**75 YEARS AGO** – From the November 16, 1937 issue of *DX News* – KVOX Moorhead, Minn. (1500 kc/s) expects to begin broadcasting on Thanksgiving Day; new member Boris Kozel of Cleveland will be the Amateur Editor for the NRC; three television stations are expected to go on the air in Germany in 1938.

**50 YEARS AGO** – From the November 17, 1962 issue of *DX News* – Henry Tyndall, Jr. of Burlington, Vermont reached 6,000 verifications after 39 years of DXing; Roy Millar reports hearing only CMCA, KINY, XENL, and CMBQ and asks “What’s wrong with this season?” and Ben Dangerfield says good reception conditions are back after the two worst weeks he’s yet recorded, logging Tunisia-962 for country #61.

**25 YEARS AGO** – From the November 16, 1987 issue of *DX News* – New stations WWLX-590 Lawrenceburg TN and KHTH-1130 Dillon CO are now on the air; Tony Fitzherbert’s “Station Profiles” column focused on WKRP-1500 Dallas GA.

**10 YEARS AGO** – From the November 18, 2002 issue of *DX News* – IDX'D included a lengthy report on changes to Mexican stations by John Callarman, based on his monitoring during a trip to the Rio Grande Valley on October 25-27.

1060 WCOK NC **Sparta** – Applies for license to cover CP for D1 1100.  
1250 KZDC TX **San Antonio** – Applies for program test authority to use CP for U4 25000/920.  
1340 WMHZ AL **Holt** – CP for new station applies for license to cover; should be testing soon.

## APPLICATION TO AMEND CP

1550 KDCO CO **Golden** – CP for new station (for U2 5000/250) applies for U2 990/480 from a different site (39-53-31/105-14-20).

## COORDINATE ADJUSTMENTS

560 KBLU AZ **Yuma** – CP to adjust coordinates to 32-43-24/114-38-34 now fully licensed.  
1080 KGVY AZ **Green Valley** – Granted CP to adjust coordinates to 31-55-45/110-59-47.  
1420 WIMS IN **Michigan City** – Granted CP to adjust coordinates to 41-40-40/86-56-10.

Writes to ask – what's up with these coordinate adjustments? Well, if a station discovers that its licensed coordinates are off by more than 3 seconds, they have to go through the full construction permit process – application, construction permit, then a "license to cover" with all the testing that requires – to relicense at the correct coordinates, even if no "construction" is involved. Smaller changes just appear unannounced in the FCC database.

So where do the changes come from? I asked Musings editor Dave Schmidt, who notes that with GPS devices it's much easier than it used to be to accurately calculate one's coordinates. In his engineering days, he discovered some real whoppers of errors in station licenses. Also, because the earth is not perfectly spherical, there are multiple methodologies for accounting for this. The FCC still uses the "NAD-27" methodology, even as most of the U.S. government (and GPS systems) have moved to the "NAD-83" methodology. ## SPECIAL TEMPORARY AUTHORITY

570 WMCA NY **New York** – Granted STA to be silent and then to operate at reduced power; transmitter was destroyed in Hurricane Sandy and a new one has been ordered.  
900 WNMB SC **North Myrtle Beach** – Requests STA to operate without two employees during business hours; one co-owner died suddenly and the other co-owner, his wife, is grieving, and so this "mom and pop" station can't follow the rules for now.  
960 WDLM IL **East Moline** – Granted STA for U1 500/102 during antenna work.  
970 WNYM NJ **Hackensack** – Granted STA to operate night transmitter at lower power 24 hours; transmitter site flooded in Hurricane Sandy and day transmitter is inoperable.

Also extensions were granted for these STAs: KFXD-630 (Boise ID) for minor pattern variance; WENR-1090 (Englewood TN) for D1 300 from a temporary longwire antenna; WINK-1200 (Pine Island Center FL) for U4 50000/2200 to overcome Cuban interference; KOLT-1320 (Scottsbluff NE) for U1 1000/1000; WFNN-1330 (Erie PA) for "reduced power" (unspecified); WWCL-1440 (Lehigh Acres FL) for U4 9900/4700 to overcome Cuban interference (first granted in 1989); and WALG-1590 (Albany GA) for U1 "reduced power" (probably U1 1250/200).

