The CRTC is investigating whether three Washington stations (KRPA-1110, KRPI-1550, and KVRI-1600) are illegally targeting the Vancouver market. The problem is not U.S. law, as the FCC couldn't care less what U.S. stations broadcast. But Canadian advertisers are being reminded that they can't take Canadian tax deductions for their advertising costs on U.S. stations targeting Canadian markets without CRTC authorization. Will this policy starve these stations of revenue? We'll see.

- 1570 WNST MD **Towson** – 8/44 2250 – Sports talk, lots of NBC Sports mentions, ID at 2300: “You are listening to Baltimore’s ... WNST,” back to Going Deep with Amani & Dan. Very poor mixing with WQTW & others. **(PS-ON)**
- WMVX MA **Beverly** – 8/23 0710 – Presumed over graveyard-like mush with Portuguese talk, “Bom dia! Bom dia...” and many mentions of Brazil. **(MKB-ON)**

- 1700 KKLF TX **Richardson** – 8/12 2235 – Presumed playing Spanish language music (Tejano/Conjunto hits according to website), promo for advertising on station (no ID heard) with 214 area code at 2246, at 2303 heard mention of Fort Worth. Very poor. **(PS-ON)**
- +++ 8/15 0001 – Over WJCC; “KKLF AM 1700 Richardson, Texas, serving the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex,” and Mexican music. **(BC-NH)**

- SMA-MB** **Shawn M. Axelrod, VE4DX1SMA, VEPC4SWL Winnipeg, MB.** Icom ICR70/Drake R8; 3 Foot un-amplified box loop/Quantum QX LOOP v2.0/155 Foot U shaped outdoor wire/100 Foot indoor wire run around the basement walls/MFJ 1026 Phasing unit

DX LOGS

- 630 KHOW CO Denver** – 8/23 1437 – On car radio, weak almost readable talk signal, in the absence of IBOC from KWPN-640, but in the presence of some AM splatter. Surely KHOW Denver at the edge of its 5 kW groundwave while in a quiet spot, 5 minutes after local mean noon. Could not hear it an hour later driving elsewhere in Enid. Per sked at <http://www.khow.com/onair/saturday/> it's 'America's Wealth Management Show' during this hour only on Saturdays. Comparable signal to 50 kW KLTT, 670, which is more commonly heard here in daytime, noise level permitting. On 630, day lobe favors SSW from Denver, but not a complete null toward us, while at night we have a lobe right at us; on 670, daytime lobe is mostly to the WSW, also unfavorable; per the NRC *AM Pattern Book*. **(GH-OK)**
- 750 KAMA TX El Paso** – 8/7 0159 – Spanish from KAMA still cheating, overcoming the clear channel station entitled to be heard even here, WSB Atlanta GA; giving phone (?)522-1235 for Univisión América call-ins. **(GH-OK)**
- 790 KFPT CA Clovis** – 8/28 0659 – "You're listening to 790 ESPN KFPT Clovis" at ToH, followed by *Mike & Mike*. Fair at best in QRM. **(JW-CO)**
- 850 KFUO MO Clayton** – 8/30 2130 – Choral music, and 2146, with KOA nulled; own DF now fits for KFUO Clayton MO, though no ID heard. Thanks to Todd Skaine for reminding me of that: KFUO has special dispensation to stay on until 9 pm = 2200 ELT, so withdraw my earlier assumption that KJON was on late past 2130 cheating. These two are making slow 0.5 Hz SAH with each other, i.e. 30 fades per minute. 8/31 2134 – Organ music ENE/WSW, better than KOA at the moment; no doubt LCMS' KFUO, Clayton MO, my ex-local station while at Washington University a semicentury ago. **(GH-OK)**
- 850 KJON TX Carrollton** – 8/25 2131 – Piano hymn into organ music, good with KOA nulled, and DFing for The Metroplex, so no doubt KJON Carrollton TX, Guadalupe Radio Network (Catholic) on the facility hijacked from Anadarko OK without even changing the call letters. Is this after LSS in August? Yes, sunset at 2115 in August, 2030 in September, so cheating, and no PSSA. **(GH-OK)**
- 910 KCJB ND Minot** – 8/21 0713 – "91-Country KCJB" ID in passing, notice of school opening delay until 10 am somewhere around Minot ND, due to power outage caused by lightning. **(GH-OK)**
- 930 WKBM IL Sandwich** – 8/2 0540 – Poor signals fading in and out with CJCA. They were running Relevant Radio programming // to the web feed. NEW. Well it looks like even in the midst of summer if you are very patient you can dig out something new. **(SMA-MB)**
- 1060 KIJN TX Farwell** – 8/21 0709 – Large steady open carrier, WSW/ENE, so no doubt KIJN, perpetually cheating daytimer; at least not modulating now. **(GH-OK)**
- 1060 CKMX AB Calgary** – 8/8 0714 – Gal with ID: "The all new Funny 1060 AM is CKMX and CFVP Calgary, a division of Bell Media," followed by a not-very-funny comedy skit. Very good signal on a number of mornings; semi-local KRCN is either off at night or running open carrier, not a big factor here with 111 watts. **(JW-CO)**



