Over the years Paul had served the NRC in many roles in both *DX News* and e-DXN.com. He was the publisher of *DX News* for over twenty years. His counsel and friendship will be missed by us all.

From the Publisher: Paul's passing is truly sad news for everyone in the NRC. Paul took over the Musings of the Members column from the legendary Ernie Cooper, then served as *DX News* publisher for more than 20 years. Many also knew him from the 1989 Topeka NRC convention. Paul made massive improvements in the technology used to produce *DX News* while he was publisher – from using scissors and glue to produce camera-ready copy for the printer to the desktop-published PDF we have today. He also was instrumental in setting up and managing e-DXN and editing the latest edition of the NRC *Pattern Book*, and served as Board Chairman after his retirement from teaching and

from *DX News* until the past few months. His dry wit, very much in evidence when conducting the annual convention auction, was probably lost on most of his middle school Spanish students,

Paul was very kind to me both when I was a column editor while he was publisher, and then when he passed on the publication duties to me in 2009. His presence will be missed.

The FCC stated on Tuesday that at least 51 stations or translators were off the air (a few others are not even listed here) due to flooding or other damage caused by the storm. While some of these stations have since returned, what has quickly struck out is that not a single one of these stations has acknowledged being off (or in one case where they moved temporarily) on their websites.

Phone-in discussion on investments. Out of nowhere came Go Hawkeyes.com. Term Provider United Way, addition pushing “Income Portfolio. ID, 0500. Good. (JE-TX)
- 740 WYGM FL **Orlando** – 9/11 0640 – Poor with detailed Hurricane/Trop Storm Irma coverage. Calls, no CFZM. logged as WKIS in 1970. (JJR-WI)
- 740 WDGY WI **Hudson** – 8/26 0720 – Out of song: “Sylvia’s Mother,” Doctor Hook. Followed by station ID: “FM 92.1, 103.7, 740 AM, and FM 107.1 HD2. The original WDGY.” (JDS-MN)

Per station the calls have changed to KOFA but they still use KAWC also in ID. Good over KCTC. New logging, ex-KAWC. **(NJ-AZ)**
- 1320 KELO SD **Sioux Falls** – 9/21 0635 – Poor with weather for "Kelo-land," "1320 and 107-9 KELO." Alone. **(JJR-WI)**
- 1400 KTUC AZ **Tucson** – 9/7 0556 – Out of NOS, "AM 1400 KTUC" New for me & taped. **(WH-CO)**
- 1400 KCYK AZ **Yuma** – 9/7 0704 – Up briefly, female announcer "KCYK Yuma," to local spots. **(WH-CO)**
- 1400 KJYE CO **Delta** – 9/6 2256 – Out of REL program *Truth for Life*, "This is KJOL 99.5 FM for the Grand Valley and in Montrose Olathe and Cedaredge at 99.1 FM" to SRN News. **(WH-CO)**
- 1400 KVSF NM **Santa Fe** – 9/7 0100 – Out of the noise, "You're listening to ESPN 1400 KVSF AM Santa Fe." **(WH-CO)**

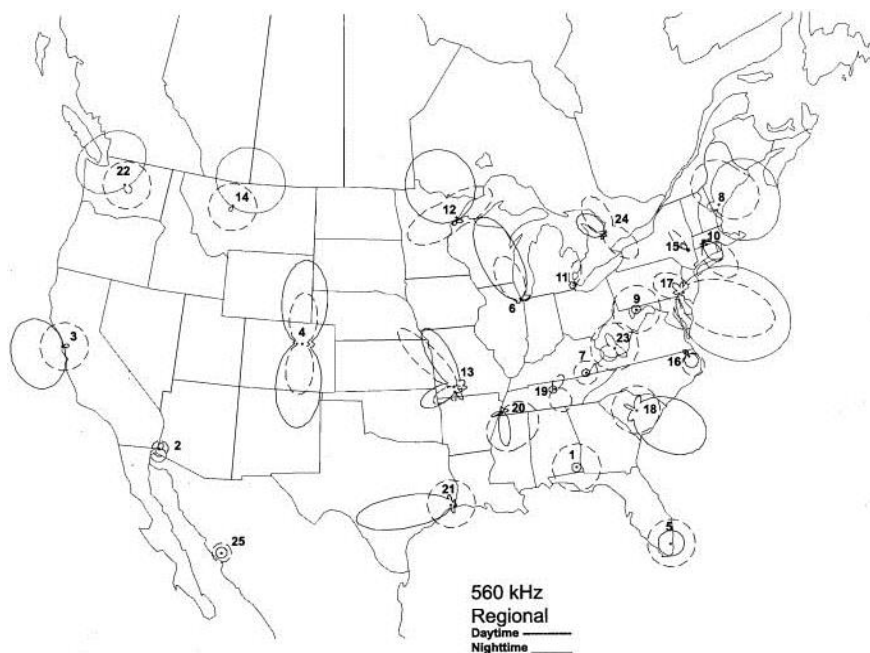

- 760 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Guane//Mayarí Arriba SEP 13 0501 - Fair, with WJR off the air; "Reportero RP" followed by canned ID with theme song parallel 640, 690, and 730 kHz. [Conti-NH]
- 770 **MEXICO** XEREV Los Mochis, Sin. SEP 15 1210 - Several "Los Cuarenta" slogans atop music, owning the frequency now; would that be 5000 watts day or 100 watts night? Had just tuned past other northwest Mexicans on 650, 700, 710, 730 kHz. KKOB should pop on to ND day pattern at 1245 during September. [Hauser-OK]