Also these requests were filed to extend existing STAs: KJCB-770 (Lafayette LA) to use longwire antenna at temporary site; WAXY-790 (South Miami FL) with U4 25000/25000 to overcome Cuban interference (has existed since 1981); KTRB-860 (San Francisco CA) with U1 50000/5000 from the day site (generator problems at night site); WHIM-1080 (Coral Gables FL) with U4 50000/20000 to overcome Cuban interference (since 1989); WSRQ-1220 (Sarasota FL) with U1 150/150 at temporary

site; KYPA-1230 (Los Angeles CA) with U1 681/681 at the CP site; WKDM-1380 (New York NY) and WWRU-1660 (Jersey City NJ) to operate with CPs even though final tests can't be completed.

**1360 WHNR FL Cypress Gardens** – Was off the air from 10/23 to 10/25 but is back on.

### NORTH OF THE BORDER

- 750 CBFA-3 QC Weymontachie** – Granted request to relay CBFQ-103.5 Chiasibi QC (instead of CBF-95.1 Montreal), still CBC French "Première Chaîne" but also with 12 hours of local aboriginal programming in Cree and Inuktitut.
- 1230 CFFB NU Iqaluit** – Granted 50-watt relays in Inukjuak, Kuujuaq, Kuujuarapik, Puvirnituk, and Salluit (all QC) on 103.5 MHz FM; these to replace "CKCX-SW" (CBC Radio North on 9625 kHz) which was to sign off permanently on November 1 (but reportedly still on the air as of 11/2 by GH and others).
- 1550 CBEF ON Windsor** – Per DDXD reports this issue, CBEF is on the air testing here (and still on 540 kHz too for the time being; will move to 1550 permanently).

## NOAA Space Weather Outlook

Issued October 29 – For the period October 29-November 24, 2012

Solar activity is expected to be low during the period with a slight chance for M-class flares during 29 October - 02 November and 15 - 24 November.

No proton events are expected at geosynchronous orbit.

The greater than 2 MeV electron flux at geosynchronous orbit is expected to be at normal to moderate levels during 29 October – 04 November. High flux levels are expected during 05 - 24 November.

Geomagnetic field activity is expected to be at quiet levels during 29 - 30 October. An increase to quiet to unsettled levels is expected late on 31 October, with a chance for active levels, due to the arrival of the coronal mass ejections (CMEs) observed on 27 October. A further increase to active levels is expected on 01 November, with a chance for minor storm periods, as CME effects continue. Field activity is expected to decrease to unsettled to active levels on 02 November as CME effects gradually subside and a coronal hole high-speed stream (CH HSS) begins to disturb the field. Activity is expected to decrease to quiet to unsettled levels on 03 November as CH HSS effects subside. Quiet conditions are expected during 04 - 07 November. An increase to unsettled levels is predicted for 08 November, due to a solar sector boundary crossing followed by a co-rotating interaction region in advance of a CH HSS. A further increase to active levels is expected on 09 November, with a chance for minor storm periods, due to a CH HSS. Activity is expected to decrease to quiet to active levels on 10 November as CH HSS effects subside. Quiet levels are expected during 11 - 24 November. ## DX Loggings

- 529 "LYQ" TN** Manchester – 10/31 0138 – "LYQ" beacon ID repeated in Morse, copyable aside Cuba 530. Capt. David Frantz, Chief Pilot of ATC, notified me that this had just been reactivated as backup to their ILS due to night flights. It's at the WWRB site, Manchester TN, and reports are welcome via the WWRB website (GH-OK)  
**530 CIAO ON** Brampton – 10/21 2200 – Fair, over Cuba's Radio Encyclopedia with start of ID: "This is Ciao (pronounced "chow")..." then lost to splatter from KWMT/CBK. First heard from Iowa City back on 1/10/1995, and I struggled a lot back then over whether or not to count this as a new logging since all it essentially did was take over CJFT's spot on the dial. After giving it much thought, I finally did. (RD-IA)  
**560 WIND IL** Chicago – 10/28 1903 – Poor, way under KWTO, only able to get CL with other talk earlier and later unintelligible, faded completely out soon after. Both their day and night pattern send some signal in our direction. Rare; only second time here in 26 years. (JE-MO)  
**600 KSJB ND** Jamestown – 10/25 2335 – Fair-good signal mixing at times with KOGO, others. IDs: "You're where you need to be, KSJB" and "Classic country KSJB," country/western music. (CK-AZ1)  
**680 WOGO WI** Hallie – 11/2 0800 – Fair to good with local political ad "dissing" Madison & Milwaukee, then call ID. Big surprise! (DS-TN1)  
**710 WFCM TN** Smyrna – 10/31 0902 – Good with preacher // FM 91.7 (had to go to car to get FM parallel, a new FM station in Kentucky was clobbering it on the home

radio). Probably the first time I've made a new FM catch as the result of an AM relog (grin!) **(DS-TN)**