- 1130 KRDU CA **Dinuba** – 8/10 0800 – Out of ad with legal ID at 0800:30: “KRDU 1130 AM Dinuba-Fresno-Visalia, Your Inspiration Station” and into “Feed My Sheep” program. Fair. (JW-CO)
- 1140 KZMQ WY **Greybull** – 8/10 0845 – “Burlington’s Good Time Oldies Station 1140 KZMQ” and into song “Smoke Gets in Your Eyes;” thought at first this was Burlington, Colorado with an new call but a few minutes later they ID’ed as “Ten Sleep’s Good Time Oldies Station 1140 KZMQ.” Burlington and Ten Sleep are burgs near Greybull. Fair/good signal. (JW-CO)
- 1230 KJQS UT **Murray** – 8/31 0759 – “Sports Radio 1230 KJQS...” at ToH. Probably a legal ID but rough copy in the jumble. (JW-CO)
- 1240.19 KCRT CO **Trinidad** – 8/4 0842 – Ad or promo with mention of “southern Colorado” and “KCRT AM 1240,” along with phone numbers 846-3355 and 846-4719; soon faded away. Finally ID’ed this for a new one. This was my Closest Unheard Station for 3 decades; that honor now goes to KGGG-1340 in Garden City, Kansas at 255 miles. (JW-CO)
- 1270 KTUZ OK **Claremore** – 8/28 0109 – Mexican music dominating and SHVA ID at 0110 as “La Zeta 12-70 AM,” loops E/W while another with Spanish talk is in its null N/S. Same canned ID heard when I was awake at 1054 UT Aug 28. Zeta is of course KRVT Claremore OK (Tulsa market), not to be confused with “La Que Buena” format which moved to 1530 KXTD Wagoner, a daytimer cheating for a week all-night. 1270 is 5/1 kW U4, so legally on air at night, lobe to the WSW, but not a null toward Enid and Liberal like in the daytime. The other SS is KFLC Fort Worth, 50/5 kW U4. Zeta has rather negative connotations in the drug and gang world, but station must consider it positive? Googling on Zeta 1270 finds two others, WMIZ in Vineland NJ, and XEAZ in Tijuana. (GH-OK)
- 1300 KCSF CO **Colorado Springs** – 8/20 0720 – Poor to fair signals fading in and out with Imus in the morning and a Sports Animal 1300 ID. This one has been on my target list for a very long time. Finally no KGLO this morning. NEW! (SMA-MB)
- 1310 WTTL KY **Madisonville** – 8/28 0125 – Promo/ad for a local event in Madisonville, Hopkins County, area code 270. Therefore it is WTTL in western Kentucky, 1500/500 watts U2, dominating frequency at the moment. Night pattern major lobe is SSW, with a null toward us, so may have been on ND day pattern. (GH-OK)
- 1390 WZZB IN **Seymour** – 7/16 2246 – Fair on presumed day power with Blondie’s “Call Me,” then ID as “Classic 1390 WZZB.” (RD-NE)
- 1400 KBRB NE **Ainsworth** – 8/17 0859 – Gal’s voice with “...1400 KBRB Ainsworth...” punching through the mob scene. (JW-CO)
- 1400 KCOW NE **Alliance** – 8/17 0859 – “The Voice of Box Butte County, this is AM 1400 KCOW Alliance,” followed by ABC news. Up and down over the next quarter-hour. (JW-CO)
- 1400 KEYE TX **Perryton** – 8/26 0759 – Call letter ID, probably legal ID, along with a mention of “KEYE online.” Barely readable in the zoo. (JW-CO)
- 1440 WGEM IL **Quincy** – 8/14 0819 – Mentions of “here in Quincy,” so WGEM sports in Illinois, but rotating soon finds another with livestock market report, ad with 303 area code, 963-number, so obviously KRDZ Wray CO on 5 kW day ND day pattern, official August sunrise being 0800 (Sept: 0830). Strangely, I am not hearing the usual dominator, Spanish gospel 50 kW KTNO, The Metroplex TX, not even dead air which it sometimes supplies. Then at 0827 there is some Spanish with a 970-AC phone --- but 970 includes Wray, one of the two CO ACs wrapping around Denver/Boulder area which keeps 303. So KRDZ mixes some Spanish too? Or did I mishear 972 which would be KTNO? Wray is right next to the KS/NE borders, a tri-state area. (GH-OK)
- 1450 KENA AR **Mena** – 8/14 2203 – Atop with late legal ID: “...1450 KENA, a Ouachita Broadcasting station,” then into a gospel song by female, possibly Sandi Patti. (RD-NE)
- 1450 KEYY UT **Provo** – 8/14 0859 – Station promo mentioning mail@keyradio.org, then man with ID: “This KEYY Provo, KEYR Richfield, KEYP Price, and KEYV Vernal;” into Insight for Living at 0900. Fair signal atop others. (JW-CO)
- 1530 KXTD OK **Wagoner** – 8/19 0207 – 5 kW “daytimer” is still running all-night with Mexican music, non-ID as “impactando --- La Qué Buena, 15-30 de AM, Qué Buena!!! “



