conduct DX tests each morning July 1 until July 15th from 0300-0700 ELT. The tests will include Morse Code ID's, sweep tones, and QRSS (Slow-speed Morse Code ID's). Les Rayburn stated: "You can attempt to detect the QRSS signal using only your radio, computer soundcard and some free spectrum analysis software from www.weaksignals.com. Download the software called 'Argo'."

More from Les: "For those who wish to experiment with receiving QRSS (slow speed Morse Code) transmissions prior to the KXTO Test, Brandon Jordan, who runs the very informative www.dxtests.info web site, has posted a sample file that will closely match the actual file for the test. It's available at: http://www.dxtests.info/_files/KXTO_10_Minute_File.wav. Keep in mind, that what you're really looking at is a audio frequency spectrum analyzer, not RF. You're feeding an audio signal from your radio (headphone jack, or other output) into one of the inputs on your computer soundcard (mic, Line, etc.) and then viewing what that audio looks like. Using this technique it's possible to detect slow speed Morse Code signals well below the noise, sometimes as much as -20db! Using this technique, world wide reception of the KXTO DX test may be possible."

Each wire is connected to the tower base on unipole antennas or the grounding ring on series fed antenna and is to rise at an angle of approximately 30 degrees to a support post. It then extends horizontally to another post at which it is terminated. It should be noted that intermediate poles may be required to keep the span between poles less than 80 or 90 feet. The wire must be insulated for its entire length other than where it is connected to the tower or ATU [Antenna Tuning Unit] ground."

HEAR AND THAR

- If you are one of the few who haven't heard that the **FCC has approved AM IBOC at night . . . well, they have.** It was announced on May 31st and will become effective on or about 15 July.
- Reported to have returned to the air: **WTOT-980 Marianna, Florida**, and **WFRL-1570 Freeport, Illinois** after being off for a couple of weeks while they replaced their transmitter.
- Gone silent: **KBRT-740 Avalon, California** due to the fires on Catalina Island off the Southern California coast; **WOWZ-1290 Appomattox, Virginia**; and **WDSK-1410 Cleveland, Mississippi**.
- Richard E. Wood** of Keaau, Hawaii reports **KHNR** remains silent, not hearing them on either 870 or 880 kHz.
- FINES: WCGA-1100 Woodbine, Georgia: \$11,000** for failure to file their renewal application in

a timely manner and subsequent unauthorized operation; **WDSK-1410 Cleveland, Mississippi: \$7000** for failure to enclose their tower base within an effective locked fence; **KUPI-980 Ammon, Idaho: \$4200** for failure to enclose the base of their tower in an effective locked fence; and **WQST-850 Forest, Mississippi: \$3000** for failure to file their renewal application in a timely manner.

□ The Mexican government has proposed allowing stations along the country's northern border to voluntarily begin broadcasting with HD Radio technology. The proposal applies to stations located within 200 miles of the border, according to IBOC developer Ibiquity Digital. There are 80 FM stations and 120 AM stations in this border area. Ibiquity believes that 15 may be on the air by the end of the year, Ibiquity told **Radio World**.



DDXD-West

FROM THE VAST WESTLAND

- ▲ The wheels of government move slowly, but, unfortunately in this case, they do move. The FCC's rules governing IBOC, first adopted on 3/22 (see DDXD-W #74-24), were released by the FCC on 5/31. Included in these rules is a provision allowing nighttime IBOC. The entire report can be found on the Web at http://hraunfoss.fcc.gov/edocs_public/attachmatch/FCC-07-33A1.doc, and the paragraphs pertaining to nighttime IBOC are #'s 89-90. The release of these rules is not the final step in implementing them. The rules must first be published in the Federal Register, and will not take effect until 30 days after publication date. The good news is that as of this column's deadline of 6/8 they have not been published, meaning the July DDXD-W deadline (7/6) will come and pass without the startup of nighttime IBOC. The bad news is that it is probably only a matter of days until they are published. By the time you receive July's snail mail edition 7/16, we DXers may already be dealing with the early-stage damage that this technology could cause our hobby.
- ▲ Since it will be in our past by the time the July DXN is published, here is a reminder of a great **Vast Westland** DX opportunity. KXTO 1550 Reno NV will run a rare summer DX test nightly from 7/1 to 7/15, and you can find details on the front page of DXN #74-26. The intriguing part of this test: although power from 7/1 to 7/13 will be only 96 watts, on 7/14 and 7/15 the test will be run at the full 2500 watts non-directional! Be sure to fire up the receiver and clamp on the earphones for this rare-state test.
- ▲ As is usual during this time of year, your faithful Editor's desk is a lonely place. All the more reason to take the time to thank those who contributed to this month's column-- Thank You! I usually direct my attention elsewhere this time of year, but this past month I have been hitting the AM dial hard. I am glad I did, as the result is five new ones, four of which you will see here and one in IDXD. I hope that you will join me this next reporting period, both in listening and sending in your logs.