- 740 KTRH TX **Houston** – 10/26, 2055 – In with *Mark Levin Show*, promo for upcoming program, ad for David Taylor GMC Truck Center, upcoming job fair by Chevron, KTRH news after TOH ID and traffic report. Fair with fades. **(RV-TX)**
- 760 KKZN CO **Thornton** – 10/28 2003 – Good signal. End of CBS news, traffic report mentioning “C470” and “I-25 at the Broadway exit,” weather forecast for Denver and vicinity (high 59 degrees), slogan-ID: “7-60 Colorado’s Progressive Talk,” program called *Ring of Fire*. QRM from ongoing 620-KTAR overmodulation/technical problems/spurs. **(CK-AZ)**
- 830 WQZQ TN **Goodlettsville** – 10/31 0901 – Very good with B:GOS // FM 101.9. **(DS-TN)**
- 910 WFDF MI **Farmington Hills** – 10/30 1945 – Good at times with Radio Disney. Presumably this one and not Salt Lake City. **(DS-TN)**
- 930 KSDN SD **Aberdeen** – 10/29 2159 – Fair, moderate QRM, with an ad or PSA just ending into legal ID and then ABC news, lead story on Hurricane Sandy. NEW! **(BD-WI)**
- 960 KGWA OK **Enid** – 10/26 0100-0105 – Another dead air Fox-hole from KGWA Enid, during which nulling its strong local carrier, I hear mostly blues music dominating, presumed WABG Greenwood MS; at 0103, 800-299-8255 phone number probably during a break in ABC news from WERC or KMA. Any phone number ending in 8255 means “TALK,” i.e. for call-ins. I find it amazing how unhelpful the dozens of reverse-phone number lookup sites are. About 15 sec before KGWA blasts back on at 0105 with a local ad, the understation starts a political ad with a black accent, probably WABG, but can't copy any clue 10/27 at 0100-0501 tonight's KGWA Fox-hole jumble is mainly occupied by a Mexican song; one ear on this and the other on 6899.4 pirate 10/28 0100 (0500 UT) KGWA maintains modulation with sports scores, running late this Saturday night, so no Fox hole. 10/29 0100 KGWA dead air is filled when nulled by pileup of other stations making heavy SAHs, but heard at first atop is definite Spanish, “Qué tal, amigos otro --- musical.” Null on this one fits for XEK Nuevo Laredo. Then I am hearing blues music, especially shrill harmonica at 0103, presumed WABG in Mississippi 10/30 0100 KGWA fails to quit modulation so no understation DX tonight. 10/31 0100 KGWA Enid fails for the second night in a row to unmodulate, so not audiblizing understation DX. We have high hopes they will resume doing so unpredictably. 11/1 0100 KGWA dead air again, but I can't DX it tonight with CBCNQ Sackville about to close down (not). **(GH-OK)**
- 980 CFPL ON **London** – 10/21 1951 – Atop with ad for California Spa & Fitness located on Exeter Road in London, then “AM 980” ID. Not heard from Iowa City since the early 1990s! **(RD-IA)**

- 1020 KCKN NM **Roswell** – 10/26 2055 – Noted with SS:REL; TOH ID consisted of a series of stations in the Radio Visión Cristiana network. Per FCC AM Query, the owner is Radio Visión Cristiana Subsidiary. **(RV-TX)**
- 1050 WNES KY **Central City** – 11/1 1026 – Faded out of the mess just in time for an ID “ESPN WNES 1050.” **(DS-TN1)**
- 1100 WZFG MN **Dilworth** – 10/21 1905 – Good in WTAM null with “AM 1100 The Flag” ID, then into pre-recorded Fargo-Moorhead weather forecast. First new Minnesota AM logging here since WKLK-1230 on 2/5/2001. **(RD-IA)**
- 1100 KDRY TX **Alamo Heights** – 10/26 2057 – Religious stand-up comedy program is the only way I can describe it, promo for program *The Active Word* by male “... right here on AM eleven-hundred, KDRY.” After that came the TOH ID “... KDRY, Alamo Heights-San Antonio ...” Mixing with KFNX-AZ. **(RV-TX)**
- 1120 KMOX MO **St. Louis** – 10/27 2339 – Poor-fair with ad for a water supplier, ID: “Your musical highway, Route 66 on KMOX,” into program of talk and oldies music, several more call letter IDs heard. KANN nulled. **(CK-AZ1)**