Although I habitually check it at least at bedtime, I'm sure it's just the same from August sunset onward, 2115-0745 sunrise; September (if not fixed by then!) 2030-0800. This thing totally blocks my access to the other recent all-night 1530 cheaters, KLBW New Boston TX, and KCMN Colorado Springs CO. 8/21 2137 – "La Qué Buena" has finally turned off its 24-hour operation since at least Aug 16, re-audiblizing WCKY now with ESPN baseball scores. I would have preferred the Mexican music if it were legal. **(GH-OK)**

- 1590 KVGB KS **Great Bend** – 8/22 0840 – The Early Morning Show with news, weather, etc.; News From the Oil Patch at 0840, with barrel prices, drilling permits, etc. - not what one would expect from Kansas; call letter ID's and "The Mighty 1590" slogans. Fair/good with local KEPN-1600's IBOC still turned off, going on 3 months now. Co-owned KRWZ-950 IBOC has been off for a year, so looks like both IBOC's may be off permanently. Hooray! **(JW-CO)**
- 1590 KELP TX **El Paso** – 8/22 2129 – Lucky catch just as I tune across, "right here on KELP," and then singing ID. 5 kW day pattern from El Paso TX is very favorable for us with broad lobe centered northeast. Its day ends at 2145 in August (2115 in Sept). Last year's NRC AM Log shows religious format, partly in Spanish. **(GH-OK)**
- 1610 CHHA ON **Toronto** – 8/12 2151 – Music looping ENE/WSW, 2158 Spanish announcement, no doubt CHHA Toronto; was also hearing it a few minutes earlier on the car radio. By no means a regular here, at some 1100 miles with odd 6.25 kW; day and night patterns are both circles tangent westward with minor lobe eastward. Audible thanks to the deletion of IBOC by 1600 KATZ St Louis a few months ago, which N0UIH assumed would only be temporary; strangely, 1600 KEPN Denver (Lakewood) also deleted IBOC at about the same time, clearing 1610 for DX here in all directions. But CHHA is the only broadcaster in North America on 1610, as the FCC is keeping 1610 for all those TIS/HAR reluctant to move to 1710. **(GH-OK)**
- 1630 KRND WY **Fox Farm** – 8/21 2122 – Up tempo banda music loops NW/SE, 2123 DJ in Spanish, 2130 ID mentions 1630 but can't make out the slogan, presumably still La Jota instead of Gran-D, the only SS around here. KRND in Fox Farm WY [Cheyenne]. Somewhat separable from KKGMM The Metroplex, not exactly in opposite direction, with praise music in English. **(GH-OK)**
- 1650 KYHN AR **Fort Smith** – 8/14 0155 – Open carrier, dead air obviously from KYHN, transmitter at Sallisaw OK, atop some weak Spanish, probably R. Luz, Denver, rather than ESPN Deportes, El Paso. **(GH-OK)**
- 1680 KGED CA **Fresno** – 8/1 0143 – *The Clark Howard Show* fades up with caller, financial advice, again appropriate DF for KGED Fresno CA; 0158 ad for apocalyptic free book from an 800 number, fades for ID, 0200 SRN News; 0205 plug Dave Ramsey show at 11-2; 0206; resume Clark Howard. This matches the KGED sked at: <http://www.my1680.com/index.php?c=2> which now bills itself as "More Conservative Talk Radio" but mostly Christian during the daytime on weekends. 8/8 0206 – "16-80, KGED" ID audible amid storm crashes, but fades in stronger at 0207 resuming financial advice show. Fresno CA, with nothing to impede it between here and there. Opposite direction and slightly closer however, is station with equal 1 kW ND, WOKB Winter Garden FL, which I've yet to hear, also with nothing in between. Maybe it's the fast SAH sometimes against KGED, if not WPRR MI. **(GH-OK)**
- 1680 KRJO LA **Monroe** – 8/15 0221 – "Classic Country 16-80" non-ID and music, loops NW/SE, CCI with financial advice from presumed KGED Fresno. So KRJO Monroe LA is back on the air after several weeks' hiatus. Classic Country was its previous identity as early as Sept 24, 2013, when I logged it, a change made after the NRC AM Log 2013-2014 which went to press about August 1 showing NWS/BIZ format. Still shows Classic Country 1680 on website <http://www.krjo.com> which is nothing but a listen link. So our clear shot to KGED is over. QSL manager Patrick Martin has not answered two reports I sent him **(GH-OK)**
- 1700 KKLF TX **Richardson** – 8/20 0116 – Promo in English mentioning KEDA and Texas; that's the 1540 Tejano station in San Antonio, and then on to IDs in English for The Metroplex Tejano here, "Kick 1700," KKLF. Are these stations related? Yes! Both licensed to Claro Communications, per FCC AM Query. Maybe they even simulcast except for local ads and announcements. **(GH-OK)**