- 1100 **COLOMBIA** HJAT *Caracol Radio*, Barranquilla SEP 10 0001 - Poor; "Caracol Radio" promos, parallel 1170 kHz. [Conti-NH]

At 1204 also surprised by a carrier on 1449 from west/southwest, or rather less than 1449 so probably a U.S. 1450 off-frequency or a local device. Nothing more than 5 kW on 1449 from Australia/New Zealand. SEP 15 1201-1208 - 1098 from west; 774, 702 and 612 from west/southwest; no others thru topend. Our sunrise today 1214 UTC. SEP 18 1154 - Only 702, with two carriers beating from west/southwest presumably 50 kW 2BL ABC Sydney, and 10 kW Magic, Auckland NZ, as other monitors have been getting into deep North America (though there is another 1 kW NZer). Skipped midband, but nothing detected on hiband either. [Hauser-OK]

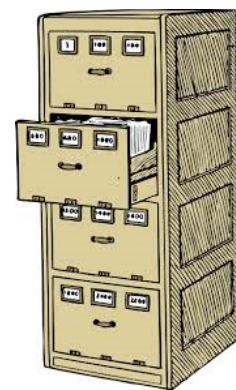

From the *DX News* archives

75 Years Ago – From the September 5, 1942 issue of *DX News*: Ed Wyman (NY State) listed about 80 monthly “frequency checks.” For anyone who doesn’t know, stations had their exact frequency (etc.) measured by a “Monitoring Company,” usually in a different city. These f/cs were the next best thing to DX Tests! NJ’s WAWZ-1380 made it to Jim Wedener’s Iowa locale at their 6 AM s/on. He also hears LR1-870 Argentina regularly! Indiana’s Bob Brown reports NZ DXer Rob Lacey has 379 USA veries.



50 Years Ago – From the September 16, 1967 issue of *DX News*: Bulletin now published by Boston’s Gordon Nelson (\$7.75/year U.S.). Nineteen stations on the DX Test Calendar including two seldom heard British Columbians (thanks to IRCA): CKXR-580, Salmon Arm & 1340 in Revelstoke. John Hoogerheide is now working for a Chilean Mining Company, telling of his 28-year old live-in housekeeper (for \$35 a month)! Among his loggings were WPTR-1540 (NY), & Floridians WGBS-710 & WINZ-940. Marc DeLorenzo (MA), roughly 180° from aforementioned John H. also logged WINZ-940! Safe to say they really “get out”. Rare Quebec, Canadian CKLD-1230 heard by Marc in late evening. Charles Reh (ON, CAN) added KGFX-1060 SD to his log.

25 Years Ago – From the October 12, 1992 issue of *DX News*: Six stations on the DX Calendar, headed by WLYN-1360 MA. John Bowker’s “In the Beginning” column listed ALL FIVE 1450 kc US stations in 1934: WSAR(MA), WHOM (NJ), WGAR (OH), WTFI (GA), & KTBS (LA). Powers varied from 250w to a kw. Henrik Klemetz authored a 168-page book of tips for the non-SS Latin American DXer entitled “Latin America by Radio” (\$17.75 from NRC) Ed Note: sure could have used that book back in the day when I DXed foreign stations from NJ & FL (60s/70s). Pete Kemp (CT) edited the “Radio Roundup” column: news of radio personalities of interest to DXers.

10 Years Ago – From the October 1, 2007 issue of *DX News*: Colorado’s John Wilkins logged his 4th Japanese station-JOAB-693; his others are JOIB-747, JOUB-774, & JOBB-828, his furthest at 6016 miles! His shack includes a Drake R-8 & a 4’ box loop. Bruce Conti (NH) reported Saudi Arabia-999 // 1512, Turkey-1017 & 1062, Israel-1287 & Sao Tome e Principe-1530, heard on his Drake R8B looped. IBOC dominated the chatter on virtually every page of the bulletin. TN’s Doug Smith reported on his road trip to ND, MT & ID using his YB-400 barefoot.

Here is National Football League (NFL) flagship information Internet searches. Some of the network lists are undated, so I do not know if they are for the current season. And I cannot rely on the copyright date at the bottom of each page, as that is probably added globally for the web site. even if the specific web page being viewed has not changed. And some team sites do not list the announcer team, while others have bios that are a few seasons' old, so I do not know if they are current.

Some of the online lists cannot be cut-and-pasted, as they are graphical images. One could create a JPEG image file and then feed it through an OCR scanner, but I find it simpler to hand-compare it to the text file I have saved from last season and create a new text file.

The announcer names are found at this URL:

That page seems to have been updated for the 2017 season, but the footnotes on that site all point to web page retrievals in 2012 at the bottom of some of the network list pages. I cannot include a network in this column if there is a "Do not Reproduce" warning on the web page.

There is a site <http://nflfootballtv.com/onlineradio.html> that has Internet online radio – streaming audio and video information on each team. I have no idea if that web site is current.

The Westwood One Radio Network (renamed to Dial Global Sports and in 2013 renamed to WestwoodOne Sports) will broadcast NFL games; this URL