- 1120 KEOR OK **Catoosa** – 10/26 1457 – Banda music, 1500 segué with no ID. We have never heard them ID in latest reactivation. 1517 recheck off the air, or maybe carrier is still on; hard to tell on caradio. 1539 on receiver with BFO, carrier is definitely off. Nothing heard around 0900 or 1300 on Oct 27. 10/26 0847 – Spanish language vocal music, with no announcements or other identifying “talk” between selections. Quick check of 1120 this morning 10/27 shows no OC from presumed KEOR, only a faint KMOX. 10/28 1550 – Back on with continuous Mexican music, well audible via car radio on another expedition north of Enid to Squirrel Haven; however, asphalt portions of US 81/64/60 where we are simultaneously northbound, westbound and eastbound, produce heavy tire static, while concrete portions much less so. I stop at a pulloff by a cell tower with no visible means of electrical support; power lines are polder, but on other side of highway. Do these things run on batteries or own generators even when power lines are handy? At least they put out no RFI on MW. - 1150 KAGO OR **Klamath Falls** – 10/26 0006 – Way down in jumble, caught clear call letter ID by man. **(CK-AZ1)**
- 1160 KCTO MO **Cleveland** – 10/21 1924 – Very good with talk in SS, local ads, 816 area code number in spot for auto body shop. **(RD-IA)**
- 1170 KREL CO **Colorado Springs** – 10/29 1959 – Fair with moderate unID’ed QRM, with “The White Tail Minute” (news about the White Tail school district), legal ID into AP news with the lead story on Hurricane Sandy. Needed call change, ex-KKKK. **(BD-WI)** *Is the frequency right? KREL is on 1580 – DY.*
- 1180 KZOT NE **Bellevue** – 10/18, 2049 – Mixing with unID XE with a station promo “... Thursday nights at 7, here on 1180 Zone 2 The Deuce” and into sports programming; couldn’t ID the network. Poor and did not last long above the mix. Needed CL change here for me. **(RV-TX)**
- 1190 CFSL SK **Weyburn** – 11/1 2302 – Out of C&W, “Playing today’s hits and all your country favorites AM 1190,” atop the channel. Haven’t heard a call ID from this in years! **(WH-CO)**
- 1210 KUNF UT **Washington** – 10/14 0958 – In with ESPN programming, ads by Washington County businesses followed by ID “... ESPN; KUNF, Washington-St. George ...,” then back to ESPN. Poor in mix. **(RV-TX)**
- 1220 WFKN KY **Franklin** – 10/31 0859 – Good, “WFKN Franklin Weather Forecast.” **(DS-TN)**
- 1220 KMVL TX **Madisonville** – 10/21 0725 – Mixing with XEB-DF, with program ‘Insight For Living’ then ‘Living The Country Life’ short spot; ID by male at BOH “Our time is 6:30 here at KMVL ...,” then ‘Focus on the Family.’ Station was slightly off-frequency had to zero-beat it at 1219.889 kHz. TX #100 from this location. **(RV-TX)**
- 1230 KGRO TX **Pampa** – 10/27 2059 – Came up and tucked itself in right after fading KRSY-NM ID with “KGRO, Pampa” ID by male and into ABC news. **(RV-TX)**
- 1240 KCLV NM **Clovis** – 10/30 2059 – Fadeup with ad then ID announcement: “News first, then talk ... Talk 12-40, KCLV,” and into ABC news. **(RV-TX)**
- 1250 KBRF MN **Fergus Falls** – 10/31 2300 – Up over the pack (mostly KYYS) call ID and SRN News. **(WH-CO)**
- 1250 KIKC MT **Forsyth** – 10/31 1900 – Out of C&W, “Bringing Classic Country to southeastern Montana, we are KIKZ 1250 AM Forsyth- Miles City,” to CBS News. **(WH-CO)**
- 1260 KTRC NM **Santa Fe** – 10/26 0031 – Poor-fair in mess with ad for “Heritage For The Blind,” call letter ID with mention of “Santa Fe.” **(CK-AZ1)**