UNID

- 590 UNID -- 8/5 0215 – Tone test, 0216 tone off and back on. I would suspect KXSP Omaha, which has exhibited some post-midnight anomalies lately, but DF is more like 40 degrees, which points to KFNS Wood River IL (St Louis market) which has a night pattern to the SSW, close enough to our WSW bearing? Although ND day. But I don't normally hear it at night at all. **(GH-OK)**
- 840 UNID -- 8/21 0144 – Romantic music in Spanish with WHAS nulled, while DF of this signal is close to N/S from here. 0145 non-ID slogan as “noticias, deportes, entretenimiento todo el día; 840 AM te escucha,” more romx. Format doesn't fit for any of the listed Mexicans in the IRCA Log. DF fits for KVJY Pharr (RGV) TX, but which in the NRC AM Log of last year was NWS/TLK “Informativa 840”; while Radio-locator.com now calls it Radio Luz, which implies religion. 1 kW at night, it has a null toward WHAS but some signal to the north. Although DF seemed wrong, another possibility in WHAS null would be CMHW in Santa Clara, CUBA; would the slogan above fit it? **(GH-OK)**
- 930 UNID -- 8/23 0149 – Coast to Coast AM affiliate // countless others, audible with WKY OKC nulled. Searching 930 at <http://www.coasttocoastam.com/stations> goes to NY, SD, MD, KY, IL and WY. Of those, most likely would be WTAD in Quincy IL as logged a number of times here. **(GH-OK)**
- 960 UNID -- 8/31 0103 – During local KGWA Fox-hole, thought I heard call sign like “KOAB” mentioned in passing. Checking last year's NRC AM Log 960 listings, closest fuzzy match would be KLAD 5 kW in Klamath Falls OR --- remotely possible only if on ND day pattern instead of night into the Pacific. **(GH-OK)**
- 1120 UNID -- 8/2 2221 – With KMOX baseball nulled, sermon in English, probably KTXW Manor (Austin) TX as now formatted, but catching an ID has been elusive; faded out by 2227. **(GH-OK)**
- 1510 UNID -- 8/22 2132 – Mexican music vs WLAC, making low rumble SAH, very slightly on the low side. 2133, SHVA (super-hype voice actor) in what sounds like a full ID with slogans, but too much QRM and fade to make anything out. Rough DF for it maybe NE/SW, and best with WLAC nulled, which means aiming N/S. So what is it not? KNNS in Larned KS which flipped off Spanish in March. Last year's NRC AM Log shows three of the 1510 Texans in Spanish, but as day timers should be off by 2100 or 2115 in August per FCC AM Query (admittedly an often unwarranted assumption). IRCA Mexican Log shows a good possibility, a new radio station I was unaware of, XEQI, La Nueva Radio in Monterrey NL, listed as 50 kW day power, cutting to 250 watts at night. Need to keep after this one! BTW, no higher het, lower below 1510 at this time from KCTE, Independence MO. **(GH-OK)**