More from Moore (May 31): This is the season for down-under (DU) here in Florida. But this morning there were a number of stations I have never heard before at this time of year. 1575 kHz was in at a 4 on the Bryant scale. I have logged Thailand many times in Dec/Jan but never a peep after Feb. In Dec this past season I heard a carrier on 1467 kHz when 1575 was coming in and assumed it might be the Thailand station listed in PAL. This morning nothing on 1467 but a good 3/4 carrier on 1476 which had never been heard before. 1566 was in at a 1 and 1557 in at a 2. Best DU station was 1503 at a 4 assumed New Zealand heard often in the past. 738 had a good carrier at 3.

TP's have been peaking sharply right around local sunrise (1046Z today). A total of 13 TP carriers were noted in my run down the band but the opening was so short I can't park on any frequency and still check all my channels. Maybe you could alert some of the other west coast DXers to check the conditions out there. I'd be interested in the results.

I'm getting too lazy to go out into the shop to listen every morning and now have my portable DX station sitting on my desk in the living room. It consists of a much modified 2010 with special 2.5 kHz Kiwa filter feeding a SUPER SCAF audio filter. Antenna is my 23-inch spiral loop with no preamp.

National Radio Club and WTFDA Club in a Joint Convention

Here are details of what is planned for the 2007 National Radio Club Convention. First of all, we are holding a joint convention with the Worldwide TV-FM DX Association, the WTFDA. And they will be hosting this first joint venture in Boise, Idaho over the Labor Day weekend, with Frank Aden as the Master of Ceremonies. Some of you may know Frank as a pre-eminent historian of Idaho broadcasting, both radio and TV.

Now, those of us who have attended NRC Conventions have always paid a large registration fee that included a banquet on Saturday night. This year, at Frank's suggestion, we are not including the price of ANY meal in the registration fee. This keeps the registraton cost low and lets each attendee select each meal, and where to eat.

This Rodeway Inn hotel has been used in years past for radio conventions so we know it will have just the amenities we need, and if the weather cooperates, there is a large area around their outdoor pool that should be a great place to tune for stations you've only ever dreamed of hearing from your east-coast or mid-west home.

The program will begin on Friday morning around 11 o'clock with a tour of a Boise television station, and Frank has arranged it so the group can sit in and watch how their noon newscast is put together and broadcast. Friday night, Frank is going to speak on the history of Idaho's earliest radio and TV stations.

Saturday will be filled with a tour of the local radio transmitting sites around Boise for those who want to see where the signals are coming from. For others, the hotel meeting room will be open for musing and swapping stories or demonstrating what you have brought with you to the convention. In the evening after dinner, we will hear about how our two clubs are doing. Frank Aden will present some video about the DuMont Television Network, and that will be followed by the annual auction.

Sunday will include the annual "Candy Quiz" for the early risers, followed by the annual "National Radio Club Examination" for those who wish to compete for a free full-year's membership in the NRC. There should be time for a visit to 7100-foot Deer Point where the Boise FM and TV transmitters are located in the hills just outside of town.

Sounds pretty good, right? Well, here's what to do:

1. Call the Rodeway Inn (Rodeway Inn, 1115 N. Curtis Road, Boise, ID 83706)now at 208-376-2700 for your room reservations. Be sure to tell them you will be attending the National Radio Club convention. Remember that the program events start Friday morning, August 31, and the convention winds up after lunch on Sunday, September 2. You can stay longer, of course, but I know many people like to beat the Labor Day traffic rush on Monday. The room rate, including tax, for one person is \$67.75 -- but the great news is that two can stay in the same room for exactly that same total price! And a third person can be in the room for only an additional \$8; \$20.34 if you want a roll-away bed. So three people could split a room for less than \$30 a night if you want to make those arrangements.

MOST important: You **MUST** make your room reservation by August 15. We will be checking with the Rodeway Inn that day to make final plans for the weekend.

2. You should also send in the Convention Registration payment by August 15. Be sure to include your name, mailing address, a phone number and your e-mail address if you have one. We need all those things so we can notify you of any last-minute change in the plans. The Registration fee is \$15, and if you're bringing a spouse, the spouse will only be charged \$10! Children get in free.