- 1270 KDJI AZ **Holbrook** – 10/28 1000 – Out of program note “Your Choice for News and Talk, we are White Mountain Radio 970 KVWM Show Low and 1270 KDJI Holbrook” to Fox News **(WH-CO)**
- 1270 KBZZ NV **Sparks** – 10/27 2100 – Out of spots, “KBZZ Reno-Sparks The Buzz AM 1270” into FSR. This one is new for me and taped! **(WH-CO)**
- 1270 WQKR TN **Portland** – 10/31 0858 – Fair with ad for funeral home with Franklin KY and Portland locations **(DS-TN)**
- 1280 KZNS UT **Salt Lake City** – 10/31 2258 – Fair signal at times, trading places with a station in Spanish. Two local ads both with “801” area code, PSA for “Utahblood.org” (organizing your own blood drive), missed legal ID, into Utah Jazz Basketball. Presumed. Local KXEG nulled. **(CK-AZ1)**
- 1290 KCUB AZ **Tucson** – 10/31 0700 – Faded up at ToH “... Sports KCUB Tucson Arizona” into Fox Sports GOOO! Not often noted here. **(WH-CO)**
- 1290 KOUU ID **Pocatello** – 10/31 1000 – Up over KMMM, “This is KOUU ... Pocatello ... Falls.” Mixed with the remnants of KMMM. **(WH-CO)**
- 1290 KMMM KS **Pratt** – 10/31 0900 – Out of OLD, “AM 1290 KMMM Pratt” to Fox News. **(WH-CO)**
- 1290 KOIL NE **Omaha** – 10/30 2105 – Out of network news “... on the Mighty 1290 Coil ....” This had never hit my Colorado log as KOIL and taped as a call change. Verified in the 60’s from WNY. **(WH-CO)**
- 1290 WHIO OH **Dayton** – 10/28 1849 – Good and in the clear with car ad, weather, CL, then into Kim Komando. Night pattern has a minor lobe in our direction. New! **(JE-MO)**
- 1290 KIVY TX **Crockett** – 10/31 0400 – Out of “Till There Was You” then “Stay tuned for another hour of America’s Best Music right here on AM 1290 KIVY Crockett Texas” and ABC News. **(WH-CO)**
- 1290 CFRW MB **Winnipeg** – 10/30 2259 – Out of furniture store spot mentioning Winnipeg “CFRW Winnipeg” call ID, briefly above KOIL. **(WH-CO)**
- 1340 WNBS KY **Murray** – 10/31 0931 – Fair, reading Trading Post items exactly as they appear on 1340wnbs.com. Trying for WBGW which was probably the sports station underneath. **(DS-TN)**
- 1380 KHEY TX **El Paso** – 11/1 0011 – Mostly good signal over KLPZ with non-ID: “We are Fox Sportsradio 13-80,” several network ads, “foxsportsradio1380.com” promo (brought up KHEY’s site), mentioned “El Paso.” **(CK-AZ1)**

This IDs my unID of 10/15 at same time. Network info that it’s functional M-F only obviously outdated, as this was Saturday **(GH-OK)**
- 1450 KQYX KS **Galena** – 10/25 2259 – Atop with conclusion of Jasper Eagles vs. McAuley Catholic Warriors high school football, ID as “1450 The Score”, then ad for business that had locations in Webb City, Carthage, and Lamar. First new AM logging from South Omaha in over 4 1/2 months. **(RD-NE)**
- 1540 KNGL KS **McPherson** – 10/28 1602 – On car radio a bit N of Enid, dominant station has ABC news, 2005 ID as “Talk Radio 1540 KNGL,” gratuitous anti-liberal promo, Mike Gallagher Show promo or start. This is 250 watts in McPherson KS, not yet overridden by KXEL skywave. **(GH-OK)**
- 1550 CBEF ON **Windsor** – 11/1 1915 – Good solid signals dominating the frequency with French talk and music. I checked the internet stream and it is them for sure. Also big thanks to Robert Ross for confirming them now here testing. I suppose that means that 540 will be freed up in the next while. NEW! Nice way to start a month off. Must be winter – good DX and I have to put on the snow tires tomorrow! **(SA-MB)**
- 1560 KGOW TX **Bellaire** – 10/22 0748 – LOUD with ad for Texas Citizens Bank, then back into programming from Yahoo Sports Radio. No sign of WPAD at all. **(RD-IA)**
- 1580 KMIK AZ **Tempe** – 10/29 2000 – Out of local spots and spots, a rarity on a Radio Disney station. “KMIK and KMIK HD Tempe Phoenix.” **(WH-CO)**
- 1590 WDBL TN **Springfield** – 10/31 0852 – VERY strong with *Laura Ingraham Show*. Four other 1590 stations carry this but none closer than Maryland. **(DS-TN)**