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

BULGARIA: *R.Blagoevgrad* informed its listeners that the 75 kW medium wave transmitter on **864 kHz** in “Belo Pole” was switched off on August 1. The station now broadcasts only on the FM band. Remaining MW broadcasts on the air in Bulgaria are *BNR1 Horizont* via Vidin-Gramada on 576 kHz (transmitting on half-power, only 200 kW) and the low-power transmitters on 747 kHz (Salmanovo, 10kW); 864 kHz (Samuil, 10 kW); 963 kHz (Kardzhali, 50 kW); 1161 kHz (Targovishte, 10 kW and DuloVo/Vodno, 10 kW), which carry both *R.Bulgaria* programs for the Turkish-speaking minorities in the country and *BNR1 Horizont*. The long wave transmitter carrying *BNR1 Horizont* and the Parliament Channel on 261 kHz (Sofia-Vakarel, 75 kW) is also active. [Georgi Bancov, *mwdx*]

GERMANY: 1107 *AFN* Kaiserlautern has shut down. [Jurgen Bartels, *mwdx*]

GREENLAND: *KNR* is to return to three medium wave frequencies following criticism about the lack of reception on the sea and outside towns and villages in Greenland. The stations expected to return: Qeqertarsuaq 650 kHz (5 kW) – due on the air in October or November 2014; Nuuk 570 kHz (5 kW) – due on the air in January, February or March 2015; Simiutaq, Qaqortoq 720 kHz (10 kW) – due on the air around June 1st 2015. With the reopening of these three MW frequencies, all plans about the launch of a short wave transmitter in Greenland have been given up for the time being. When all three MW transmitters are back on the air, it will be decided if more MW frequencies are to be relaunched. [Stig Hartvig Nielsen, *mwdx*]

HAITI: 840 *Radio 4VEH* is back on the air after being off for an extended period. Facebook status update on September 2; “Please pray for the Lord’s help for Tim Zook, engineer with HCJB, who is arriving in Cap-Haitien today to work with 4VEH technicians Jonathan and Danny to fix our broken transmitter so we can broadcast again on 840 AM.” Facebook status update September 5; “Praise the Lord! The AM transmitter has been fixed, and we are broadcasting on 840 AM again! Continue to pray for the Towers for Jesus team, making good progress in laying concrete etc. in preparation for putting up the new towers. Thanks so much for your prayers!” [www.facebook.com/radio4veh]