- 1610 CHHA ON **Toronto** – 10/22 0217 – Atop with 416 area code number heard in SS ad for local family services agency. **(RD-IA)**
- 1630 KCJJ IA **Iowa City** – 10/21 0720 – Fair with The Buckingham's "Kind Of A Drag," then "the Mighty 1630 KCJJ" ID heard in chatter from DJ Billy Suter (pronounced "suitor") during his Sunday morning oldies program. **(RD-IN)**
- 1640 KFXV OK **Enid** – 10/21 1931 – Fair under WKSH with Southern Gospel music from a group called the Isaacs, then "Faith 1640" ID. Music format seemed to be off satellite, not live. **(RD-IA)**
- 1680 KGED CA **Fresno** – 10/30 2358 – Good signal. Christian talk format, "Christian Talkradio" slogan, legal ID by man. **(CK-AZ2)**
- 1690 CHTO ON **Toronto** – 10/22 0224 – Overtaking WVON at times with Greek music, featuring the easily recognizable sound of the main stringed instrument, the Bouzouki. **(RD-IA)**

- 930 UNID -- 11/1 0129 – Something is occupying the null of Spanish WKY OKC: promo for Rush at 9 am, then temps but no local refs caught; and into Yahoo Sportsradio.com, slogan something like "Sportstalk 930." - WVSG OH **Columbus** – 10/30 1913 – Poor with break in programming, “1-800-631 ... Catholic ...,” lost to CHAM, WCPT, then at 1959, “... 614-890-2665 in Westerville, that’s 614-890 ....” Power cut. Still, to me, enough of a match. NEW! **(JJR-MI)**
- 830 WCCO MN **Minneapolis** – 10/26 2157 – Struggling way under local powerhouse WCRN with Milwaukee-Minnesota NBA game in progress. At 2203, “Just past the 9-o’clock hour, let’s pause for 10 seconds for station identification across the Minnesota Timberwolves Radio Network.” Local announcer: “The new home for the Minnesota Timberwolves, News Radio Eight-Three-Oh WCCO and WCCO-HD Minneapolis-St. Paul.” Back in its clear-channel day, this one was a fairly easy catch – but no more. **(BH-MA)**
- 850 KOA CO **Denver** – 10/29 0300 – Sunrise Breakfast.com spot, ID “This is an iHeart radio station, newsradio 8-50, KOA Denver. Home of the Broncos, Rockies, and ??? Bucks,” into news. Clear except for WHAS-840 splash as the ID was playing. **(FV-OH)**
- 860 KOSE AR **Wilson** – 10/25 2259 – Out of C&W song into ID “Classic Country, 8-60 KOSE Wilson-Osceola. A proud member of the ?? Broadcasting Group” and back into music. Heavy interference from CJBC and WWL-870. **(FV-OH)**
- 870 KAAN MO **Bethany** – 10/30 0800 – Fair with oldies, slogan “Ameri-Kaan’s Greatest Hits,” legal ToH ID with AM calls and FM translator into ABC news. **(JJR-MI)**
- 880 KRVN NE **Lexington** – 10/30 1945 – Peaks up, equal to WCBS at times with farm equipment ads, Farm Expo promo; call ID at 1947. UNID C&W station also there. **(HF-MI)**

- CFAC AB **Calgary** – 10/29 0650 – Good briefly with ad for Mugshots on Blackfoot Trail and the Boys and Girls Club of Canada. ID: “Fox Sports on Sports Radio 960 The Fan.” Identical spot heard next day at same time. (NW-PEI)
- 970 WGTK KY **Louisville** – 10/29 0400 – After several playbacks on the Perseus, was able to hear a “WGTK Louisville a division of ....” under WFUN. Very weak, and really had to work at it. Last I heard this one was in Toledo in early 70s as WAVE. (FV-OH)
- WFUN OH **Ashtabula** – 10/27 1959 – ID with very soft speaking male announcer: “WFUN Ashtabula” into Fox News. (FV-OH)
- 1050 WDVM WI **Eau Claire** – 10/30 0900 – Fair and alone with Relevant Radio Catholic programs, “for the diocese of La Crosse” and ToH ID. Rare! (JJR-MI)