INDIA: Nautel is completing deployment of 27 MW AM transmitters and associated equipment ordered in 2013. All transmitters have shipped and are currently being installed, commissioned, and going on air for *All India Radio (AIR)*. The orders for eleven Nautel NX100 (100 kW), ten NX200 (200 kW), and six NX300 (300 kW) DRM-enabled transmitters comprise the world’s largest digital radio deployment to date. All transmitters were configured for DRM30 transmission. Working with Nautel on the deployment are Comcon – Nautel’s in-country partner, along with Altronic providing RF test loads, Digidia providing DRM modulators/content servers, and Kintronic Labs supplying matching systems for the project. The first transmitter to ship was an NX200 on August 27, 2013. This flagship installation on **819 kHz** in Delhi went on air May 30, 2014. *AIR* is currently installing NX300 systems at Jammu, Jalandhar, Lucknow and Rajkot, as well as an NX100 system at Panaji. August 2013; NX200 shipped to Delhi (819 kHz). August 2013; three NX300’s shipped to Jammu (990 kHz), Jalandhar (873 kHz), and Lucknow (747 kHz). December 2013; four NX100’s shipped to Vijayawada (837 kHz), Tiruchirapalli (936 kHz), Patna (621 kHz), and Varanasi (1242 kHz). January 2014; four NX200’s shipped to Chennai (720 kHz), Bengaluru-Bangalore (612 kHz), Dharwad (765 kHz) and Ajmer (603 kHz). March 2014; four NX100’s shipped to Mumbai A (1044 kHz), Mumbai B (558 kHz), Panaji (1287 kHz) and Pune (792 kHz). April 2014; three NX300’s shipped to Dibrugarh (567 kHz), Rajkot (810 kHz) and Suratgarh (918 kHz). June 2014; five NX200’s shipped to Kolkata A (657 kHz), Ahmedabad (864 kHz), Jabalpur (801 kHz), Siliguri (711 kHz) and Itanagar (675 kHz). July 2014; three NX100’s shipped to Kolkata B (1008 kHz), Ranchi (549 kHz) and Pasighat (1062 kHz). [www.nautel.com]

ISLE OF MAN: On October 1, the Isle of Man post office will issue a set of postage stamps commemorating the 50th anniversary of *Manx Radio*. From the humble beginnings of a caravan in Onchan, *Manx Radio* came onto the airwaves in the summer of 1964 and became the first commercial radio station licensed in Britain created to inform, entertain and educate the whole of the island. The set of eight stamps have been specially designed and pictorially reflect some of the

key programmes and services that the station broadcast throughout their 50 year history. More info at <https://www.iompost.com/stamps-coins/collection/manx-radio-50th-anniversary/>.

LITHUANIA: New schedule of MW transmissions from Sitkunai, Lithuania, received directly from Rimantas Pleikys, *R.Baltic Waves International* project coordinator: Kaunas/Sitkunai, **1386 kHz**, 75 kW; 0200-0330 R.Free Europe/R.Liberty, Russian; 0330-0400 NHK World, Russian; 0400-0500 R.Free Europe/R.Liberty, Belarusian; 1730-1800 NHK World, Russian; 1800-1900 R.Free Europe/R.Liberty, Russian; 1900-2000 R.Free Europe/R.Liberty, Belarusian; 2000-2100 Polish Radio, Belarusian; 2100-2200 R.Free Europe/R.Liberty, Russian. **612 kHz** isn't used any longer; this transmitter has been switched off AUG 17 2100 UTC. Note the shortened relay of RL Belarusian (now only 2 hours per day) and the new relay of RL Russian (3.5 hours per day). Reception reports are welcome and will be confirmed. ST. KITTS & NEVIS: 820 *R.Paradise* has been off the air since mid-2013 because of a dispute between outgoing TBN station manager Andre Gilbert and new owner Rev. Richard Wiles of Flowing Streams Church, according to an August 8 news report in the *St. Kitts & Nevis Observer* newspaper. TBN donated the station to Flowing Streams, but Gilbert has refused to complete legal transfer of the station. *R.Paradise* broadcast equipment and office furniture were moved to storage while the station has remained in limbo. Rev. Wiles described the situation as at crisis stage, approaching the point of no return for the radio station. [www.thestkittsnevisobserver.com]

SPAIN: It's confirmed that another Spanish medium wave station, EAJ-20 *La Zarxa*, 882 kHz, also called *COM Ràdio* (Catalunya Ona Mitjana), former *R.Sabadell*, will be closed for good. This network will continue through FM frequencies. The 20 kW transmitter is located Estany de Gallecs, Barcelona. [Guillermo Sáez, *mediumwave.info*]

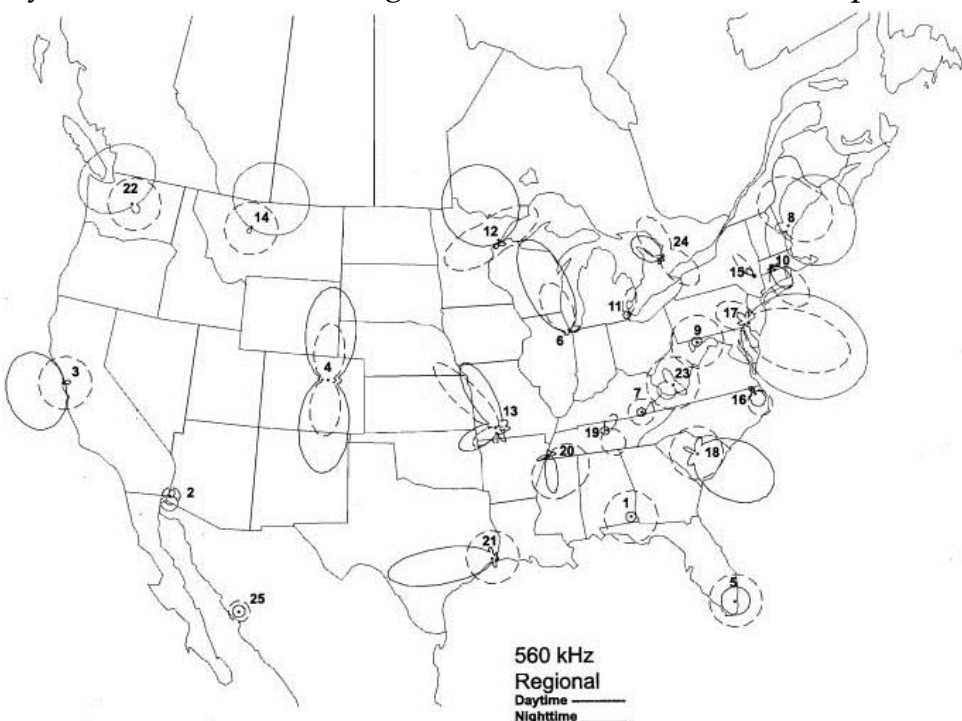
SWITZERLAND: The 188 metre high mast of the Sottens MW transmitter (formerly *Radio Suisse Romande* 765 kHz) was scheduled to be dismantled on the 20th of August. Source: Guy Vanoverbeke, via ondescourtes.group. [Bernard Enfelder, *mwmasts*]

VATICAN: In the morning hours on Thursday 8 May 2014, Vatican Radio medium wave antennas were demolished at Santa Maria di Galeria Transmitting Centre. An unexpected event ends an extraordinary history of radio broadcasting. Medium wave **1530 kHz** ended broadcasting in 2011 but the transmitting plant including a four-tower directional antenna system had been saved until now for further use. The demolition abruptly occurred 13 years after accusations of electro-magnetic pollution were formulated. Vatican Radio medium wave covered Europe and the Mediterranean with a very good signal at night. The end of MW broadcasts deeply affected travellers as well as everyone not having access to the internet but also dramatically reduced any opportunity to make the Pope's message reach the world independently from other operators and connections. Here is National Football League (NFL) flagship information Internet searches. Some of the network lists are undated, so I do not know if they are for the current season. And I cannot rely on the copyright date at the bottom of each page, as that is probably added globally for the web site. even if the specific web page being viewed has not changed. And some team sites do not list the announcer team, while others have bios that are a few seasons' old, so I do not know if they are current.