- KATQ MT **Plentywood** – 10/31 0931 – Poor, presumed with ads for “Sheridan Sheet Metal ... 765-2244.” Search revealed only fit for that phone number. (JJR-MI)
- WKOK PA **Sunbury** – 10/3 1830 – In multi-station mix, woman with “the WKOK news time is 6:30” into local news. (KK-VA)
- CHOK ON **Sarnia** – 10/3 1825 – In multi-station mix (WKOK, WINA, WFNI and UNID SS) with C&W songs, man with slogan for FM // “... on country 103.9.” (KK-VA)
- 1080 WWNL PA **Pittsburgh** – 10/3 1845\* – In WTIC mix with sign-off announcement: “WWNL Pittsburgh ends its broadcasting day ... have a blessed and peaceful night.” (KK-VA)
- 1090 WTNK TN **Hartsville** – 11/2 0734 – Poor with C&W, slogan “Your Hometown Radio Station, 1090 WTNK.” No KAAV. (JJR-MI)
- 1100 KWWN NV **Las Vegas** – 10/27 2059 – Poor in WTAM tight null with San Diego State v. UNLV Rebels college football, then pause for “KWWN Las Vegas, ESPN radio ...” ID. NEW! (JJR-MI)
- WHLI NY **Hempstead** – 10/29 2044 – Running News 12 Long Island TV audio with Hurricane Sandy coverage. Underneath WTAM-Cleveland. (NW-PEI)
- 1130 CKWX BC **Vancouver** – 10/30 0630 – Barely audible under WBBR with recognizable Hakim Optical spot. (NW-PEI)
- 1150 KSAL KS **Salina** – 10/30 0744 – Poor upon tune in, mention of “on KSAL,” lost to WHBY. (JJR-MI)
- WHBY WI **Kimberley** – 10/29 0600 – End of Infotrak infomercial. ID “your voice for election coverage, 1150 WHBY.” Mixing with CKOC-Hamilton and another station. (NW-PEI)
- 1160 KVCE TX **Highland Park** – 10/27 1925 – ID as “AM 11-60, KVCE ... the Metroplex ...” into infomercial for the wonders of garlic supplement pills. Good signal, though garlic is smelly. (TLK-FL)
- 1190 KQQZ MO **Desoto** – 10/30 2021 – End of C&W song, male “KQQZ, 11-90 AM” and mention of “a moment of silence” for something they thought important followed by several more rapid KQQZ mentions, then, “... back to our regularly scheduled program on KQQZ ...” Otherwise, nice traditional old Country vocals, lots of 50’s/60’s stuff. Fair on peaks over all the other co-channel stations. (TLK-FL)

- 1220 WLPO IL **LaSalle** – 10/30 0738 – Poor but steady with long, detailed obits, weather and am1220wlpo.com website promo. (JJR-MI)
- CJRB MB **Boissevain** – 10/31 0846 – Poor with ad for Boissevain and Morton Foundation, “CJRB Radio 1220” ID and chatter. Alone to fade-out. (JJR-MI)
- 1230 WHCO IL **Sparta** – 10/30 0300 – Popped out at the ToH was a guitar effect followed by “Real Country, 12-30 WCHO Sparta,” jingle singers say “real country,” then

the ID says something else which I couldn't understand. Then they joined CBS news. VERY hard to copy, and I had to enlist some other DXers on the e-mail list folks to help me verify what I thought I heard. **(FV-OH)**

- WKLK MN Cloquet** – 10/29 1853 – Poor with NOS songs, “AM 1230 WKLK” jingle to fade. **(JJR-MI)**
- KTRF MN Thief River Falls** – 10/29 0830 – Poor with cable ad, student athlete of the week, “Coaches corner on KTRF.” **(JJR-MI)**
- KWNO MN Winona** – 10/30 1853 – Poor with “AM 1230 KWNO” ID and short chatter. Soon lost. **(JJR-MI)**
- WCLO WI Janesville** – 10/29 0713 – Poor with mention of “sports on WCLO ...” and quick fade out in mess. **(JJR-MI)**
- WXCO WI Wausau** – 10/29 1849 – Poor with mention of “... in downtown Stevens Point” in mess. **(JJR-MI)**
- 1240 WSBC IL Chicago** – 10/27 1900 – Poor with ToH legal ID upon tune-in, into ethnic program and fade out. **(JJR-MI)**

- WLIK TN Newport** – 10/27 1959 – ToH ID: “since 1964, this is WLIK Newport Tennessee,” into jingle (the same one we used on WNRC at Convention 2003), and then into NBC Radio News. **(FV-OH)**
- 1280 WMCP TN Columbia** – 10/30 0300 – C&W music followed by “WMCP Columbia Tennessee,” then into ABC news. Real rough copy due to WONW Defiance, OH. Had to play around with filters a while to get it clearly. **(FV-OH)**
- 1290 KOIL NE Omaha** – 10/27 2208 – Poor with station promo mentioning “339 B street ... Mighty 1290 Koil.” **(JJR-MI)**
- 1300 KPMI MN Bemidji** – 10/31 0835 – Poor with ad for Bemidji Bowl, “News Channel 1300” slogan, lost to WOOD, then nice fade up with local weather. “News Channel 1300 KPMI” ID into Insider Radio minute with Hollywood gossip. NEW! **(JJR-MI)**
- KOLY SD Mobridge** – 10/29 0907 – Fair with local news mentioning “North Dakota land prices booming ... Upper Missouri basin, Dakota News Network” then political ad, Chevy dealer ad for 2013 Malibu, “Larry Jenson KOLY Star 99 news,” local obits. **(JJR-MI)**
- 1310 WTTL KY Madisonville** – 10/24 0100 – Weather for Madisonville, then ID “The [unintelligible] AM Station, 13-10, WTTL Madisonville,” and sounded like into ESPN radio with female host. **(FV-OH)**

- 1320 KRLW AR **Walnut Ridge** – 10/30 0300 – Long top of hour stager with “KRLW Pocahontas-Walnut Ridge, we are Oldies 1320.” Well down in noise. Took some digging to ID it. **(FV-OH)**

- 1380 WPYR LA **Baton Rouge** – 10/26 0101 – Sounded like “Bearcat Financial Ministries,” then ID as “WPYR Baton Rouge, Catholic Radio for your community is your 40 days for life station. Going on now in the Diocese of Baton Rouge.” Cut into program. **(FV-OH)**
- 1390 KCLN IA **Clinton** – 10/29 0938 – Poor but steady with call letter ID and “info in 8 minutes on KCLN” news promo. **(JJR-MI)**
- WTJS TN **Jackson** – 10/30 0300 – Excited announcer with “AM 13-90 WTJS Jackson” and mention of 94.3, but it faded so I didn’t hear call sign of the FM station, followed by “News and Talk ... Now!” into Fox News. **(FV-OH)**
- 1400 WLJN MI **Elmwood Township** – 10/30 0838 – Poor with call letter ID and request for prayers and donations at 1-800-968-1400.” WCCY, others nulled. **(JJR-MI)**

Greetings to all of the membership from the Oklahoma Panhandle, better known as No Mans Land. After reading about other DXers start in the hobby, it brought back memories of my own. I was born in 1947 and remember as a child sitting on the floor in front of the console radio/record player (a Truetone, I think) and listening to the Lone Ranger, Dragnet and many other programs. When I was 9-10 years old, my Dad brought me a Zenith 5G500 suitcase radio made in 1941. I am sure it came from my Uncle's Zenith Radio and TV shop. That old Zenith (which I still have) was a great radio with a Wave Magnet antenna, which some of you old-timers like me will remember, and it picked up stations from all over the United States with ease. At that time, I did not know anything about logging stations but just listened and enjoyed them. I remember having a Zenith Royal 50 transistor and later a Royal 500. When I was about 20 years old, I bought a Hallicrafter SX-99 at an estate sale for about \$15.00, and that started my real DXing experience. I strung a longwire out of a window to a tree and began logging MW and SW stations from all over. Then, in about 1982, I saw an ad in the Daily Oklahoman for some ham equipment and a Hammarlund HQ-150. I called the gentleman and asked him to hold it for me. The next Saturday, I drove the 265 miles to Oklahoma City and found the 150 to be as near mint condition as possible. I recall paying \$125 for the real "boat anchor" and hauled it home. The Hammarlund was quite a step up from the SX-99 and made DXing easier and more fun. I logged many stations with both the 99 and the 150 and still have both receivers to this day. The next receiver I obtained was an Icom R-70 to usher in the digital age and found it to be another excellent DX machine. I recently found a Drake R8 in excellent condition and am still in the "playing with it" stage, although I have logged a couple of new stations since I got it. My biggest problem now I guess is age, and my hearing is not what it used to be, therefore, I am sure my neighbors can sometimes hear my radios as I try to pull out call letters or identifiers. ## Network listings for professional sports play-by-play coverage

Here is 2012/2013 National Basketball Association (NBA) flagship information from the Internet. Many web pages did not list the announcers' names. And most of the network station lists are not dated, so I cannot be sure that the lists are current for the upcoming season. For some teams I found a list for a previous season, and for some I was unable to locate a network list. I am not sure that the freqseek.com lists are current or complete; at least one did not contain the flagship stations. There are also network lists on FreeBasketballRadio.com ; I have not looked at them to compare them to the official (nba.com) lists nor to the freqseek.com . This FBR site lists only stations that have Internet broadcast capability, so its lists are not complete. This flagship list may not contain information on all of the Spanish language broadcasts. At the end are all of the network lists that I could locate. The URL [http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List\\_of\\_current\\_National\\_Basketball\\_Association\\_broadcasters](http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List_of_current_National_Basketball_Association_broadcasters) has some errors in the flagship stations; they disagree with the information in the web pages sites as footnotes.