The announcer names are at http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List_of_current_NFL_broadcasters, but the footnotes on that site all point to web page retrievals in 2012. That URL also has flagship and network size information. The site <http://www.freqseek.com/nfl-radio-networks.aspx> has the NFL networks, but there is no source information there. And I do not know if the site honors the "Do Not Reproduce" statement at the bottom of some of the network list pages. I cannot include a network in this column if there is a "DNR" warning on the web page.

There is a site <http://nflfootballtv.com/onlineradio.html> that has Internet online radio - streaming audio and video information on each team. I have no idea if that web site is current.

The Westwood One Radio Network (renamed to Dial Global Sports and in 2013 renamed to WestwoodOne Sports) will broadcast NFL games; <http://www.nfl.com/tvradio/broadcasters/westwoodone> has the lists of announcers:

- Monday Night: Kevin Harlan & Boomer Esiason or Dan Fouts
- Sunday Night: Kevin Kugler & James Lofton
- Thursday Night: Ian Eagle & Trent Green
- Sunday Afternoon: Dave Sims & Mark Malone; Tom McCarthy & Rod Woodson
- Sideline Reporters: Hub Arkush, Laura Okmin, Rocky Boiman, Scott Kaplan, Steve Tasker

The URL <http://www.westwoodone.com/index.php/programming/sports> has "TBA" for Monday Night Football, Thursday Night Football, Sunday Night Football, and Sunday Afternoon Doubleheader. The only scheduling that is not confirmed is which early and late Sunday afternoon games will be broadcast. I do not know if the station list will vary, based on the day of the week, and I do not know if the WestwoodOne broadcast will occur in the two cities of the teams that are playing. For example, if there is a WestwoodOne station in Chicago, I am not sure that a Bears' game will be broadcast, deferring to the Bears' network broadcast.

SDR Loggings

Mark Durenberger sends this along.

Hi Shawn. Through the 2014 summer months we enjoyed singularly quiet conditions on the Medium-Wave band here in the "North Country." A 140-foot D-Kaz antenna was carefully 'tuned' and pre-sunrise Perseus SDR recordings were made over several days. The IDs are tabulated below and we kept the recordings as proof. The list grew larger than expected when we shared the SDR data with Neil Kazaross. (He has a better pair of ears than mine and was able to add additional catches.) Orientation of the antenna (325 degrees) meant a large number of Canadians are in the mix, keeping company with some nice copy from the Western United States. Notice little if any copy from the back-side of the very-efficient D-Kaz.

For some brevity we are not reporting many of the more-obvious and local signals. We do include night power in watts (I just don't believe *most* stations 'cheat'...though there might be a few below). Mark Durenberger (Upsala, MN).

 Subject: Kintronic Labs – Radio World Article

The August 1st edition of Radio World included a short blurb about Kintronic Labs titled “Promotes Quality AM Radio.” The company’s president is advancing the idea that the FCC should mandate a minimum set of technical standards for AM radio receivers to allow AM radio reception quality to compete with that of FM. They have a demonstration that includes the use of adaptive filtering and noise blanking to help combat noise problems. They’re also proposing that receivers offer greater bandwidth than those currently offered by most receivers.

The article also mentions Kintronic being a long time advocate of the increased use of synchronous AM repeaters. I assume this would be similar to those offered by high-end Part 15 transmitter options, which allow the broadcaster to synchronize several smaller transmitters across an area, allowing a station to achieve more uniform coverage than can be achieved using a single monopole antenna and transmitter. I’ve heard the Part 15 versions of this type of technology, and they can work amazingly well.

Did anyone ever copy transmissions from their short-monopole station, WS2XTR on 1680 KHz from Evergreen Hills, VA back in 2002? They successfully demonstrated a short vertical (only 45 feet tall) that had 98% of the efficiency of a quarter-wavelength antenna, according to their press release. I can’t tell if they’ve sold or installed any of these short monopole antennas at commercial locations since then. I know some 160 Meter operators who might love to learn more about the design!
